

the Parishes of Warbstow and Otterham shall continue distinct in all respects.

" 3. That upon the day when any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme shall be published in the London Gazette the unions hereinbefore recommended and proposed shall forthwith take effect and the said John Reid Davies if he is then Incumbent of the said Benefice of Treneglos with Warbstow shall be the first Incumbent of the United Benefice of Tresmere with Treneglos and Tremaine.

" 4. That upon the said Unions taking effect the Parsonage House at present belonging to the said Benefice of Tresmere shall become and be the house of residence for the Incumbent of the United Benefice of Tresmere with Treneglos and Tremaine and the Parsonage House at present belonging to the said Benefice of Otterham shall become and be the house of residence for the Incumbent of the United Benefice of Warbstow with Otterham; and so soon as conveniently may be the Parsonage House at present belonging to the said Benefice of Treneglos with Warbstow and the site and appurtenances thereof and the grounds heretofore usually occupied and enjoyed therewith shall be sold and disposed of by us the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners at such time or times and in such manner in all respects as to us shall seem expedient and that the net proceeds of such sale shall (a) as to so much as may be necessary be applied by us towards the cost of such works of renovation and improvement to the said Parsonage House at Tresmere as shall appear to us and to the said Bishop of Truro to be desirable and (b) as to the residue held and invested by us the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners as to one moiety of such residue for the benefit of the United Benefice of Tresmere with Treneglos and Tremaine and as to the other moiety of such residue for the benefit of the United Benefice of Warbstow with Otterham.

" 5. That with the consent of His Royal Highness (in testimony whereof the Secretary and Keeper of the Records of the Duchy of Cornwall being the person duly authorised to act on His Royal Highness' behalf under the Duchy of Cornwall Management Act, 1863, has signed this Scheme) and with the consent of the said Bishop of Truro (testified as aforesaid), after the said unions have taken effect (a) the Patronage of the United Benefice of Tresmere with Treneglos and Tremaine shall belong wholly to His Royal Highness as Duke of Cornwall and (b) the Patronage of the United Benefice of Warbstow with Otterham shall be exercised by the Patron of the said Benefice of Otterham and by the Bishop of Truro for the time being alternately, and the first turn of presentation after the Union shall belong to the Patron of the said Benefice of Otterham.

" 6. That upon the unions taking effect (a) the whole of the endowments and real and personal property now belonging to the said Benefice of Egloskerry with Tremaine shall remain and continue to be the endowment of the Benefice of Egloskerry notwithstanding the severance of the said Benefice of Tremaine as aforesaid; (b) the whole of the endowments and real and personal property now belonging to the said Benefices of Tresmere and Treneglos

with Warbstow, with the exception of the Tithe Rent Charge commuted at £135 Os. 1d. arising within the Parish of the said Benefice of Warbstow, and all capital sums of money and stocks (if any) representing or being the produce of any sale, redemption or other conversion of the whole or any part or parts of such Tithe Rent Charge, shall become and be the endowment of the United Benefice of Tresmere with Treneglos and Tremaine; and (c) the whole of the endowments and real and personal property now belonging to the said Benefice of Otterham together with all the Tithe Rent Charge commuted at £135 Os. 1d. arising within the Parish of the said Benefice of Warbstow and now belonging to the said Benefice of Treneglos with Warbstow and all capital sums of money and stocks (if any) representing or being the produce of any sale, redemption or other conversion of the whole or any part or parts of such Tithe Rent Charge shall become and be the endowment of the United Benefice of Warbstow with Otterham.

" Provided always that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid or any of them in accordance with the provisions of the said Measure or of any other Measure of the National Assembly of the Church of England, or of any Act of Parliament."

And whereas drafts of the said Scheme have been duly published in accordance with the provisions of the said Union of Benefices Measure, 1923, and Notices have been transmitted to the persons or bodies entitled under the same Measure to receive Notice requiring any objections to such draft Scheme to be stated or transmitted in writing to the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners within the time prescribed in the Statutory Rules applicable to proceedings under the said Union of Benefices Measure, 1923:

And whereas the prescribed time has elapsed and no such objections have been so stated or transmitted to the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners:

And whereas public notice of the certification to His Majesty in Council of the said Scheme and the consent thereto in writing of the Bishop of Truro has been duly given in the manner and within the time prescribed in the Statutory Rules aforesaid:

And whereas the said Scheme has been approved by His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to affirm the said Scheme and to order that the Benefices therein recommended to be united shall be united to the extent and for the purposes recommended in the said Scheme, and further to order and direct that the said Scheme and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the date when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Measure.

And His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said Diocese of Truro.
