## PRESENT,

The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS by an Order in Council bearing date the Twenty-second day of July, 1920, and known as the Tanganyika Order in Council, 1920, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, was pleased to constitute the office of Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Territory of Tanganyika, and amongst other things to provide for the appointment of a Deputy to the said Governor and Commander-in-Chief in the events therein specified, and was further pleased to reserve to Himself, His heirs and successors power, with the advice of His or Their Privy Council, at any time to revoke, alter or amend the said Order:

And whereas it is expedient to make other provisions than in the said recited Order in Council are contained with regard to the powers to be exercised by the Deputy to the said Governor and Commander-in-Chief:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by virtue and in exercise of the powers on that behalf by the Foreign Jurisdiction Act, 1890, or otherwise in His Majesty vested, is pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:—

I. This Order may be cited as "The Tanganyika Order in Council, 1926."

II. Clause (5) of Article 4 of the Tanganyika Order in Council, 1920, is, as from the coming into operation of this Order, hereby revoked, without prejudice to anything lawfully done thereunder, and in place thereof the following clause shall be substituted and take effect:—

" (5) In the event of the Governor having occasion at any time to be temporarily absent for a short period from the seat of Government, or, in the exercise or discharge of any powers or duties conferred or imposed upon him by His Majesty, or through one of His Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, to visit any territories adjacent to or near to the Territory, he may by an instrument under the Public Seal of the Territory appoint the Chief Secretary, or if there be no such officer or such officer is absent or unable to act, then any other person to be his Deputy within any part of the Territory, during such temporary absence and in that capacity to exercise, perform and execute, for and on behalf of the Governor during such absence but no longer, all such powers and authorities vested in the Governor, as shall in and by such instrument be specified and limited, but no others. Every such Deputy shall conform to and observe all such instructions as the Governor shall from time to time address to him for his guidance. Provided nevertheless that by the appointment of a Deputy as aforesaid the power and authority of the Governor shall not be abridged, altered, or in any way affected otherwise than His Majesty may at any time think proper to direct.

III. This Order shall be published in the Official Gazette of the Tanganyika Territory and shall thereupon commence and come into operation.

IV. His Majesty, His heirs and successors, in Council may at any time revoke, alter, or amend this Order.

And the Right Honourable Leopold Stennett Amery, one of His Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, is to give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

## TENDERS FOR TREASURY BILLS.

- 1. The Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury hereby give notice that Tenders will be received at the Chief Cashier's Office, at the Bank of England, on Friday, the 25th February, 1927, at 1 o'clock, for Treasury Bills to be issued under the Treasury Bills Act, 1877, the National Debt Act, 1889, and the War Loan Acts, 1914-1919, to the amount of £40,000,000.
- 2. The Bills will be in amounts of £5,000 or £10,000. They will be dated at the option of the Tenderer on any business day from Monday, the 28th February, 1927, to Saturday, the 5th March, 1927, inclusive, and will be payable at three months after date.
- 3. The Bills will be issued and paid at the Bank of England.
- 4. Each Tender must be for an amount not less than £50,000, and must specify the date on which the Bills required are to be dated, and the net amount per cent. (being an even multiple of one penny) which will be given for the amount applied for. Separate Tenders must be lodged for Bills of different dates.

- Tenders must be made through a London Banker, Discount House or Broker.
- 6. The persons whose Tenders are accepted will be informed of the same not later than the following day, and payment in full of the amounts of the accepted tenders must be made to the Bank of England by means of Cash or a Banker's Draft on the Bank of England not later than 2 o'clock (Saturday 12 o'clock) on the day on which the relative Bills are to be dated.
- 7. In virtue of the provisions of Section 1 (4) of the War Loan Act, 1919, Members of the House of Commons are not precluded from tendering for these Bills.
- 8. Tenders must be made on the printed forms, which may be obtained from the Chief Cashier's Office, Bank of England.
- 9. The Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury reserve the right of rejecting any tenders.

REGULATIONS FOR THE APPOINTMENT BY COM-PETITIVE SELECTION OF INSPECTORS (MALE) UNDER THE MINISTRY OF AGRICULTURE AND FISHERIES FOR THE PURPOSES OF THE AGRICUL-TURAL WAGES (REGULATION) ACT, 1924.

