“And whereas by Your Majesty's Order in Council of the 19th December, 1923, sanctioning various alterations in the rates of extra duty pay for non-commissioned officers and men, Royal Marines, extra duty pay of 1s. 0d. a day is payable to a Royal Marine qualified and employed as Blacksmith (Smith Gunner):

“And whereas we are of opinion that it is desirable, in consequence of alteration in the qualifications required for the appointment, to change the title of Blacksmith (Smith Gunner) to Artificer:

“We beg leave humbly to recommend that Your Majesty may be graciously pleased, by

Your Order in Council, to sanction the change of title accordingly.”

His Majesty, having taken the said Memorial into consideration, was pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to approve of what is therein proposed.

And the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty are to give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

“Whereas by Section 3 of the Naval and Marine Pay and Pensions Act, 1865, it is enacted, *inter alia*, that all pay, pensions, or other allowances in the nature thereof, payable in respect of services in Your Majesty's Naval or Marine Force to a person being or having been an Officer, Seaman or Marine therein, shall be paid in such manner and subject to such restrictions, conditions and provisions as are from time to time directed by Order in Council:

" And whereas Your Majesty was graciously pleased, by Your Orders in Council bearing the dates 18th day of December, 1921, 28th day of November, 1923, and 26th day of May, 1925, to sanction regulations relative to the counting of service (after retirement) for increase of retired pay in the case of retired Officers of the Royal Navy, and Royal Marines, serving in the Inspection, Experimental and Compass Departments of the Admiralty, and in certain similar posts:

" And whereas we consider it desirable that any retired Officer of the Royal Navy or Royal Marines, who may be appointed as Superintendent of Mine Design, H.M.S. 'Vernon,' should be subject to the provisions of the aforesaid Orders in Council:

" We beg leave humbly to recommend that Your Majesty may be graciously pleased, by Your Order in Council, to sanction the addition of the post of Superintendent of Mine Design H.M.S. 'Vernon,' to the list of appointments to which the provisions of Your aforesaid Orders in Council apply.

" The Lords Commissioners of Your Majesty's Treasury have signified their concurrence in this proposal."

##### BOOT AND SHOE REPAIRING TRADE BOARD (GREAT BRITAIN).

##### PROPOSAL TO VARY CERTAIN MINIMUM RATES OF WAGES FOR MALE AND FEMALE WORKERS AND TO CANCEL OVERTIME RATES FOR OUTWORKERS.

In accordance with Regulations made under Section 18 of the Trade Boards Act, 1909, by the Minister of Labour, and dated 31st October, 1918, 1st August, 1922, and 1st April, 1926, respectively, the Boot and Shoe Repairing Trade Board (Great Britain), HEREBY GIVE NOTICE that they PROPOSE TO VARY certain General Minimum Piece-Rates, General Minimum Time-Rates and Overtime Rates for male and female workers and to CANCEL the Overtime Rates for Outworkers as at present set out in the Notices D. (32) and D. (34) dated 12th May, 1926, respectively, issued by the Boot and Shoe Repairing Trade Board (Great Britain).

Particulars of the Minimum Rates proposed are available for inspection at the address shown below or may be obtained on application to the Secretary of the Trade Board.

Under Section 3 (5) of the Trade Boards Act, 1918, the Trade Board will consider any OBJECTIONS to the above Proposal to Vary which may be lodged with them within two months from the 14th day of December, 1926. Such objections should be in writing and signed by the person making the same (adding



his or her full name and address) and should be sent to the Secretary, Boot and Shoe Repairing Trade Board (Great Britain), 1, Whitehall Gardens, London, S.W. 1.

It is desirable that Objections should state precisely and, so far as possible, with reasons, what is objected to.

**THE COAL (EMERGENCY) SUPPLEMENTARY (No. 7) DIRECTIONS, 1926, DATED DECEMBER 11TH, 1926, GIVEN BY THE BOARD OF TRADE UNDER THE EMERGENCY REGULATIONS (No. 8), 1926.**

The Board of Trade, in exercise of the powers conferred upon them by the Emergency Regulations (No. 8), 1926, and of all other powers enabling them in that behalf, hereby direct as follows:—

1. Articles 21 and 22 of Part VI of the Coal (Emergency) Directions, 1926, are hereby revoked.

2. These Directions may be cited as the Coal (Emergency) Supplementary (No. 7) Directions, 1926, and shall come into force on the 13th day of December, 1926.

**SHORES OR BANKS OF THE SEA AT SIDMOUTH AND SALCOMBE REGIS.**

**PROHIBITION OF REMOVAL OF MATERIALS.**

Whereas the Board of Trade acting in pursuance of the Harbours Act, 1814, as amended by the Harbours Transfer Act, 1862, found it necessary for the protection of the Port of Exeter to issue an Order dated the 17th day of December, 1908, prohibiting the taking or removing of any shingle or ballast on the shores or banks of the sea between the points situate respectively about 266 yards east and 1,870 yards west of the seaward end of Fore Street, Sidmouth, within the said Port.

