#### PRESENT,

The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS by the Representation of the People (Economy Provisions) Act, 1926, (16 & 17 Geo. V, c. 9), (hereinafter referred to as "the Act") provision is made for one register only of electors to be made in each year:

And whereas by the Act power is conferred on His Majesty to make by Order in Council such adaptations in the provisions of any Act as may seem to Him necessary to make those provisions conform with the provisions of the Act:

And whereas certain adaptations in the provisions of the Juries Act, 1922, (12 & 13 Geo. V,

c. 11), are necessary for the purpose aforesaid:
Now, therefore, His Majesty, in pursuance
of the powers conferred upon Him by the Act
and of all other powers enabling Him in that
behalf is pleased by and with the advice of
His Privy Council to order and it is hereby
ordered as follows:—

1. The following adaptations shall be made in the provisions of the Juries Act, 1922:—

(a) The words "in the case of the autumn register" in subsection (2) of section 2 shall be omitted;

(b) The words "register of electors" shall be substituted for the words "autumn register" wherever the same occur; and

(c) Paragraph (b) of subsection (1) of section 6 (which relates to the provisional marking of names of persons as jurors or special jurors in the electors lists for the spring register) shall be omitted.

2. This Order may be cited as the Economy Provisions (Adaptation of Enactments) Order, 1927.

The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

HEREAS by an Order made by the late King's Most Excellent Majesty in Council on the 19th March, 1908, His Majesty was pleased to order (amongst other things) that the several units of Yeomanry and Volunteers detailed in the first column of the Schedule to that Order should on and from 1st April, 1908, be transferred to the Territorial Force and should thereafter be units of the Territorial Force and should be respectively known by the titles specified in the second column of the said Schedule:

And whereas the said Order further provided that all property belonging to or held for the benefit of any unit of the Volunteers or Yeomanry mentioned in the first column of the Schedule to the said Order and vested in the commanding officer of any corps or regiment of volunteers or yeomanry as such should, so far as it consisted of land or any interest in land, by virtue of the said Order become vested in, and, so far as it consisted of other property, be transferred to, the Association mentioned in the third column of the Schedule to the said Order and in the manner and subject to the conditions provided in the said Order:

And whereas the 5th Volunteer Battalion, The Royal Scots, detailed in the first column of the said Schedule was by virtue of that Order transferred to the Territorial Force and became the unit of the Territorial Force known by the title of the 7th Battalion, The Royal Scots, specified in the second column of the said Schedule, and the property of the said unit was vested in or transferred to the Association for the County of Midlothian in the manner prescribed in the said Order:

And whereas the 6th Volunteer Battalion, The Royal Scots, was in like manner transferred and became part of the unit of the Territorial Force known by the title of the 8th Battalion, The Royal Scots, and the property of the said unit was vested in or transferred to the Association for the County of Peebles in the manner prescribed in the said Order:

And whereas it was provided by the Territorial Army and Militia Act, 1921, that the Territorial Force should be called the Terri-

And whereas the said 7th Battalion, The Royal Scots, has become amalgamated with the 9th Battalion, The Royal Scots, and is now known by the title of the 7th/9th Battalion, The Royal Scots, Territorial Army, and that part of the said 8th Battalion, The Royal Scots, which was formerly known as the 6th Volunteer Battalion, The Royal Scots, has become a unit of the Royal Artillery, Territorial Army, and is known by the title of the 228th (Peebles and Midlothian) Battery:

And whereas the boundaries of the County of the City of Edinburgh were so extended by virtue of the Edinburgh Boundaries Extension and Tramways Act, 1920, as to include the borough of Leith, wherein is situated the property first mentioned in the first column of the Schedule to this Order:

And whereas the 7th/9th Battalion, The Royal Scots, and the 228th (Peebles and Midlothian) Battery, Royal Artillery, Territorial Army, are now administered by the Association for the County of the City of Edinburgh:

And whereas it is deemed expedient that the properties mentioned in the first column of the Schedule to this Order which were formerly vested in the officers commanding the units of the Volunteers shown in the second column of that Schedule and by virtue of the before mentioned Order, dated 19th March, 1908, were vested in or transferred to the Association shown in the third column of that Schedule shall be transferred to and vested in the Association mentioned in the fourth column of that Schedule:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, doth order and it is hereby ordered, that as from the date of this Order the said properties shall be transferred from the Associations mentioned in the third column of the Schedule to this Order to and vested in the Association mentioned in the fourth column of that Schedule subject to any charges thereon and to any liabilities in or towards the discharge of which the said properties are properly applicable and shall be held by the said Association for the benefit of the said units of the Territorial Army or for such other purposes as the Association with the consent of the said Units (to be ascertained in manner prescribed by regulations of the Army Council) shall direct.

