WHEREAS there was this day read at the Board a Memorial from the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty, dated the 18th day of November, 1926 (N. 4159/26), in the words following, viz.:—

"Whereas by Section 3 of the Naval and Marine Pay and Pensions Act, 1865, it is enacted *inter alia* that all pay, pensions or other allowances in the nature thereof payable in respect of services in Your Majesty's Naval or Marine Force to a person being or having been an Officer, Seaman or Marine therein shall be paid in such manner and subject to such restrictions, conditions and provisions as are from time to time directed by Order in Council:

"And whereas by Order in Council bearing date the 13th day of October, 1922, Your Majesty was pleased to sanction the creation of a Supply Branch of the Royal Navy with titles and rates of pay as shown in the Schedule thereto:

"And whereas we consider it desirable that certain boys should be entered in the Royal Navy to be trained for the Supply Branch:

"We beg leave humbly to recommend that Your Majesty may be graciously pleased, by Your Order in Council, to sanction the institution of a rating in the Royal Navy with the title of Supply Boy, and with the rate of pay of 1s. 6d. per diem.

"The Lords Commissioners of Your Majesty's Treasury have signified their concurrence in this proposal."

His Majesty, having taken the said Memorial into consideration, was pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to approve of what is therein proposed.

And the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty are to give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of the Union of Benefices Measure, 1923, duly prepared, and laid before His Majesty in Council, a Scheme, bearing date the 11th day of November, 1926, in the words and figures following, that is to say:—

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, acting in pursuance of the Union of Benefices Measure, 1923, have prepared, and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council, the following Scheme for effecting the union (a) of the Benefice (being a Rectory) of Knaptoft and the Benefice (being a Rectory) of Laughton, (b) of the Benefice (being a Rectory) of Kimcote and the Chapelry of Walton (now annexed to the said Benefice of Knaptoft), and (c) of the Benefice (being a Vicarage) of

Arnesby and the Chapelry of Shearsby (now annexed to the said Benefice of Knaptoft), all of which Benefices are situate in the County of Leicester and in the Diocese of Peterborough:

"Whereas Commissioners appointed at our request by the Right Reverend Cyril, Bishop of Peterborough, pursuant to the provisions of the said Union of Benefices Measure, 1923, to inquire into and report upon the union of the said two Benefices of Knaptoft and Laughton, and also the union of the said Benefice of Kimcote and the said Chapelry of Walton, and the union of the said Benefice of Arnesby and the said Chapelry of Shearsby, duly made their Report to the said Bishop of Peterborough and therein recommended the said unions and the terms for effecting the same, and the said Bishop of Peterborough signified in writing his approval of the said Report:

"And whereas we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, have prepared this Scheme for the said unions based upon the terms recommended in the said Report:

"And whereas all of the said Benefices of Knaptoft, Laughton, and Kimcote are now full, the Reverend Decimus Albert Gay Taylor being the present Incumbent of the said Benefice of Knaptoft, the Reverend Andrew Hughes John Matthews being the present Incumbent of the said Benefice of Laughton, and the Reverend Wilfred Alec Radford Young being the present Incumbent of the said Benefice of Kimcote, and the said Benefice of Arnesby is at present vacant:

"Now, therefore, with the consent of the said Cyril, Bishop of Peterborough (in testimony whereof he has signed this Scheme), and with the consents also of the said Decimus Albert Gay Taylor, and of the said Wilfred Alec Radford Young (testified by their signing this Scheme), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, do humbly recommend and propose to Your Majesty as follows, that is to say:—

"1. That the said Chapelry of Walton comprising so much of the said Benefice of Knaptoft as is contained within the Civil Parish of Kimcote and Walton shall be severed from the said Benefice of Knaptoft, and the Chapelry of Walton so severed and the said Benefice of Kimcote shall be permanently united together and form one Benefice with Cure of Souls under the style of 'The United Benefice of Kimcote with Walton,' and one Parish for ecclesiastical purposes and for such other purposes as in the said Measure provided.

