BOROUGH OF CHESTERFIELD.

NOTICE is hereby given that the Chesterfield Town Council have made the following Byelaws with regard to their Tramways, Trolley Vehicles and Motor Omnibuses, viz.:—

1. Throughout these Byelaws the following expressions shall have the respective meanings hereby assigned to them, namely:—

“The Corporation” means The Mayor, Aldermen and Burgesses of the Borough of Chesterfield, and shall include any Lessees or persons for the time being working the Tramways, Trolley Vehicles and Motor Omnibus systems hereinafter referred to.

“Tramway Undertaking” means The Tramway, The Trolley Vehicles and the Motor Omnibus Systems now or hereafter worked by the Corporation whether situate in the Borough of Chesterfield, the Urban Districts of Bolsover and Clay Cross, the parishes of Brimington, Calow, Duckmanton, Hasland, North Wingfield, Staveley, Temple Normanton, Tupton, Unstone, Wingerworth or Woodthorpe, or in any other district.

“Car” means any carriage, car or motor omnibus owned or used by the Corporation for the conveyance of passengers in connection with their Tramway Undertaking.

“Premises” means any stand, shelter, waiting room or other place or premises used in connection with the Tramway Undertaking.

“Conductor” means any officer or servant of the Corporation having the charge of or helping in the charge of a car.

“Driver” means any officer or servant of the Corporation driving or helping to drive a car.

Application of Byelaws.

2. The Byelaws and Regulations herein set forth shall extend and apply to all cars of the Corporation and over all premises, places or things with respect to which the Corporation have power to make Byelaws.

Special Cars.

3. No male person shall, unless duly authorised by the Corporation, mount or attempt to mount upon any car which is run and reserved by the Corporation for female persons only, and on which a notice to that effect is conspicuously exhibited. In any case in which a car is run and reserved for any special purpose, which shall be indicated by a notice conspicuously exhibited upon such car, no person other than the person or persons for whose conveyance the same car is reserved shall mount or attempt to mount upon such car.

Byelaws to be Exhibited on Cars.

4. There shall be placed and kept placed in a conspicuous position inside of each car in use and upon all premises a printed copy of these Byelaws.

Conductors and Drivers to enforce Byelaws.

5. Every Conductor and Driver shall, to the best of his ability, enforce these Byelaws and prevent the breach thereof.

Power to Remove Passengers Committing Offence.

6. Any person who shall commit, whilst in or on any Car, any breach of these Byelaws and Regulations shall, if the offence is continued, be liable, in addition to incurring the penalty hereinafter provided, to be immediately removed from the Car by or under the direction of the Conductor, and if such person shall have paid his fare he shall not be entitled to claim its return.

Penalty.

7. Any person infringing the foregoing Byelaw No. 3 shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding 40s.

These Byelaws shall come into force on the First day of June, 1927.