#### PRESENT.

The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS by an Order of His late Majesty King Edward the Seventh in Council bearing date the 22nd day of October, 1906, and entitled "the East Africa Order in Council, 1906," provision was made for the appointment of a Governor and Commander in Chief in and for the East Africa Protectorate and for the constitution of an Executive Council and also a Legislative Council in and for the said Protectorate:

And whereas by Article XI of the said East Africa Order in Council, 1906, it was provided that the Governor, in His Majesty's name and on His Majesty's behalf, might make and execute, under the Public Seal, grants and dispositions of any lands within the Protectorate which might be lawfully granted or disposed of by His Majesty: Provided that every such grant or disposition should be made in conformity, either with some Order in Council or law then or thereafter in force in the Protectorate, or with some Instructions which might be addressed to the Governor under His Majesty's Sign Manual and Signet, or through one of His Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State:

And whereas by an Order in Council bearing date the 11th day of June, 1920, and entitled "the Kenya (Annexation) Order in Council, 1920" the territories comprised in the East Africa Protectorate, save and excepting only such territories therein included as form part of the dominions of His Highness the Sultan of Zanzibar, were annexed to and now form part of His Majesty's dominions and are known as the Colony of Kenya:

And whereas by an Order in Council bearing date the 18th day of August, 1920, and entitled "the Kenya Protectorate Order in Council, 1920," it is provided that the territories comprised in the East Africa Protectorate other than those so annexed as aforesaid shall be known as the Protectorate of Kenya:

And whereas by an Order in Council bearing date the 27th day of June, 1921, and entitled "the Kenya Colony Order in Council, 1921," it is amongst other things provided that the Governor may make grants or leases of any Crown lands in the Colony or may permit them to be temporarily occupied on such terms and conditions as he may see fit, subject to the provisions of any Ordinance:

And whereas by Article XV of the said "Kenya Protectorate Order in Council, 1920," it is provided that the Governor, in His Majesty's name and on His Majesty's behalf, may make and execute, under the Public Seal, grants and dispositions of any lands within the Protectorate which may be lawfully granted or disposed of by His Majesty: Provided that every such grant or disposition be made in conformity, either with some Order in Council or law now or hereafter in force in the Protectorate, or with some Instructions which may be addressed to the Governor under His Majesty's Sign Manual and Signet, or through one of His Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State:

And whereas the said East Africa Order in Council, 1906, has ceased to apply to the Colony of Kenya but still applies to the Protectorate:

And whereas doubts have arisen whether the provisions of Article XI of the said East Africa Protectorate Order in Council, 1906, should be deemed to curtail the power of the Governor and Legislative Council of Kenya to make provision for the form, execution and conditions of grants of land in the Protectorate; and it is desirable to remove such doubts.

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by virtue and in exercise of the powers by the Foreign Jurisdiction Act, 1890, or otherwise in His Majesty vested, is pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:—

1. This Order may be cited as the Kenya Protectorate (Disposition of Lands) Order in Council. 1927.

2. Article XI of the said East Africa Order in Council, 1906, shall be and is hereby amended by the addition of the following provision:—

"Nothing in this Article shall be deemed to affect the power of the Governor and Legislative Council to enact legislation regarding the form, execution and conditions of such grants and dispositions."

3. This Order shall be published in the Official Gazette of the Colony and Protectorate of Kenya and shall thereupon commence and come into operation.

