

perpetual right of Patronage of and presentation to the Churches and Cure (hereinafter called 'the said Benefice') of Ingham with Culford and Timworth, in the County of Suffolk and in the Diocese of Saint Edmundsbury and Ipswich:

"Whereas the Advowson or perpetual right of Patronage of and presentation to the said Benefice of Ingham with Culford and Timworth is vested for an estate in fee simple without incumbrances in Cecil Berens, of Kevington, Saint Mary Cray, in the County of Kent, Esquire:

"And whereas the said Cecil Berens is desirous that the whole Advowson or perpetual right of Patronage of and presentation to the said Benefice of Ingham with Culford and Timworth, now vested in him as aforesaid, should be transferred to and be vested in the Bishop of Saint Edmundsbury and Ipswich for the time being:

"And whereas the Right Reverend Walter Godfrey, now Bishop of Saint Edmundsbury and Ipswich, is willing to accept such transfer, and in token of such his willingness and also in token that the same transfer has that consent of the Bishop of the Diocese which by the Acts in the hereinbefore mentioned Act recited or by some or one of them is made necessary he, the said Walter Godfrey, Bishop of Saint Edmundsbury and Ipswich, has executed this Scheme as hereinafter mentioned:

"And whereas the transfer of the Patronage of the said Benefice of Ingham with Culford and Timworth which is hereinbefore mentioned and hereinafter recommended and proposed will in our opinion tend to make better provision for the Cure of Souls in the Parish or District in or in respect of which the right of Patronage or Advowson so recommended and proposed to be transferred as aforesaid arises or exists, that is to say, in the Parishes of Ingham, Culford and Timworth:

"Now, therefore, with the consent of the said Cecil Berens (in testimony whereof he has signed and sealed this Scheme), and with the consent of the said Walter Godfrey, Bishop of Saint Edmundsbury and Ipswich (in testimony whereof he has signed this Scheme and sealed the same with his Episcopal Seal), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, humbly recommend and propose that upon and from the day of the date of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme and without any conveyance or assurance in the law other than such duly gazetted Order the whole Advowson or perpetual right of Patronage of and presentation to the said Benefice of Ingham with Culford and Timworth, now vested in him, the said Cecil Berens as aforesaid, shall be transferred to the said Walter Godfrey, Bishop of Saint Edmundsbury and Ipswich, and his successors in the same Bishopric, and shall thereupon and thenceforth become and be absolutely vested in and shall and may from time to time be exercised by the said Walter Godfrey, Bishop of Saint Edmundsbury and Ipswich, and by his successors in the same Bishopric for ever.

"And we further recommend and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any

further or other measures relating to the matters aforesaid, or any of them, in accordance with the provisions of the said Acts, or of any of them, or of any other Act of Parliament."

And whereas the said Scheme has been approved by His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said Scheme, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Acts.

And His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said Diocese of Saint Edmundsbury and Ipswich.

WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of the Union of Benefices Measure, 1923, duly prepared, and laid before His Majesty in Council, a Scheme, bearing date the 9th day of December, 1926, in the words and figures following, that is to say:—

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, acting in pursuance of the Union of Benefices Measure, 1923, have prepared, and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council, the following Scheme for altering the boundaries of the Parish of the Benefice of Bittadon situate in the County of Devon and in the Diocese of Exeter, by annexing thereto a contiguous part of the Parish of the Benefice of Marwood, situate in the said County and Diocese:

"Whereas Commissioners appointed at our request by the Right Reverend William, Bishop of Exeter, pursuant to the provisions of the said Union of Benefices Measure, 1923, to inquire into and report (inter alia) upon the desirability of altering the boundaries of the Parishes of the said Benefices of Bittadon and Marwood by transferring a portion of the Parish of the said Benefice of Marwood to the Parish of the said Benefice of Bittadon duly made their Report to the said Bishop of Exeter and therein recommended such alteration of boundaries, and the said Bishop of Exeter signified in writing his approval of the said Report:

"And whereas we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, have prepared this Scheme for the alteration of the boundaries of the Parishes of the said Benefices, which Scheme is based upon the terms recommended in the said Report:

"And whereas both of the said Benefices of Bittadon and Marwood are now full, the Reverend Charles Hammond being the present Incumbent of the said Benefice of Bittadon and the Reverend George Frederick Mattinson
