

than two persons to serve as Co-opted Members.

The Council shall hold office for five years as from the 1st day of July, 1927, and at the expiration of that period and of any succeeding period of five years (which periods are hereinafter referred to as quinquennial periods) the members of the Council shall retire and their places shall thereupon be filled by newly elected members, together with such members as may be co-opted.

4. The Chairman shall be appointed by the Elected Members from outside their own number. He shall be eligible for re-election on retirement.

5. The Elected Members of the Council shall be Registered Teachers resident in England or Wales. They shall be eligible for re-election on retirement.

6. The members shall be elected or co-opted in the following manner:—

I. Twelve Members representing University Teachers:

(a) Not later than the 1st day of March before the beginning of every quinquennial period the Council shall cause to be sent to each University in England and Wales an invitation to nominate a representative on the Council.

(b) Nominations shall be received at the office of the Council not later than the 1st day of May next following, and shall give particulars of the person nominated, including the full name and address, and registration number.

(c) Should the number of Universities nominating representatives not exceed twelve then the persons nominated shall be members of the Council for the quinquennial period beginning on the 1st day of July next following.

(d) Should the number of Universities nominating representatives exceed twelve the names of such Universities shall be arranged and numbered in alphabetical order and the persons nominated by the first twelve Universities on the list shall be members of the Council during the year beginning on the 1st day of July next following. At the end of that year there shall be removed from the beginning to the end of the list (retaining them in alphabetical order) those Universities having numbers on the list below the integer next higher than one-fifth of the total number of nominating Universities, and the list so arranged shall be renumbered. The representatives nominated by the first twelve Universities on the list so rearranged and renumbered shall be members of the Council during the year beginning on the 1st day of July next following. This procedure shall be followed in each succeeding year, whether it is a year in the same quinquennial period or not.

(e) Should a casual vacancy among University representatives occur during a quinquennial period, the University concerned may nominate a representative for the remainder of the quinquennial period.

II. Thirty-six Members representing Non-University Teachers:

(a) Not later than the 1st day of February before the beginning of every quinquennial period the Council shall cause to be inserted in at least one newspaper of general circulation in England and Wales, and in such educational periodicals as it may choose, advertisements inviting Registered Teachers to submit the names of candidates for election to the Council for the quinquennial period next following.

(b) Nominations shall—

(i) be received at the office of the Council not later than the 1st day of March before the beginning of every quinquennial period;

(ii) give particulars of the person nominated, including the full name and address, registration number, and type of teaching work in which now or last engaged;

(iii) be signed by a proposer and at least twelve supporters, all of whom must be Registered Teachers, but no individual may sign more than three nomination papers.

(c) Voting papers containing the names and particulars of all persons so nominated shall be posted as directed by the Council to the last known address of each Registered Teacher (except such Registered Teachers as are engaged in Universities) not later than the 15th day of March before the beginning of every quinquennial period.

(d) An elector shall vote only for a candidate or candidates engaged in the same type of teaching work as that in which the elector is or was last principally engaged, and the number of votes given by each elector shall not exceed the number of persons to be elected to represent that type of teaching work. An elector who is a whole-time teacher of a specialist subject included in Nos. 15 to 23 of the Schedule to this Order and also a member of a school staff may vote either as a teacher of that specialist subject or as a school teacher engaged in one of the types of teaching work numbered 1 to 13 in the Schedule to this Order. An elector who is or was last principally engaged in a type of teaching work not specifically mentioned in the Schedule to this Order may vote in respect of any type of teaching work mentioned in the Schedule, but no elector may vote in respect of more than one type of teaching work.

(e) A voting paper shall not be valid unless—

(i) it contains the elector's full name and address and registration number, and states the type of teaching work for which the elector votes;

(ii) it is received at the office of the Council not later than the 31st day of March before the beginning of the quinquennial period.

(f) The votes shall be counted under the direction of the Council. Those candidates, to the number given in the Schedule to this Order with respect to each type of teaching