"2. That the said Chapelry of Shearsby comprising so much of the said Benefice of Knaptoft as is contained within the Civil Parish of Shearsby shall be severed from the said Benefice of Knaptoft, and the Chapelry of Shearsby so severed and the said Benefice of Arnesby shall be permanently united together and form one Benefice with Cure of Souls under the style of 'The United Benefice of Arnesby with Shearsby,' and one Parish for ecclesiastical purposes and for such other purposes as in the said Measure provided.

"3. That the said Benefice of Knaptoft, after the severance of the said Chapelries of Walton and Shearsby as aforesaid, and the said Benefice of Laughton shall be permanently united together and form one Benefice with Cure of Souls under the style of 'The United

Benefice of Mowsley with Laughton and Knaptoft,' and that such United Benefice shall be included in and form part of the Archdeaconry of Leicester and Rural Deanery of Gartree First, but the Parishes of the said Benefices shall continue distinct in all respects.

"4. That the Church of the Parish of Kimcote shall be the Parish Church of the United Parish of Kimcote with Walton, and the Church of the Parish of Arnesby shall be the Parish Church of the United Parish of Arnesby with Shearsby, and the Tables of Fees for the said Parishes of Kimcote and Arnesby shall (until revised or altered by proper authority) be the Tables of Fees for the United Parishes of Kimcote with Walton and Arnesby with Shearsby respectively.

"5.—(a) That the union of the said Benefice of Kimcote and the said Chapelry of Walton shall take effect upon the day when any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme shall be published in the London Gazette, and the said Wilfred Alec Radford Young, if he is then Incumbent of the said Benefice of Kimcote or other the Incumbent (if any) at that time of the said Benefice of Kimcote, shall be the first Incumbent of the United Benefice.

"(b) That the union of the said Benefice of Arnesby and the said Chapelry of Shearsby shall take effect either upon the next avoidance of the said Benefice of Knaptoft or upon the next avoidance of the said Benefice of Laughton, whichever shall happen first, and in either case the Incumbent (if any) at that time of the said Benefice of Arnesby shall become the first Incumbent of the United Benefice; and

"(c) That the union of the said Benefice of Knaptoft and the said Benefice of Laughton shall take effect upon the next avoidance of the said Benefice of Laughton, and the said Decimus Albert Gay Taylor, if he is then Incumbent of the said Benefice of Knaptoft, or other the Incumbent (if any) at that time of the said Benefice of Knaptoft, shall become the first Incumbent of the United Benefice.

"6.—(a) That upon the taking effect of the union of the said Benefice of Kimcote and the said Chapelry of Walton the Parsonage House at present belonging to the said Benefice of Kimcote shall become and be the house of residence for the Incumbent of the United Benefice.

"(b) That upon the taking effect of the union of the said Benefice of Arnesby and the said Chapelry of Shearsby the Parsonage House at present belonging to the said Benefice of Arnesby shall become and be the house of residence for the Incumbent of the United Benefice; and

"(c) That upon the taking effect of the union of the said Benefice of Knaptoft and the said Benefice of Laughton the Parsonage House (situate at Mowsley) at present belonging to the said Benefice of Knaptoft shall become and be the house of residence for the Incumbent of the United Benefice, and so soon as conveniently may be, the Parsonage House at present belonging to the said Benefice of Laughton and the site and appurtenances thereof and the grounds heretofore usually occupied and enjoyed therewith shall be sold and disposed of by us the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners at such time or times and in

such manner in all respects as to us shall seem expedient, and that the net proceeds of such sale shall constitute and form part of the Expenses Fund established pursuant to the 32nd Section of the said Union of Benefices Measure, 1923.

