His Majesty The KING has been pleased to award the Albert Medal to Rifleman Aimansing Pun, 1/6th Gurkha Rifles, in recognition of his gallantry in endeavouring to save life at Attock, India, in May last.

On May 16th, 1926, a party of men were washing their clothes on the banks of a wide

river, which by reason of the strong converging currents was extremely dangerous to swimmers.

Contrary to orders, one of the party Kishanbahadur Thapa, entered the stream, swam out some fifty yards from the bank, was caught by the current and rendered helpless.

Although well acquainted with the danger involved, Rifleman Aimansing Pun without hesitation went to the rescue of his comrade and succeeded in getting hold of the drowning man. He commenced to swim with him to the further bank, but his efforts proved ineffectual owing to the violent struggles of Kishanbahadur Thapa, who dragged his rescuer under water. On coming to the surface Pun, whose hold on the drowning man had been broken, could see no trace of his comrade. He reached land only with great difficulty, in a most exhausted condition.

**APPOINTMENT OF STANDING FOR FIFTEEN HACKNEY CARRIAGES.**

*By virtue of the Act 13 and 14 Victoria, Chapter 7, intituled "An Act for Consolidating the Office of the Registrar of Metropolitan Public Carriages with the Office of Commissioners of Police of the Metropolis, and making other Provisions in regard to the Consolidated Offices."*

I, WILLIAM THOMAS FRANCIS HORWOOD, Commissioner of Police of the Metropolis, do hereby APPOINT a Standing for fifteen Hackney Carriages at Redcliffe Gardens and Redcliffe Square, Kensington, in three portions, and do make the following Regulations with regard to the Boundaries for the same, viz. :—

*First Portion.*—In Redcliffe Gardens, two carriages to stand in the centre of roadway, commencing at a point twelve yards South of lamp-post outside entrance to Coleherne Court adjoining Williams Deacon's Bank, Limited, and extending Southward as far as necessary for two carriages.

Front of vehicles toward the North.

*Second Portion.*—In Redcliffe Gardens, three carriages to stand on East side of roadway, commencing at a point six yards South of the Southern post of gateway to garden enclosure opposite St. Luke's Church, and extending Southward, by kerb, as far as necessary for three carriages.

Front of vehicles toward the North.

*Third Portion.*—In Redcliffe Square, South side, ten carriages to stand on North Side of roadway, commencing at a point ten yards East of lamp-post at junction with Redcliffe Gardens, and extending Eastward, by kerb of garden enclosure, as far as necessary for ten carriages.

Front of vehicles toward the West.

The first portion of the Standing to be fed exclusively by carriages from the second portion, and the second portion by carriages from the third portion.

Provided that no Hackney Carriage shall be suffered to stand across any street or thoroughfare, or opposite the end of any street or carriageway, or upon any place where Foot Passengers usually cross the carriageway.

Under and by virtue of the powers conferred upon the Clearing Office and the Administrator by Article 1 (xiv) of the Treaty of Peace (Hungary) Orders 1921-23, I hereby prescribe the 30th day of October, 1926, as the final date by which

(a) Proofs by British nationals to whom an extension of time may be granted under the second paragraph of the Rule issued by me dated the 7th March, 1923, in respect of debts due to them by Hungarian nationals or of pecuniary obligations of the Hungarian Government under Article 231 of the Treaty of Trianon,

(b) Claims by British nationals against the Hungarian Government with the payment of which the property rights and interests within His Majesty's Dominions or Protectorates belonging to nationals of the former Kingdom of Hungary at the date when the said Treaty came into force (not being property rights or interests acquired under any general licence issued by or on behalf of His Majesty) and the net proceeds of their sale, liquidation or other dealings therewith are charged by Article 1 (ix) of the above-mentioned Orders in Council,

must be made upon the prescribed Forms and lodged with this Department in order to rank for payment of the sixth dividend to be declared by me out of the funds in my hands arising from the liquidation of the above-mentioned property rights and interests belonging to nationals of the former Kingdom of Hungary or received by me from the Hungarian Clearing Office under paragraph 11 of the

Annex to Article 231 of the above-mentioned Treaty in pursuance of the Agreement between His Majesty's Government and the Hungarian Government of the 20th December, 1921, respecting the settlement of Enemy Debts referred to in Section III of Part X of the above-mentioned Treaty, or arising out of any other available property.