4. His Majesty may from time to time revoke, alter, add to, or amend this Order.

WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of the Act of the 59th year of His late Majesty King George the Third, Chapter 134, of the Act of the 2nd and 3rd years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 49, and of the Act of the 19th and 20th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 55, duly prepared, and laid before His Majesty in Council, a Representation bearing date the 20th day of January, 1927, in the words and figures following, that is to say:—

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of the Act of the 59th year of His late Majesty King George the Third, Chapter 134, of the Act of the 2nd and 3rd years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 49, and of the Act of the 19th and 20th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 55, have prepared, and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council, the following Representation as to the assignment of a District Chapelry to the consecrated Church of Saint Augustine, Wembley Park, situate in the New Parish (sometime Particular District) of Saint John the Evangelist, Wembley, in the County of Middlesex, and in the Diocese of London:

"Whereas it appears to us to be expedient that a District Chapelry should be assigned to the said Church of Saint Augustine, Wembley Park, situate as aforesaid:

"Now, therefore, with the consent of the Right Honourable and Right Reverend Arthur Foley, Bishop of London (testified by his having signed and sealed this Representation), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, humbly represent that it would, in our opinion, be expedient, that all that part of the said New Parish of Saint John the Evangelist, Wembley, which is described in the Schedule hereunder written, all which part, together with the boundaries thereof, is delineated and set forth on the map or plan hereunto annexed, should be assigned as a District Chapelry to the said Church of Saint Augustine, Wembley Park, situate as aforesaid, and that the same should be named 'The District Chapelry of Saint Augustine, Wembley Park."

"And with the like consent of the said Arthur Foley, Bishop of London (testified as aforesaid), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, further represent, that it appears to us to be expedient that banns of matrimony should be published, and that marriages, baptisms, churchings and burials should be solemnized or performed at the said Church of Saint Augustine, Wembley Park, situate as aforesaid, and that the fees or dues to be received in respect of the publication of banns and of the solemnization or performance of marriages, churchings and burials should be paid and belong to the minister of the same church for the time being; provided always that, so long as the Reverend John William Potts Silvester, Clerk in Holy Orders, the present Vicar or Incumbent of the Vicarage of the said New Parish of Saint John the Evangelist, Wembley, shall continue to be such Vicar or Incumbent, all the fees or dues which may be received in respect of such publication, solemnization, or performance at the said Church of Saint Augustine, Wembley Park, situate as aforesaid, shall be paid over by the Minister thereof to the said John William Potts Silvester.

"We, therefore, humbly pray that Your Majesty will be graciously pleased to take the premises into Your Royal consideration and to make such Order with respect thereto as to Your Majesty, in Your Royal Wisdom, shall seem meet.

- "THE SCHEDULE to which the foregoing Representation has reference.
- "The District Chapelry of Saint Augustine, Wembley Park, being:—
- "All that part of the New Parish (sometime Particular District) of Saint John the Evangelist, Wembley, in the County of Middlesex, and in the Diocese of London, which is bounded upon the east partly by the New Parish of Neasden cum Kingsbury and partly by the Parish of Kingsbury, upon the north, upon the north west and upon the west by the Parish of Harrow on the Hill, upon part of the south west by the New Parish of Saint Andrew,

Sudbury, all in the said County and Diocese, and upon the remaining sides, that is to say, upon the remaining part of the south west, upon the south and upon the south east, by an imaginary line commencing upon the boundary which divides the said New Parish of Saint Andrew, Sudbury, from the said New Parish of Saint John the Evangelist, Wembley, at the centre of the bridge which carries East Lane across the main line of the London and North Western Section of the London, Midland and Scottish Railway, and extending thence south eastward along the middle of such line of railway for a distance of 49 chains or thereabouts to the centre of the bridge which carries the line of the Great Central Section of the London and North Eastern Railway across the first mentioned line of railway, and extending thence eastward along the middle of the said Great Central line of railway for a distance of 42½ chains or thereabouts to the centre of the bridge which carries Wembley Hill Road across such line of railway, and extending thence first northward and then north westward along the middle of Wembley Hill Road for a distance of 16 chains or thereabouts to its junction with the road called Raglan Gardens, and extending thence first eastward and then north eastward along the middle of Raglan Gardens for a distance of 45 chains or thereabouts to the centre of the bridge which carries such road across the Extension Line of the Metropolitan Railway, and extending thence south eastward along the middle of the last mentioned line of railway for a distance of 51 chains or thereabouts to the boundary which divides the said New Parish of Saint John the Evangelist, Wembley, from the said New Parish of Neasden cum Kingsbury."