"7. That a portion of the sum of £12,757 4s. 9d. Four pounds per centum per annum Funding Stock now held by us, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, as part of the endowments of the said Benefice of Knaptoft shall be transferred to the United Benefices of Kimcote with Walton and Arnesby with Shearsby respectively, that is to say, a sum of £250 of the said Stock shall be transferred to the United Benefice of Kimcote with Walton as from the date of the union of the said Benefice of Kimcote and the said Chapelry of Walton, and if under the provisions of Clause 5 of this Scheme the said Decimus Albert Gay Taylor shall become the first Incumbent of the United Benefice of Mowsley with Laughton and Knaptoft then

"(1) a further sum of £6,875 of the said Stock shall be transferred to the United Benefice of Arnesby with Shearsby as from the date of the union of the said Benefice of Knaptoft and the said Benefice of Laughton, and

"(2) a further sum of £2,150 of the said Stock shall be transferred to the United Benefice of Arnesby with Shearsby and a further sum of £1,000 of the said Stock shall be transferred to the United Benefice of Kimcote with Walton as from the date of the avoidance of the United Benefice of Mowsley with Laughton and Knaptoft by the said Decimus Albert Gay Taylor;

but if the said Decimus Albert Gay Taylor ceases to be Incumbent of the said Benefice of Knaptoft before the union of the said Benefices of Knaptoft and Laughton then, in lieu of the foregoing provision:—

"(1) a further sum of £4,300 of the said Stock shall be transferred to the United Benefice of Arnesby with Shearsby as from the date of the union of the said Benefice of Arnesby and the said Chapelry of Shearsby, and

"(2) a further sum of £4,725 of the said Stock shall be transferred to the United Benefice of Arnesby with Shearsby, and a further sum of £1,000 of the said Stock shall be transferred to the United Benefice of Kimcote with Walton as from the date of the union of the said Benefice of Knaptoft and the said Benefice of Laughton.

"Provided always that all the endowments of the said Benefice of Knaptoft, other than the Stock hereinbefore recommended to be transferred to the United Benefices of Kimcote with Walton and Arnesby with Shearsby respectively, shall continue to belong to the said Benefice of Knaptoft or to the United Benefice of Mowsley with Laughton and Knaptoft as the case may be, and the whole of the First Fruits and tenths now payable to the Governors of Queen Anne's Bounty in respect of the said Benefice of Knaptoft shall continue to be payable by the Incumbent of the said Benefice of Knaptoft or of the United Benefice of Mowsley with Laughton and Knaptoft as the case may be.

"8. That after the said unions have taken effect (a) the Patronage of the United Benefice

of Kimcote with Walton shall belong wholly to the Patron of the said Benefice of Kimcote; (b) the course and succession in which the respective Patrons shall present or nominate to the United Benefice of Arnesby with Shearsby from time to time as the same shall become vacant shall be as follows, that is to say, that in every series of three successive turns of presentation or nomination to be made to such United Benefice after the union the Patron of the said Benefice of Knaptoft shall have the first and the second turns and the Patron of the said Benefice of Arnesby shall have the third turn, and (c) the course and succession in which the respective Patrons shall present or nominate to the United Benefice of Mowsley with Laughton and Knaptoft from time to time as the same shall become vacant shall be as follows, that is to say, the right of presentation shall be exercised by the Patrons of the said Benefices of Knaptoft and Laughton alternately, the Patron of the said Benefice of Laughton having the right upon the first presentation to the United Benefice to be made after the union and every alternate right of presentation and the Patron of the said Benefice of Knaptoft having the right of presentation upon the second presentation to the United Benefice to be made after the union and every alternate turn thereafter.

"Provided always that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid, or any of them, in accordance with the provisions of the said Measure, or of any other Measure of the National Assembly of the Church of England, or of any Act of Parliament."

And whereas drafts of the said Scheme have been duly published in accordance with the provisions of the said Union of Benefices Measure, 1923, and Notices have been transmitted to the persons or bodies entitled under the same Measure to receive Notice requiring any objections to such draft Scheme to be stated or transmitted in writing to the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners within the time prescribed in the Statutory Rules applicable to proceedings under the said Union of Benefices Measure, 1923:

And whereas the prescribed time has elapsed and no such objections have been so stated or transmitted to the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners:

And whereas public notice of the certification to His Majesty in Council of the said Scheme and the consent thereto in writing of the Bishop of Peterborough has been duly given in the manner and within the time prescribed in the Statutory Rules aforesaid:

And whereas the said Scheme has been approved by His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to affirm the said Scheme and to order that the Benefices therein recommended to be united shall be united to the extent and for the purposes recommended in the said Scheme, and further to order and direct that the said Scheme and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the date when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Measure.

