PRESENT,

The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS by Section 16 of the Education (Administrative Provisions) Act, 1907, it is enacted that it shall be lawful for His Majesty by Order in Council to constitute a Registration Council representative of the teaching profession to whom shall be assigned the duty of forming and keeping a register of such teachers as satisfy the conditions of registration established by the Council for the time being, and who apply to be registered:

And whereas by subsection (3) of the said Section any such Order in Council may be revoked, altered or added to by a subsequent Order:

And whereas, by virtue of the powers conferred by the said Act, provision was made by the Registration Council Order in Council, 1912, for the constitution of the Registration Council:

And whereas it is desirable to alter the constitution of the said Council and that the said Order should be revoked:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, and by virtue of the Authority committed to Him by the said Act, and of all other powers enabling Him in that behalf, is pleased to order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:—

1. As from the 1st day of July, 1927, the Teachers Registration Council established by the Registration Council Order in Council, 1912, shall, instead of being constituted as provided in that Order, be constituted as is hereinafter provided in this Order.
2. There shall be assigned to the Council the duty of forming and keeping a register of such teachers as satisfy the conditions of registration established by the Council for the time being, and who apply to be registered.
3. The Council shall consist of 49 members, that is to say, a Chairman and 48 Elected Members, but the total number may be increased to 51 by the appointment of not more

than two persons to serve as Co-opted Members.

The Council shall hold office for five years as from the 1st day of July, 1927, and at the expiration of that period and of any succeeding period of five years (which periods are hereinafter referred to as quinquennial periods) the members of the Council shall retire and their places shall thereupon be filled by newly elected members, together with such members as may be co-opted.

4. The Chairman shall be appointed by the Elected Members from outside their own number. He shall be eligible for re-election on retirement.

5. The Elected Members of the Council shall be Registered Teachers resident in England or Wales. They shall be eligible for re-election on retirement.

6. The members shall be elected or co-opted in the following manner:—

I. Twelve Members representing University Teachers:

(a) Not later than the 1st day of March before the beginning of every quinquennial period the Council shall cause to be sent to each University in England and Wales an invitation to nominate a representative on the Council.

(b) Nominations shall be received at the office of the Council not later than the 1st day of May next following, and shall give particulars of the person nominated, including the full name and address, and registration number.

(c) Should the number of Universities nominating representatives not exceed twelve then the persons nominated shall be members of the Council for the quinquennial period beginning on the 1st day of July next following.

(d) Should the number of Universities nominating representatives exceed twelve the names of such Universities shall be arranged and numbered in alphabetical order and the persons nominated by the first twelve Universities on the list shall be members of the Council during the year beginning on the 1st day of July next following. At the end of that year there shall be removed from the beginning to the end of the list (retaining them in alphabetical order) those Universities having numbers on the list below the integer next higher than one-fifth of the total number of nominating Universities, and the list so arranged shall be renumbered. The representatives nominated by the first twelve Universities on the list so rearranged and renumbered shall be members of the Council during the year beginning on the 1st day of July next following. This procedure shall be followed in each succeeding year, whether it is a year in the same quinquennial period or not.

(e) Should a casual vacancy among University representatives occur during a quinquennial period, the University concerned may nominate a representative for the remainder of the quinquennial period.

II. Thirty-six Members representing Non-University Teachers:

(a) Not later than the 1st day of February before the beginning of every quinquennial period the Council shall cause to be inserted in at least one newspaper of general circulation in England and Wales, and in such educational periodicals as it may choose, advertisements inviting Registered Teachers to submit the names of candidates for election to the Council for the quinquennial period next following.

(b) Nominations shall—

(i) be received at the office of the Council not later than the 1st day of March before the beginning of every quinquennial period;

(ii) give particulars of the person nominated, including the full name and address, registration number, and type of teaching work in which now or last engaged;

(iii) be signed by a proposer and at least twelve supporters, all of whom must be Registered Teachers, but no individual may sign more than three nomination papers.

(c) Voting papers containing the names and particulars of all persons so nominated shall be posted as directed by the Council to the last known address of each Registered Teacher (except such Registered Teachers as are engaged in Universities) not later than the 15th day of March before the beginning of every quinquennial period.