And whereas the said Representation has been approved by His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said Representation, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Acts.

And His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said Diocese of London.

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of the Act of the 33rd and 34th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 39, and of the Acts therein mentioned, that is to say, the Act of the 3rd and 4th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 113, the Act of the 4th and 5th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 39, and the Act of the 31st and 32nd years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 114, have prepared, and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council, the following Scheme for effecting a transfer of the ownership of the Advowson or perpetual right of Patronage of and presentation to the Church and Cure (hereinafter called 'the said Benefice') of Saint Peter, Hargrave, in the County of Chester, and in the Diocese of Chester:

"Whereas under or by virtue of an Order made by the Board of Charity Commissioners for England and Wales (hereinafter called 'the said Board') on the 11th day of July, 1873, the legal estate in the Advowson or perpetual right of Patronage of and presentation to the said Benefice of Saint Peter, Hargrave, is vested in the Official Trustee of Charity Lands in trust for the Charity of Sir Thomas Moulson:

"And whereas Henry Dashwood Stucley Leake, Esquire, is the present Secretary of the said Board and as such the Official Trustee of Charity Lands:

"And whereas the Most Noble Hugh Richard Arthur, Duke of Westminster, G.C.V.O., D.S.O., the Right Reverend Henry Luke, Bishop of Chester, the Very Reverend Frank Selwyn Macaulay Bennett, Deau of the Cathedral Church of Chester, Henry Arthur Heywood, of Christleton Lodge, Christleton, Chester, Esquire, and Robert Barbour, of Bolesworth Castle, Chester, Esquire, as the Trustees of the said Charity of Sir Thomas Moulson, are desirous that the whole Advowson or perpetual right of Patronage of and presentation to the said Benefice of Saint Peter, Hargrave, now vested as aforesaid, should be transferred to and be vested in the Bishop of Chester for the time being:

"And whereas by a Scheme established by an Order made by the said Board on the 25th day of June, 1926, the Trustees of the said Charity of Sir Thomas Moulson are authorised to do and execute all such acts and assurances as shall be necessary or proper for transferring to the Bishop of Chester the said Advowson or perpetual right of Patronage of and presentation to the said Benefice of Saint Peter, Hargrave, and the said Official Trustee of Charity Lands is directed to give any consent which may be required from him for carrying such transfer into effect:

"And whereas the said Henry Luke, Bishop of Chester, acting as such Bishop, is willing to accept such transfer, and in token of such his willingness and also in token that the same transfer has that consent of the Bishop of the

Diocese which by the Acts in the hereinbefore mentioned Act recited or by some or one of them is made necessary he, the said Henry Luke, Bishop of Chester, has executed this Scheme as hereinafter mentioned:

"And whereas the transfer of the Patronage of the said Benefice of Saint Peter, Hargrave, which is hereinbefore mentioned and hereinafter recommended and proposed will render the same Benefice more eligible for augmentation out of funds under our control, and this circumstance will in our opinion tend to make better provision for the Cure of Souls in the Parish or District in or in respect of which the right of Patronage or Advowson so recommended and proposed to be transferred as aforesaid arises or exists, that is to say, in the New Parish of Saint Peter, Hargrave:

"Now, therefore, with the consents of the said Hugh Richard Arthur, Duke of Westminster; Frank Selwyn Macaulay Bennett; Henry Arthur Heywood, and Robert Barbour (in testimony whereof they have signed and sealed this Scheme), and with the consent of the said Henry Luke, Bishop of Chester (in testimony whereof he has signed this Scheme and sealed the same with his Episcopal Seal), and with the consent of the said Official Trustee of Charity Lands (in testimony whereof the said Henry Dashwood Stucley Leake has signed and sealed this Scheme), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners England, humbly recommend and propose that upon and from the day of the date of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme and without any conveyance or assurance in the law other than such duly gazetted Order the whole Advowson or perpetual right of Patronage of and presentation to the said Benefice of Saint Peter, Hargrave, now vested as aforesaid, shall be transferred to the said Henry Luke, Bishop of Chester, as such Bishop, and to his successors in the same Bishopric, and shall thereupon and thenceforth become and be absolutely vested in and shall and may from time to time be exercised by the said Henry Luke, Bishop of Chester, and by his successors in the same Bishopric for ever.

