First Portion.—One carriage to stand by kerb on the North side of Earls Court Gardens at a point six feet East of the Eastern building line of Earls Court Road. Front of vehicle toward the West.

NOTE.—This portion of the rank will be available between the hours of 10 p.m. and 1 a.m. only.

Second Portion.—Five carriages to stand on the South side of Penywern Road, commencing at a point six feet West of the Western building line of Earls Court Road and extending Westward, by kerb, as far as necessary for five carriages.

Front of vehicles toward the East.

The first portion of the Standing to be fed exclusively by carriages from the second portion between the hours of 10 p.m. and 1 a.m. only.

Provided that no Hackney Carriage shall be suffered to stand across any street or thoroughfare, or opposite the end of any street or carriageway, or upon any place where foot passengers usually cross the carriageway.

THE GARSTANG GAS (MAXIMUM PRICE) ORDER, 1926, DATED DECEMBER 15, 1926, MADE BY THE BOARD OF TRADE UNDER SECTION 13 OF THE GARSTANG GAS ORDER, 1914.

Whereas by Section 13 of the Garstang Gas Order, 1914, the Board of Trade may by Order in writing alter the maximum price of six shillings per thousand cubic feet which the Garstang Gas Company Limited are authorised by that section to charge for gas supplied by them:

And whereas the Company have applied to the Board for the issue of an Order substituting a maximum price of six shillings and tenpence per thousand cubic feet in lieu of the existing maximum price, such substituted price to operate from the date of the Order until the 31st December, 1927:

Now, therefore, the Board of Trade, in exercise of the powers conferred upon them by the said section, hereby order as follows:—

1. During the period from the date of this Order until the thirty-first day of December, nineteen hundred and twenty-seven, the price of six shillings and tenpence per thousand cubic feet shall be substituted for the price of six shillings per thousand cubic feet mentioned in Section 13 (Price of Gas) of the Garstang Gas Order, 1914.

2. This Order may be cited as the Garstang Gas (Maximum Price) Order, 1926.
