By virtue of an Act passed in the 24th year of the Reign of His Majesty King George III, intituled "An Act to repeal so much of two "Acts made in the 10th & 15th years of the "Reign of His present Majesty, as "authorizes The Speaker of the House of "Commons to issue his Warrant to the "Clerk of the Crown for making out Writs "for the Election of Members to serve in "Parliament in the manner therein men-"tioned, and for substituting other pro-"visions for the like purposes;" And of an Act passed in the 26th year of the Reign of Her Majesty Queen Victoria, intituled "An "Act to further limit and define the time "for proceeding to Election during the "Recess."

TENDERS FOR TREASURY BILLS.

1. The Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury hereby give notice that Tenders will be received at the Chief Cashier's Office, at the Bank of England, on Friday, the 4th February, 1927, at 1 o'clock, for Treasury Bills to be issued under the Treasury Bills Act, 1877, the National Debt Act, 1889, and the War Loan Acts, 1914-1919, to the amount of \pounds 30,000,000.

2. The Bills will be in amounts of £5,000 or £10,000. They will be dated at the option of the Tenderer on any business day from Monday, the 7th February, 1927, to Saturday, the 12th February, 1927, inclusive, and will be payable at three months after date.

3. The Bills will be issued and paid at the Bank of England.

4. Each Tender must be for an amount not less than £50,000, and must specify the date on which the Bills required are to be dated, and the net amount per cent. (being an even multiple of one penny) which will be given for the amount applied for. Separate Tenders must be lodged for Bills of different dates.

5. Tenders must be made through a London Banker, Discount House or Broker.

6. The persons whose Tenders are accepted will be informed of the same not later than the following day, and payment in full of the amounts of the accepted tenders must be made to the Bank of England by means of Cash or a Banker's Draft on the Bank of England not