"And we further recommend and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any further or other measures relating to the matters aforesaid, or any of them, in accordance with the provisions of the said Acts, or of any of them, or of any other Act of Parliament."

And whereas the said Scheme has been approved by His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said Scheme, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Acts.

And His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said Diocese of Chester. Lord Chamberlain's Office, Buckingham Palace, S.W. 11th February, 1927.

Officers, R.N., R.N.R., and R.N.V.R., not in possession of Full Dress Uniform—No. 3 Dress (Frock Coat with Equalettes).

Army.—Officers in possession of Full Dress of their rank—Levée Dress.

Officers not in possession of Full Dress Uniform of their rank—Service Dress.

Air Force.—Officers in possession of Full Dress Uniform—Full Dress.

Officers not in possession of Full Dress Uniform—Service Dress.

Civilians.—Levée Dress.

The following are the Regulations to be observed:—

- 1. Peers, Bishops, His Majesty's Lieutenants of Counties, Deputy Lieutenants of Counties, Members of Parliament, Officials connected with the Houses of Parliament, Clergy of all Denominations, and all gentlemen other than those mentioned in the following Regulations, should communicate with the Comptroller, Lord Chamberlain's Office, St. James's Palace. No applications can be received from gentlemen in the foregoing categories wishing to be presented. Their names must be forwarded by the gentleman making the presentation.
- 2. All gentlemen referred to in the following Regulations, wishing to attend or be presented at a Levée, should make a written application as directed below.
- 3. All Officers, whether on the active or retired lists of the Royal Navy and the Royal Marines, will communicate with and obtain their cards, whether for attendance or presentation, from the Private Secretary to the First Lord of the Admiralty.
- 4. All Officers on the active, retired, and reserve lists of the Regular Army, the Militia, and the Territorial Army, except Officers of the Household Cavalry and the Brigade of Guards, and those on the Indian and Colonial Establishments, will communicate with and obtain their cards, whether for attendance or presentation, from the Under-Secretary of State, War Office.

Officers of the Household Cavalry and the Brigade of Guards will communicate, through their Regimental Headquarters, with the Comptroller, Lord Chamberlain's Office, St. James's Palace, to obtain their cards for attendance or presentation.

5. All Officers on the active list of the Royal Air Force and Officers of the Special Reserve and Auxiliary Air Force will obtain their cards, for attendance or presentation, through the usual channels. Officers of the Reserve of Air Force Officers and Officers on the retired list of the Royal Air Force will communicate with and obtain their cards,

whether for attendance or presentation, from the Secretary, Air Ministry, Kingsway, W.C. 2.

6. All Officers of the Indian Services and of the Indian Army, whether on the active or retired list, will communicate with and obtain their cards, for attendance or for presentation, from the Private Secretary to the Secretary of State at the India Office, Whitehall.

· 7. All Officers of the Colonial Service and Colonial Forces, whether on the active or retired lists, will communicate with and obtain their cards, whether for attendance or presentation, from the Colonial Office, Whitehall, with the exception of Officers of the local Forces of the self-governing Dominions, who will apply to the Under-Secretary of State, the War Office, for their cards for attendance or for presentation, supporting their application in all cases by a credential from the Governor-General, Governor, Officer commanding the local Forces, or the representative in London of the Dominion concerned.

8. His Majesty The KING has been graciously pleased to award the Edward Medal to Bhikam Sirdar and Kristo Kamar, in recognition of their gallantry in the following circumstances:—

