APPOINTMENTS OF STANDINGS FOR HACKNEY CARRIAGES WITHIN THE METROPOLITAN POLICE DISTRICT, AND REGULATIONS TO BE OBSERVED.

By virtue of the Act 13 and 14 Victoria, chapter 7, intituled "An Act for consolidating the Office of the Registrar of Metropolitan Public Carriages with the Office of Commissioners of Police of the Metropolis and making other provisions in regard to the Consolidated Offices."

I, WILLIAM THOMAS FRANCIS HORWOOD, Commissioner of Police of the Metropolis, do hereby APPOINT Standings for Hackney Carriages at the following places, and do make the following Regulations with regard to the Boundaries for the same, viz.:—

#### APPOINTMENTS.

DAVIES STREET AND MOUNT ROW, BERKELEY SQUARE, W.

Fourteen Hackney Carriages in three portions:

First Portion.—Five carriages in the centre of roadway, at Davies Street, commencing at a point 15 feet South of the Southern building line of Brook Street and extending Southward as far as necessary for five carriages.

Front of vehicles toward the North.

Second Portion.—Three carriages in the centre of roadway, at Davies Street, commencing at a point 15 feet South of the Southern building line of Grosvenor Street and extending Southward as far as necessary for three carriages.

Front of vehicles toward the North.

Third Portion.—Six carriages in the centre of roadway, at Mount Row, commencing at a point in line with the party wall of Nos. 52/53, Mount Row, and extending Westward as far as necessary for six carriages.

Front of vehicles toward the East.

The first portion of the Standing to be fed exclusively by carriages from the second portion, the second portion by carriages from the third portion.

DAVIES STREET, BERKELEY SQUARE, W.

Two Hackney Carriages:

In the centre of roadway, commencing at a point in line with the party wall of No. 1, Mount Street and No. 3, Davies Street, and extending Northward as far as necessary for two carriages. Front of vehicles toward the South.

Provided that no Hackney Carriage shall be suffered to stand across any street or thoroughfare, or opposite the end of any street or carriage-way, or upon any place where foot passengers usually cross the carriage-way.

# WATFORD ELECTRICITY (EXTENSION) (SPECIAL ORDER).

(The Supply of Electricity by the Mayor, Aldermen, and Burgesses of the Borough of Watford in the parishes of Little Gaddesden and Nettleden in the rural district of Berkhampstead and the parish of Great Gaddesden in the Rural District of Hemel Hempstead all in the County of Hertford).

NOTICE is hereby given that the Mayor, Aldermen and Burgesses of the Borough of Watford (hereinafter called "the Corporation") whose address is the Municipal Offices, Watford, intend to apply to the Electricity Commissioners for a Special Order (hereinafter called "the Order") under the Electricity (Supply) Acts, 1882 to 1922, for all or some of the following amongst other purposes (that is to say):—

- 1. To extend the area of supply under the Watford Electricity Act and Orders 1897 to 1922 by adding thereto the parishes of Little Gaddesden and Nettleden in the rural district of Berkhampstead and the parish of Great Gaddesden in the Rural District of Hemel Hempstead all in the County of Hertford. The areas so proposed to be added to the said area of supply are hereinafter referred to as "the added area."
- 2. To authorise the Corporation to generate and supply electricity for all public and private purposes as defined by the Electricity (Supply) Acts, 1882 to 1922, within all portions of the added area.
- 3. To extend and make applicable to the added area all or some of the provisions contained in the Watford Electricity Act and Orders 1897 to 1922 and to apply such provisions to the undertaking to be authorised by the Order, subject to such variations and exceptions as may be contained therein.
- 4. To incorporate in the Order such of the provisions contained in the Schedule to the Electric Lighting (Clauses) Act, 1899, as are applicable and to apply such provisions to the undertaking to be authorised by the Order with such variations and exceptions as may be contained therein.
- 5. To authorise the Corporation to open, break up, and interfere with all streets, roads and public places, ways, footpaths, bridges, culverts, sewers, drains and gas and water mains and pipes and telegraph and telephone and other wires within the added area and to lay down, erect, maintain, renew and remove either above or under ground or otherwise, electric lines, conductors, mains, pipes, tubes, wires, posts, street or distributing boxes, meters, apparatus or other works or things required for the purpose of enabling the Corporation to generate, supply, store, convey, transmit or distribute electricity within the added area and to confer all such other powers upon the Corporation as may be necessary for effecting the objects of the proposed undertaking.
- 6. To prescribe the maximum price or maximum prices that may be demanded and taken by the Corporation in respect of the supply of electrical energy within the added area and to prescribe the minimum prices to be paid by

persons supplied with electricity by the Corporation or connected to their electricity undertaking in that area.

Main road through the village of Nettleden from a point opposite Nettleden House to a point opposite the footpath to St. Margaret's.

The following Areas are now "Movement Areas" for the purposes of Part I of the Sheep (Double Dipping) Order of 1920:—

Inverness.—(1) An Area comprising the islands known as the Outer Hebrides (except the islands of St. Kilda, Dune, Soay and Boreray), in the county of Inverness.

(2) An Area in the county of Inverness comprising the islands known as Skye or Inner Hebrides.

namely:---

Commencing at a point where the London Midland and Scottish Railway from Lancaster to Long Preston crosses the county boundary near High Bentham, thence south-easterly along that railway to the point where it intersects the road from Settle to Rathmell, thence in a southerly direction along that road via Rathmell, Wigglesworth, Becks Brow Bottom, Pikeber, Mere Sike, Flass Gate, Forest Becks, Holden, Bolton Peel, and Bow Lathe to Sawley; thence continuing in a south westerly direction along the road from Sawley via Foxley Bank, Grindleton, Lane Side, Lower West Clough, West Bradford, Waddington, Bashall Bridge, Backridge, and Bashall to the River Hodder; thence following the county boundary in a generally northerly direction to the point of commencement.
