The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

**W**HEREAS Her Majesty Queen Victoria in Council was pleased on the 5th day of May, 1873, to make an Order in Council (in this Order referred to as "the Order of 1873") as to the issue and effect of Commissions in Her Land, Royal Marine and Auxiliary Forces and the forms thereof:

And whereas it is expedient that the said Order should be revoked and that in lieu thereof provision should be made in manner herein-after appearing:

Now, therefore, His Majesty is pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:—

1. For the purposes of Commissions, His Majesty's Military Forces shall be divided into the following forces, each of which is in this Order referred to as a force:—

- (1) The Land Forces; that is to say, the Regular Forces at home and abroad with their reserves, including the Militia;
- (2) The Royal Marines, including their reserves;
- (3) The Territorial Army, including its reserves.

2. Save as hereinafter provided with respect to Commissions in the Royal Army Chaplains' Department, Honorary Commissions and Commissions of officers who at the date of this Order have retired or are not on the active list, there shall be issued—

- (a) to every officer on the active list at the date of this Order in the Land Forces,

the Royal Marines, or the Territorial Army, who has not before the first day of April, 1927, received a Commission in the form numbered 3 in Schedule B to the Order of 1873;

(b) to every officer of any force on first appointment after the date of this Order to commissioned rank in any other force;

(c) to every person on first appointment after the first day of April, 1927, by His Majesty to commissioned rank in the Land Forces, the Royal Marines, or the Territorial Army;

(d) to every officer of the Land Forces not holding commissioned rank in the Regular Forces on appointment after the date of this Order to commissioned rank in the Regular Forces;

a Commission under His Majesty's Royal Sign Manual in the form set out in Part I of the Schedule to this Order.

3. There shall be issued to every person on first appointment by His Majesty to the Royal Army Chaplains' Department, including persons so appointed before the date of this Order who have not before that date received a Commission in that Department, a Commission under His Majesty's Royal Sign Manual in the form set out in Part II of the Schedule to this Order.

4. There shall be issued to every person appointed by His Majesty to an Honorary rank in the Land Forces, the Royal Marines, or the Territorial Army, who does not hold any other Commission, a Commission under His Majesty's Royal Sign Manual in the form set out in Part III of the Schedule to this Order.

5. Where an officer of the Land Forces, the Royal Marines, or the Territorial Army, has

retired or is not on the active list at the date of this Order, but is eligible to be re-employed or is liable to be recalled to service in a national emergency or when a national emergency appears imminent, he shall on re-employment or recall serve on his original Commission as if this Order had not been made :

Provided that such an officer on being so re-employed or recalled shall exercise power of command in such manner and on such occasions as shall be prescribed whatever may be the form of his Commission.

6. Where any officer as aforesaid having retired has, before the date of this Order, been re-employed and the circumstances are such that had the date of the re-employment occurred after the date of this Order he would have served on his original Commission, the last foregoing Article shall apply to him as if his re-employment had occurred after the date of this Order.

7. An officer who at the date of this Order holds a Commission in the form numbered 3 or the form numbered 5 in Schedule B to the Order of 1873, and an officer who receives a Commission in the form set out in Part I or in the form set out in Part II of the Schedule to this Order, shall not receive a further Commission on his future appointment by promotion, exchange, transfer or otherwise in the force to which he belongs, but such appointment, when approved by His Majesty, shall be notified by one of His Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, or, in the case of an officer of the Royal Marines, by the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty, in the London Gazette, or shall be notified in such other manner as may for the time being be prescribed by Order in Council.

8. All Commissions in the form set out in the Schedule to this Order shall be countersigned by two members of the Army Council, or, in the case of the Royal Marines, by two of the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty.

9. (1) This Order may be cited as the Officers' Commissions Order, 1927.

(2) The Order of 1873 is hereby revoked, but such revocation shall not invalidate a Commission issued in either of the forms numbered 3 or 5 in Schedule B, or 9 in Schedule C to that Order, or of any Commission held by an officer who is retired or not on the active list and is re-employed or recalled to service

**P**URSUANT to Section 5 of the County Courts Act, 1903, His Majesty is pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:—

1. The Schedule to the County Courts Order in Council, 1924, shall be amended as follows:—

(i) In Circuit 26, Tunstall is removed from the third column of the said Schedule.

(ii) In Circuit 36, (a) Warwick is removed from the second column of the said Schedule, and (b) Abingdon and Southam are removed from the third column thereof.

(iii) In Circuit 46, (a) Circuit No. 46 is removed from the first column of the said Schedule (b) Horsham is removed from the second column thereof and (c) East Grinstead is removed from the third column thereof.

(iv) In Circuit 59, (a) Falmouth and Truro are removed from the second column of the said Schedule, and (b) St. Austell is removed from the third column thereof.

2. This Order may be cited as the County Courts (Extended Jurisdiction) Order in Council, 1927, and shall come into operation on the 1st day of June, 1927, and the County Courts Order in Council, 1924, shall have effect as amended by this Order.