During the month of February, sections of a coal mine at the Tikak Colliery in Assam caught fire. The burning\_sections had been sealed off by dams but on February 25th a strong smell of fire became perceptible in a seam of the mine in which work was pro-The European Manager with two European foremen and a gang of coolies proceeded to plaster the dams but after six hours' work the majority of the men became affected by the fumes of carbon monoxide gas and the party were forced to withdraw. Early on the morning of February 26th the three Europeans with forty coolies resumed the work but after spending little more than an hour in the seam the whole of the party collapsed. Sirdar, a contractor who had been engaged in the fire area on the previous day and was feeling the effects of the gas, arrived on the scene and brought three men into the fresh air. He then proceeded to obtain further assistance and meeting Kristo Kamar, the head Sirdar, at the entrance to the seam directed him to take two coolies who were with him and to do what he could to get the men out. He himself collected twenty more coolies and then returned to the fire area where Kristo Kamar had succeeded in bringing out the three Europeans and six coolies all unconscious. Bhikam and Kristo then proceeded to bring out the remaining coolies, all of whom were badly affected by the gas, and one died. The men rescued had to be brought about 80 yards along narrow roadways into the fresh air and subsequently to the entrance of the mine which was some hundreds of yards away.

Both Bhikam Sirdar and Kristo Kamar behaved with great bravery and but for their action there is no doubt that many lives would have been lost. Both men from their previous day's experience were well aware of the danger they were incurring and of the risk to their own lives. Bhikam Sirdar gallantly started the rescue operations himself and then wisely organised first a small rescue party under Kristo and then a larger body to complete the work. Kristo Kamar was instrumental in saving three Europeans and six natives and continued with the work of rescue until he himself was overcome by the gas.

IMPORTATION OF CARCASES (PRO-HIBITION) (AMENDMENT) ORDER OF 1927.

The Minister of Agriculture and Fisheries by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in him under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 to 1925, and of every other power enabling him in this behalf, hereby orders as follows:—

1. The following article shall be substituted for Article 3 of the Importation of Carcases (Prohibition) (Amendment) Order of 1926 (No. 4):—

Bacon and Ham to be accompanied by Statements as to Curing.

3.—(1) Every side or piece of bacon or ham landed in Great Britain under the provisions of Article 1 (a) of the principal Order shall be marked with a label containing:—

(a) A statement signed and dated by a responsible officer of the Government of the country in which the bacon or ham has been cured, describing fully the process of curing to which it has been subjected, in such a way as to show that the process was one of those mentioned in article 1 hereof; and

(b) The name of the factory where the process of curing has been carried out, and of the locality and country in which

it is situated.

A similar label shall be affixed securely to the outside of the wrapping, crate, box or other container, enclosing each separate

parcel of bacon or ham.

(2) In the case of bacon or ham cured in and brought from Denmark, the Netherlands, Sweden, or any other countries from time to time specified for the purposes of this Order by the Minister of Agriculture and Fisheries (hereinafter called the Minister), it shall be sufficient compliance (except as herein provided) with the requirements of paragraph (1) of this article if every side or piece of such bacon or ham is stamped or branded with an official stamp or brand of a pattern prescribed by regulations of the Government of such country and approved by the Minister:

country and approved by the Minister: Provided that the Minister shall not approve an official stamp or brand under this article unless it includes the official registered number or the name or location of the factory in which the bacon or ham was cured, and unless the Government of such country has given a formal undertaking to him to the effect that the stamp or brand will be affixed only to bacon or ham which has been cured by one of the processes mentioned in article 1 hereof and has been cured in a factory which is under the continuous supervision of a Veterinary Inspector or other responsible officer of the Government of the country.

(3) The Minister may, at any time, withdraw any approval given by him of any stamp or brand, and if he does so, the stamping or branding with such stamp or brand shall cease to be deemed to be a compliance with the requirements of para-

graph (1) of this article.

(4) Nothing in paragraph (2) hereof shall exempt any bacon or ham from the provision of paragraph (1) hereof requiring a label to be affixed securely to the outside of the wrapping, crate, box or other container enclosing each separate parcel of bacon or ham:

Provided that, in cases to which the said paragraph (2) applies, the label to be so affixed shall only be required to contain a statement similar to that contained in the official stamp or brand referred to in para-

graph (2).

(5) The landing in Great Britain of any side or piece of bacon or ham without having such labels as are hereby required or which is not stamped or branded in the manner hereby prescribed, shall be deemed to be the landing of a carcase or part thereof which is prohibited by the principal Order.

#### Commencement.

2. This Order shall come into operation on the first day of April, nineteen hundred and twenty-seven.

Short Title and Construction.

