

Road from the Winchester—Bishops Waltham Road (A. 333) at the Alma Inn, Lower Upham, via Job's Corner, Snakemoor, and Stapleford Farm, to the road junction at the south-west end of Durley Village with branch road from Job's Corner to the Durley Street—Lower Upham Road 350 yards north-west of Durley Street, and branch road at Snakemoor to the rural district boundary towards Horton Heath.

Road from the Winchester—Bishops Waltham Road (A. 333), 1 mile north-west of Bishops Waltham, via Ashton and Chapel Farm, to its junction with the Morestead—Bishops Waltham Road at Street End.

Road from the Winchester—Bishops Waltham Road (A. 333), near Wool Street Farm (both branch roads), via Stake's Farm, Upham and Bigpath to the Morestead—Bishops Waltham Road at Stephens Castle Down.

Road from the Bishops Waltham—Corhampton Road (B. 3035), 1 mile west of Corhampton, via Beacon Hill to the Winchester—Cheesefoot Head—Preshaw—Warnford Road, $1\frac{1}{2}$ miles west of Warnford.

Road from the Wickham—West Meon Road (A. 32) at Warnford (both branch roads) to the Bramdean—West Meon Road, 300 yards north of Lippen Cottages.

City of Winchester.

Kingsgate Street (including St. Swithun's Archway) from its junction with the north side of College Street to its junction with the south side of St. Swithun's Street.

SECOND SCHEDULE.

Rural District of Droxford.

Road from the Wickham—Droxford—West Meon Road (A. 32), 200 yards south of Corhampton, via Meonstoke, to the Droxford—Hambledon Road (B. 2150) at Brockbridge.

Road from the Morestead—Bishops Waltham Road, 100 yards south-east of the entrance to Belmore House, to the Bishops Waltham—Corhampton Road (B. 3035), one mile west of Corhampton.

Road from the Shedfield—Botley Road (A. 334) at Curdridge to the Botley—Swanwick Road (A. 27) at the entrance to Fairthorn Grange.

Road from the Winchester—Bishops Waltham Road (A. 333), 220 yards south-east of the Alma Inn, Lower Upham, via Wintershill House, to the Durley—Bishops Waltham Road at Durley Street.

Road from the Wickham—West Meon Road (A. 32) at Warnford, via Wheely Down, towards Winchester to the rural district boundary, 450 yards east of the Fox and Hounds public house, Beauworth.

Notice is hereby given that the Minister of Transport by virtue and in exercise of the powers given to him by Section 7 of the London

Traffic Act, 1924, the London Traffic (Restricted Streets) Regulations, 1925, the London Traffic (Restricted Streets) (No. 2) Regulations, 1925, and the London Traffic (Restricted Streets) (No. 3) Regulations, 1925, after consulting the London and Home Counties Traffic Advisory Committee, has relaxed the restrictions and limitations imposed by Regulation 2 of each of the said Regulations upon the occasion of the season of Christmas, 1926, so that notwithstanding anything in the said Regulations the East Surrey Traction Company Limited may maintain on Thursday and Friday, the 23rd and 24th December, 1926, upon any route in respect of which a Schedule has been deposited by them in accordance with Section 6 of the London Traffic Act, 1924, the service set out in any such Schedule for operation on Saturdays; provided that nothing herein contained shall be deemed to affect or derogate from the powers of the Commissioner of Police of the Metropolis under the provisions of Section 52 of the Metropolitan Police Act, 1839, to give direction to constables for keeping order and for preventing any obstruction of the thoroughfares.

ORDER OF THE MINISTER OF AGRICULTURE AND FISHERIES.

(DATED 2ND DECEMBER, 1926.)

FOOT-AND-MOUTH DISEASE DECLARATION OF INFECTED AREAS ORDER OF 1926 (No. 133).

The Minister of Agriculture and Fisheries, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in him under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 to 1925, and of every other power enabling him in this behalf, hereby orders as follows:—

Contraction of Certain Infected Area.

1.—(1) The Foot-and-Mouth Disease Declaration of Infected Areas Order of 1926 (No. 128) shall be read and have effect as if the Area described in the First Schedule to this Order were substituted for the Infected Area (No. 7) described in the Schedule to that Order.

(2) This Article shall come into operation on the seventh day of December, nineteen hundred and twenty-six.

Contraction of Certain Infected Area.

2.—(1) The Foot-and-Mouth Disease Declaration of Infected Areas Order of 1926 (No. 129) shall be read and have effect as if the Area described in the Second Schedule to this Order were substituted for the Infected Area (No. 8) described in the Schedule to that Order.

(2) This Article shall come into operation on the ninth day of December, nineteen hundred and twenty-six.
