No such animals as aforesaid shall be landed except with a licence granted by an Inspector of the Ministry, which licence shall not be granted unless and until the animals have been examined by a Veterinary Inspector of the Ministry and certified by him to be free from symptoms of contagious disease.

*Regulations Applicable to the Animals on Landing.*

4. The animals, on being landed, shall forthwith be moved under the supervision of an Inspector of the Ministry of Agriculture and



Fisheries from the quay to the premises described in the Second Schedule hereto, and shall be there detained for a period of twenty-eight days. During the said period the animals shall be kept separate from all other animals and no other animals shall be moved into such premises.

*Revocation of Certain Order.*

5. The Order of the Minister (No. 4419) dated 25th February, 1927, authorising the landing of certain animals from the steamship "Umona" is hereby revoked.
