“And whereas we consider that the allowance should not be withheld from a Lieutenant-Commander appointed as Executive Officer to a Flag Ship in which an Executive Com-
mander is not borne :

“We beg leave humbly to recommend that Your Majesty may be graciously pleased by Your Order in Council to sanction payment of Flag Allowance, at existing rates, with retrospective effect to the 1st April, 1926, to either the Commander or the Lieutenant Commander appointed for Executive Duties to a ship bearing a Flag or Broad Pendant :

“The Lords Commissioners of Your Majesty's Treasury have signified their concurrence in this proposal.”

His Majesty, having taken the said Memorial into consideration, was pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to approve of what is therein proposed.

"And whereas Your Majesty was graciously pleased by Your Order in Council bearing date the 5th April, 1921, to sanction the payment, at our discretion, of Machinery Allowance to the Engineer Officers borne for charge of the machinery of the Central Reserve of Minesweepers, although these vessels are not in commission:

"And whereas there is now a Reserve of Minesweepers at Malta, constituted on similar lines to the Central Reserve of Minesweepers, in respect of which we consider that Machinery Allowance should also be paid to the Engineer Officers borne for charge of machinery:

"We beg leave humbly to recommend that Your Majesty may be graciously pleased by Your Order in Council, to authorize us, at our discretion, to issue as from the 1st April, 1925, payment of Machinery Allowance to the Engineer Officers borne for charge of machinery of the Reserve of Minesweepers at Malta.

"The Lords Commissioners of Your Majesty's Treasury have signified their concurrence in this proposal."

WHEREAS by Section 80 of the Merchant Shipping Act, 1906, power is given to His Majesty by Order in Council to make Regulations with respect to the manner in which Government ships may be registered as British ships for the purpose of the Merchant Shipping Acts:

And whereas by the said Section it is provided that those Acts shall, subject to any exceptions and modifications which may be made by Order in Council, either generally or as respects any special class of Government ships, apply to Government ships registered in accordance with such Regulations as if they were registered in manner provided by those Acts:

And whereas the provisions of Section 1 of the Rules Publication Act, 1893, have been complied with:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by virtue of the powers in this behalf by the said Act, or

otherwise in Him vested, is pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered, that the following Regulations shall have effect as regards any Government ships in the service of the Government of the Colony of the Straits Settlements (hereinafter referred to as the Colonial Government):—

1. An application for registry of a Government ship in the service of the Colonial Government shall be made in writing under the hand of the Colonial Secretary of the Straits Settlements or other officer of the Colonial Government nominated by the Governor, or by one of the Crown Agents for the Colonies. Such application shall contain the following particulars:—

(i) A statement of the name and description of the ship.

(ii) A statement of the time when and place where the ship was built, or, if the ship was foreign built, and the time and place of building are unknown, a statement to that effect and of her foreign name.

(iii) A statement of the nature of the title to the said ship, whether by original construction by or for the Colonial Government, or by purchase, capture, condemnation, or otherwise, and a list of the documents of title, if any, in case she was not originally constructed by or for the Colonial Government.

(iv) A statement of the name of the Master.

2. The Registrar, on receiving such application in respect of a Government ship in the service of the Colonial Government, shall—

(i) enter the ship in the Register Book as belonging to "His Majesty, represented by the Government of the Colony of the Straits Settlements" and shall also enter therein:

(ii) the name of the port to which she belongs:

(iii) the particulars stated in the application for registration:

(iv) the details comprised in the Surveyor's Certificate.

3. On the registry of a Government ship in the service of the Colonial Government the Registrar shall retain in his possession the Surveyor's Certificate and the application for registry and any documents of title mentioned in such application.

4. Upon the transfer of a registered Government ship in the service of the Colonial Government by Bill of Sale, the Colonial Government shall be the transferors, and the Bill of Sale shall be in Form A in the proper form prescribed under the Merchant Shipping Act, 1894, hereinafter called the principal Act, omitting the covenant therein contained. Any such Bill of Sale shall be signed by the Colonial Secretary or other officer or Crown Agent as aforesaid on behalf of the Colonial Government.