**W**HEREAS a majority of the whole Council of the Borough of Grantham in the County of Lincoln did on the 7th day of July, 1926, agree to petition, and the Council of the said Borough thereupon petitioned, His Majesty under and in pursuance of the provisions of Section 30 of the Municipal Corporations Act, 1882, as amended by Section 2 of the Municipal Corporations Act, 1893, and extended by the Borough Councillors (Alteration of Number) Act, 1925, for an alteration of the number of Councillors and of the number and boundaries of the Wards of the said Borough:

And whereas His Majesty was pleased by His Order in Council of the 26th day of July, 1926, to refer the said Petition to a Committee of the Lords of His Privy Council:

And whereas His Majesty was pleased by His Order in Council of the 5th day of November, 1926, to alter the number of Councillors of the said Borough of Grantham and to order and direct that henceforth the number of the said Councillors should be eighteen, and further to fix the number of Wards into which the Borough of Grantham should be henceforth divided and to order and direct that the number of the said Wards should be six:

And whereas on the 24th day of November, 1926, the Right Honourable Sir William Joynson-Hicks, Baronet, one of His Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, did appoint Richard Cowdy Maxwell, Esquire, O.B.E., LL.D., Barrister at Law, to be a Commissioner for determining the boundaries of and for apportioning the Councillors among the Wards of the Borough of Grantham:

And whereas the said Commissioner has accordingly prepared the following Scheme, dated the 9th day of March, 1927:—

“ SCHEME for determining the Boundaries of the Wards of the Borough of Grantham in the County of Lincoln and apportioning the Councillors among the said Wards in pursuance of Order in Council of the 5th day of November, 1926; and incidental, consequential, and supplemental provisions.

“ BOROUGH OF GRANTHAM.

“ Boundaries of Wards.

“ I.

“ 1. St. Wulfram's Ward.

“ A line commencing at the intersection of the Borough Boundary with the Great North Road on the North side of the Borough, thence proceeding in a South Easterly direction along the centre of the said road, Gonerby Road, North Parade, North Street, Watergate, to the intersection of Vine Street, thence in an Easterly direction along the centre of Vine Street to the intersection of Swinegate, thence in a Southerly direction along the centre of Elmer Street North to the intersection of Bluegate, thence in an Easterly direction along the centre of Bluegate to the intersection of Castlegate, thence in a Southerly

direction along the centre of Castlegate to the junction of a passage known as Middlemore Yard, thence in an Easterly direction along the centre of Middlemore Yard to the River Witham, thence in a Northerly direction following the centre line of the River Witham to the intersection of the Borough Boundary, and thereafter in a North Westerly and South Westerly direction following the Borough Boundary to the point of commencement aforesaid.

“ 2. St. Peter's Ward.

“ A line commencing at the intersection of High Street with Watergate and Vine Street, thence proceeding in an Easterly direction along the Southern Boundary of St. Wulfram's Ward as hereinbefore defined to the River Witham, thence in a Southerly direction along the centre of the River Witham to the centre of the bridge over the River on Bridge End Road, thence in a Westerly direction along the centre of Bridge End Road to the intersection of London Road, thence in a Northerly direction along the centre of London Road, St. Peter's Hill and High Street to the point of commencement aforesaid.

“ 3. Somerby Ward.

“ A line commencing at the intersection of the Borough Boundary with the River Witham on the North Side of the Borough, thence proceeding in a Southerly direction along the centre of the River to a point in the centre of the bridge over the River on the Bridge End Road, thence in an Easterly and South Easterly direction along the centre of Bridge End Road and Somerby Hill to the intersection of the Borough Boundary and thereafter following the Borough Boundary in a Northerly and North Westerly direction to the point of commencement aforesaid.

“ 4. St. John's Ward.

“ A line commencing at the intersection of the Borough Boundary with Somerby Hill, thence proceeding in a North Westerly, Westerly and Northerly direction along the Southern Boundary of Somerby Ward and the Western Boundary of St. Peter's Ward as hereinbefore defined to the intersection of Wharf Road with London Road, thence in a Westerly direction along the centre of Wharf Road to the intersection of Commercial Road, thence in a Southerly direction along the centre of Commercial Road to the intersection of Launder Terrace, thence in a Westerly direction along the centre of Launder Terrace to the intersection of Station Road, thence in a Southerly direction along the centre of Station Road to a point 140 yards or thereabouts South of the entrance to the Railway Booking Hall, thence by the shortest line in a South Westerly direction across the Station Yard to the extreme Southern end of the up-platform of Grantham Station of the London and North Eastern Railway, thence in a Southerly direction along the centre of the up-line of the London and North Eastern Railway Main Line to a point in the centre of the railway Bridge crossing over Springfield Road, thence in a Westerly direction along the centre of Springfield Road to the intersection of the Borough Boundary, and thereafter following the line of the Borough

Boundary in a South Easterly and North Easterly direction to the point of commencement aforesaid.

“ 5. Spittlegate Ward.

“ A line commencing at the intersection of the Borough Boundary with the Grantham and Nottingham Canal, thence proceeding in a North Easterly and Northerly direction along the centre of the Canal to the intersection with the entrance road of the Wharf Sidings of the London and North Eastern Railway, thence in an Easterly direction along the centre of Old Wharf Road and Wharf Road to the intersection of Commercial Road, thence in a Southerly, Westerly, Southerly, and Westerly direction along the Northern and North Western Boundaries of St. John's Ward as hereinbefore defined to the intersection of the Borough Boundary with Springfield Road, and thereafter following the Borough Boundary in a North Westerly and South Westerly direction to the point of commencement aforesaid.

“ 6. Grange Ward.

