C. Cottage, including any garden provided with the cottage except where the cottage is one in regard to which the Medical Officer of Health has reported that it is in a state so dangerous or injurious to health as to be unfit for human habitation.

B. Board, for a 7-day week—11s. per week; for a 6-day week—9s. per week.

C. Cottage, 3s. per week, less any rent or rates paid by the occupier, provided that in the case of a cottage with regard to which the Committee, on an application by or on behalf of a worker have certified

that by reason of inadequate accommodation, want of repair or sanitation, the value of such cottage is less than 3s., the value shall be such sum less than 3s. as the Committee shall determine on consideration of the defects.

URBAN DISTRICT OF SPENBOROUGH.

PUBLIC HEALTH ACT, 1925.

BY an Order dated the 3rd day of December, 1926, the Minister of Health has repealed the following provisions of the Cleckheaton Urban District Council Act, 1914, for the purpose of bringing that Act into con-

formity with the Public Health Act, 1925, namely:—

Section 17 (power to lay pipes in private streets).

Section 46 (trees overhanging highways).

Section 49 (continuation of existing streets to be deemed new streets).

Section 50 (widening of roads when only one side is built upon).

So much of section 60 as is contained in paragraphs (A) and (B) in sub-section (1) of the said section (regulation of manufacture and sale of ice-cream).

Section 63 (places used for storage, &c., of human food not to be used as sleeping places).

Section 64 (defining establishment of new business).
