PRESENT,

The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS by Section 9 of the Weights and Measures Act, 1904 (4 Edw. VII Ch. 28), it is provided that it shall be lawful for His Majesty by Order in Council to specify new fees to be paid in respect of the Verification and Stamping of Weights, Measures and Weighing and Measuring instruments in substitution for the fees specified in the First Schedule of the Weights and Measures Act, 1889 (52 & 53 Vict., Ch. 21), and that any Order in Council so made may be varied or revoked by a subsequent Order in Council:

And whereas it is provided by subsection 2 of Section 3 of the Weights and Measures (Amendment) Act, 1926 (16 & 17 Geo. 5, Ch. 8), that the aforesaid power of His Majesty shall include and be deemed always to have included the power of specifying fees to be paid whether or not the weighing or measuring apparatus is found correct or is stamped:

And whereas His Majesty, by Order in Council dated 26th day of April, 1920 (S.R. & O. 1920, No. 685), directed that the fees specified in the Schedule to that Order should be taken in substitution for the fees specified in the Schedules to Orders in Council dated the 19th day of July, 1918, and the 11th day of July, 1919:

And whereas the Board of Trade have represented to His Majesty that it would be expedient to specify new fees to be paid upon the Verification and Stamping of Weights, Measures and Weighing and Measuring Instruments:

Now, therefore, His Majesty is pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:—

1. This Order may be cited as the Weights and Measures (Verification and Stamping Fees) Order, 1926, and shall come into force on the 1st day of October, 1926.

2. The Order in Council dated 26th April, 1920 (S.R. & O. 1920, No. 685), is hereby revoked.

3. The fees specified in the Schedule hereto to be paid in respect of the verification and stamping of weights, measures, weighing or measuring instruments, shall be substituted for the fees specified in the first Schedule to the Weights and Measures Act, 1889.

4. The fees specified in the Schedule hereto shall likewise be paid in respect of any weight, measure or weighing or measuring instrument which on verification is found to be incorrect or defective.

5. No fee shall be payable in respect of any weight, measure or weighing or measuring instrument voluntarily submitted to an Inspector for re-verification, provided that at the time of such submission, it bears a stamp of verification (which has not been defaced or obliterated in pursuance of the Weights and Measures Regulations, 1907, S.R. & O. 1907,

No. 698, or of any other Regulations made in substitution therefor) and has not been altered, repaired or adjusted since the date of the previous verification.

The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS the Right Reverend William, Lord Bishop of Exeter, has, under Section 26 of the Pluralities Act, 1838, made a Representation to the Right Honourable and Most Reverend Randall Thomas, Lord Archbishop of Canterbury, in the following terms:—

“ We, William, Lord Bishop of Exeter, in pursuance of the 26th Section of the Pluralities Act, 1838, do hereby represent to your Grace as follows:—

“ There is in the County of Devon and Diocese of Exeter the Benefice or United Rectory of North Lew with Ashbury the Parish of North Lew whereof contains a population of 730 persons or thereabouts with accommodation in the Parish Church for 200 persons.

“ The net annual value of the Benefice of North Lew with Ashbury is £612 or thereabouts.

“ There is also in the same County and Diocese the United Rectory of Halwill and Beaworthy. The Parish of Beaworthy contains a population of 253 persons or thereabouts with accommodation in the Parish Church for 100 persons.

“ The net annual value of the Benefice of Halwill and Beaworthy is £427 or thereabouts.

“ That it appears to us and we do hereby represent to your Grace that under the provisions of the said Pluralities Act, 1838, a portion of the Parish of North Lew (the boundaries of which are more particularly described in the Scheme annexed to this Representation and also delineated on the Ordnance Map annexed thereto and thereon edged with red) may be advantageously separated therefrom and be annexed to the said Parish of Beaworthy to which it is contiguous.

“ The Patron of the Benefices of North Lew with Ashbury and Halwill with Beaworthy is His Most Gracious Majesty King George the Fifth and the Reverend William Romaine Hervey is the Incumbent of North Lew with Ashbury and the Reverend Francis George Powell is the Incumbent of Halwill with Beaworthy.

“ That pursuant to the directions contained in the 26th Section of the Pluralities Act, 1838, we, the said Lord Bishop, have drawn up a Scheme in writing annexed to this Representation describing the mode in which it appears to us that the alterations above proposed may best be effected and how the changes consequent on such alterations in respect to Ecclesiastical dues rates and payments and in respect to Patronage and rights to pews may be made with justice to all parties interested and we do hereby submit the same together with the consents in writing of the said Patrons and Incumbents of the said Benefices to the intent that if your Grace shall on full consideration and enquiry be satisfied with such Scheme you may certify the same and such consents as aforesaid to His Majesty in Council.”