(d) An elector shall vote only for a candidate or candidates engaged in the same type of teaching work as that in which the elector is or was last principally engaged, and the number of votes given by each elector shall not exceed the number of persons to be elected to represent that type of teaching work. An elector who is a whole-time teacher of a specialist subject included in Nos. 15 to 23 of the Schedule to this Order and also a member of a school staff may vote either as a teacher of that specialist subject or as a school teacher engaged in one of the types of teaching work numbered 1 to 13 in the Schedule to this Order. An elector who is or was last principally engaged in a type of teaching work not specifically mentioned in the Schedule to this Order may vote in respect of any type of teaching work mentioned in the Schedule, but no elector may vote in respect of more than one type of teaching work.

(e) A voting paper shall not be valid unless—

(i) it contains the elector's full name and address and registration number, and states the type of teaching work for which the elector votes;

(ii) it is received at the office of the Council not later than the 31st day of March before the beginning of the quinquennial period.

(f) The votes shall be counted under the direction of the Council. Those candidates, to the number given in the Schedule to this Order with respect to each type of teaching

work, who receive the largest number of votes shall be declared elected members of the Council.

(g) The types of teaching work and the number of members to be elected to represent each type of teaching work shall be those specified in the Schedule to this Order.

(h) Casual vacancies occurring during any quinquennial period shall be filled by the appointment of the available non-elected candidate who received the largest number of votes in the type of teaching work concerned. The person thus appointed shall serve until the end of the quinquennial period. Should no non-elected candidate be available the Council shall co-opt a person, who in its opinion is qualified, to represent the type of teaching work concerned until the end of the quinquennial period.

III. Election of Chairman :

At the first meeting of every quinquennial period the Elected Members shall appoint from their own number a Temporary Chairman to serve until the Chairman is elected. Nominations for the office of Chairman shall be made by the Elected Members and if more than one person is nominated a vote shall be taken and the person receiving the highest number of votes shall be declared elected as Chairman for the quinquennial period. Where the votes are equal in number the Temporary Chairman shall have a casting vote.

IV. Co-opted Members :

At the beginning of every quinquennial period the Elected Members may appoint not more than two additional persons, being Registered Teachers, to serve as Co-opted Members of the Council to represent such types of teaching work as, in the opinion of the Elected Members, are not adequately represented in the Council as elected.

7. The Council may appoint such committees consisting of members of their own body or of such members with persons co-opted from outside their own body as for the purpose of their business they may think expedient.

8. Before removing the name of any person from the Register of Teachers the Council shall, if the person concerned so desires, consider the report of a special Committee which shall include persons co-opted from outside the Council.

9. The fees charged to persons in respect of Registration shall be at a uniform rate to all such persons, but such uniform fees may be altered from time to time as the Council may direct.

10. The Council may out of the funds and property of the Council or out of fees payable to the Council in respect of registration or otherwise provide such offices and appoint and employ such officers and servants as may be required for the purpose of their duties and may pay to any person so appointed or employed such remuneration as the Council think fit.

11. No act or proceeding of the Council or of any committee of the Council shall be questioned on account of any vacancy in the Council or committee.

12. Any member who is incapacitated from acting or who communicates in writing to the Council a wish to resign or who is adjudged bankrupt or makes a composition or arrangement with his creditors or is absent from all meetings of the Council and its committees during a period of six months (except for some reason approved by the Council) shall thereupon cease to be a member of the Council.

13. The accounts of the Council shall be audited in such manner and by such body or person as may from time to time be directed by the Treasury, and copies of the accounts and of any report made upon them by the auditor shall be transmitted by the Council to such bodies or persons as the Treasury require.

14. In this Order and in the Schedule thereto the expression—

“ The Council ” means the Teachers Registration Council.

“ Registered Teacher ” means a person whose name appears in the Register of Teachers formed and maintained by the Council.

“ Public Elementary School ” means a school conducted in accordance with the Regulations of the Board of Education in respect of Grants to Public Elementary Schools.

“ Public Secondary School ” means a school not in private ownership, which normally makes provision for the retention of whole time pupils in general education beyond the age of sixteen years.