And His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said Diocese of Peterborough.

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, acting in pursuance of the Union of Benefices Measure, 1923, have prepared, and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council, the following Scheme for effecting the union of the Benefice (being a Vicarage) of Oare and the Benefice (being a United Benefice) of Luddenham with Stone, both of which Benefices are situate in the County of Kent and in the Diocese of Canterbury:

"Whereas Commissioners appointed at our request by the Right Honourable and Most Reverend Randall Thomas, Archbishop of Canterbury, pursuant to the provisions of the said Union of Benefices Measure, 1923, to inquire into and report upon the union of the said two Benefices of Oare and Luddenham with Stone duly made their Report to the said Archbishop of Canterbury and therein recommended the union of the said two Benefices and the terms for effecting the union, and therein further recommended certain alterations of boundaries affecting the Parishes of Benefices not referred to in the Commission, namely, the Benefices of Ospringe, The Brents, Murston, Buckland, Preston next Faversham, Goodnestone with Graveney and Faversham, all in the said County of Kent and in the said Diocese of Canterbury, and the said Archbishop of Canterbury signified in writing his approval of the said Report:

"And whereas we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, have prepared this Scheme for the union of the said two Benefices based upon the terms recommended in the said Report:

"And whereas both of the said Benefices of Oare and Luddenham with Stone are now full, the Reverend Alfred Dyson being the present Incumbent of the said Benefice of Oare and the Reverend Percy Lewis being the present Incumbent of the said Benefice of Luddenham with Stone:

"And whereas only one Parsonage House will be left standing or remaining within or belonging to the United Benefice when the union which is hereinafter recommended and proposed shall take effect namely the Parsonage House belonging to the said Benefice of Oare:

"And whereas it may become necessary that the Parsonage House at Oare hereinafter recommended to become the Parsonage House of the United Benefice shall be restored or rebuilt, but we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, and the Governors of Queen Anne's Bounty, hold certain funds

which will be available for that purpose if and when the union hereinafter recommended and proposed shall take effect:

"And whereas there is no Parish Church left standing within the Parish of the said Benefice of Stone:

"And whereas the said Randall Thomas, Archbishop of Canterbury, has certified to us, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, that the Patron of the said Benefice of Buckland cannot be found and we have accordingly directed that for the purposes of this Scheme the said Archbishop of Canterbury shall represent such Patron:

"Now, therefore, we the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, with the consent of the said Randall Thomas, Archbishop of Canterbury (in testimony whereof he has signed this Scheme), do humbly recommend and propose to Your Majesty as follows, that is to say:—

"1. That the said Benefice of Oare and the said Benefice of Luddenham with Stone shall be permanently united together and form one Benefice with Cure of Souls under the style of 'The United Benefice of Oare with Luddenham and Stone,' and that the Parishes of Luddenham and Stone be united into one Parish (hereinafter called the Parish of Luddenham with Stone) for all Ecclesiastical purposes and for such other purposes as in the said Measure provided, but the Parish of Oare and the Parish of Luddenham with Stone aforesaid shall continue distinct in all respects.

"2. That if upon the day when any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme shall be published in the London Gazette both of the said two Benefices shall be vacant, the union of the same two Benefices shall take effect forthwith; and if one only of the said two Benefices shall be then vacant the said union shall also take effect forthwith if the Incumbent of the other of the said two Benefices shall consent to become the first Incumbent of the United Benefice, but, if he shall not so consent then the said union shall take effect upon the next avoidance of his Benefice and the then Incumbent (if any) of the other of the said two Benefices shall be the first Incumbent of the United Benefice; and if neither of the said two Benefices be then vacant then the said union shall take effect on the next avoidance of either of the said two Benefices if the Incumbent at that time of the other of the said two Benefices shall consent to become the first Incumbent of the United Benefice, but if he shall not so consent then the said union shall take effect immediately upon the next vacancy of his Benefice and the then Incumbent (if any) of the other of the said two Benefices shall become the first Incumbent of the United Benefice.

"3. That upon the said union taking effect the Parsonage House at present belonging to the said Benefice of Oare shall become and be the house of residence for the Incumbent of the United Benefice.

