FOOT-AND-MOUTH DISEASE (DECLARATION OF INFECTED AREAS) ORDER OF 1926 (No. 139).

The Minister of Agriculture and Fisheries, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in him under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 to 1925, and of every other power enabling him in this behalf, hereby orders as follows:—

Contraction of Ashmansworth, Hants, Infected Area.

1.—(1) The Foot - and - Mouth Disease (Declaration of Infected Areas) Order of 1926 (No. 136) shall be read and have effect as if the Area described in the Schedule to this Order were substituted for the Infected Area (No. 5) described in the First Schedule to that Order.

(2) This Article shall come into operation on the twenty-sixth day of December, nineteen hundred and twenty-six.

Release of Ashmansworth, Hants, Area from Restrictions.

2.—The Area described in the Schedule to this Order shall cease to be an Infected Area for the purposes of the Foot-and-Mouth Disease (Infected Areas Restrictions) Order of 1925 as from the third day of January, nineteen hundred and twenty-seven.

Short Title.

3.—This Order may be cited as the Footand-Mouth Disease (Declaration of Infected Areas) Order of 1926 (No. 139).

The Minister of Agriculture and Fisheries, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in him under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 to 1925, and of every other power enabling him in this behalf, hereby orders as follows:—

Declaration of Further Foot-and-Mouth Disease Injected Area.

1. The Area described in the Schedule to this Order is hereby declared to be a Foot-and-Mouth Disease Infected Area for the purposes of the Foot-and-Mouth Disease (Infected Areas Restrictions) Order of 1925. The Foot-and-Mouth Disease Declaration of Infected Areas Order of 1926 (No. 136) shall be read and have effect as if the Area described in the Schedule hereto were included as Area No. 6 in the First Schedule to that Order.

Short Title.

2. This Order may be cited as the FOOT-AND-MOUTH DISEASE DECLARATION OF INFECTED AREAS ORDER OF 1926 (No. 140) and shall be read with the Orders referred to in Article 1.