3. This Order may be cited as the Importation of Carcases (Prohibition) (Amendment) Order of 1927.

the coast, thence following the said road via Goginan to the point where it crosses the county boundary; thence following the county boundary in a southerly and then westerly direction to the point where it is intersected at Lampeter by the Great Western Railway line from Llanbyther to Tregaron; thence in a northerly direction along that railway to the point where it is met by the Great Western Railway line from Aberayron; thence in a north-westerly direction along the last mentioned railway line to the point where it crosses the Afon Aeron river north of Llanerch Aeron; thence following that river to the point where it reaches the sea.

FOOT-AND-MOUTH DISEASE (MON-TAGUE STREET (BIRMINGHAM) PIG MARKET) ORDER OF 1927.

The Minister of Agriculture and Fisheries, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in him under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 to 1925, and of every other power enabling him in this behalf, hereby orders as follows:—

#### Market to which this Order applies.

1. The Pig Market at Montague Street in the city of Birmingham, is hereby authorised by the Minister of Agriculture and Fisheries to be used for the purposes of this Order, provided that whilst being so used no animals shall be kept in or moved into the market other than swine moved with a licence under this Order.

#### Movement of Swine to Market.

- 2.—(1) Swine intended for immediate slaughter may, notwithstanding the provisions of any Order made by the Minister restricting the movement of animals into an Infected Area, be moved to the market to which this Order applies with a licence granted by the Local Authority of the city of Birmingham, provided that no such licence shall be granted unless the owner of the swine shall sign and give to the Local Authority an undertaking in the form set out in the Schedule to this Order.
- (2) Swine moved to the market to which this Order applies shall either be moved from the market under and in accordance with the

conditions of a licence granted under Article 3 of this Order within 36 hours of their arrival at the market, or shall be slaughtered at the Montague Street slaughterhouse, Birmingham, immediately after the expiration of 36 hours from the time of their arrival at the market.

#### Removal of Swine from Market.

3. Swine moved to the market to which this Order applies with a licence granted under this Order shall not be moved therefrom except with a licence of an Inspector of the Local Authority of the city of Birmingham or to any place other than a slaughterhouse or bacon factory approved by the Inspector and situate in the area to which the Foot-and-Mouth Disease (Infected Areas) Order of 1927 (No. 17) or any Order amending that Order for the time being applies, provided that no such licence shall be granted unless the owner of the swine shall sign and give to the Local Authority an undertaking in the form set out in the Schedule to this Order, and also provided that no such licence shall be deemed to authorise the movement of any animals out of the said Area.

#### Detention and Slaughter.

4. Swine moved to a slaughterhouse or bacon factory with a licence under this Order, shall be there detained until they are slaughtered, and shall be slaughtered within 36 hours after their arrival.

Undertakings to be Transmitted to Ministry.

5. The undertakings when received by the Local Authority shall be forthwith transmitted to the Ministry of Agriculture and Fisheries.

#### Conditions of Movement.

6. Swine moved under this Order shall be moved by the nearest available route and without unnecessary delay to the place of destination specified in the licence and not elsewhere, and shall so far as practicable be kept separate from all animals which are not being moved or have not been moved with a licence under this Order.

#### Licences.

7. Movement licences granted under this Order shall, unless a shorter period is therein

specified by the Inspector granting the same, be available for six days including the day of the date thereof and no longer.

#### Short Title.

8. This Order may be cited as the FOOT-AND-MOUTH DISEASE (MONTAGUE STREET (BIRMING-HAM) PIG MARKET) ORDER OF 1927, and shall be read with the Foot-and-Mouth Disease (Infected Areas) Order of 1927 (No. 17) and any Order amending that Order.



Notices of Dissolution of Partnership will not be inserted unless signed by the Partners named therein, or by their legal representatives; and the signature or representative character of the signatory must be verified by Statutory Declaration made by a Solicitor of the Supreme Court.

A Notice of Dissolution of Partnership not signed by all the Partners, or their legal representatives, must be accompanied by a Statutory Declaration made by a Solicitor of the Supreme Court to the effect that such notice is given in pursuance of the terms of the partnership to which it relates.

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Advertisements relating to Bills before Parliament will not be inserted unless signed by a Parliamentary Agent or a Solicitor of the Supreme Court.