"4. That after the said union has taken effect the course and succession in which the respective Patrons shall present or nominate to the United Benefice from time to time as the same shall become vacant shall be as follows, that is to say, the right of presentation shall be exercised by the Patrons of the said two Benefices alternately; and the first turn

of presentation or nomination to the United Benefice shall belong to the Patron of that one of the said two Benefices of Oare and Luddenham with Stone an Incumbent of which does not become the first Incumbent of the United Benefice under any of the provisions of Clause 2 of this Scheme.

" 5. (a) That with the consent of the Master, Fellows and Scholars of the College of Saint John the Evangelist in the University of Cambridge being the Patrons of the said Benefice of Ospringe (in testimony whereof they have hereunto set their Common or Corporate Seal) and with the consent of the Reverend Charles Frederick Hodges now Incumbent of the said Benefice of Ospringe (in testimony whereof he has signed this Scheme) upon the union taking effect all that part of the Parish of Luddenham with Stone (being also part of the Civil Parish of Stone) which lies to the south of the middle of Watling Street shall be transferred for all Ecclesiastical purposes to the said Parish of Ospringe all which part is more particularly delineated and set forth upon the Map or Plan annexed hereto and thereon coloured blue.

" (b) That with the consent of the said Randall Thomas, Archbishop of Canterbury, being the Patron of the said Benefice of The Brents (which consent is testified as aforesaid) and with the consent of the Reverend William Walton now Incumbent of the said Benefice of The Brents (in testimony whereof he has signed this Scheme), upon the union taking effect all that detached portion of the said Parish of Luddenham with Stone (being conterminous with a detached portion of the Civil Parish of Luddenham) which is contiguous to and lies to the north west of the Parish of The Brents and is bounded upon the west by the road leading from Faversham to Oare, upon the north west by Oare Creek, and upon the north east by Faversham Creek, shall be transferred for all Ecclesiastical purposes to the said Parish of The Brents, all which part is more particularly delineated and set forth upon the said Map or Plan and thereon coloured pink.

" (c) That with the consent of the said Master, Fellows and Scholars of the College of Saint John the Evangelist in the University of Cambridge being the Patrons of the said Benefice of Murston (which consent is testified as aforesaid) and with the consent of the Reverend Archibald Patrick McNeile now Incumbent of the said Benefice of Murston (in testimony whereof he has signed this Scheme) upon the union taking effect all that detached portion of the Parish of Murston which is bounded upon the north by the main portion of the Civil Parish of Luddenham, upon the east by the Civil Parish of Davington, upon the south partly by the main portion of the Civil Parish of Stone and partly by the Civil Parish of Buckland and upon the west by the Civil Parish of Buckland, shall be transferred for all Ecclesiastical purposes to the Parish of Luddenham with Stone, all which part is more particularly delineated and set forth upon the said Map or Plan and thereon coloured yellow.

" (d) That with the consent of the said Randall Thomas, Archbishop of Canterbury, representing the Patron of the said Benefice

of Buckland (which consent is testified as aforesaid) and with the consent of the Reverend Laurence Bevil Charles Newell, now Incumbent of the said Benefice of Buckland (in testimony whereof he has signed this Scheme) upon the union taking effect all that part of the Parish of Buckland lying between and contiguous to the main portion of the Civil Parish of Stone (part of the Ecclesiastical parish of Luddenham with Stone) and the detached portion of the Civil Parish of Stone (part of the Ecclesiastical parish of Luddenham with Stone) and to the north of the middle of the main line of the Southern (South Eastern and Chatham) Railway from London to Canterbury, shall be transferred for all Ecclesiastical purposes to the said Parish of Luddenham with Stone all which part is more particularly delineated and set forth upon the said Map or Plan and thereon coloured green.