“ Private Secondary School ” means a school, not being a preparatory school, which is in private ownership and is not in receipt of public funds and normally makes provision for the retention of whole time pupils in general education beyond the age of sixteen years.

“ Preparatory School ” means a school which is in private ownership and is not in receipt of public funds and is solely engaged in general education preparing pupils for admission to secondary schools.

“ Technical Institute ” means an institution conducted in accordance with the Regulations of the Board of Education in respect of Grants for Technical Education.

15. The Interpretation Act, 1889, applies to the interpretation of this Order as it applies to an Act of Parliament.

16. Any application by the Council for the revocation, alteration, or for any addition to this Order shall be made at least six months before the expiration of any quinquennial period.

17. —a. This Order may be cited as the Teachers Registration Council Order, 1926.

b. The Registration Council Order in Council, 1912, is hereby revoked.

WHEREAS a majority of the whole Council of the Borough of Wrexham in the County of Denbigh did on the 30th day of March, 1926, agree to petition, and the Council of the said Borough thereupon petitioned, His Majesty under and in pursuance of the provisions of Section 30 of the Municipal Corporations Act, 1882, as amended by Section 2 of the Municipal Corporations Act, 1893, and extended by the Borough Councillors (Alteration of Number) Act, 1925, for an alteration of the number and boundaries of the Wards and for an alteration of the number of Councillors of the said Borough :

And whereas His Majesty was pleased by His Order in Council of the 30th day of April, 1926, to refer the said petition to a Committee of the Lords of His Privy Council :

And whereas His Majesty was pleased by His Order in Council of the 28th day of June, 1926, to fix the number of Wards into which the Borough of Wrexham should be hence-

forth divided and to order and direct that the number of the said Wards should be seven :

And whereas His Majesty was further pleased by His Order in Council of the 26th day of July, 1926, to alter the number of Councillors of the said Borough of Wrexham and to order and direct that henceforth the number of the said Councillors should be twenty-one :

And whereas on the 6th day of August, 1926, the Right Honourable Sir William Joynson-Hicks, Baronet, one of His Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, did appoint Charles Matthew Knowles, Esquire, Barrister at Law, to be a Commissioner for determining the boundaries of and for apportioning the Councillors among the Wards of the Borough of Wrexham :

And whereas the said Commissioner has accordingly prepared the following Scheme, dated the 9th day of December, 1926 :—

“ **SCHEME** for Determining the Boundaries of the Wards of the Borough of Wrexham in the County of Denbigh and apportioning the Councillors among the said Wards in pursuance of Orders in Council of 28th June, 1926, and 26th July, 1926; and incidental, consequential and supplemental provisions.

" BOROUGH OF WREXHAM.

" I.—BOUNDARIES OF WARDS.

" 1. *North Ward.*

" A line commencing at the point where the boundary of the Borough intersects Chester Road thence southward along the centre of Chester Road and Chester Street to the junction with High Street, thence westward along the centre of High Street to the junction with Hope Street, thence north-westward along the centre of Hope Street and Regent Street to the boundary of the Borough and thence following the line of the boundary of the Borough north-eastward, westward, northward and south-eastward to the point of commencement aforesaid.

" 2. *Brynyffynnon Ward.*

" A line commencing at the point where the boundary of the Borough intersects Regent Street, thence south-eastward along the southern boundary of North Ward as hereinbefore defined to the junction of Hope Street with Town Hill, thence south-westward along the centre of Town Hill, Bridge Street and Penybryn to the junction with Ruthin Road, thence westward along the centre of Ruthin Road and Ruthin Road West to the boundary of the Borough and thence following the boundary of the Borough northward to the point of commencement aforesaid.

" 3. *Offa Ward.*

" A line commencing at the point where the boundary of the Borough intersects Ruthin Road West, thence eastward along the southern boundary of Brynyffynnon Ward as hereinbefore defined to the junction with Ruabon Road, thence south-westward along the centre of Ruabon Road to the boundary of the Borough and thence following the boundary of the Borough northward to the point of commencement aforesaid.

