To all to whom these presents shall come, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England send greeting:


Whereas a new church has lately been built within the Parish of Saint Helens, in the County of Lancaster and in the Diocese of Liverpool, and has been consecrated and is known as the Church of Saint Helen.

And whereas the Right Reverend Albert Augustus, Bishop of Liverpool, as Diocesan, Sir Gilbert Greenall, Baronet, of Walton Hall, in the County of Chester, Samuel Robinson, of Rydal House, Huyton, Liverpool, Esquire, James Crooks, of Woodlands, Eccleston Park, Prescot, in the said County of Lancaster, Esquire, George Pilkington Varley, of Haresfinch, Saint Helens, Esquire, William Norman Pilkington, of Rainford Hall, in the said County of Lancaster, Esquire, Sir David Gamble, Baronet, of The White Lodge, Purton, in the County of Wilts, John Masson, of Ormskirk Street, Saint Helens, Doctor of Medicine, The Right Honourable Edward Herbert, Baron Cozens-Hardy, Guy Reginald Pilkington, of Fairfield, Rainford, in the said County of Lancaster, Esquire, Frederick Richard Dixon Nuttall, of Ingleholme, Eccleston Park, Prescot, Esquire, Arthur Thomas Todd, of Number 6, Sunnyside, Princes Park, Liverpool, Esquire, and Hugh Gamble, of Limehurst, Bromborough, in the said County of Chester, Esquire, as the Patrons of the Vicarage of the said Parish of Saint Helens (hereinafter called "the said Patrons") and the Reverend Frank Child, Clerk in Holy Orders, as the Vicar or Incumbent of the said Vicarage of Saint Helens, have by an Instrument under their hands, bearing date on or about the eleventh day of November, in the year One thousand nine hundred and twentysix, certified to us, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, that it would be for the convenience of the said Parish of Saint Helens that the said new Church of Saint Helen, situate within such parish, should be substituted for the old parish church (known as the Church of Saint Mary) of the same parish;

Now therefore, we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in exercise and execution of the power or authority in that behalf contained in the Act of the eighth and ninth years of Her late Majesty, Queen Victoria, chapter seventy, and in the Act of the nineteenth and twentieth years of Her said late Majesty, chapter fifty-five, and of all other powers or authorities in anywise enabling us in the same behalf, do by this Instrument under our Common Seal, with the consents (testified as hereinafter mentioned) of the said Albert Augustus, Bishop of Liverpool, of the said Patrons and of the said Frank Child, hereby declare that the said new Church of Saint Helen, situate within the said Parish of Saint Helens and duly consecrated as aforesaid, shall be and the same is hereby substituted for the said old parish church of the same parish, and that such new church shall henceforth be the parish church of the said Parish of Saint Helens in lieu of the said cld parish church of the same parish as fully in all respects as if the said new Church of Saint Helen so hereby substituted, had been originally the parish church of the same parish; And we, the said Ecclesiastical Com-

missioners for England, in further pursuance and exercise of the powers and authorities aforesaid, and with such consents as aforesaid (testified as hereinafter mentioned), do hereby transfer all the endowments, emoluments and rights of or belonging to the said old parish church of the said Parish of Saint Helens or of or belonging to the Vicar or Incumbent thereof, to the said new Church of Saint Helen (now being by virtue of these presents the parish church of the said Parish of Saint Helens) and to the Vicar or Incumbent thereof and his successors for ever.

In witness whereof to these presents we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, have set our Common Seal, and the said Albert Augustus, Bishop of Liverpool, has set his hand and affixed his Episcopal Seal, and the said Patrons and the said Frank Child have respectively set their hands and affixed their seals, this twenty-fifth day of November, in the year One thousand nine hundred and twenty-six.

BICESTER ELECTRICITY.

NOTICE is hereby given that Cecil James
Cooper and William Cecil Hands, both
of No. 14, Gloucester Road, South Kensington,
London, S.W. 7, is applying to the Electricity
Commissioners for a Special Order (hereinafter
called "the Order") under the Electricity
(Supply) Acts, 1882 to 1922, for all or some of