" (e) That with the consent of the said Randall Thomas, Archbishop of Canterbury, being Patron of the said Benefice of Preston next Faversham (which consent is testified as aforesaid) and with the consent of the Reverend John Hankins Martin, now Incumbent of such Benefice (testified by his signing this Scheme) upon the union taking effect, all that detached portion of the said Parish of Luddenham with Stone (being conterminous with a detached portion of the Civil Parish of Luddenham) which is contiguous to the Parish of Preston next Faversham and is bounded on all sides partly by the said Parish of Preston next Faversham and partly by the hereinbefore mentioned Parish of Ospringe shall be transferred for all Ecclesiastical purposes to the said Parish of Preston next Faversham, all which part is more particularly delineated and set forth upon the said Map or Plan and thereon coloured purple.

" (f) That with the consent of the said Randall Thomas, Archbishop of Canterbury, being one of the Patrons for alternate turns of the said Benefice of Goodnestone with Graveney (which consent is testified as aforesaid) with the consent also of the Honourable Henry Augustus Milles-Lade, of Nash Court, Faversham, being the other of the Patrons for alternate turns of the said Benefice of Goodnestone with Graveney (testified by his signing this Scheme) and with the consent of the Reverend William Waite now Incumbent of the said Benefice of Goodnestone with Graveney, upon the union taking effect all that detached portion of the said Parish of Luddenham with Stone (comprising about 40 acres and being conterminous with a detached portion of the Civil Parish of Luddenham) which is contiguous to the said Parish of Goodnestone and lies adjacent to the south eastern corner of such Parish shall be transferred for all Ecclesiastical purposes to the said Parish of Goodnestone all which part is more particularly delineated and set forth upon the said Map or Plan and thereon coloured brown.

" (g) That with the consent of the Dean and Chapter of the Metropolitan Church of Christ at Canterbury, being the Patrons of the said Benefice of Faversham (in testimony whereof they have caused their Capitular or Common Seal to be affixed to this Scheme) and with the consent of the Reverend Canon Percy Amelius Lovel Clarke, now Incumbent of the said Benefice of Faversham (in

testimony whereof he has signed this Scheme) upon the union taking effect all that detached portion of the Parish of Faversham (being continuous with a detached portion of the Civil Parish of Faversham Without) which is contiguous to the main portion of the Parish of Oare and also contiguous to the detached portion of such Parish and which is bounded upon the west and south west partly by the Parish of Luddenham with Stone and partly by the detached portion of the Parish of Oare, upon the east by the main portion of the said Parish of Oare and upon the north by The Swale shall be transferred for all Ecclesiastical purposes to the said Parish of Oare, all which part is more particularly delineated and set forth upon the said Map or Plan and thereon coloured orange.

" 6. Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to affirm the said Scheme and to order that the Benefices therein recommended to be united shall be united to the extent and for the purposes recommended in the said Scheme, and further to order and direct that the said Scheme and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the date when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Measure.

"3. That upon the said Union taking effect the Parsonage House at present belonging to the said Benefice of Thornford shall become and be the house of residence for the Incumbent of the United Benefice.

"4. That after the said union has taken effect the course and succession in which the respective Patrons shall present or nominate to the United Benefice from time to time as the same shall become vacant shall be as follows, that is to say, the right of presentation shall be exercised by the Patrons of the said two Benefices alternately and the first turn of presentation or nomination to be made to the United Benefice after the union shall belong to the Patron of that one of the said two Benefices of Thornford and Beer Hackett an Incumbent of which does not become the first Incumbent of the United Benefice under any of the provisions of Clause 2 of this Scheme.

"Provided always that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid, or any of them, in accordance with the provisions of the said Measure, or of any other Measure of the National Assembly of the Church of England, or of any Act of Parliament."

And whereas public notice of the certification to His Majesty in Council of the said Scheme and the consent thereto in writing of the Bishop of Salisbury has been duly given in the manner and within the time prescribed in the Statutory Rules aforesaid:

And whereas no appeal has been made to His Majesty in Council within the period of one month after the date of the said public notice in accordance with the provisions of the said Measure against the said Scheme or any part thereof by any person who has made objection as aforesaid to the said draft Scheme:

"And whereas we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, have prepared this Scheme for the said union based upon the terms recommended in the said Report:

"And whereas both of the said Benefices of Hutton Roof and Kirkby Lonsdale are now full, the Reverend Christopher Gathorne being the present Incumbent of the said Benefice of Hutton Roof, and the Reverend Robert Percival Brown being the present Incumbent of the said Benefice of Kirkby Lonsdale:

