

Electric Lighting (Clauses) Act, 1899, as are applicable.

3. The names of the streets in which it is proposed that electric lines shall be laid down within a period to be specified by the Order are as follows:—

Market Street, Sheep Street, North Street, Buckingham Road from North Street to the Great Western Railway Station, The Causeway, Church Street, Roman Road from Church Street to the Nurses Home, Market Square, London Road from Market Square to the approach to the London Midland and Scottish Railway Station, Launton Road from London Road to Market End, Chapel Street and Priory Road.

4. To authorise the Undertakers to break up in the area of supply the following streets and parts of streets not repairable by the local authority and railway:—

*Main roads:—*

Market Square, Market Hill, London Road, Launton Road, Sheep Street, Bell Lane, North Street, Buckingham Road, Field Street, St. John Street, Banbury Road, Bardwell Terrace, Causeway, Church Street and Roman Road.

*Other roads:—*

Palace Yard, Blake Road, Woodfield and Stable Road, Woodfield.

*Railway:—*

The level crossings over the London Midland and Scottish Railway known as (1) the Bicester Crossing over the London Road and (2) Tubbs Crossing over the accommodation road leading from Launton Road towards Frogley Farm.

5. To prescribe and limit the prices to be charged for a supply of electricity.

6. To provide for the transfer to a Company of the undertaking to be authorised by the Order.

Printed copies of the draft Order as applied for and of the Order when made may be obtained (at the price of two shillings for each copy) at the offices of the Bicester Urban District Council at Bicester and at the offices of the undermentioned Parliamentary Agents.

Every local or other public authority, company or person being desirous of bringing before the Electricity Commissioners any objection respecting the application may do so by registered letter addressed to the Secretary, Electricity Commission, Savoy Court, Strand, W.C. 2, and despatched on or before the 17th day of January, 1927, and a copy of such objection must also be forwarded to the undermentioned Parliamentary Agents.

MID WARWICKSHIRE ELECTRICITY.

NOTICE is hereby given that application has been made by the Leicestershire and Warwickshire Electric Power Company (hereinafter called "the Company"), whose principal office is at 66, Queen Street, in the City of London, to the Electricity Commissioners for

a Special Order under the Electricity (Supply) Acts, 1882 to 1922, for the following amongst other purposes (that is to say):—

1. To authorise the Company to supply and distribute electricity for all public and private purposes as defined by the above mentioned Acts within:—

The Rural District of Monks Kirby;

The Parishes of Ansty, Binley, Keresley, Shilton, Stoke Heath, Walsgrave on Sowe, Willenhall, Withybrook and Wyken in the Rural District of Foleshill;

The Parishes of Allesley, Corley and Coundon in the Rural District of Meriden and so much of the Parishes of Berkswell, Fillongley, Great Packington, Maxstoke and Meriden, in the said Rural District as lies to the east of an imaginary straight line commencing at Daw Mill on the river Bourne at the westernmost point of the Rural District of Nuneaton and proceeding in a direction slightly west of south to and terminating at Bradnock's Marsh Mill situate near the junction of the Parishes of Barston Balsall and Berkswell;

The Parishes of Arley, Astley, Burton Hastings, Stretton Baskerville and Wolvey in the Rural District of Nuneaton;

The Parishes of Brandon and Bretford, Brinklow, Church Lawford, Combefields, Easenhall, Frankton, Kings Newnham, Marton, Princethorpe, Ryton on Dunsmore, Stretton on Dunsmore and Wolston in the Rural District of Rugby; and

The Parishes of Baginton, Bubbenhall, Eathorpe, Hunningham and Wappenbury in the Rural District of Warwick and so much of the Parish of Stoneleigh in the said Rural District as lies to the south-west of the road from Stoneleigh to the road from Burton Green to Hockley via Gibbet Hill, Kirby Corner and Westwood Heath.

all in the County of Warwick (hereinafter called "the area of supply").

2. To authorise the Company to exercise within the area of supply the powers usually conferred on distributors of electricity.

3. To prescribe and limit the price to be charged for the supply of electricity.

4. To authorise the Company to break up the following streets not repairable by the local authority and railways, namely:—

(A) *Streets.*

In the Rural District of Foleshill—

Parish of Ansty—

Road from the Coventry—Hinckley Road to Noonhill Bridge over the Oxford Canal.

Parish of Binley—

Binley Avenue, Grange Avenue, Road from Binley to Binley Mill (disused).

Parish of Keresley—

Grove Lane, Road from Rookery Farm in a south-westerly direction to its junction with the road from Holbrooks to Keresley Green.

Parish of Withybrook—

Road from Withybrook to Fosse Way via Withybrook Grange.

Parish of Wyken—

Blackberry Lane from Meikle's Farm to Stoke Heath.
