BILSTON.

Whereas the Urban District Council of Bilston propose to make new byelaws under the Public Health Acts with respect to new streets and buildings, and with this object they have made application to the Minister of Health for the issue of a Provisional Order under Sections 297 and 303 of the Public Health Act, 1875, partially to repeal, alter or amend the Bilston Improvement Act, 1850, so as:—

(1) To repeal Section I of the said Local Act in so far as the said Section incorporates the following Sections of the Towns Improvement Clauses Act, 1847, namely:—

Sections 36 to 42 (as to drainage of houses).

Sections 57 to 60 (as to laying out new streets).

Sections 84 to 86 (in so far as those Sections relate to procedure in connection with or consequent upon the fixing of the level of a new street).

Section 109 (as to the construction of houses).

Sections 110 to 112 (as to supplying buildings with fresh air).

(2) For the several purposes of the Application or for purposes connected with, incidental to, or consequent on those purposes to make any such alteration or amendment of the said Local Act, or of any other Local Act or of any Act confirming a Provisional Order made in pursuance of any of the Sanitary Acts or of the Public Health Act, 1875, and in force in the said District as may be necessary or desirable.

And whereas it is proposed that a Provisional Order should be issued in compliance with the said Application.

Notice is hereby given that the Minister of Health will consider any objections or representations made in writing before the thirty-first day of December, 1926, by any person interested in the subject-matter of the said

application, and the proposed Provisional Order. Such objections or representations should be addressed to the Secretary, Ministry of Health, Whitehall, London, S.W. 1, and copies of them should be sent at the same time to the Clerk to the Urban District Council, Town Hall, Bilston.

And notice is hereby further given that a draft of the proposed Provisional Order may be inspected at the Office of the Clerk, as above, on any week-day prior to the said date during ordinary office hours.

THE ROADS ACT, 1920.

COUNTY OF NORTHAMPTON.

Notice is hereby given that on the 6th day of December, 1926, the Minister of Transport made an Order under Section 7 (4) of the Roads Act, 1920, in respect of a certain highway in the County of Northampton.

The Order, which will come into force on the 28th day of December, 1926, and will remain in force for a period of five years, is to the following effect:—

No person shall drive or cause to be driven on the highway specified in the Schedule hereto. any locomotive, any heavy motor car (as defined by Article II of the Heavy Motor Car Order, 1904), or any motor car with seats for more than fourteen persons exclusive of the driver.

SCHEDULE.

Rural District of Kettering.

The road over Geddington Old County Bridge (A. 43) from a point about 77 yards south-west of Queen Eleanor's Cross, Geddington, for a distance of 100 yards towards Queen Street, Geddington.