And whereas for the further protection of the said Port the Board of Trade did by an Order dated the 7th day of August, 1924, prohibit the taking or removing of any shingle or ballast from the shores or banks of the sea at Salcombe Regis between the eastern boundary of the Urban District of Sidmouth (being approximately the mouth of the River Sid) and Salcombe Mouth (being about one mile 123 yards eastward from the mouth of the River Sid) in the Parish of Salcombe Regis, in the County of Devon, within the said Port.

And whereas the Urban District Council of Sidmouth desiring to construct certain sea defence works at Sidmouth and to remove for

the purposes of the said sea defence works a quantity of 2,500 cubic yards or thereabouts of sand, shingle or ballast from the shore adjacent to the said Urban District and adjoining it on the east in the Parish of Salcombe Regis such shore being part of the shores or banks within the limits specified in the said Orders of the 17th day of December, 1908, and the 7th day of August, 1924, the Board of Trade did by an Order dated the 26th day of August, 1925, revoke the said Orders of the 17th day of December, 1908, and the 7th day of August, 1924, so far only as those Orders prohibited the taking or removing by the said Urban District Council their servants or workmen for the purposes of the said sea defence works of any shingle or ballast (not exceeding in all 2,500 cubic yards thereof) from the shore at Sidmouth and Salcombe Regis between a point 100 yards eastward of the River Sid and the western groyne at the western end of the esplanade, being about 470 yards westward of the seaward end of Fore Street, Sidmouth.

And whereas the said Urban District Council have now completed the construction of the said sea defence works at Sidmouth and have removed for the purposes of the said sea defence works the quantity of sand, shingle or ballast required therefor.

Now therefore the Board of Trade do by this Order revoke the said Order of the 26th day of August, 1925, and declare the same to be void and of no effect and do further declare that in all respects the said Orders of the 17th day of December, 1908, and the 7th day of August, 1924, shall again be and remain in full force and operate as heretofore.

(1) Nothing in those Regulations shall prevent any person who at the date hereof was maintaining a regular service in accordance with the London Traffic Act, 1924, upon any approved route, from using for the purpose of plying for hire along a restricted street or part thereof in the maintenance of a regular service on the approved route in accordance with Section 6 of the London Traffic Act, 1924:—

(a) during the period from the 15th to the 23rd days of December, 1926 (both days inclusive), in addition to the number of omnibuses which he may operate in that street or part thereof under the said Regulation 2, a number equal to 10 per cent. of the total number of omnibuses (excluding spare vehicles) scheduled by him on the 13th December, 1926, for operation upon approved routes, provided that where any person ordinarily operates less than 10 omnibuses he shall be allowed so to operate one additional omnibus.

(b) on Friday the 24th day of December, 1926, in addition to the number of omnibuses which he may operate in that street or part thereof under the said Regulation 2 on either a Friday or a Saturday, a number equal to 10 per cent. of the total number of omnibuses (excluding spare vehicles) scheduled by him on the 13th December, 1926, for operation upon approved routes, provided that where any person ordinarily operates less than 10 omnibuses he shall be allowed so to operate one additional omnibus.

(2) On Christmas Day, the 25th day of December, 1926, the restrictions and limitations imposed by the said Regulation 2 shall be dispensed with;

provided that nothing herein contained shall be deemed to affect or derogate from the powers of the Commissioner of Police of the Metropolis under the provisions of Section 52 of the Metropolitan Police Act, 1839, to give direction to constables for keeping order and for preventing any obstruction of the thoroughfares.

### FOOT-AND-MOUTH DISEASE (DECLARATION OF INFECTED AREAS) ORDER OF 1926 (No. 138).

The Minister of Agriculture and Fisheries, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in him under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 to 1925, and of every other power enabling him in this behalf, hereby orders as follows:—

#### Part I.

##### *Further Contraction of Cheshire Infected Area.*

1. The Foot-and-Mouth Disease (Declaration of Infected Areas) Order of 1926 (No. 136) shall be read and have effect as if the Area described in the First Schedule to this Order were substituted for the Infected Area (No. 1) described in the First Schedule to that Order.

##### *Further Contraction of Northamptonshire Infected Area.*

2. The Foot-and-Mouth Disease Declaration of Infected Areas Order of 1926 (No. 136) shall be read and have effect as if the Area described in the Second Schedule to this Order were substituted for the Infected Area (No. 2) described in the First Schedule to that Order.

#### Commencement.

3. This Part of this Order shall come into operation on the eighteenth day of December, nineteen hundred and twenty-six.

#### Part II.

##### *Release of Areas from Restrictions.*

4. The Areas Nos. 1 and 2 described in the Schedules to this Order shall cease to be Infected Areas for the purposes of the Foot-and-Mouth Disease (Infected Areas Restrictions) Order of 1925, as from the twenty-eighth day of December, nineteen hundred and twenty-six.

