

At the Court at *Buckingham Palace*, the 5th day of *November*, 1926.

PRESENT,

The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

**WHEREAS** the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of the Act of the 8th and 9th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 70, of the Act of the 14th and 15th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 97, and of the Act of the 19th and 20th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 55, duly prepared, and laid before His Majesty in Council, a Representation, bearing date the 29th day of July, 1926, in the words and figures following, that is to say:—

“ We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of the Act of the 8th and 9th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 70, of the Act of the 14th and 15th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 97, and of the Act of the 19th and 20th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 55, have prepared, and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council, the following Representation as to the assignment of a Consolidated Chapelry to the consecrated Church of Saint Luke, West Hartlepool, situate within the New Parish (sometime District Chapelry) of Saint Paul, West Hartlepool, in the County of Durham and in the Diocese of Durham:

“ Whereas at certain extremities of the said New Parish of Saint Paul, West Hartlepool, and of the Parish of Hart, in the said County and Diocese, which said extremities lie contiguous one to another, and are described in the Schedule hereunder written, there is collected together a population which is situate at a distance from the several churches of such New Parish and Parish:

“ And whereas it appears to us to be expedient that certain contiguous portions (being the portions containing the population aforesaid) of the said New Parish of Saint Paul, West Hartlepool, and of the said Parish of Hart should be formed into a Consolidated Chapelry for all Ecclesiastical purposes, and that the same should be assigned to the said Church of Saint Luke, West Hartlepool, situate as aforesaid:

“ Now, therefore, with the consent of the Right Reverend Herbert Hensley, Bishop of Durham, as such Bishop, and also as the Patron, in right of his See, as well of the Vicarage of the said New Parish of Saint Paul, West Hartlepool, as of the Vicarage of the said Parish of Hart, (in testimony whereof he has signed and sealed this Representation), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, humbly represent, that it would, in our opinion, be expedient that all those contiguous portions of the said New Parish of Saint Paul, West Hartlepool, and of the said Parish of Hart, which are described in the Schedule hereunder written, all which portions, together with the boundaries thereof, are delineated and set forth on the map or plan hereunto annexed should be united and formed into one Consolidated Chapelry for the said Church of Saint Luke, West Hartlepool, situate as aforesaid, and that the same should be named ‘The Consolidated Chapelry of Saint Luke, West Hartlepool.’

“ We, therefore, humbly pray that Your Majesty will be graciously pleased to take the premises into Your Royal consideration, and to make such Order in respect thereto as to Your Majesty in Your Royal Wisdom shall seem meet.

“ THE SCHEDULE to which the foregoing Representation has reference.

“ The Consolidated Chapelry of Saint Luke, West Hartlepool, comprising:—

“ All those contiguous portions of the New Parish (sometime District Chapelry) of Saint Paul, West Hartlepool, and of the Parish of Hart, both in the County of Durham and in the Diocese of Durham, which are comprised within and are bounded by an imaginary line commencing at the junction of Mulgrave Road with Grange Road, and extending thence westward along the middle of Grange Road for a distance of  $26\frac{1}{2}$  chains or thereabouts to its junction with Wooler Road and the road known as The Parade, and extending thence westward along the middle of The Parade for a distance of 14 chains or thereabouts to its junction with the road known as Park Avenue, and extending thence first northward and then north eastward along the middle of Park Avenue (thereby crossing the boundary which divides the said New Parish of Saint Paul, West Hartlepool, from the said Parish of Hart) for a distance of  $10\frac{1}{2}$  chains or thereabouts to its junction with Serpentine Road and the proposed new road leading to Dunston Road and Hart Lane, and extending thence northward along the middle of the course of the said proposed road for a distance of  $23\frac{1}{2}$  chains or thereabouts to its junction with Dunston Road and Hart Lane, and extending thence north westward along the middle of Hart Lane for a distance of  $14\frac{1}{2}$  chains or thereabouts to the point where it is crossed by the boundary of the County Borough of West Hartlepool, and extending thence first northward and then in various directions along the said County Borough boundary (thereby following in part the boundary which divides the said Parish of Hart from the said New Parish of Saint Paul, West Hartlepool), for a distance of 71 chains or thereabouts to the point on the southern side of the road leading from Throston Grange to the Hartlepool Union Workhouse where the boundaries of the said New Parish of Saint Paul, West Hartlepool, of the said Parish of Hart, of the New Parish of the Holy Trinity, Hartlepool, and of the New Parish of Saint Oswald, West Hartlepool, both in the said County and Diocese, all meet, and extending thence south eastward along the boundary which divides the said New Parish of Saint Oswald, West Hartlepool, from the said New Parish of Saint Paul, West Hartlepool, for a distance of  $40\frac{1}{2}$  chains or thereabouts to the junction of Chester Road with Jesmond Road, where such boundary meets the boundary which divides an isolated portion of the New Parish of Christ Church, West Hartlepool, in the said County and Diocese, from the said New Parish of Saint Paul, West Hartlepool, and extending thence first southward and then in various directions along the last mentioned boundary (thereby following in one part the middle of Jesmond Road and in another part the western boundary wall of the West Hartlepool Cemetery) for a distance of  $18\frac{1}{2}$  chains or