" 4. *Erddig Ward.*

" A line commencing at the point where the boundary of the Borough intersects Ruabon Road, thence north-eastward along the eastern boundaries of Offa Ward and Brynyffynnon Ward as hereinbefore defined to the junction with Hope Street thence eastward along the centre of High Street to the junction with Yorke Street, thence southward along the centre of Yorke Street, Tuttle Street, Madeira Hill, Percy Road, Hillbury Road and Sontley Road to the boundary of the Borough and thence along the boundary of the Borough southward, north-westward and north-eastward to the point of commencement aforesaid.

" 5. *Wrexham Fechan Ward.*

" A line commencing at the point where the boundary of the Borough intersects Sontley Road, thence northward along the eastern boundary of Erddig Ward as hereinbefore defined to the junction with Mount Street, thence south-eastward along the centre of Mount Street, Salop Road and Kings Mills Road to the boundary of the Borough and thence following the boundary of the Borough south-westward to the point of commencement aforesaid.

" 6. *Caia Ward.*

" A line commencing at the point where the boundary of the Borough intersects Kings

Mills Road and proceeding north-westward along the boundary of Wrexham Fechan Ward as hereinbefore defined to the junction with Yorke Street, thence northwards along the centre of Yorke Street to the junction with Charles Street, thence eastward along the centre of Charles Street and the roadway on the south side of Beast Market, centre of Smithfield Road and the footpath leading out of Smithfield Road to the boundary of the Borough and thence southward along the boundary of the Borough to the point of commencement aforesaid.

" 7. *Maesydre Ward.*

" A line commencing at a point in the centre of Chester Street at the junction with Charles Street, thence northward along the eastern boundary of North Ward as hereinbefore defined to the Borough boundary, thence eastward and southward along the Borough boundary to the intersection of the footpath leading out of Smithfield Road, thence westward along the northern boundary of Caia Ward as hereinbefore defined to the point of commencement aforesaid.

" III.—INCIDENTAL, CONSEQUENTIAL AND SUPPLEMENTAL PROVISIONS.

" (1) (a) The election of the nine additional Councillors of the Borough shall be held on Wednesday, the 2nd February, 1927.

" (b) The number of Councillors to be elected for each Ward shall be the number specified in Column 2 of the Schedule to this Scheme opposite to the name of the Ward as given in Column 1 of that Schedule.

" (c) Subject to the provisions of this Scheme the election shall be held in the same manner as elections to fill ordinary vacancies.

" Provided that in any Ward to which no existing Alderman is in pursuance of this Scheme assigned for the purpose of acting as

Returning Officer at the election of Councillors the Mayor shall be the Returning Officer but he may appoint to act as Returning Officer another Alderman or a Councillor not being a Councillor for that Ward and not being registered as a local government elector in respect of a qualification in that Ward.

"(d) The Councillors elected for each Ward shall come into office immediately after the election and shall go out of office on the ordinary day of election of Councillors in the years specified in Column 3 of the Schedule opposite to the name of the Ward as given in Column 1 of that Schedule. The Councillor elected by the smallest number of votes in each Ward shall go out of office first and the Councillor elected by the next smallest number of votes shall go out of office next.

"(2) The election of the three additional Aldermen made necessary by the increase in the number of Councillors of the Borough shall take place at the next meeting of the Council after the 2nd February, 1927, and the additional Aldermen shall come into office immediately after the election, and of such additional Aldermen the one who is elected by the smallest number of votes shall go out of office on the ordinary day of election of Aldermen in the year 1929 and the other two on the ordinary day of election of Aldermen in the year 1932.

"(3) If for any reason it is doubtful which of the Councillors or Aldermen, as the case may be, elected in pursuance of this Scheme ought to retire in the years specified in this Scheme, the question shall be determined at the first or second meeting of the Council after the election by lot under the direction of the Mayor or the person presiding at that meeting.

"(4) The existing Aldermen shall be respectively assigned as returning officers until the 9th November, 1927, at elections of Councillors for the following Wards, namely:—

- " Sydney Gardnor Jarman—North Ward.
- " Thomas Buchanan Taylor—Wrexham Fechan Ward.
- " Edward Hughes—Caia Ward.
- " William Jonah Williams—Offa Ward.