“ A line commencing at the intersection of the Borough Boundary with the Grantham and Nottingham Canal, thence proceeding in a Northerly and North Easterly direction along the Borough Boundary to the intersection of the Great North Road, thence in a South Easterly direction along the Western Boundary of St. Wulfram's Ward and of part of St. Peter's Ward, as hereinbefore defined, to the intersection with Wharf Road, thence in a Westerly direction along the Northern Boundary of St. John's Ward, as hereinbefore defined, to the intersection with Commercial Road, and thereafter following the Northern and Western Boundaries of Spittlegate Ward, as hereinbefore defined, to the point of commencement aforesaid.

“ Plan delineating Boundaries.

“ The Boundaries of the Borough Wards as above defined are delineated on the Plan which is annexed hereto and forms part of this Scheme.

“ In case of any discrepancy between the Wards as delineated on the Plan and the textual description of the Wards as above set out, the textual description shall prevail.

### " III.

" Incidental, Consequential, and Supplemental Provisions.

" (1) (a) The election of the six additional Councillors of the Borough shall be held on Friday the eighth day of April, 1927, or such later day as may be fixed by the Secretary of State.

" (b) The number of Councillors to be elected for each Ward shall be the number specified in column two of the Schedule to this Scheme opposite the name of the Ward as given in Column 1 of that Schedule.

" (c) Subject to the provisions of this Scheme the election shall be held in the same manner as elections to fill ordinary vacancies. Provided that in any Ward to which no existing Alderman is in pursuance of this Scheme assigned for the purpose of acting as Returning Officer at the election of Councillors the Mayor shall be the Returning Officer, but he may appoint to act as Returning Officer an Alderman or a Councillor not being a Councillor for that Ward and not being registered as a local government elector in respect of a qualification in that Ward.

" (d) The Councillors elected for each Ward shall come into office immediately after the election and shall go out of office on the ordinary day of election of Councillors in the years specified in Column 3 of the Schedule opposite to the name of the Ward as given in Column 1 of that Schedule. The Councillor elected by the smallest number of votes in the Grange Ward shall go out of office first and the Councillor elected by the next smallest number of votes shall go out of office next.

" (2) The election of the two additional Aldermen made necessary by the increase in the number of Councillors of the Borough shall take place at the next meeting of the Council after the day of the election of the six additional Councillors in pursuance of this Scheme, and the additional Aldermen shall come into office immediately after the election, and of such additional Aldermen the one who is elected by the smallest number of votes shall go out of office on the ordinary day of election of Aldermen in the year 1928 and the other on the ordinary day of election of Aldermen in the year 1931.

" (3) If for any reason it is doubtful which of the Councillors or Aldermen, as the case may be, elected in pursuance of this Scheme ought to retire in the years specified in this Scheme, the question shall be determined at the first or second meeting of the Council after the election by lot under the direction of the Mayor or the person presiding at that meeting.

" (4) The existing Aldermen shall be respectively assigned as Returning Officers until the 9th November, 1927, at elections of Councillors for the following Wards, namely:—

- " 1. Theophilus Rowle—St. Wulfram's Ward.

- " 2. George William Golding—Spittlegate Ward.  
 " 3. Harry Beeden—Grange Ward.  
 " 4. Joe Handley Parker—St. Peter's Ward.

" One of the two additional Aldermen to be elected shall on the day of their election be assigned by the Council as Returning Officer until the 9th November, 1927, to each of the following Wards, namely:—

Somerby Ward, and  
 St. John's Ward.

" (5) If any vacancy exists at the date of the Order in Council approving this Scheme or thereafter occurs amongst the existing Councillors, an election to fill the vacancy shall be held for the Ward to which the Councillor whose death or retirement causes the vacancy has been apportioned by this Scheme.

" (6) If the register of electors is not so framed as to show the local government electors entitled to vote at any election of Councillors of the Borough to be held for any of the Wards constituted by this Scheme it shall be the duty of the Registration Officer for the Parliamentary County of Kesteven and Rutland to make such alteration or re-arrangement of the register as may be necessary for the purpose of such election, and it shall be the duty of the Town Clerk of the Borough to render the Registration Officer such assistance as he may require for the purpose of the alteration or re-arrangement.

WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of the Act of the 7th and 8th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 94, of the Act of the 18th and 14th years of Her said

late Majesty, Chapter 94, and of the Act of the 32nd and 33rd years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 94, duly prepared, and laid before His Majesty in Council, a Scheme or Representation bearing date the 3rd day of February, 1927, in the words and figures following, that is to say:—

“ We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, acting under the provisions of the Act of the 7th and 8th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 94, the Act of the 13th and 14th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 94, and the Act of the 32nd and 33rd years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 94, have prepared, and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council, the following Scheme or Representation for altering the boundaries of the New Parish of Hollinwood, the New Parish of Christ Church, Chadderton, and the New Parish of Emmanuel, Chadderton, all in the County of Lancaster and in the Diocese of Manchester:

“ Whereas by the authority of an Order of His late Majesty King William the Fourth in Council bearing date the 4th day of March, 1835, and published in the London Gazette on the 5th day of May, 1835, parts of the Parochial Chapelry of Oldham, in the Parish of Prestwich, in the said County of Lancaster and at that time in the Diocese of Chester, but now in the said Diocese of Manchester, were assigned as Chapelry Districts to six consecrated Churches, situate in the said Parochial Chapelry of Oldham, and one of such Chapelry Districts was named the Hollinwood District:

“ And whereas by the authority of an Order of Her said late Majesty in Council bearing date the 24th day of March, 1871, and published in the London Gazette on the 28th day of the same month, a Consolidated Chapelry was assigned to the consecrated Church called Christ Church, situate within the limits of the New Parish of Saint John, Chadderton, in the said County of Lancaster and in the said Diocese of Manchester, and such Consolidated Chapelry was named ‘ The Consolidated Chapelry of Christ Church, Chadderton ’:

“ And whereas the said Chapelry District of Hollinwood and the said Consolidated Chapelry of Christ Church, Chadderton, have, under the provisions of the Act of the 19th and 20th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 104, become New Parishes of the character contemplated by that Act, by the Act of the 6th and 7th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 37, and by the above-mentioned Act of the 32nd and 33rd years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 94:

“ And whereas by the authority of an Order of Your Majesty in Council bearing date the 10th day of November, 1911, and published in the London Gazette on the 14th day of the same month, a District Chapelry was assigned to the consecrated Church of Emmanuel, Chadderton, situate in the said New Parish of Christ Church, Chadderton, and such District Chapelry was named ‘ The District Chapelry of Emmanuel, Chadderton ’:

“ And whereas the said District Chapelry of Emmanuel, Chadderton, has also, under the provisions of the above-mentioned Act of the 19th and 20th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 104, become a New Parish of the character contemplated by that Act, by the above-mentioned Act of the 6th and 7th years

of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 37, and by the above-mentioned Act of the 32nd and 33rd years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 94:

“ And whereas it has been represented to us and it appears to us to be expedient that the boundaries of the said New Parish of Hollinwood, of the said New Parish of Christ Church, Chadderton, and of the said New Parish of Emmanuel, Chadderton, should be altered in the manner which is hereinafter mentioned:

“ And we further represent, recommend and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from representing, recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid, or any of them, in accordance with the provisions of the hereinbefore mentioned Acts, or of any of them, or of any other Act of Parliament.

"Whereas at certain extremities of the said Parish of West Derby and of the Parish of Childwall, in the said County and Diocese, which said extremities lie contiguous one to another, and are described in the Schedule hereunder written, there is collected together a population which is situate at a distance from the several churches of such Parishes:

"And whereas it appears to us to be expedient that certain contiguous portions (being the portions containing the population aforesaid) of the said Parish of West Derby and of the said Parish of Childwall should be formed into a Consolidated Chapelry for all Ecclesiastical purposes, and that the same should be assigned to the said Church of Saint John the Evangelist, Knotty Ash, situate as aforesaid:

"Now, therefore, with the consent of the Right Reverend Albert Augustus, Bishop of Liverpool, as such Bishop, and also as the Patron, in right of his See, of the Vicarage of the said Parish of Childwall, and with the consent of the Reverend Percy Stewart, of Polesacre, Crawley, in the County of Sussex, Clerk in Holy Orders, as the Patron of the Rectory of the said Parish of West Derby (in testimony whereof they the said consenting parties have respectively signed and sealed this Representation), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, humbly represent, that it would, in our opinion, be expedient that all those contiguous portions of the said Parish of West Derby and of the said Parish of Childwall which are described in the Schedule hereunder written, all which portions, together with the boundaries thereof, are delineated and set forth on the map or plan hereunto annexed, should be united and formed into one Consolidated Chapelry for the said Church of Saint John the Evangelist, Knotty Ash, situate as aforesaid, and that the same should

be named 'The Consolidated Chapelry of Saint John the Evangelist, Knotty Ash.'

"We, therefore, humbly pray that Your Majesty will be graciously pleased to take the premises into Your Royal consideration, and to make such Order in respect thereto as to Your Majesty in Your Royal Wisdom shall seem meet.

"THE SCHEDULE to which the foregoing Representation has reference.

"The Consolidated Chapelry of Saint John the Evangelist, Knotty Ash, comprising:—

"I. “ Whereas, by an Order of Your Majesty in Council, dated the 7th day of November, 1924, and published in the *London Gazette* on the 11th day of the same month, Your Majesty was pleased to affirm a Scheme prepared by us, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, and certified to Your Majesty in Council for uniting the said Benefices of *Marston Sicca* and *Dorsington* upon the happening of the event in the said Scheme mentioned, that is to say, upon the first avoidance of that one of the Benefices affected by the said Scheme which should last be avoided after the publication in the *London Gazette* of the Order affirming the said Scheme:

“ And whereas it was in the said Scheme provided that upon the taking effect of the union of the said two Benefices of *Marston Sicca* and *Dorsington* the Parsonage House belonging to the said Benefice of *Marston Sicca* should become and be the house of residence for the Incumbent of the United Benefice and further that after the union had taken effect the Patronage of the United Benefice should be exercised by the Patrons of the said two Benefices in alternate turns:

“ And whereas since the publication in the *London Gazette* as aforesaid of the hereinbefore mentioned Order of Your Majesty in Council, Commissioners appointed at our request by the Right Reverend Arthur Cayley, Bishop of Gloucester, pursuant to the provisions of the said Union of Benefices Measure, 1923, to inquire into and report (inter alia) upon the union of the said three Benefices of *Pebworth*, *Marston Sicca*, and *Dorsington*, duly made their Report to the said Bishop of Gloucester and therein recommended the union of the said three Benefices and the terms for effecting the union together with an alteration of boundaries affecting the Parish of the Benefice of *Quinton*, situate in the said County of Gloucester and in the said Diocese of Gloucester, and the said Bishop of Gloucester signified in writing his approval of the said Report:

