DANGEROUS DRUGS.

THE DANGEROUS DRUGS REGULATIONS, 1926, DATED JULY 29TH, 1926, MADE BY THE SECRETARY OF STATE UNDER SECTION 7 OF THE DANGEROUS DRUGS ACT, 1920 (10 & 11 GEO. V, c. 46.)

In pursuance of section 7 of the Dangerous Drugs Act, 1920, I hereby make the following Regulations amending the Dangerous Drugs Regulations, 1921, hereinafter referred to as the Principal Regulations.

1. Regulation 5 of the Principal Regulations shall be amended and shall take effect as if—

(1) for the words "the total amount of the drug to be supplied on the prescription" were substituted the words "the total amount of the morphine, cocaine, ecgonine or diamorphine or salt thereof, to be supplied on the prescription, except that in the case of a preparation which is contained in the British Pharmacopoeia, the British Pharmaceutical Codex or the Drug Tariff issued by the Minister of Health for national health insurance purposes and which is not combined with any other preparation of any of the drugs not so contained, it shall be sufficient to state the total amount of the preparation to be supplied and"

(2) at the end of the first paragraph were inserted the following new paragraph:—

A prescription shall only be given by a duly qualified medical practitioner when required for purposes of medical treatment.

2. Regulation 7 of the Principal Regulations shall be amended and shall take effect as if the following proviso were added to paragraph (d) of the Regulation:—

Provided that the last foregoing provision shall not apply to any drug supplied to a person for his use by a medical practitioner or in accordance with a prescription if that person was at the time of the supply in course of receiving treatment from another medical practitioner in respect of addiction to any of the drugs or otherwise, and of being supplied with any of the drugs by or on a prescription given by that last-mentioned practitioner, and did not disclose that fact to the first-mentioned practitioner before the drug was supplied to him.

3. Every duly qualified medical practitioner, registered dentist and registered veterinary surgeon, shall, if not already required to do so

in pursuance of Regulation 9 of the Principal Regulations, enter or cause to be entered in a register kept for the sole purpose in respect of each supply of each of the drugs purchased or otherwise obtained by him, the particulars shown in Schedule I (a) to the Principal Regulations.

4. If the Secretary of State is of opinion that there is reason to think that a duly qualified medical practitioner may be supplying, administering or prescribing any of the drugs either to or for himself or to or for other persons otherwise than as required for purposes of medical treatment, he may refer the case to a tribunal constituted in the manner described in the Schedule for examination and consideration, and if the tribunal so recommend, the Secretary of State may by notice in the London or Edinburgh Gazette withdraw the authorisation of such practitioner to be in possession of or to supply the drugs and may direct that the exception in Regulation 4 of the Principal Regulations in respect of drugs lawfully dispensed in pursuance of a prescription given by a duly qualified medical practitioner shall not apply in respect of prescriptions given by such practitioner as aforesaid.

5. Regulation 12 of the Principal Regulations shall be amended and shall take effect as if at the end were added the following sentence:—

“ Where such person is a duly qualified medical practitioner or registered dentist or registered veterinary surgeon, the Secretary of State may also, by notice given in the like manner, direct that the exception in Regulation 4 of the Principal Regulations in respect of drugs lawfully dispensed in pursuance of a prescription given by a duly qualified medical practitioner or registered dentist or registered veterinary practitioner shall not apply in respect of prescriptions given by such practitioner, dentist, or veterinary surgeon as aforesaid.”

6. A medical practitioner, registered dentist or registered veterinary surgeon shall not give any prescription for the supply of any of the drugs, if a direction has been given in pursuance of Regulation 4 or Regulation 5 of these Regulations that the exception in Regulation 4 of the Principal Regulations is not to apply in respect of prescriptions given by such practitioner, dentist or veterinary surgeon.

7. Every person authorised in pursuance of Regulation 10 of the Principal Regulations to carry on the business of manufacturing, selling or distributing the drugs shall keep the same in a locked receptacle of which the key shall be kept by himself or a qualified assistant.

