By an exchange of notes dated November 22nd and 29th, 1926, between the Mexican Minister for Foreign Affairs and His Britannic Majesty's Minister at Mexico, it has been agreed that the denunciation by the Mexican Government of the Treaty of Friendship, Commerce and Navigation, signed at Mexico on November 27th, 1888, which denunciation was notified to His Majesty's Principal Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs by the Mexican Minister in London on December 22nd, 1925, shall be suspended for six months from December 22nd, 1926.

The Treaty will therefore not terminate until June 22nd, 1927.

*Further Contraction of Devizes (Wilts.)
Infected Area.*

1.—(1) The Foot - and - Mouth Disease (Declaration of Infected Areas) Order of 1926 (No. 143) as amended by the Foot-and-Mouth Disease (Infected Areas) Order of 1927 (No. 2), shall be read and have effect as if the Area described in the Schedule to this Order were substituted for the Infected Area (No. 8) described in the First Schedule to the last mentioned Order.

(2) This Article shall come into operation on the nineteenth day of January, nineteen hundred and twenty-seven.

*Release of Devizes (Wilts.) Area from
Restrictions.*

2. The Area described in the Schedule to this Order shall cease to be an Infected Area for the purposes of the Foot-and-Mouth Disease (Infected Areas Restrictions) Order of 1925 as from the twenty-sixth day of January, nineteen hundred and twenty-seven.

Short Title.

3. This Order may be cited as the FOOT-AND-MOUTH DISEASE (INFECTED AREAS) ORDER OF 1927 (No. 5).

 Sections 62, 64 and 65, comprised in Part IV (infectious diseases); and
 Section 93, comprised in Part X (miscellaneous provisions).

2. The Council shall forthwith cause a statement of the effect of this order and of the place where a copy of the order may be inspected to be published in some newspaper circulating in the Borough.

3. This Order may be cited as the Borough of Swindon (Public Health) Order, 1927.

To make further and better provision for regulating the gas undertaking of the Corporation with regard to the supply of gas by pre-payment meters, the construction and placing of pipes, relief from obligation to supply, power to compel repairs in case of danger, to provide for the use of valves where high pressure air is used, for fixing the minimum payments to be made for supplies of gas to premises having a supply from other sources of Electricity, Steam or other form of energy, for the method of cutting off supplies of gas, power to supply gas fittings etc., for the recovery of expenses of re-connecting discontinued supply, removal of fittings where supply discontinued, power to enter premises to which a supply of gas is laid on, to require consumers to give notice before removal, to provide for the use of anti-fluctuators in certain cases, to determine the period of error in defective meters, power to refuse supply to persons in debt for other premises, and power to contract for supply and purchase of gas in bulk.

4. To authorise the Corporation to borrow further money for and in connection with their gas undertaking and to charge the moneys so borrowed on the revenue of the gas undertaking and the Borough Fund and Borough Rate either jointly or separately and to provide that moneys borrowed under the Order shall not be reckoned in the limit of borrowing prescribed by the Public Health Act, 1875, to make provision for the repayment of such moneys and as to the application of gas revenue.

5. To vary or extinguish all rights, powers and privileges inconsistent with or which would or might in any way interfere with any of the objects of the Order and to confer other rights and privileges.

TIVERTON GAS SPECIAL ORDER.

(Application for Special Order under
Section 10 of the Gas Regulation Act, 1920.)

THE Mayor Aldermen and Burgesses of the borough of Tiverton in the County of Devon (hereinafter called "the Corporation") acting by the Council as the urban district council of the said borough whose address is the Town Hall, Tiverton aforesaid are applying to the Board of Trade under Section 10 of the Gas Regulation Act 1920 for a Special Order for the following objects:—

1. To repeal any enactments or other provisions requiring the Corporation to supply gas of any particular illuminating or calorific power and to substitute therefor power to charge for thermal units supplied in the form of gas.

2. To repeal any statutory or other provisions affecting the prices which may be charged by the Corporation for the supply of gas, to substitute prices per therm (i.e. 100,000 British Thermal Units) for prices per

1,000 cubic feet and to increase the maximum prices now authorised for gas supplied by the Corporation from 4s. 6d. per 1,000 cubic feet to 15d. per therm.

3. To authorise the Corporation to borrow further money for the purposes of their gas undertaking (including the provision of working capital) and to charge the moneys so borrowed on the revenue of the gas undertaking and the general rate fund and general rate (or the district fund and general district rate) of the said borough either jointly or separately; to provide that moneys borrowed under the Order shall not be reckoned in the limit of borrowing prescribed by the Public Health Act 1875 and to make provisions as to the mode of raising money and the repayment thereof.

4. To make new provision as to the application of the revenues of the gas undertaking of the Council; to increase the respective limits on the price charged by the Council for gas supplied by them, subject to which any surplus revenue of the said undertaking may be carried to, or any deficit in the revenue of the said undertaking may be made good out of, the general rate fund or district fund of the borough, to define such limits by prices per therm instead of prices per 1,000 cubic feet.

5. To authorise the Corporation to pay the costs charges and expenses of the Order out of the revenue of the gas undertaking, the general rate fund (or district fund) of the borough or out of the moneys to be borrowed for the purpose, and to make other financial provision with reference to the Council's gas undertaking.

6. To amend Article XXV of the Tiverton Gas Order 1896 as regards the interest payable by the Corporation on consumers' deposits.

7. To authorise the Corporation to lay down and maintain pipes culverts and other works within their limits of supply for the purpose of procuring conducting or disposing of oil or other materials and to break up and interfere with streets and roads for that purpose and any other purposes of the Order.

8. To make provision with reference to the laying of pipes in private streets; minimum payment to be made for stand-by supplies of gas; cutting off and reconnecting supplies and the expenses of so doing, refusal to supply gas to persons in debt to the Corporation, to provide that fittings apparatus and appliances let on hire shall remain the property of and

be removable by the Corporation, entry on premises and removal of fittings, relief from obligation to supply gas, antifluctuators, the provision of valves where high pressure air or other gas is used, defective meters, notices to be given by consumers before removal and of discontinuance of supply, the recovery of demands and penalties and the contents of summonses.

9. To authorise the Corporation and any other local authority company or person to enter into contracts for the supply of gas in bulk to each other, whether within or beyond or for use beyond the the Corporation's limits of supply.

10. To empower the Corporation to purchase or take on lease and to erect fit up maintain and let houses and cottages for their employees, and offices, show rooms and other buildings for the purposes of their gas undertaking.

11. To incorporate and apply to the Corporation with or without modification the provisions of the Gasworks Clauses Acts 1847 and 1871 and to repeal extend alter or amend some of the provisions of the Tiverton Gas Order 1896.