And whereas the said Scheme drawn up by the said Bishop and the Consents referred to in the said Representation are as follows:—

“ SCHEME.

“ It is proposed to separate from the Parish of North Lew and annex to the Parish of Beaworthy all that part of the Parish of North Lew being a portion of the Winsford Estate situate within the Eastern Boundary of the Parish of North Lew the boundaries of which are delineated on the Ordnance Map annexed hereto and edged with red.

“ That the Incumbent of the Benefice of Halwill with Beaworthy shall have sole and exclusive Cure of Souls within such portion so to be separated from North Lew.

“ That any inhabitants of such portion shall be entitled to accommodation in the Parish Church of Beaworthy but shall cease to be entitled to any right or accommodation in the Parish of North Lew.

“ That any inhabitant of the aforesaid portion shall have such and the same right to have Marriages Baptisms Churchings and Burials solemnized and performed in the Parish Church of Beaworthy as they might have had in the Parish Church of North Lew.

“ That no alterations shall be made in the Patronage of the said Benefices or either of them.

“ That the whole of the Tithe Rent Charge arising out of the land proposed to be separated from North Lew and added to the Parish of Beaworthy together with all glebe land, if any, in the area so to be separated is to remain the property of the Incumbent of North Lew as heretofore.

“ CONSENTS.

“ We, The Right Honourable Stanley Baldwin, First Lord of the Treasury, the Patron entitled to present or nominate to the Benefice of North Lew with Ashbury, and The Right Honourable George, Viscount Cave, Lord High Chancellor of Great Britain, the Patron entitled to present or nominate to the Benefice of Halwill with Beaworthy, The Reverend William Romaine Hervey the Incumbent of the said United Benefice of North Lew with Ashbury and the Reverend Francis George Powell the Incumbent of the United Rectory of Halwill with Beaworthy hereby respectively signify to your Grace our several consents to the Scheme above proposed and set forth and to every matter and thing herein contained.

" In testimony whereof we have hereunto set our respective hands this first day of July, 1926.

WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of the Union of Benefices Measure, 1923, duly prepared, and laid before His Majesty in Council, a Scheme bearing date the 10th day of June, 1926, in the words and figures following, that is to say:—

" We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, acting in pursuance of the Union of Benefices Measure, 1923, have prepared, and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council, the following Scheme for effecting the union of the Benefice (being a Vicarage) of Shipton Bellinger and the Benefice (being a Rectory) of South Tidworth both of which Benefices are situate in the County of Southampton and in the Diocese of Winchester:

" Whereas Commissioners appointed at our request by the Right Reverend Theodore, Bishop of Winchester, pursuant to the provisions of the said Union of Benefices Measure, 1923, to inquire into and report upon the union of the said two Benefices of Shipton Bellinger and South Tidworth duly made their Report to the said Bishop of Winchester and therein recommended the union of the said two Benefices and the terms for effecting the union, and the said Bishop of Winchester signified in writing his approval of the said Report:

" And whereas we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, have prepared this Scheme for the union of the said two Benefices based upon the terms recommended in the said Report:

" And whereas the said Benefice of South Tidworth is now full, the Reverend John Percival Thompson being the present Incumbent thereof and the said Benefice of Shipton Bellinger is at present vacant:

" And whereas the said John Percival Thompson has consented to become the first Incumbent of the United Benefice, if and when the union which is hereinafter recommended and proposed shall take effect:

" And whereas there is a Parsonage House belonging to each of the said Benefices of Shipton Bellinger and South Tidworth but neither of such Parsonage Houses is suitable for a Parsonage House for the United Benefice hereinafter recommended and proposed to be constituted:

" Now, therefore, we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, with the consent of the said Theodore, Bishop of Winchester (in testimony whereof he has signed this Scheme), do humbly recommend and propose to Your Majesty as follows, that is to say:—

" 1. That the said Benefice of Shipton Bellinger and the said Benefice of South Tidworth shall be permanently united together and form one Benefice with Cure of Souls under the style of 'The United Benefice of Shipton Bellinger with South Tidworth' but the Parishes of the said Benefices shall continue distinct in all respects.

" 2. That upon the day when any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme shall be published in the London Gazette the union shall forthwith take effect and the said John Percival Thompson if he is then Incumbent of the said Benefice of South Tidworth shall be the first Incumbent of the United Benefice.