8. These Regulations may be referred to as the DANGEROUS DRUGS REGULATIONS, 1926.

Now, therefore, in pursuance of the powers conferred on me by Regulation 12 of the Dangerous Drugs Regulations, 1921, as amended by Regulation 5 of the Dangerous Drugs Regulations, 1926, I hereby give notice that I direct, as from to-day's date, that the exception in Regulation 4 of the Dangerous Drugs Regulations, 1921, which permits dangerous drugs to be supplied on a prescription given by a duly qualified medical practitioner shall not apply in respect of prescriptions given by the said Dr. Frederick George Lewtas.

Commencing at the point of intersection of the boundaries of Cheshire, Derbyshire and Yorkshire, near Saltersbrook Bridge, then in a westerly direction along the county boundary of Cheshire and Derby to Crowden Station, thence along the road via Torside, and the Devils Elbow to the point where it reaches the boundary of the borough of Glossop, thence along the eastern boundary of the said boundary, to the point where it meets the main road to Hayfield, thence in a southerly direction along that road via the Grouse Inn to Hayfield, thence continuing in a generally south-easterly direction via Chinley Head and Bole Hill to Chapel-en-le-Frith, thence in an easterly direction along the road via Laneside to the Inn at Sparrowpit, thence along the road via Perryfoot, Oxlow House and the Winnats to Castleton, thence in an easterly and south-easterly direction along the main road via Hope to Hathersage, thence by the road under the Railway from Hathersage to Grindleford, west of Hathersage Station, to Grindleford Bridge, thence in a north-easterly direction along the road from Grindleford Bridge to Sheffield, to the point where it meets the western boundary of the parish of Totley, near Fox House Inn, thence in a northerly direction along the western boundaries of the parishes of Totley and Dore, to the county boundary, thence in a generally north-easterly and northerly direction to the point of commencement.

*In the county of the West Riding of Yorkshire.*

The parish of Bradfield; so much of the parish of Langsett as lies to the south and west of the road from Sheffield via Langsett and Crow Edge to Hepworth, and such part of the city and county borough of Sheffield as lies to the west of the following boundary, namely:—

Commencing at the county boundary near Ringinglow, thence via Ringinglow, Andwell Lane, Blackbrook Road, Rails Road, Bingley Lane and Hopwood Lane to the city boundary.

An Area comprising:—

*In the county of the West Riding of Yorkshire.*

The boroughs of Keighley, Todmorden and Ripon.

The petty sessional divisions of Todmorden, Ewecross, Keighley, Otley, Ripon Liberty (*except the parish of Nidd*), Kirkby Malzeard, East Staincliffe, West Staincliffe and Bolton-by-Bowland; the Pateley Bridge (Claro) subdivision of the petty sessional division of Claro, and the parishes of Denholme, Haverah Park, Hampsthwaite and Felliscliffe.

Such part of the county of the North Riding of Yorkshire as is comprised within the following boundary, namely:—

Commencing at the southernmost point in the boundary of the parish of Carlton Highdale, thence in easterly and north easterly directions along the boundary of that parish till it joins the River Cover; thence north eastward along the River Cover till it joins the River Ure, thence westward and northward along the River Ure to the county boundary of the North Riding; thence southward along the western boundary and eastward along the southern boundary of that Riding to the point of commencement.

The administrative counties of Denbigh, Flint, Merioneth, and Montgomery, such part of the administrative county of Cardigan as lies to the north of the main road from Aberystwyth via Goginan to Eisteddfa Gurig, and the parishes of Brompton and Rhiston and Chirbury in the administrative county of Salop.

An Area comprising:—

*In the administrative county of Brecknock.*

The parishes of Traian-Glas, Ystradgynlais Lower, Ystradgynlais Higher and Glyntawe; and

*In the administrative county of Carmarthen.*

The parishes of Quarter Bach, Llanddeusant, Myddfai, Llangadock, and Llandilo-Fawr Rural (*except its detached part*).
