PRESENT,

The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS by subsection (3) of Section 26 of the Tithe Act, 1925, it is enacted that, except where otherwise expressly provided, the Act shall come into operation on the appointed day, and the appointed day shall be a date or dates not earlier than the sixth day of April nineteen hundred and twenty-six, and not later than the first day of April nineteen hundred and twenty-seven:

And whereas the said subsection provides that different days may be fixed for different provisions and different purposes of the Act:

Now, therefore, His Majesty is pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:—

- (1) This Order may be cited as the "Tithe Act (Appointed Days) Order, 1926."
- (2) For the purposes of sections 7 and 25 of the Tithe Act, 1925, the appointed day shall be the first day of October, 1926.
- (3) For the purposes of the remaining provisions of the said Act, the appointed day shall be the 31st day of March, 1927.