" 3. That upon the said union taking effect and pending the provision of a new Parsonage House for the United Benefice the Parsonage House at present belonging to the said Benefice of South Tidworth shall become and be the house of residence for the Incumbent of the United Benefice and so soon as conveniently may be the Parsonage House at present belonging to the said Benefice of Shipton Bellinger and the site and appurtenances thereof and the grounds heretofore usually occupied and enjoyed therewith shall be sold and disposed of by us the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners at such time or times and in such manner in all respects as to us shall seem expedient and that the net proceeds of such sale shall be applied towards the cost of the provision of a new Parsonage House for the United Benefice.

" 4. That after the said union has taken effect the course and succession in which the respective Patrons shall present or nominate to the United Benefice from time to time as the same shall become vacant shall be as follows, that is to say, the right of presentation shall be exercised by the Patrons of the said two Benefices alternately, the Patron of the said Benefice of South Tidworth having the right upon the first presentation to the United Benefice to be made after the union and every alternate right of presentation and the Patrons of the said Benefice of Shipton Bellinger having the right of presentation upon the second presentation to the United Benefice to be made after the union and every alternate turn thereafter.

" Provided always that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid, or any of them, in accordance with the provisions of the said Measure, or of any other Measure of the National Assembly of the Church of England, or of any Act of Parliament."

And whereas drafts of the said Scheme have been duly published in accordance with the

provisions of the said Union of Benefices Measure, 1923, and Notices have been transmitted to the persons or bodies entitled under the same Measure to receive Notice requiring any objections to such draft Scheme to be stated or transmitted in writing to the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners within the time prescribed in the Statutory Rules applicable to proceedings under the said Union of Benefices Measure, 1923:

And whereas certain objections have been so stated or transmitted to the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners within the time prescribed in the same Rules:

And whereas the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners after giving full consideration to such objections have deemed right to make no alterations in such draft Scheme:

And whereas public notice of the certification to His Majesty in Council of the said Scheme and the consent thereto in writing of the Bishop of Winchester has been duly given in the manner and within the time prescribed in the Statutory Rules aforesaid:

And whereas no appeal has been made to His Majesty in Council within the period of one month after the date of the said public notice in accordance with the provisions of the said Measure against the said Scheme or any part thereof by any person who has made objection as aforesaid to the said draft Scheme:

And whereas the said Scheme has been approved by His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to affirm the said Scheme and to order that the Benefices therein recommended to be united shall be united to the extent and for the purposes recommended in the said Scheme, and further to order and direct that the said Scheme and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the date when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Measure.

And His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said Diocese of Winchester.

“ We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, acting in pursuance of the Union of Benefices Measure, 1923, have prepared, and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council, the following Scheme for effecting the union of the Benefice (being a Vicarage) of Long Wittenham and the Benefice (being a Rectory) of Little Wittenham, both of which Benefices are situate in the County of Berks and in the Diocese of Oxford:

“ Whereas Commissioners appointed at our request by the late Right Reverend Hubert Murray, Bishop of Oxford, pursuant to the provisions of the said Union of Benefices Measure, 1923, to inquire into and report upon the union of the said two Benefices of Long Wittenham and Little Wittenham duly made their Report to the Right Reverend Thomas Banks now Bishop of Oxford and therein recommended the union of the said two Benefices and the terms for effecting the union, and the said Thomas Banks, Bishop of Oxford, signified in writing his approval of the said Report:

“ And whereas we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, have prepared this Scheme for the union of the said two Benefices based upon the terms recommended in the said Report:

“ And whereas the said Benefice of Little Wittenham is now full the Reverend Walter Francis Bennett Ward being the present Incumbent thereof and the said Benefice of Long Wittenham is at present vacant:

“ Now, therefore, we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, with the consent of the said Thomas Banks, Bishop of Oxford (in testimony whereof he has signed this Scheme) do humbly recommend and propose to Your Majesty as follows, that is to say:—

“ 1. That the said Benefice of Long Wittenham and the said Benefice of Little Wittenham shall be permanently united together and form one Benefice with Cure of Souls under the style of ‘ The United Benefice of Wittenham ’ and that such United Benefice shall be included in and form part of the Rural Deanery of Abingdon but the Parishes of the said Benefices shall continue distinct in all respects.

