EXETER GAS.

(Application for Special Order under Section 10 of the Gas Regulation Act, 1920.)

NOTICE is hereby given that application is intended to be made to the Board of Trade by the Exeter Gaslight and Coke Company (hereinafter referred to as "the Company") whose address is 11 and 12, East Southernhay, Exeter, for a Special Order (hereinafter referred to as "the Order")

under Section 10 of the Gas Regulation Act 1920 for all or some of the following purposes (that is to say):—

To authorise the Company to purchase the gas undertaking at Topsham belonging to John Griffiths Sanders Lee upon such terms and conditions as may be prescribed by the Order.

To extend the limits of supply of the Company so as to include the parishes of Pinhoe, Ide, Broadclyst, Poltimore, Sowton, Clyst St. Mary, Clyst St. George, Exminster, Shillingford, Powderham and Kenton in the rural district of St. Thomas and so much of the parishes of Whitestone and Upton Pyne in that rural district and of the parish of Newton St. Cyres in the rural district of Crediton as is within a radius of 3 miles from the western entrance of Exeter Cathedral all in the county of Devon and to empower the Company to exercise within the aforesaid parishes or parts of parishes all or some of the rights and powers exercisable by them within their existing limits of supply, and to provide for a different and a higher price being charged by the Company for gas supplied within part of the parish of Topsham and within the additional limits or such parts thereof as may be prescribed by the Order than that charged by them for gas supplied within the City of Exeter.

To authorise the Company to erect and maintain alter extend renew and improve works for the manufacture or conversion and storage of gas and residual products arising from the manufacture of gas and to make and store gas and such residual products upon the following lands:—

All that piece or parcel of land with the gasworks erected thereon belonging or reputed to belong to John Griffiths Sanders Lee and situate in the parish of Topsham in the rural district of Saint Thomas in the County of Devon and bounded on or towards the north by White Street on or towards the south by the railway siding to Topsham Wharf Topsham and on or towards the east by premises known as No. 32, White Street, and on or towards the west by a piece of garden ground between the gas works and No. 1 Bussel Court, Topsham.

All that piece or parcel of land with the railway sidings thereon belonging or reputed to belong to the Exeter Gaslight and Coke Company and situate in the City of Exeter and bounded on or towards the east by the existing gasworks of the Company on or towards the south by Water Lane on or towards the west by the Great Western Railway (Exeter Basin Branch) and on or towards the north by land belonging to the Great Western Railway Company and leased by them to the Company.
