The Civil Service Commissioners hereby give notice that an Open Competitive Examination will be held in London, the written work commencing on the 12th July, 1927, under the Regulations respecting Open Competitive Examinations for the situations of Assistant Inspector of Taxes in the Inland Revenue Department and Junior Assistant Auditor in the Ministry of Health, dated the 20th March, 1925, and published in the London Gazette of the same date.

Not fewer than 30 vacancies as Assistant Inspector of Taxes will be filled on the result of this Examination, if so many candidates should be found to be qualified in all respects.