“ And whereas we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, have prepared this Scheme for the union of the said three Benefices, thereby extending the provisions of the hereinbefore mentioned Order of Your

Majesty in Council by including the said Benefice of *Pebworth* in the union provided for by such Order and for supplementing or amending the provisions of such Order where necessary in consequence of the inclusion of the said Benefice of *Pebworth* as aforesaid which Scheme is based upon the terms recommended in the said Report:

“ And whereas the said Benefice of *Marston Sicca* is now full, the Reverend Constantine Edward Macdonald Read being the present Incumbent thereof and both of the said Benefices of *Pebworth* and *Dorsington* are now vacant:

“ And whereas the Parsonage House of the said Benefice of *Pebworth* has been sold and there is in the hands of the Governors of *Queen Anne's Bounty* a fund representing the net proceeds of such sale and available towards the cost of a new Parsonage House proposed to be provided in the Parish of the said Benefice of *Pebworth*:

“ Now, therefore, we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, with the consent of the said Arthur Cayley, Bishop of Gloucester (in testimony whereof he has signed this Scheme), do humbly recommend and propose to Your Majesty as follows, that is to say:—

“ 1. That the said Benefice of *Pebworth*, the said Benefice of *Marston Sicca*, and the said Benefice of *Dorsington* shall be permanently united together and form one Benefice with Cure of Souls under the style of ‘ The United Benefice of *Pebworth* with *Marston Sicca* and *Dorsington* ’ but the Parishes of the said Benefices shall continue distinct in all respects.

“ 2. That the union of the said three Benefices shall take effect upon the first avoidance of the said Benefice of *Marston Sicca* happening after the date of the publication in the *London Gazette* of any Order of Your Majesty in Council affirming this Scheme.

“ 3. That pending the union of all the said three Benefices as aforesaid and immediately upon the publication in the *London Gazette* of any Order of Your Majesty in Council affirming this Scheme the said two Benefices of *Pebworth* and *Dorsington* shall be united together and form one Benefice with Cure of Souls under the style of ‘ The United Benefice of *Pebworth* with *Dorsington*, ’ but the Parishes of the said Benefices shall continue distinct in all respects.

“ 4. That upon the taking effect of the union of the said two Benefices of *Pebworth* and *Dorsington* as aforesaid, and until such time as a new Parsonage House shall have been provided in the said Parish of *Pebworth* as aforesaid or until the union of all the said three Benefices the Parsonage House at present belonging to the said Benefice of *Dorsington* shall become and be the house of residence for the Incumbent of the United Benefice of *Pebworth* with *Dorsington*.

“ 5. That after the union of the said two Benefices of *Pebworth* and *Dorsington* has taken effect and pending the union of all the said three Benefices as aforesaid, the Patronage of the United Benefice of *Pebworth* with *Dorsington* shall be exercised by the Patrons of the said two Benefices of *Pebworth* and *Dorsington* alternately, the Patron of the said Benefice of *Pebworth* having the right to

collate or present upon the first presentation to be made to the United Benefice after the union.

" 6. That upon the union of all the said three Benefices taking effect a Curate shall be employed to assist the Incumbent in performing the duties of the United Benefice of Peabworth with Marston Sicca and Dorsington.

" 7. That upon the union of all the said three Benefices taking effect the Parsonage House to be provided as aforesaid in the Parish of the said Benefice of Peabworth shall become and be the house of residence for the Incumbent of the United Benefice of Peabworth with Marston Sicca and Dorsington and so soon as conveniently may be the Parsonage House at present belonging to the said Benefice of Marston Sicca and the site and appurtenances thereof and the grounds heretofore usually occupied and enjoyed therewith shall be sold and disposed of by us the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners at such time or times and in such manner in all respects as to us shall seem expedient and that the net proceeds of such sale shall if required and so far as may be required be applied by us towards the repayment of any money borrowed for the purpose of supplementing the funds available for providing a new Parsonage House at Peabworth as aforesaid and any part of such net proceeds not so required or the whole of such net proceeds if no part is so required shall constitute and form part of the Expenses Fund established pursuant to the 32nd Section of the said Union of Benefices Measure, 1923.

" 8. That after the union of all the said three Benefices has taken effect the course and succession in which the respective Patrons shall present or nominate to the United Benefice of Peabworth with Marston Sicca and Dorsington from time to time as the same shall become vacant shall be as follows, that is to say, that in every series of three successive turns of presentation or nomination to be made to the United Benefice after the union, the Patron of the said Benefice of Dorsington shall have the first turn, the Patron of the said Benefice of Marston Sicca shall have the second turn, and the Patron of the said Benefice of Peabworth shall have the third turn.