"And whereas only one Parsonage House will be left standing or remaining within or belonging to the United Benefice when the union which is hereinafter recommended and proposed shall take effect, namely the Parsonage House belonging to the said Benefice of Hutton Roof:

"Now, therefore, we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, with the consent of the said Henry Herbert, Bishop of Carlisle (in testimony whereof he has signed this Scheme), do humbly recommend and propose to Your Majesty as follows, that is to say:—

"2. That the Church of the Parish of Hutton Roof shall be the Parish Church of the United Parish and that the Table of Fees for the said Parish of Hutton Roof shall (until revised or altered by proper authority) be the Table of Fees for the United Parish.

"3. That with the consents of the said Christopher Gathorne and Robert Percival Brown (testified by their signing this Scheme) upon the day when any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme shall be published in the London Gazette the union shall forthwith take effect, and the said Christopher Gathorne if he is then Incumbent of the said Benefice of Hutton Roof shall be the first Incumbent of the United Benefice.

"4. That upon the said union taking effect the Parsonage House at present belonging to the said Benefice of Hutton Roof shall become and be the house of residence for the Incumbent of the United Benefice.

"5. That after the said union has taken effect the Patronage of the United Benefice

shall belong wholly to the Patron of the said Benefice of Hutton Roof.

"Provided always that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid, or any of them, in accordance with the provisions of the said Measure, or of any other Measure of the National Assembly of the Church of England, or of any Act of Parliament."

And whereas drafts of the said Scheme have been duly published in accordance with the provisions of the said Union of Benefices Measure, 1923, and Notices have been transmitted to the persons or bodies entitled under the same Measure to receive Notice requiring any objections to such draft Scheme to be stated or transmitted in writing to the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners within the time prescribed in the Statutory Rules applicable to proceedings under the said Union of Benefices Measure, 1923:

And whereas the prescribed time has elapsed and no such objections have been so stated or transmitted to the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners:

And whereas public notice of the certification to His Majesty in Council of the said Scheme and the consent thereto in writing of the Bishop of Carlisle has been duly given in the manner and within the time prescribed in the Statutory Rules aforesaid:

And whereas the said Scheme has been approved by His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to affirm the said Scheme and to order that the Benefices therein recommended to be united shall be united to the extent and for the purposes recommended in the said Scheme, and further to order and direct that the said Scheme and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the date when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Measure.

And His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said Diocese of Carlisle.

"There is also in the same County and Diocese the Benefice or Rectory of Liffon the Parish whereof contains a population of 918 persons or thereabouts with accommodation in the Parish Church of 362 persons.

"The net annual value of the Benefice of Liffon is £320 or thereabouts.

"That it appears to us and we do hereby represent to Your Grace that under the provisions of the said Pluralities Act, 1838, a portion of the Parish of Broadwoodwidge (the boundaries of which are more particularly described in the Scheme annexed to this Representation and also delineated on the Ordnance Map annexed thereto and thereon edged with red) may be advantageously separated therefrom and be annexed to the said Parish of Ashwater to which it is contiguous.

"That the isolated portion of the Parish of Liffon (the boundaries of which are more particularly described in the said Scheme and also delineated on the Ordnance Map annexed thereto and thereon edged with green) may be advantageously separated therefrom and annexed to the Parish of Broadwoodwidge to which it is contiguous.

"That a portion of the Parish of Bratton Clovelly (the boundaries of which are more particularly described in the said Scheme and also delineated on the Ordnance Map annexed thereto and thereon edged with blue) may be advantageously separated therefrom and annexed to the Parish of Broadwoodwidge to which it is contiguous.

"The Patrons of the Benefice of Broadwoodwidge with Germansweek are The Dean and Chapter of Bristol Cathedral and the Reverend Francis Fitz-Gerald-Doherty is the Incumbent thereof. The Patron of the Benefice of Bratton Clovelly is the Right Reverend The Lord Bishop of Exeter and the Reverend Robert Kinninmonth Bennett is the Incumbent thereof. The Reverend George Douglas Melhuish is the Patron and Incumbent of the Benefice of Ashwater. The Patron of the Benefice of Liffon is Thomas Buller Bradshaw Esquire and the Reverend Andrew Naesmyth Fitzgerald Keogh is the Incumbent thereof.