5. The application for a Certificate of Sale referred to in Sections 39 to 42 and Sections 44 to 46 of the principal Act, may be made in respect of a Government ship in the service of the Colonial Government by the Colonial Secretary or other officer or Crown Agent as aforesaid on behalf of the Colonial Government.

6. The person to whom the management of any Government ship in the service of the Colonial Government is entrusted by the Colonial Government shall be registered as provided by Section 59 (2) of the principal Act.

7. Where any provision of the Merchant Shipping Acts which by virtue of the Merchant Shipping Act, 1906, and this Order in Council is applicable to Government ships in the service of the Colonial Government imposes any duty or liability or confers any right or power upon or contemplates any act being performed by the owner of a ship such duty, liability, right, or power shall, subject always to the other provisions of this Order in Council be carried out, borne, or exercised by the Colonial Government on behalf of His Majesty.

8. In this Order in Council the term Merchant Shipping Acts shall mean and include any of the Merchant Shipping Acts, any provision of which is by virtue of the Merchant Shipping Act, 1906, and this Order, applicable to Government ships.

9. The following sections and provisions of the Merchant Shipping Acts shall not apply to Government ships in the service of the Colonial Government registered in pursuance of this Order, namely:—

(i) The Merchant Shipping Act, 1894—Sections 1, 8 to 12, 427 to 431.

The provisions of Part II of the Act relating to the requirement of officers to hold certificates of competency and the production of these certificates.

(ii) The Merchant Shipping (Mercantile Marine Fund) Act, 1898—Sections 3 and 5.

(iii) The Merchant Shipping Act, 1906—Sections 25 and 27.

Provided always that no provision of the Merchant Shipping Acts which, according to a reasonable construction, would not apply in the case of Government ships in the service of the Colonial Government, shall be deemed to apply to such ships by reason only that its application is not hereby expressly excluded.

10. Anything required or authorised by this Order in Council to be done by the Colonial Government may be done by the Colonial Secretary or other officer or Crown Agent as aforesaid.

“ We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, acting in pursuance of the Union of Benefices Measure, 1923; have prepared, and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council, the following Scheme for altering the boundaries of the Parishes of the Benefice (being an United Benefice) of Potten End with Nettleden situate partly in the County of

Buckingham and partly in the County of Hertford and in the Diocese of Saint Albans, by annexing thereto contiguous parts of the Parishes of the Benefices of Great Gaddesden; Sunnyside, Saint Michael and All Angels; Hemel Hempstead (Saint Mary); and Berkhamstead Saint Mary (otherwise known and hereinafter referred to as Northchurch) all situate in the said County of Hertford and in the said Diocese of Saint Albans:

“ Whereas Commissioners appointed at our request by the Right Reverend Michael, Bishop of Saint Albans, pursuant to the provisions of the said Union of Benefices Measure, 1923, to inquire into and report upon the desirability of altering the boundaries of the Parishes of the said Benefices (inter alia) of Potten End with Nettleden; Great Gaddesden; Sunnyside, Saint Michael and All Angels; and Northchurch duly made their Report to the said Bishop of Saint Albans, and therein recommended certain alterations of the boundaries of the Parishes of the said Benefices and also recommended an alteration of the boundaries of the Parish of the said Benefice of Hemel Hempstead (Saint Mary), and the said Bishop of Saint Albans signified in writing his approval of the said Report:

“ And whereas we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, have prepared this Scheme for the alteration of boundaries recommended in the said Report based upon the terms therein recommended:

“ And whereas all of the said Benefices of Potten End with Nettleden; Great Gaddesden; Sunnyside, Saint Michael and All Angels; Hemel Hempstead (Saint Mary); and Northchurch are now full, the Reverend Augustine Rhun Price being the present Incumbent of the said Benefice of Potten End with Nettleden, the Reverend Augustus Theodore Hollis being the present Incumbent of the said Benefice of Great Gaddesden, the Reverend Lister Goodenough Elton Sunderland being the present Incumbent of the said Benefice of Sunnyside, Saint Michael and All Angels, the Reverend Archibald Francis Robson being the present Incumbent of the said Benefice of Hemel Hempstead (Saint Mary), and the Reverend Prebendary Reginald Henry Pope being the present Incumbent of the said Benefice of Northchurch:

“ And whereas the Advowson or perpetual right of Patronage of and presentation to the said Benefice of Hemel Hempstead (Saint Mary) is vested in Your Majesty, Your Heirs and Successors and is exercised on behalf of Your Majesty by the Lord High Chancellor of Great Britain for the time being:

“ Now, therefore, we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, with the consent of the said Michael, Bishop of Saint Albans, and with the consents of George, Viscount Cave, now Lord High Chancellor of Great Britain, the said Augustine Rhun Price, the said Augustus Theodore Hollis, the said Lister Goodenough Elton Sunderland, the said Archibald Francis Robson, and the said Reginald Henry Pope (in testimony whereof they have respectively signed this Scheme), do humbly recommend and propose to Your Majesty as follows, that is to say:—

“ That upon the day of the date of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council affirming this Scheme

(A) there shall be severed from the Parishes of the said three Benefices of Great Gaddesden, Sunnyside Saint Michael and All Angels and Hemel Hempstead (Saint Mary) and transferred and annexed for all ecclesiastical purposes to the Parish of Potten End certain portions of the Parishes of the said three Benefices respectively namely (a) the south western portion of the Parish of the said Benefice of Great Gaddesden which includes Pottenend Farm, Hollybush Wood and a part of Heizdin's Wood all which portion is more particularly delineated and set forth upon the map or plan hereto-annexed and thereon coloured purple; (b) the northern portion of the Parish of the said Benefice of Sunnyside Saint Michael and All Angels including Moor Cottage and Littleheath Small Farm all which portion is more particularly delineated and set forth upon the said map or plan and thereon coloured blue; and (c) all that portion of the Parish of the said Benefice of Hemel Hempstead (Saint Mary) which lies to the north of the middle of the road which runs from Potten End to Hemel Hempstead and to the west of the footpath leading from the same road northwards to Pottenend Farm all which portion is more particularly delineated and set forth upon the said map or plan and thereon coloured green and (B) there shall be severed from the Parish of the said Benefice of Northchurch and transferred and annexed for all ecclesiastical purposes to the Parish of Nettleden all that detached portion of the said Parish of Northchurch marked 'Northchurch Detachment Number 2' upon the Ordnance Map (upon the scale of six inches to a mile) of Hertfordshire published in the year 1901 (Second Edition) all which portion is more particularly delineated and set forth upon the said map or plan and thereon coloured pink.

" Provided always that nothing herein contained shall be construed as affecting in any way the endowments or property of any of the Benefices herein mentioned.

" And provided further that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid, or any of them, in accordance with the provisions of the said Measure, or of any other Measure of the National Assembly of the Church of England, or of any Act of Parliament."

And whereas drafts of the said Scheme have been duly published in accordance with the provisions of the said Union of Benefices Measure, 1923, and Notices have been transmitted to the persons or bodies entitled under the same Measure to receive Notice requiring any objections to such draft Scheme to be stated or transmitted in writing to the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners within the time prescribed in the Statutory Rules made under the said Union of Benefices Measure, 1923:

And whereas the prescribed time has elapsed and no such objections have been so stated or transmitted to the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners:

And whereas public notice of the certification to His Majesty in Council of the said Scheme and the consent thereto in writing of the Bishop of Saint Albans has been duly given in the manner and within the time prescribed in the Statutory Rules aforesaid:

And whereas the said Scheme has been approved by His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to affirm the said Scheme and to order that the alteration of boundaries therein recommended shall be duly effected and further to order and direct that the said Scheme and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the date when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Measure.

And His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said Diocese of Saint Albans.