" 9. That with the consent of the Dean and Chapter of the Cathedral Church of Christ and the Blessed Mary the Virgin at Worcester now Patrons of the said Benefice of Quinton (in testimony whereof they have caused their Common or Chapter Seal to be affixed to this Scheme), and with the consent of the Reverend Gordon Hugh Poole, now Incumbent of the said Benefice of Quinton (in testimony whereof he has signed this Scheme), upon the union of the said three Benefices of Peabworth, Marston Sicca and Dorsington taking effect, the boundaries of the Parishes of the said Benefices of Peabworth, Marston Sicca and Quinton shall be altered, that is to say, all those portions of the said Parishes of Peabworth and Marston Sicca which lie to the east of the middle of the Stratford upon Avon and Honeybourne Branch Line of the Great Western Railway shall be severed from the respective Parishes of which they now form part and shall thereupon and thenceforth be annexed to and form part of the said Parish of Quinton for all ecclesiastical purposes:

" Provided always that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid, or any of them, in accordance with the provisions of the said Measure, or of any other Measure of the National Assembly of the Church of England, or of any Act of Parliament."

And whereas drafts of the said Scheme have been duly published in accordance with the provisions of the said Union of Benefices Measure, 1923, and Notices have been transmitted to the persons or bodies entitled under the same Measure to receive Notice requiring any objections to such draft Scheme to be stated or transmitted in writing to the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners within the time prescribed in the Statutory Rules applicable to proceedings under the said Union of Benefices Measure, 1923:

And whereas certain objections have been so stated or transmitted to the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners:

And whereas the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners after giving full consideration to such objections have deemed right to make no alterations in such draft Scheme:

And whereas public notice of the certification to His Majesty in Council of the said Scheme and the consent thereto in writing of the Bishop of Gloucester has been duly given in the manner and within the time prescribed in the Statutory Rules aforesaid:

And whereas no appeal has been made to His Majesty in Council within the period of one month after the date of the said public notice in accordance with the provisions of the said Measure against the said Scheme or any part thereof by any person who has made objection as aforesaid to the said draft Scheme:

And whereas the said Scheme has been approved by His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to affirm the said Scheme and to order that the Benefices therein recommended to be united shall be united to the extent and for the purposes recommended in the said Scheme, and further to order and direct that the said Scheme and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the date when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Measure.

And His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said Diocese of Gloucester.

“ We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, acting in pursuance of the Union of Benefices Measure, 1923, have prepared, and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council, the following Scheme for effecting the union of the Benefice (being a Rectory) of Lydham, situate partly in the County of Salop and partly in the County of Montgomery, and the Benefice (being a Rectory) of More, situate wholly in the said County of Salop, and both situate in the Diocese of Hereford:

“ Whereas Commissioners appointed at our request by the Right Reverend Martin Linton, Bishop of Hereford, pursuant to the provisions of the said Union of Benefices Measure, 1923, to inquire into and report upon the union of the said two Benefices of Lydham and More, duly made their Report to the said Bishop of Hereford and therein recommended the union of the said two Benefices, and the terms for effecting the union, and the said Bishop of Hereford signified in writing his approval of the said Report:

“ And whereas we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, have prepared this Scheme for the union of the said two Benefices based upon the terms recommended in the said Report:

“ And whereas the said Benefice of Lydham is now full, the Reverend Alexander Hawken being the present Incumbent thereof, and the said Benefice of More is at present vacant:

“ Now, therefore, we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, with the consent of the said Martin Linton, Bishop of Hereford (in testimony whereof he has signed this Scheme), do humbly recommend and propose to Your Majesty as follows, that is to say:—

“ 1. That the said Benefice of Lydham and the said Benefice of More shall be permanently united together and form one Benefice with Cure of Souls under the style of ‘ The United Benefice of More and Lydham ’ but the Parishes of the said Benefices shall continue distinct in all respects.

And whereas public notice of the certification to His Majesty in Council of the said Scheme and the consent thereto in writing of the Bishop of Hereford has been duly given in the manner and within the time prescribed in the Statutory Rules aforesaid:

And whereas no person who has made objection as aforesaid to the said draft Scheme has proceeded with an appeal to His Majesty in Council against the said Scheme or any part thereof:

And whereas the said Scheme has been approved by His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to affirm the said Scheme and to order that the Benefices therein recommended to be united shall be united to the extent and for the purposes recommended in the said Scheme and further to order and direct that the said Scheme and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the date when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Measure.

And His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said Diocese of Hereford.

The net annual value of the Benefice of Egton is Three hundred

pounds and the Patronage thereof is vested in the said Archbishop of York and the present Vicar is the Reverend Charles Henry Steel, Clerk, Master of Arts.

" 2. That there is also within the same County and Diocese the Vicarage of Goathland adjoining the said Vicarage of Egton the boundaries of which are well known and defined and the parish whereof contains an estimated population of Five hundred and ninety-one persons. The net annual value of the Benefice of Goathland is Two hundred and eighty pounds and the Patronage thereof is vested in the said Archbishop of York and the present Vicar is the Reverend Harold Arthur Floud, Master of Arts.

" 3. That there is also within the same County and Diocese the Vicarage of Glaisdale the boundaries whereof are well known and defined the parish whereof contains an estimated population of One thousand one hundred and fourteen persons. The net annual value of the Benefice of Glaisdale is Two hundred and thirty-three pounds and the Patronage thereof is vested in the said Archbishop of York and the present Vicar is the Reverend William Winning.

" 4. That the said Reverend Charles Henry Steel, Harold Arthur Floud and William Winning are as Vicars of the said respective Benefices consenting parties to the separation, re-arrangement and annexation hereinafter proposed.

