

Provided that this Order shall not apply to any prepared foodstuffs which have, in the course of preparation, been boiled for at least one hour.

Interpretation.

2. In this Order "animals" means cattle, sheep, pigs or goats.

Offences.

3. If anything is done, or omitted to be done in contravention of this Order the owner and person in charge of the animals, and the owner and person in charge of any of the above-mentioned articles in respect of which the contravention is committed, and the person causing, directing or permitting the contravention, shall each according to and in respect of his own acts or omissions be deemed guilty of an offence against the Diseases of Animals Act, 1894.

Commencement.

4. This Order shall come into operation on the seventh day of March, nineteen hundred and twenty-seven.

Short Title.

5. This Order may be cited as the FOOT-AND-MOUTH DISEASE (BOILING OF ANIMAL FOODSTUFFS) ORDER OF 1927.

ORDER OF THE MINISTER OF
AGRICULTURE AND FISHERIES.

(DATED 25TH FEBRUARY, 1927.)

The Minister of Agriculture and Fisheries, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in him under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 to 1925, and of every other power enabling him in this behalf, hereby orders as follows:—

*Authorisation of Landing of Animals for
Exceptional Purposes.*

1. The landing of the animals described in the First Schedule hereto, which are intended for exceptional purposes, is hereby allowed subject to the provisions of Part II (Quarantine) of the Third Schedule to the Diseases of Animals Act, 1894, and of the Foreign Animals (Quarantine) Order of 1896, and of this Order.

Definition of Quarantine Station.

2. The premises described in the Second Schedule hereto are hereby defined as a Foreign Animals Quarantine Station for the purpose of the detention of the animals described in the First Schedule hereto.

Examination before Landing.

3. No such animals as aforesaid shall be landed except with a licence granted by an Inspector of the Ministry, which licence shall not be granted unless and until the animals have been examined by a Veterinary Inspector of the Ministry and certified by him to be free from symptoms of contagious disease.

*Regulations Applicable to the Animals on
Landing.*

4. The animals, on being landed, shall forthwith be moved under the supervision of an Inspector of the Ministry of Agriculture and Fisheries from the quay to the premises described in the Second Schedule hereto, and shall be there detained for a period of twenty-eight days. During the said period the animals shall be kept separate from all other animals and no other animals shall be moved into such premises.

PUBLIC HEALTH ACTS AMENDMENT ACT, 1907.

NOTICE is hereby given that by an Order operating on the Seventh day of March, 1927, the Minister of Health has confirmed an Order made on the Thirtieth day of December, 1926, by the Urban District Council of Scunthorpe and Frodingham in pursuance of Section 112 of the Public Health Act, 1875, as amended by Section 51 of the Public Health Act, 1907, declaring the trade of a blood-drier, a tanner, a leather dresser, a fat-melter or fat-extractor, a glue-maker, a size-maker, a gut-scraper, and a rag and bone dealer, within the Urban District of Scunthorpe and Frodingham, to be an offensive trade.