"That pursuant to the directions contained in the 26th Section of the Pluralities Act, 1838, we, the said Lord Bishop, have drawn up a Scheme in writing annexed to this Repre-

sentation describing the mode in which it appears to us that the alterations above proposed may best be effected and how the changes consequent on such alterations in respect to the Ecclesiastical dues rates and payments and in respect to Patronage and rights to pews may be made with justice to all parties interested and we do hereby submit the same together with the consents in writing of the said Patrons and Incumbents of the said Benefices to the intent that if Your Grace shall on full consideration and enquiry be satisfied with such Scheme you may certify the same and such consents as aforesaid to His Majesty in Council."

And whereas the said Scheme drawn up by the said Bishop and the Consents referred to in the said Representation are as follows:—

" It is proposed to separate from the Parish of Broadwoodwidge and annex to the Parish of Ashwater all that part of the Parish of Broadwoodwidge situate north of the road from Dubb's Cross to Foxhole Cross the boundaries of which are delineated on the Ordnance Map annexed hereto and edged with red.

" That the whole of the Tithe Rent Charge arising out of the land proposed to be separated from Broadwoodwidge and added to the Parish of Ashwater together with all Glebe land if any in the area so to be separated is to remain the property of the Incumbent of Broadwoodwidge as heretofore.

" It is also proposed to annex the isolated portion of the Parish of Lifton situate in the Parish of Broadwoodwidge to the Parish of Broadwoodwidge the boundaries of which are delineated on the Ordnance Map annexed hereto and edged with green.

" That the Incumbent of the Benefice of Broadwoodwidge shall have sole and exclusive Cure of Souls within such portion so to be annexed from Lifton.

" That any inhabitants of such portion shall be entitled to accommodation in the Parish Church of Broadwoodwidge but shall cease to be entitled to any right or accommodation in the Parish Church of Lifton.

" That any inhabitants of the aforesaid portion shall have such and the same right to have Marriages Baptisms Churchings and Burials solemnized and performed in the Parish

Church of Broadwoodwidge as they might have had in the Parish Church of Lifton.

" That all fees, Ecclesiastical offerings and emoluments which may arise from the said portion so to be separated from Lifton shall belong to the Incumbent of Broadwoodwidge.

" That the whole of the Tithe Rent Charge arising out of the land proposed to be separated from Lifton and added to the Parish of Broadwoodwidge together with all Glebe land if any in the area so to be separated is to remain the Property of the Incumbent of Lifton as heretofore.

" It is also proposed to separate from the Parish of Bratton Clovelly and annex to the Parish of Broadwoodwidge all that part of the Parish of Bratton Clovelly comprising the properties known as East Banbury, West Banbury, Rixon, Staddon and Brewers the boundaries of which are delineated on the Ordnance Map annexed hereto and edged with blue.

" That the Incumbent of the Benefice of Broadwoodwidge shall have sole and exclusive Cure of Souls within such portion so to be separated from Bratton Clovelly.

" That any inhabitants of such portion shall be entitled to accommodation in the Parish Church of Broadwoodwidge but shall cease to be entitled to any right or accommodation in the Parish Church of Bratton Clovelly.

" That any inhabitants of the aforesaid portion shall have such and the same right to have Marriages Baptisms Churchings and Burials solemnized and performed in the Parish Church of Broadwoodwidge as they might have had in the Parish Church of Bratton Clovelly.

" That all fees, Ecclesiastical offerings and emoluments which may arise from the said portion so to be separated from Bratton Clovelly shall belong to the Incumbent of Broadwoodwidge.

" That the whole of the Tithe Rent Charge arising out of land proposed to be separated from Bratton Clovelly and added to the Parish of Broadwoodwidge together with all Glebe land if any in the area so to be separated is to remain the property of the Incumbent of Bratton Clovelly as heretofore.

" That no alterations shall be made in the Patronage of the said Benefices or either of them.