N.B.—These Regulations are liable to alteration from time to time.

1. Application for appointment shall be made in the first instance to the Secretary, Ministry of Agriculture and Fisheries, at such time and in such manner as may be fixed by the Ministry. When a vacancy occurs, the Ministry will cause notice to be given by an advertisement in the Press, which will include a statement of the last day fixed for the receipt of applications.

- 2. A candidate must have attained the age of 30 and must not have attained the age of 45 on the last day fixed for the receipt of applications; provided that in reckoning age for this purpose a candidate who served in the Army, Navy, or Air Force between the 4th August, 1914, and the 11th November, 1918, may deduct from his actual age any period of service between the 4th August, 1914, and the 31st December, 1919.
- 3. A candidate must be a natural-born British subject and the child of a father also a natural-born British subject; provided that exception may be made in the case of candidates serving in a civil situation to which they were admitted with the certificate of the Civil Service Commissioners, and provided that exception may be made as regards the father in the case of candidates who served in His Majesty's Armed Forces during the Great War between the 4th August, 1914, and the 11th November, 1918.
- 4. Until further notice preference will be given to candidates who served in His Majesty's Forces during the War between the 4th August, 1914, and the 11th November, 1918.

No person will be eligible who obtained from any tribunal established under the Military Service Acts, 1916-1918, exemption from service in His Majesty's Forces under those Acts on the ground of a conscientious objection to the undertaking of military service, or, although not so exempted, declined to comply with obligations imposed upon him by those Acts.

5. Persons holding situations in the Civil Service must obtain the permission of the authorities of their Department to apply for appointment.

No person actually serving in the Army, Navy, or Air Force will be eligible for consideration unless he produces, when called upon to do so, the permission of his Commanding Officer to apply for appointment, dated before his appearance before the Selection Board, and given in accordance with such orders as may from time to time be issued.

Persons upon whose training for the occupation of teacher public money has been spent cannot be appointed until the consent of the appropriate education authority has been notified to the Civil Service Commissioners.

- 6. A candidate must satisfy the Ministry that he possesses a good general education, and a sufficient knowledge of agricultural conditions.
- 7. The completed application forms will be scrutinised by the Ministry and selected Candidates will be interviewed by a Board consisting of representatives of the Ministry and of the Civil Service Commissioners. The Board will recommend to the Ministry for appointment to the vacancies existing those Candidates who appear to them to possess the highest qualifications, provided they find so many suitable. In recommending Candidates for appointment the Board will give great weight to personality and especially to tact.

Any attempt on the part of candidates to enlist support for their applications through Members of Parliament or other influential persons will disqualify them for appointment. The Selection Board will disregard spon-

taneous recommendations from persons who are not personally acquainted with the candidate's previous work.

- 8. The necessary number of candidates will be appointed on probation, subject to their satisfying the Civil Service Commissioners that they are eligible for appointment in respect of age, nationality, health and character, and to the payment of a fee of £3 7s. 6d.
- 9. Service as an Inspector will be probationary for a period of two years, and the retention of an officer beyond that date will be conditional on his passing a prescribed examination after the expiry of that period.
- 10. An Inspector after passing the examination is eligible for consideration for appointment to the established staff if and when a vacancy occurs thereon. Appointment to the established staff is conditional on the issue by the Civil Service Commissioners of a Certificate of Qualification; a fee of £3 7s. 6d., being the balance of the prescribed fee of £6 15s., is payable before the Certificate of Qualification can be issued.

5. To empower the directors of the Company to issue so as to be redeemable preference shares or stock and redeemable debenture stock, to make provision with respect to the redemption of such shares or stocks either by a payment in cash or by the issue of other shares or stock (redeemable or otherwise) and to authorise the creation and issue of new shares or stock for any such purpose and the re-issue of any redeemable preference shares or stock or debenture stock after redemption.

6. To make further provision with reference to the Company's affairs, including provisions as to the holding of annual meetings, the notices of meetings, the preparation of the Company's accounts, the appointment of proxies, voting rights (including voting by joint holders), the election, disqualification and powers of the directors, the appointment of managing directors and auditors, and the closing of transfer books, and to empower the directors to pay interim dividends without the sanction or direction of a general meeting.