" One of the three Additional Aldermen to be elected shall on the day of their election be assigned by the Council as returning officer until the 9th November, 1927, to each of the following Wards, namely:—

- " Brynyffynnon Ward.
- " Erddig Ward, and
- " Maesydre Ward.

"(5) If any vacancy exists at the date of the Order in Council approving this Scheme or thereafter occurs amongst the existing Councillors, an election to fill the vacancy shall be held for the Ward to which the Councillor whose death or retirement causes the vacancy has been apportioned by this Scheme.

"(6) If the register of electors is not so framed as to show the local government electors entitled to vote at any election of Councillors of the Borough to be held for any of the Wards constituted by this Scheme it shall be the duty of the Registration Officer for the Parliamentary County of Denbigh to make such alteration or rearrangement of the register as may be necessary for the purpose

of such election, and it shall be the duty of the Town Clerk of the Borough to render the Registration Officer such assistance as he may require for the purpose of the alteration or rearrangement.

WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of the Act of the 33rd and 34th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 39, and of the Acts therein mentioned, that is to say, the Act of the 3rd and 4th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 113, the Act of the 4th and 5th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 39, and the Act of the 31st and 32nd years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 114, duly prepared, and laid before His Majesty in Council, a Scheme, bearing date the 25th day of November, 1926, in the words and figures following, that is to say:—

" We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of the Act of the 33rd and 34th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 39, and of the Acts therein mentioned, that is to say, the Act of the 3rd and 4th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 113, the Act of the 4th and 5th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 39, and the Act of the 31st and 32nd years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 114, have prepared, and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council, the following Scheme for effecting a transfer of the ownership of the Advowson or

perpetual right of Patronage of and presentation to the Churches and Cure (hereinafter called 'the said Benefice') of Ingham with Culford and Timworth, in the County of Suffolk and in the Diocese of Saint Edmundsbury and Ipswich:

"Whereas the Advowson or perpetual right of Patronage of and presentation to the said Benefice of Ingham with Culford and Timworth is vested for an estate in fee simple without incumbrances in Cecil Berens, of Kevington, Saint Mary Cray, in the County of Kent, Esquire:

"And whereas the said Cecil Berens is desirous that the whole Advowson or perpetual right of Patronage of and presentation to the said Benefice of Ingham with Culford and Timworth, now vested in him as aforesaid, should be transferred to and be vested in the Bishop of Saint Edmundsbury and Ipswich for the time being:

"And whereas the Right Reverend Walter Godfrey, now Bishop of Saint Edmundsbury and Ipswich, is willing to accept such transfer, and in token of such his willingness and also in token that the same transfer has that consent of the Bishop of the Diocese which by the Acts in the hereinbefore mentioned Act recited or by some or one of them is made necessary he, the said Walter Godfrey, Bishop of Saint Edmundsbury and Ipswich, has executed this Scheme as hereinafter mentioned:

"And whereas the transfer of the Patronage of the said Benefice of Ingham with Culford and Timworth which is hereinbefore mentioned and hereinafter recommended and proposed will in our opinion tend to make better provision for the Cure of Souls in the Parish or District in or in respect of which the right of Patronage or Advowson so recommended and proposed to be transferred as aforesaid arises or exists, that is to say, in the Parishes of Ingham, Culford and Timworth:

"Now, therefore, with the consent of the said Cecil Berens (in testimony whereof he has signed and sealed this Scheme), and with the consent of the said Walter Godfrey, Bishop of Saint Edmundsbury and Ipswich (in testimony whereof he has signed this Scheme and sealed the same with his Episcopal Seal), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, humbly recommend and propose that upon and from the day of the date of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme and without any conveyance or assurance in the law other than such duly gazetted Order the whole Advowson or perpetual right of Patronage of and presentation to the said Benefice of Ingham with Culford and Timworth, now vested in him, the said Cecil Berens as aforesaid, shall be transferred to the said Walter Godfrey, Bishop of Saint Edmundsbury and Ipswich, and his successors in the same Bishopric, and shall thereupon and thenceforth become and be absolutely vested in and shall and may from time to time be exercised by the said Walter Godfrey, Bishop of Saint Edmundsbury and Ipswich, and by his successors in the same Bishopric for ever.