" Whereas Commissioners appointed at our request by the Right Reverend William, Bishop of Exeter, pursuant to the provisions of the said Union of Benefices Measure, 1923, to inquire into and report upon the union of the said two Benefices of Dunkeswell and Dunkeswell Abbey, Holy Trinity, duly made their Report to the said Bishop of Exeter and therein recommended the union of the said two Benefices and the terms for effecting the union, and the said Bishop of Exeter signified in writing his approval of the said Report:

" And whereas we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, have prepared this Scheme for the union of the said two Benefices based upon the terms recommended in the said Report:

" And whereas the said Benefice of Dunkeswell Abbey, Holy Trinity, is now full, the Reverend Victor Edwin Seagrove being the present Incumbent thereof and the said Benefice of Dunkeswell is at present vacant:

" And whereas the Advowson or perpetual right of Patronage of and presentation to each of the said two Benefices of Dunkeswell and Dunkeswell Abbey, Holy Trinity, now belongs to one and the same Patron or Patrons:

" Now, therefore, we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, with the consent of the said William, Bishop of Exeter (in

testimony whereof he has signed this Scheme), do humbly recommend and propose to Your Majesty as follows, that is to say:—

“ 1. That the said Benefice of Dunkeswell and the said Benefice of Dunkeswell Abbey, Holy Trinity, shall be permanently united together and form one Benefice with Cure of Souls under the style of ‘ The United Benefice of Dunkeswell with Dunkeswell Abbey ’ and that the Parishes of the said Benefices shall also be united into one Parish for ecclesiastical purposes and for such other purposes as in the said Measure provided.

“ 2. That the Church of the Parish of Dunkeswell shall be the Parish Church of the United Parish and that the Table of Fees for the said Parish of Dunkeswell shall (until revised or altered by proper authority) be the Table of Fees for the United Parish.

“ 3. That if upon the day when any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme shall be published in the London Gazette both of the said two Benefices shall be vacant, the union of the same two Benefices shall take effect forthwith; and if the said Benefice of Dunkeswell Abbey, Holy Trinity only shall be then vacant the said union shall also take effect forthwith if the Incumbent of the other of the said two Benefices shall consent to become the first Incumbent of the United Benefice, but if he shall not so consent then the said union shall take effect upon the then next avoidance of the said Benefice of Dunkeswell and the then Incumbent of Dunkeswell Abbey, Holy Trinity, shall be the first Incumbent of the United Benefice; and if the said Benefice of Dunkeswell only shall be then vacant the said union shall take effect upon the next avoidance of the said Benefice of Dunkeswell Abbey, Holy Trinity, and if neither of the said two Benefices be then vacant, then the said union shall take effect on the next avoidance of the said Benefice of Dunkeswell Abbey, Holy Trinity, if the Incumbent at that time of the said Benefice of Dunkeswell shall have been instituted to Dunkeswell subsequently to the date of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme or if instituted before that date shall consent to become the Incumbent of the United Benefice; but if he shall have been instituted to Dunkeswell before that date and shall not so consent, then the said union shall take effect immediately upon the next vacancy of the Benefice of Dunkeswell following such avoidance of the Benefice of Dunkeswell Abbey, Holy Trinity, and the then Incumbent of Dunkeswell Abbey, Holy Trinity, shall become the first Incumbent of the United Benefice.

“ 4. That upon the union taking effect the marriage registers in duplicate current at the Church of Dunkeswell Abbey, Holy Trinity, shall be sent by the Incumbent of the United Benefice to the Registrar General to be closed officially.

“ 5. That upon the said union taking effect the Parsonage House at present belonging to the said Benefice of Dunkeswell shall become and be the house of residence for the Incumbent of the United Benefice.

And His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said Diocese of Exeter.

“ Whereas the said two Benefices of Much Wenlock and Bourton are now held in plurality and have been so held continuously save during periods of avoidance under not less than three successive Incumbencies:

" And whereas the said Benefices of Much Wenlock and Bourton are now held in plurality by the Reverend John William Isherwood :

" And whereas the said John William Isherwood has consented to become the first Incumbent of the United Benefice, if and when the union which is hereinafter recommended and proposed shall take effect :

" And whereas there is no Parsonage House belonging to either of the said two Benefices of Much Wenlock or Bourton :

" And whereas the right of presentation or nomination to the said Benefice of Bourton belongs to the Vicar or Incumbent for the time being of the Vicarage of the said Benefice of Much Wenlock :