" 5. That it appears to the said Archbishop that under the provisions of the said Act of Parliament and of an Act passed in the 2nd and 3rd years of the reign of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 49, the boundaries of the said parishes of Egton, Goathland and Glaisdale may advantageously be re-arranged, such re-arrangement being in the opinion of the said Archbishop desirable owing to the fact that the portions of the parishes hereinafter referred to are in every case nearer to the Parish Church of the Parish to which it is proposed to annex the same than to the Parish Church of the Parish to which they now belong and that the said alteration will be for the convenience of the inhabitants of such portions.

" 6. That pursuant to the directions contained in the said first mentioned Act of Parliament the said Archbishop has prepared a Scheme in writing appended to this Report describing the mode in which it appears to him the said alterations and re-arrangement of the boundaries of the said Parishes may be best effected and how the changes consequent thereupon in respect of Ecclesiastical jurisdiction, glebe-lands, tithe rent charges and other Ecclesiastical dues, rates and payments and in respect of the Patronage may be made with justice to all parties concerned. And the said Archbishop being on full consideration and inquiry satisfied with such scheme he doth by this Report to Your Majesty in Council certify the same to Your Majesty in Council with the consents in writing to the said Scheme of the said Archbishop as Patron of the said Benefices of Egton, Goathland and Glaisdale and of the Incumbents thereof to the intent that Your Majesty in Council in case it should be thought expedient and proper so to do may make an Order for carrying such scheme into effect.

" 1. The separation of that part of the Parish of Egton which is edged round with a green verge line on the plan attached hereto from the said Parish of Egton and the annexation of the same to the said Parish of Glaisdale.

" 2. The separation of that portion of the Parish of Egton which is edged round with a yellow verge line on the said plan from the said Parish of Egton and the annexation of the same to the said Parish of Goathland.

" 3. That the Incumbents of the said Parishes of Glaisdale and Goathland respectively shall have sole and exclusive charge of souls within the limits of those portions of the Parish of Egton which are respectively transferred to them.

" 6. That no alteration shall be made in the Patronage of any of the Benefices affected by this Scheme.

**PUBLIC HEALTH (IMPORTED FOOD) REGULATIONS, 1925.**

The Minister of Health gives notice, in pursuance of the above-named Regulations, that he hereby recognises for the purposes of items (a) and (c) of the Second Schedule to the Regulations, *i.e.*:—

(a) A severed part of the carcase of a pig (including the severed head and the whole carcase without the head) which has not been salted, cured, pickled, dried or smoked or otherwise prepared in the manner in which bacon or ham is ordinarily prepared, and from which no submaxillary, pre-scapular, pre-cruial, or popliteal gland has been taken out;

(c) All edible parts of a pig other than (i) the head or other severed parts of the carcase and (ii) the intestines prepared in the form of sausage casings;

each of the Official Certificates of which particulars are given in the Schedule hereto as evidence that the meat to which it relates has been derived from an animal which was free from disease at the time of slaughter and has been dressed or prepared and packed with all necessary precautions for the prevention of danger to public health.

The recognition applies only if the label is securely affixed to the meat or to the package containing the meat and if the label has not in any other circumstances or on any other occasion been used as an Official Certificate.

The label hereby recognised as an Official Certificate for meat imported from the Argentine Republic is in substitution for the mark or stamp of which particulars were given in Part I of the First Schedule to the Notice published in the London Gazette of 22nd May, 1925.

ORDER OF THE MINISTER OF  
AGRICULTURE AND FISHERIES.

(DATED 18TH MARCH, 1927.)

KINROSS-SHIRE (CONTROL OF DOGS)  
ORDER OF 1927.

The Minister of Agriculture and Fisheries,  
by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested  
in him under the Diseases of Animals Acts,

1894 to 1925, and of every other power  
enabling him in this behalf, hereby orders as  
follows:—

*Power to make Regulations.*

1.—(1) The Local Authority of the District  
specified in the Schedule to this Order may,  
in accordance with the provisions of this Order,  
make Regulations, with a view to the pre-  
vention of worrying of cattle (including sheep)  
for requiring that dogs or any class of dogs  
shall, during all or any of the hours between

sunset and sunrise, be kept by the owners thereof under control in manner prescribed by the Regulations.

(2) The Regulations may apply to the whole or any part of the District, and may exempt any class of dogs either generally or under prescribed conditions.

#### *Confirmation of Regulations.*

2.—(1) Regulations made under this Order shall not take effect unless and until they have been submitted to and confirmed by the Minister of Agriculture and Fisheries.

(2) A copy of any Regulations made by the Local Authority under this Order, signed and certified by the Clerk of that Local Authority to be a true copy and to have been duly confirmed shall be evidence, until the contrary is proved, in all legal proceedings, of the due making, confirmation and existence of the Regulations, without further or other proof.

#### *Seizure of Dogs where Regulations are contravened.*

3. Any dog in respect of which an offence is being committed against a Regulation made under this Order may be seized and treated as a stray dog under the powers conferred by Section three of the Dogs Act, 1906.

#### *Extension of Definition in Diseases of Animals Act, 1894.*

4. Dogs shall be animals for the purposes of the following sections of the Diseases of Animals Act, 1894 (namely):—

Section forty-three (powers of police);

Section forty-four (powers of inspectors);

and also for the purposes of all other sections of the said Act containing provisions relative to or consequent on the provisions of those sections and this Order, including such sections as relate to offences and legal proceedings.