"And we further recommend and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any

further or other measures relating to the matters aforesaid, or any of them, in accordance with the provisions of the said Acts, or of any of them, or of any other Act of Parliament."

And whereas the said Scheme has been approved by His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said Scheme, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Acts.

"Whereas Commissioners appointed at our request by the Right Reverend William, Bishop of Exeter, pursuant to the provisions of the said Union of Benefices Measure, 1923, to inquire into and report (inter alia) upon the desirability of altering the boundaries of the Parishes of the said Benefices of Bittadon and Marwood by transferring a portion of the Parish of the said Benefice of Marwood to the Parish of the said Benefice of Bittadon duly made their Report to the said Bishop of Exeter and therein recommended such alteration of boundaries, and the said Bishop of Exeter signified in writing his approval of the said Report:

"And whereas we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, have prepared this Scheme for the alteration of the boundaries of the Parishes of the said Benefices, which Scheme is based upon the terms recommended in the said Report:

"And whereas both of the said Benefices of Bittadon and Marwood are now full, the Reverend Charles Hammond being the present Incumbent of the said Benefice of Bittadon and the Reverend George Frederick Mattinson

being the present Incumbent of the said Benefice of Marwood :

" Now, therefore, we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, with the consent of the said William, Bishop of Exeter (in testimony whereof he has signed this Scheme), do humbly recommend and propose to Your Majesty as follows, that is to say :—

" That with the consents of the said Charles Hammond and the said George Frederick Mattinson (testified by their signing this Scheme) upon the day of the date of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council affirming this Scheme so much of the said Parish and Benefice of Marwood as is described in the Schedule hereto annexed and is more particularly delineated and set forth upon the Map or Plan hereto annexed and thereon coloured pink shall forthwith be transferred for all ecclesiastical purposes to the said Parish and Benefice of Bittadon. Provided always that no alteration in the Patronage or endowments of the said Benefices of Marwood and Bittadon shall be made by reason of such transfer of territory.

" And provided also that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid, or any of them, in accordance with the provisions of the said Measure, or of any other Measure of the National Assembly of the Church of England, or of any Act of Parliament.

" SCHEDULE.

" All that part of the Parish of Marwood which is bounded upon the east by the Parish of East Down upon the north partly by the Parish of East Down, partly by the Parish of Berrynarbor partly by the Parish of Bittadon and partly by the Parish of West Down and upon the west, upon the south and upon the south-east by an imaginary line commencing upon the boundary which divides the said Parish of West Down from the said Parish of Marwood at the junction of Bittadon Lane with the road leading from Ilfracombe and West Stowford Barton to Marwood and extending thence southwards along the middle of the lastly mentioned road for about a mile and two thirds to its junction (at Gipsy Corner) with the road leading to Whiddon Cross, and extending thence eastwards along the middle of the lastly mentioned road for about a third of a mile to its junction (at Whiddon Cross) with North Lane, and extending thence generally northwards along the middle of North Lane for about half a mile to its junction with the road leading to Milltown and Muddiford and extending thence north-eastwards and in a straight line for a distance of about a mile and a quarter to a point (situate about 13 chains south west of Hewish Down Beacon) in the middle of the road leading from Muddiford to Berry Down and Berrynarbor at the junction of the lastly mentioned road with the road leading to Reed's Cross and Hewish Barton and extending thence north eastwards along the middle of the aforesaid road leading from Muddiford to Berry Down and Berrynarbor to the point (about seven and a half chains south of its junction with Reed's Lane) where it meets the boundary between the said Parish of Marwood and the said Parish of East Down."

And whereas public notice of the certification to His Majesty in Council of the said Scheme and the consent thereto in writing of the Bishop of Exeter has been duly given in the manner and within the time prescribed in the Statutory Rules aforesaid :

And whereas the said Scheme has been approved by His Majesty in Council :

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of his said Council, is pleased hereby to affirm the said Scheme and to order that the alteration of boundaries therein recommended shall be duly effected, and further to order and direct that the said Scheme and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the date when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Measure.

And His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said Diocese of Exeter.