" Now, therefore, we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England with the consent of the Right Reverend Martin Linton, Bishop of Hereford (in testimony whereof he has signed this Scheme), and with the consent of the Diocesan Committee of the Diocese of Hereford appointed pursuant to the first section of the said Union of Benefices Measure, 1923, (signified by a Resolution of the said Diocesan Committee dated the 23rd day of June, 1926, and duly communicated to us the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners), do humbly recommend and propose to Your Majesty as follows, that is to say :—

“ Whereas it has been represented to us by the Right Reverend Henry Herbert, Bishop of Carlisle, that the arrangements which are hereinafter recommended and proposed with respect to some of the Rural Deaneries within the said Archdeaconry of Carlisle are desirable and should be carried into effect and we are of opinion that the same may be properly carried into effect :

and be and form part of the Rural Deanery and Archdeaconry under the names of which it is set down as aforesaid, and shall be subject to the jurisdiction and authority of the Rural Dean of the Rural Deanery and of the Archdeacon of the Archdeaconry under which it is so set down as aforesaid, and shall not belong to or be a part of any other Rural Deanery or Archdeaconry, nor be subject to the juris-

diction and authority of any other Rural Dean or of any other Archdeacon.

“ And we further recommend and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other matter or thing with respect to the matters aforesaid, or any of them by virtue of the said Acts, or of any of them, or of any other Act of Parliament.”

“ Whereas by the authority of an Order of Her said late Majesty in Council bearing date the 26th day of June, 1861, and published in the London Gazette on the 28th day of the same month, a separate District was annexed to the consecrated Church of Saint Peter, Levenshulme, situate within the original limits of the said Parish of Manchester, and the said District was named ‘ The District of Saint Peter, Levenshulme ’ :

“ And whereas by the authority of an Order of His late Majesty King Edward the Seventh in Council bearing date the 11th day of June, 1902, and published in the London Gazette on

the 13th day of the same month, portions of the Parish of Saint Elisabeth, Reddish, of the Parish of Saint James, Gorton, of the Parish of Christ Church, Denton, and of the District of Saint George, Abbey Hey, all within the original limits of the said Parish of Manchester, were constituted a separate District for spiritual purposes, and the said District was named ‘ The District of Saint Agnes, North Reddish ’ :

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of the Act of the 3rd and 4th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 113, of the Act of the 6th and 7th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 37, and of the Act of the 19th and 20th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 104, have prepared and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council the following Scheme for constituting a separate District for spiritual purposes to be taken partly out of the New Parish (sometime District Chapelry) of Christ Church, Crewe, partly out of the Parish of Wistaston, and partly out of the Parish of Wybunbury, all in the County of Chester and in the Diocese of Chester:

"Whereas we are satisfied that the said New Parish of Christ Church, Crewe, the said Parish of Wistaston, and the said Parish of Wybunbury are Cures wherein or in parts whereof the provision for public worship and for pastoral superintendence is insufficient for the spiritual wants of the inhabitants thereof and it has been made to appear to us that it would promote the interests of religion that the particular portions of the said New Parish of Christ Church, Crewe, the said Parish of Wistaston and the said Parish of Wybunbury which are hereinafter mentioned and described should be constituted a separate District in the manner which is hereinafter set forth:

“ Now, therefore, with the consent of the Right Reverend Henry Luke, now Bishop of Chester (in testimony whereof he has signed and sealed this Scheme), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, humbly recommend and propose that all those portions of the said New Parish of Christ Church, Crewe, of the said Parish of Wistaston, and of the said Parish of Wybunbury which are described in the Schedule hereunder written, all which portions together with the boundaries thereof are delineated and set forth upon the map or plan hereunto annexed, shall, upon and from the day of the date of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme, become and be constituted a separate District for spiritual purposes and that the same shall be named ‘ The District of Saint Andrew, Crewe.’

“ And we further recommend and propose that the whole right of patronage of the said District so recommended to be constituted and when such District shall have become a New Parish, as aforesaid then of such New Parish, and of the nomination of an Incumbent

thereof shall without any assurance in the law other than this Scheme and any duly gazetted Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying the same and upon and from the day of the date of the publication of such Order in the London Gazette as aforesaid, be assigned to and be absolutely vested in and shall and may from time to time be exercised by the said Henry Luke, Bishop of Chester, and his successors for ever.