#### *Local Authority to enforce Order.*

5. The provisions of this Order shall be executed and enforced by the Local Authority.

#### *Short Title.*

6. This Order may be cited as the KINROSS-SHIRE (CONTROL OF DOGS) ORDER OF 1927.

## CLACTON ELECTRICITY (EXTENSION).

## SHEEP SCAB MOVEMENT AREAS.

The following Areas are now "Movement Areas" for the purposes of Part I of the Sheep (Double Dipping) Order of 1920 :—

**Inverness.**—(1) An Area comprising the islands known as the Outer Hebrides (*except the islands of St. Kilda, Dune, Soay and Boreray*), in the county of Inverness.

(2) An Area in the county of Inverness comprising the islands known as Skye or Inner Hebrides.

**Ross and Cromarty.**—An Area comprising the island of Lewis, including the smaller islands adjacent thereto, in the county of Ross and Cromarty.

An Area comprising :—

*In the administrative county of Derby.*

The parishes of Hope Woodlands, Derwent, Edale, Dore and Totley, and such parts of the parishes of Charlesworth, Hayfield, Chapel-en-le-Frith, Peak Forest, Castleton, Aston, Thornhill, Bamford, Outseats and Hathersage, as lie to the south, east and north of the following boundary, namely :—

Commencing at the point of intersection of the boundaries of Cheshire, Derbyshire and Yorkshire, near Saltersbrook Bridge, then in a westerly direction along the county boundary of Cheshire and Derby to Crowden Station, thence along the road via Torside, and the Devils Elbow to the point where it reaches the boundary of the borough of Glossop, thence along the eastern boundary of the said boundary, to the point where it meets the main road to Hayfield, thence in a southerly direction along that road via the Grouse Inn to Hayfield, thence continuing in a generally south-easterly direction via Chinley Head and Bole Hill to Chapel-en-le-Frith, thence in an easterly direction along the road via Laneside to the Inn at Sparrowpit, thence along the road via Perryfoot, Oxlow House and the Winnats to Castleton, thence in an easterly and south-easterly direction along the main road via Hope to Hathersage, thence by the road under the Railway from Hathersage to Grindleford, west of Hathersage Station, to Grindleford Bridge, thence in a north-easterly direction along the road from Grindleford Bridge to Sheffield, to the point where it meets the western boundary of the parish of Totley, near Fox House Inn, thence in a northerly direction along the western boundaries of the parishes of Totley and Dore, to the county boundary, thence in a generally north-easterly and northerly direction to the point of commencement.

*In the county of the West Riding of Yorkshire.*

The parish of Bradfield; so much of the parish of Langsett as lies to the south and west of the road from Sheffield via Langsett and Crow Edge to Hepworth, and such part of the city and county borough of Sheffield as lies to the west of the following boundary, namely :—

Commencing at the county boundary near Ringinglow, thence via Ringinglow, Andwell

Lane, Blackbrook Road, Rails Road, Bingley Lane and Hopwood Lane to the city boundary.

An Area comprising :—

*In the county of Lancaster.*

So much of the parishes of Bowland Forest Higher Division, Bowland Forest Lower Division, Easington, Slaidburn, Newton, Bentham, Clapham-cum-Newby, Austwick, Lawkland, Giggleswick, Rathmell, Wigglesworth, Gisburn Forest, Tosside, Bolton-by-Bowland, Sawley, Grindleton, West Bradford, Waddington, Bashall Eaves and Great Mitton as lies within the following boundary, namely :—

Commencing at a point where the London Midland and Scottish Railway from Lancaster to Long Preston crosses the county boundary near High Bentham, thence south-easterly along that railway to the point where it intersects the road from Settle to Rathmell, thence in a southerly direction along that road via Rathmell, Wigglesworth, Becks Brow Bottom, Pikeber, Mere Sike, Flass Gate, Forest Becks, Holden, Bolton Peel, and Bow Lathe to Sawley; thence continuing in a south westerly direction along the road from Sawley via

## An Area comprising:—

So much of the county of Westmorland as is comprised within the following boundary, namely:—

Commencing at a point in the parish of Shap Urban where the railway runs underneath the road from Hackthorpe to Shap, thence northerly along the said railway to a point where it meets the stonewall from the Sweet-holme Buildings, thence in the direction of the stonewall through the said buildings to the point where it meets the Sweetholme road below Wilson Scar, thence along that road to its junction with the Shap-Bampton road; thence through the village of Rosgill, following the road west of the River Lowther to Bomby, Bampton, Helton and Askham, and continuing along the road as far as Pooley Bridge; thence along the eastern edge of Ullswater Lake to Sandwick and Patterdale, thence following the Kirkstone Pass as far as the Kirkstone Inn; thence taking the Troutbeck road and keeping to the road which meets the main Windermere-Kendal road at Ings; thence in an easterly direction along the main road through Staveley to the point where the railway crosses the said main road, and then along the railway to Burneside; thence following in a north-easterly direction the road to Garnett Bridge and Watchgate, thence taking the main Kendal-Shap road as far as High Borrow Bridge, and from that point going east along Borrow Beck to the point where it touches the railway at Low Borrow Bridge, thence northerly along the said railway via Tebay and Shap to the point of commencement.
