

And whereas the said Scheme drawn up by the said Bishop and the Consents referred to in the said Representation are as follows:—

“ SCHEME.

“ 1. That the said Chapelry or Rectory of Northwood shall be separated from the said Vicarage and Parish Church of Carisbrooke and be constituted a separate Parish and Benefice for Ecclesiastical purposes by the name or style of the Rectory of Northwood of which the said Church or Chapel in the said Chapelry shall be the Parish Church.

“ 2. That the proposed separate Parish and Benefice shall be subject to the same Ecclesiastical jurisdiction as the said Vicarage of Carisbrooke and that the Incumbent of such separate Parish and Benefice shall have exclusive Cure of Souls within the limits of the same.

“ 3. That two Churchwardens shall be annually chosen in and for such Parish and Benefice and every person so chosen shall be duly admitted and shall do all things pertaining to the office of Churchwarden as to Ecclesiastical matters within the said separate Parish and Benefice.

“ 4. That all fees and other ecclesiastical dues and payments for Churchings Marriages Burials and other ecclesiastical offices solemnized and performed within the proposed separate Parish and Benefice of Northwood and all other Ecclesiastical dues offerings and emoluments usually payable to the Incumbent of a Parish or Benefice as shall arise within the said separate Parish or Benefice of Northwood shall belong to the Incumbent thereof.

“ 5. That the residence house situate at Northwood shall belong to the Parish and Benefice of Northwood as and for a residence house.

“ 6. That the Parishioners of the said proposed separate Parish of Northwood shall be exclusively subject and liable to all rates charges and assessments to be made for or in respect of the maintenance and repair of the Church or Chapel of Northwood aforesaid and the expenses incidental to the due performance of Divine Service therein and shall be exempt from all rates charges and assessments to be made for or in respect of the Parish Church of Carisbrooke aforesaid or for or in respect of any other Church or Chapel situate elsewhere than within the limits of the said proposed separate Parish.

“ 7. That the Parishioners of the said proposed separate Parish of Northwood shall not hereafter be entitled to accommodation in the Church of Carisbrooke nor shall the Parishioners of Carisbrooke be entitled to any accommodation in the Church or Chapel of Northwood.

“ 8. That no alteration shall be made in the Patronage of the said Benefices or either of them.

“ 9. That the whole of the Tithe Rent Charges arising at present or payable in future in respect of lands within the said Chapelry or Rectory of Northwood so to be separated from Carisbrooke with Northwood shall be annexed and belong to and form part of the endowment of the Parish and Benefice of Northwood for ever and be held received and enjoyed by the Incumbent for the time being accordingly.”

“ CONSENTS.

“ We, the Provost and Scholars of the Queen's College, in the University of Oxford, the Patrons or persons entitled to present or nominate to the Vicarage and Parish of Carisbrooke with the Chapelry or Rectory of Northwood annexed, in the County of Hants, and Diocese of Winchester, in case the same were now vacant, and I, Horace Spence Footman, Vicar of Carisbrooke, with the said Chapelry or Rectory of Northwood annexed do hereby respectively signify our consent to the Scheme above proposed and set forth and to every matter and thing therein contained.
