A PROCLAMATION.

GEORGE R.I.

**W**HEREAS by the Emergency Powers Act, 1920, it is enacted that if it appears to Us that any action has been taken or is immediately threatened by any persons or body of persons of such a nature and on so extensive a scale as to be calculated, by interfering with the supply and distribution of food, water, fuel, or light, or with the means of locomotion, to deprive the community, or any substantial portion of the community, of the essentials of life, We may, by proclamation, declare that a state of emergency exists:

And whereas on the twenty-fifth day of August last, We did, by and with the advice of Our Privy Council, declare by proclamation, in pursuance of the said Act, that a state of emergency existed:

And whereas it is enacted by the said Act that no such proclamation shall be in force for more than one month, without prejudice to the issue of another proclamation at or before the end of that period:

And whereas the continued cessation of work in Coal Mines does, in Our opinion, constitute a state of emergency within the meaning of the said Act:

Now, therefore, in pursuance of the said Act, We do, by and with the advice of Our

Privy Council, hereby declare that a state of emergency exists.

Given at Our Court at *Balmoral*, this twenty-second day of September, in the year of our Lord One thousand nine hundred and twenty-six, and in the Seventeenth year of Our Reign.

A PROCLAMATION FOR THE SUMMONING OF PARLIAMENT.

GEORGE R.I.

**W**HEREAS on the 30th day of April, 1926, We were pleased, by virtue of the powers conferred upon Us by the Emergency Powers Act, 1920, to issue a Proclamation of Emergency:

And whereas on the 29th day of May, 1926, the 28th day of June, 1926, the 26th day of July, 1926, and the 25th day of August, 1926, We were pleased, by virtue of the said powers, to make further Proclamations of Emergency:

And whereas the Proclamation of Emergency made on the said 25th day of August, 1926, will expire after one month from the date thereof:

And whereas We have this day been pleased to make a new Proclamation of Emergency under the said Act:

And whereas it is provided by the said Act that where a Proclamation of Emergency has been made the occasion thereof shall forthwith be communicated to Parliament, and, if Parliament is then separated by such adjournment or prorogation as will not expire within five days, a Proclamation shall be issued for the meeting of Parliament within five days, and Parliament shall accordingly meet and sit upon the day appointed by that Proclamation, and shall continue to sit and act in like manner as if it had stood adjourned or prorogued to the same day:

And whereas the House of Lords stands adjourned to Thursday, the 21st day of October next, and the House of Commons stands adjourned to Tuesday, the 9th day of November next:

Now, therefore, We, in pursuance of the said Act and all other powers enabling Us in that behalf, by and with the advice of Our Privy Council, hereby proclaim and give notice of Our Royal intention and pleasure that Our Parliament, notwithstanding that it now stands adjourned as aforesaid, shall assemble and be holden on Monday, the 27th day of September instant; and the Lords Spiritual and Temporal, and the Knights, Citizens, and Burgesses, and the Commissioners for Shires and Burghs of the House of Commons, are hereby required and commanded to give their attendance accordingly, at Westminster, on the said Monday, the 27th day of September.

Given at Our Court at *Balmoral*, this twenty-second day of September, in the year of our Lord One thousand nine hundred and twenty-six, and in the Seventeenth year of Our Reign.

#### TENDERS FOR TREASURY BILLS.

1. 2. The Bills will be in amounts of £5,000 or £10,000. They will be dated at the option of the Tenderer on any business day from Monday, the 4th October, 1926, to Saturday, the 9th October, 1926, inclusive, and will be payable at three months after date.

3. The Bills will be issued and paid at the Bank of England.

4. Each Tender must be for an amount not less than £50,000, and must specify the date on which the Bills required are to be dated, and the net amount per cent. (being an even multiple of one penny) which will be given for the amount applied for. Separate Tenders must be lodged for Bills of different dates.

5. Tenders must be made through a London Banker, Discount House or Broker.

6. The persons whose Tenders are accepted will be informed of the same not later than the following day, and payment in full of the amounts of the accepted tenders must be made to the Bank of England by means of Cash or a Banker's Draft on the Bank of England not later than 2 o'clock (Saturday 12 o'clock) on the day on which the relative Bills are to be dated.

7. In virtue of the provisions of Section 1 (4) of the War Loan Act, 1919, Members of the House of Commons are not precluded from tendering for these Bills.

8. Tenders must be made on the printed forms, which may be obtained from the Chief Cashier's Office, Bank of England.

The Minister of Agriculture and Fisheries, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in him under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 to 1925, and of every other power enabling him in this behalf, hereby orders as follows:—

*Contraction of Certain Infected Area.*

1. The Foot-and-Mouth Disease (Declaration of Infected Areas) Order of 1926 (No. 98) shall be read and have effect as if the Area described in the Schedule to this Order were substituted for the Infected Area (No. 1) described in the First Schedule to that Order.

*Commencement.*

2. This Order shall come into operation on the twenty-ninth day of September, nineteen hundred and twenty-six.

*Short Title.*

3. This Order may be cited as the FOOT-AND-MOUTH DISEASE DECLARATION OF INFECTED AREAS ORDER OF 1926 (No. 108).

Where a whole-time male worker is employed by the week or any longer period and the hours of work agreed between the worker and the employer in any week (excluding hours of overtime employment) are less than 50, the rate of wages applicable to that worker shall be such as to secure to the worker the wages which would have been payable if the agreed hours had been 50.

4. For the purpose of the above rates, the hours of work shall not include meal times, but shall include any time during which by reason of weather conditions, an employer has prevented from working a worker who was present at the place of employment and ready to work.

5. These rates shall continue in operation until 11th October, 1927.

6. For the purpose of the application of the above differential overtime rates, the Wiltshire Agricultural Wages Committee have by Order dated the 11th February, 1925, defined the following employment as the employment which is to be treated as overtime employment:—

(a) All employment in excess of 6 hours on a Saturday or on such other day (not being Sunday) in every week as may be agreed between the employer and the worker.

(b) All employment on a Sunday.

(c) All employment in excess of 50 hours in any week (excluding all hours which are to be treated as hours of overtime employment).