And whereas the said Scheme has been approved by His Majesty in Council:

WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of the Act of the 6th and 7th years of His late Majesty King William the Fourth, Chapter 77, and of the Act of the 5th and 6th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria,

Chapter 26, duly prepared, and laid before His Majesty in Council, a Scheme, bearing date the 29th day of July, 1926, in the words and figures following, that is to say:—

" We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of the Act of the 6th and 7th years of His late Majesty King William the Fourth, Chapter 77, and of the Act of the 5th and 6th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 26, have prepared and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council the following Scheme for authorising certain improvements at the Episcopal House of Residence belonging to the See of Hereford, which is known as 'The Palace, Hereford:'

" Whereas the Right Reverend Martin Linton, now Bishop of Hereford, is desirous that certain improvements should be made at the said Episcopal House of Residence and has submitted to us the particulars of such improvements and we have specified our general approval of the same:

" And whereas the said Bishop is also desirous and it appears to us to be expedient that towards the cost of effecting the aforesaid improvements a sum of £200 (being a sum which, together with the outstanding balance of the sum already borrowed upon the same security under the authority of the statutes hereinbefore mentioned, does not exceed two years' income of the See) should be provided by his borrowing the same by way of mortgage upon the security of all and every part of the lands, tenements and hereditaments, endowments or emoluments which now belong or may hereafter belong to the Bishopric of Hereford:

" Now, therefore, with the consent of the said Martin Linton, Bishop of Hereford (testified by his having affixed his signature and Episcopal Seal to this Scheme), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, humbly recommend and propose that the said Bishop be authorised to borrow from the Governors of the Bounty of Queen Anne, and that the said Governors be empowered to lend under the provisions of the above mentioned Acts any sum not exceeding £200 and that as a security for the same the said Bishop do mortgage all and every part of the lands tenements and hereditaments and endowments or emoluments which now belong or may hereafter belong to his said See to the said Governors by Deed for a term of 12 years or until the said sum of £200, with interest for the same as hereinafter mentioned, and all costs and charges which may attend the recovery thereof, shall be fully paid and satisfied and that such principal sum shall be repaid with interest in the manner following, that is to say, during and in respect of the first period of 12 months of the said term computed from the day of the date of the mortgage, no part of the said principal sum shall be repayable but the said Bishop or his successors shall yearly at the end of the second period of 12 months so computed and at the end of every such like period of 12 months thereafter, pay to the said Governors, their successors or assigns, one tenth part of the said principal sum of £200 until the whole thereof shall be repaid, and shall also at the end of the first and each succeeding

period of 12 months, computed as aforesaid, pay interest at the rate of £4 per centum per annum on the said principal sum or on so much thereof as shall from time to time remain unpaid. And that if and when it shall happen that either the principal or the interest directed to be paid as hereinbefore mentioned shall be in arrear and unpaid for the space of 40 days after the same shall have become due it shall and may be lawful for the said Governors their successors and assigns to recover the same and the costs and charges attending the recovery thereof by distress and sale in the like manner as rents may be recovered by landlords or lessors from their tenants by the laws in force at the time of such distress and sale. And that such mortgage Deed shall be in the form and to the effect to be approved by us, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, and shall bind as well the said Martin Linton, now Bishop of the said Diocese of Hereford, as every succeeding Bishop of the same Diocese, until the principal money and interest costs and charges shall have been paid off and discharged.

" And we further recommend and propose that the said sum of £200 so to be borrowed as aforesaid shall be paid to us, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, that the said Governors and their successors shall not be bound or required to see to the application thereof, and that upon the receipt of the said sum so to be borrowed as aforesaid the whole or any part or parts thereof shall be applied by us at such time or times and in such manner as shall appear to us to be expedient towards effecting the said proposed improvements at the Episcopal House of Residence aforesaid.

" And we further recommend and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid, or any of them, in conformity with the provisions of the herein named Acts, or of either of them, or of any other Act of Parliament."