#### Short Title.

5. This Order may be cited as the FOOT-AND-MOUTH DISEASE (DECLARATION OF INFECTED AREAS) ORDER OF 1926 (No. 138).

### PARCEL POST.

#### THE FOREIGN PARCELS (EXCISE) WARRANT, 1926. DATED NOVEMBER 10, 1926.

Whereas it is desirable to make provision for the delivery from the entered premises of licensed manufacturers of artificial silk yarn and waste without payment of duty for exportation by Parcel Post of such artificial silk yarn (including artificial silk thread and straw) and artificial silk waste as the Commissioners of Customs and Excise may from time to time allow.

We, the Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury, in exercise of the powers conferred on us by Section fourteen of the Post Office (Parcels) Act, 1882, and of all other powers enabling us in this behalf, do, by this Warrant, made on the recommendation of the Commissioners of Customs and Excise and of His Majesty's Postmaster-General (testified by their respectively signing the same), order, direct and declare as follows:—

1. The Foreign Parcels (Customs) Warrant, 1885, shall not apply to such yarn or waste goods as aforesaid which are delivered from the entered premises of a licensed manufacturer of artificial silk yarn and waste without payment of duty for exportation by the Imperial and Foreign Parcel Post.

2. Every parcel of such goods delivered from such entered premises for exportation by parcel post shall on its removal to the Post Office bear on the outer cover thereof a label on which shall be printed in conspicuous type the words "exempt from duty on exportation" and shall be accompanied by a shipping bill in the form prescribed by the said Commissioners.

3. The Officer of the Post Office accepting such parcel duly labelled and accompanied by the said shipping bill shall give to the sender a certificate of the posting of the parcel.

4. The certificate of posting thus given shall, for the purposes of Section 104 of the Customs Consolidation Act, 1876, be deemed to be evidence of an act equivalent to shipment under that section.

5. The delivery of every such parcel from the said entered premises shall be subject to such bond and to such special conditions as the said Commissioners may from time to time prescribe.

6. If any claim shall be made on the Postmaster-General for compensation in respect of the loss of or damage to any such parcel, that claim shall, in the absence of proof to the contrary, be deemed to be conclusive evidence that such parcel has not been duly exported and that its contents have gone into consumption in Great Britain or Northern Ireland.

7. This Warrant shall come into operation on the 10th day of November, 1926.

8. This Warrant may be cited as the Foreign Parcels (Excise) Warrant, 1926.

## SHEEP SCAB MOVEMENT AREAS.

The following Areas are now "Movement Areas" for the purposes of Part I of the Sheep (Double Dipping) Order of 1920 :—

*Inverness*.—(1) An Area comprising the islands known as the Outer Hebrides (*except the islands of St. Kilda, Dune, Soay and Boreray*), in the county of Inverness.

(2) An Area in the county of Inverness comprising the islands known as Skye or Inner Hebrides.

*Ross and Cromarty*.—An Area comprising the island of Lewis, including the smaller islands adjacent thereto, in the county of Ross and Cromarty.

An Area comprising :—

*In the administrative county of Derby*.

The parishes of Hope Woodlands, Derwent, Edale, Dore and Totley, and such parts of the parishes of Charlesworth, Hayfield, Chapel-en-le-Frith, Peak Forest, Castleton, Aston, Thornhill, Bamford, Outseats and Hathersage, as lie to the south, east and north of the following boundary, namely :—

Commencing at the point of intersection of the boundaries of Cheshire, Derbyshire and Yorkshire, near Saltersbrook Bridge, then in a westerly direction along the county boundary of Cheshire and Derby to Crowden Station, thence along the road via Torside, and the Devils Elbow to the point where it reaches the boundary of the borough of Glossop, thence along the eastern boundary of the said boundary, to the point where it meets the main road to Hayfield, thence in a southerly direction

along that road via the Grouse Inn to Hayfield, thence continuing in a generally south-easterly direction via Chinley Head and Bole Hill to Chapel-en-le-Frith, thence in an easterly direction along the road via Laneside to the Inn at Sparrowpit, thence along the road via Perryfoot, Oxlow House and the Winnats to Castleton, thence in an easterly and south-easterly direction along the main road via Hope to Hathersage, thence by the road under the Railway from Hathersage to Grindleford, west of Hathersage Station, to Grindleford Bridge, thence in a north-easterly direction along the road from Grindleford Bridge to Sheffield, to the point where it meets the western boundary of the parish of Totley, near Fox House Inn, thence in a northerly direction along the western boundaries of the parishes of Totley and Dore, to the county boundary, thence in a generally north-easterly and northerly direction to the point of commencement.

*In the county of the West Riding of Yorkshire*.

The parish of Bradfield; so much of the parish of Langsett as lies to the south and west of the road from Sheffield via Langsett and Crow Edge to Hepworth, and such part of the city and county borough of Sheffield as lies to the west of the following boundary, namely :—

Commencing at the county boundary near Ringinglow, thence via Ringinglow, Andwell Lane, Blackbrook Road, Rails Road, Bingley Lane and Hopwood Lane to the city boundary.

NOTE.—The term "administrative county" used in the description of Areas is the district for which a county council is elected under the Local Government Act, 1888, and includes all boroughs therein which are not county boroughs.