“ 2. “ We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of the Act of the 33rd and 34th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 39, and of the Acts therein mentioned, that is to say, the Act of the 3rd and 4th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 113, the Act of the 4th and 5th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 39, and the Act of the 31st and 32nd years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 114, have prepared, and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council, the following Scheme for effecting a transfer of the ownership of the Advowson or perpetual right of Patronage of and presentation to the Church and Cure (hereinafter called ‘ the said Benefice ’) of Yate, in the County of Gloucester and in the Diocese of Gloucester :

“ Whereas the Advowson or perpetual right of Patronage of and presentation to the said Benefice of Yate is vested for an estate in fee simple without incumbrances in Walter Hyett Madge, of the City of Gloucester, Solicitor :

“ And whereas the said Walter Hyett Madge is desirous that the whole Advowson or perpetual right of Patronage of and presentation to the said Benefice of Yate, now vested in him as aforesaid, should be transferred to and be vested in the Bishop of Gloucester for the time being :

“ And whereas the Right Reverend Arthur Cayley, now Bishop of Gloucester, is willing to accept such transfer and in token of such his willingness and also in token that the same transfer has that consent of the Bishop of the Diocese which by the Acts in the hereinbefore mentioned Act recited or by some or one of them is made necessary he, the said Arthur Cayley, Bishop of Gloucester, has executed this Scheme as hereinafter mentioned :

“ And whereas the transfer of the Patronage of the said Benefice of Yate which is hereinbefore mentioned and hereinafter recommended and proposed will in our opinion tend to make better provision for the Cure of Souls in the Parish or District in or in respect of which the right of Patronage or Advowson so recommended and proposed to be transferred as aforesaid arises or exists, that is to say, in the Parish of Yate :

“ Now, therefore, with the consent of the said Walter Hyett Madge (in testimony whereof he has signed and sealed this Scheme)

and with the consent of the said Arthur Cayley, Bishop of Gloucester (in testimony whereof he has signed this Scheme and sealed the same with his Episcopal Seal), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, humbly recommend and propose that upon and from the day of the date of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme and without any conveyance or assurance in the law other than such duly gazetted Order the whole Advowson or perpetual right of Patronage of and presentation to the said Benefice of Yate now vested in him the said Walter Hyett Madge as aforesaid, shall be transferred to the said Arthur Cayley, Bishop of Gloucester, and his successors in the same Bishopric, and shall thereupon and thenceforth become and be absolutely vested in and shall and may from time to time be exercised by the said Arthur Cayley, Bishop of Gloucester, and by his successors in the same Bishopric for ever.

"And we further recommend and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any further or other measures relating to the matters aforesaid, or any of them, in accordance with the provisions of the said Acts, or of any of them or of any other Act of Parliament."

And whereas the said Scheme has been approved by His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said Scheme, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Acts.

And His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said Diocese of Gloucester.

WEST HARTLEPOOL CORPORATION (TRAMWAYS ABANDONMENT).

And whereas in exercise of the powers conferred by the said Section 5 of the Act of 1923 the Corporation have provided and equipped

trolley vehicles along the route of the tramways hereinafter described; that is to say:—

(4) Tramway No. 1A authorised by the West Hartlepool Tramways Order, 1898, commencing by a junction with the existing tramway of the Promoters in Cleveland Road at a point .57 chain or thereabouts measured south-westwards from the north-west corner of the Public Library in Clarence Street and passing thence by a curved line along Cleveland Road and Clarence Street, and terminating in Clarence Street by a junction with the proposed Tramway No. 1 at a point 0.424 chain or thereabouts measured north-

easterly from the said north-west corner of the Public Library in Clarence Street.

And whereas the Corporation have applied to the Minister of Transport for an Order to authorise the permanent discontinuance and abandonment by them of the tramways hereinbefore described.

Now therefore the Minister of Transport in exercise of the powers in that behalf conferred on him by the said Section 17 of the Act of 1923 and of any and every other power thereunto him enabling hereby orders as follows:—

(1) The Corporation may and shall forthwith abandon and discontinue the tramways hereinbefore described and shall with all reasonable despatch remove the rails of the said tramways and restore the portion of the road upon which such rails are laid to as good a condition as that in which it was before such rails were laid down.

(2) As from the date of this Order the powers and obligations of the Corporation to run services of tramcars on the said tramways under any Act or Order shall cease, and as from the date on which the removal of the rails of the said tramways and the restoration of the road upon which the same are laid shall be duly completed all other powers liabilities duties or obligations conferred or imposed on the Corporation by any Act or Order relating to the said tramways shall cease except so far as such powers liabilities duties or obligations are applicable or relate to the trolley vehicles of the Corporation.

(3) This Order may be cited as the West Hartlepool Corporation (Tramways Abandonment) Order, 1926.
