PRESENT,

The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS it is enacted by the Juries Act, 1922 (hereinafter referred to as "the Act of 1922"), that provision may be made by Order in Council—

(a) for prescribing the manner in which overseers are to furnish to the registration officers particulars of persons qualified and liable to serve as jurors or qualified to serve as special jurors:

(b) for authorizing the sheriff to require information to be furnished to him in writing or otherwise by persons summoned to attend on juries with respect to their sex and their professions, callings or businesses, and for imposing on persons who fail to furnish the required information or who furnish false information a penalty to be recovered on summary conviction not exceeding five pounds in respect of any one offence:

(c) for making such adaptations in any enactments as are necessary for giving full effect to the said Act:

(d) otherwise for carrying that Act into effect:

And whereas provision was made with respect to the matters aforesaid by the Juries Order, 1923:

And whereas by the Economy Provisions (Adaptation of Enactments) Order, 1927, such adaptations were made in the provisions of the Act of 1922 as were necessary to make those provisions conform with the provisions of the Representation of the People (Economy Provisions) Act, 1926:

And whereas the powers and duties of overseers under the enactments relating to the preparation of the jurors book were by Article 3 of the Overseers Order, 1927, transferred to the rating authority, and it is further provided by the said Article that in certain cases the rating authority shall designate one or more of their officers to perform the said duties and that the officer or officers so designated shall, while the designation continues in force perform the said duties:

And whereas it is expedient, by reason of the changes aforesaid, that the Juries Order, 1923, should be revoked and that this Order should have effect in lieu thereof:—

Now, therefore, His Majesty, in pursuance of the powers conferred upon Him by the Act of 1922, and of all other powers enabling Him in that behalf, is pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:—

1. The name of any person appearing in the electors lists for the register of electors for any year who is qualified and liable to serve as a juror shall be marked with the letter "J" and the name of any person so appearing who is qualified to serve as a special juror shall be

marked with the letters " SJ " in manner following, that is to say :—

The said letter or letters shall (subject to any variation authorized by the Secretary of State in any particular case) be printed in heavy type and inserted in column (3) of the register, immediately after the names of the juror concerned, as in the following example :—

Whitehead, Albert Stanley—J.

Longmore, William—SJ.

2.—(1) The particulars to be furnished by the rating authority to the registration officer under subsection (3) of section 1 of the Act of 1922 shall be furnished in the following manner, that is to say, the rating authority shall, as the registration officer may require,—

(a) furnish the registration officer with a list of all the persons in each parish, or where a parish consists of more than one registration unit, in each registration unit in the parish, who are qualified and liable to serve as jurors, showing in the case of each person the address of his qualifying premises in the parish and the value of those premises for the purposes of assessment to the poor rate and his occupation, and whether that person is qualified to serve as a special juror:

(b) insert in copies of the electors lists and lists of claimants, if any, the marks required by this Order to be inserted in the electors lists for the register of electors against the names of the persons in those lists who are qualified and liable to serve as jurors, or qualified to serve as special jurors, as the case may be, and to transmit to the registration officer the copies so marked.

(2) If the registration officer, for the purpose of his duties under the Act of 1922, requires any particulars in addition to those provided in manner aforesaid he may send to the rating authority a demand for further information on Form C of heading I of Schedule I to the Representation of the People Order or on a form similar thereto and the authority shall complete and return the form.

(3) Where the duties of a rating authority in relation to the preparation of the jurors book are to be performed by a designated officer, this Article shall have effect as though for references therein to the rating authority there were substituted references to the designated officer.

3. Where an application is made to the registration officer by any person marked as a juror to have the mark placed against his name removed, notification by the registration officer of his decision under subsection (5) of section one of the Act of 1922, shall be given to that person on or before the fifteenth day of September in any year.

4.—(1) If, where the registration officer under paragraph 21 of the First Schedule to the Representation of the People Act, 1918, allows a claim made by any person to be registered as a voter, the registration officer considers that person to be qualified and liable to serve as a juror, he shall give that person notice that he will be marked as a juror unless within five clear days thereafter he gives notice of objection to the registration officer,

and in any case in which the registration officer is of opinion that any person who has made a claim to be registered as a voter would, if so registered, be qualified and liable to serve as a juror, he shall include in any notice issued under the said paragraph as to the time and place at which the claim of that person to be so registered will be considered, a notice that if the claim is allowed that person will be marked as a juror unless he gives notice of objection to being so marked in manner aforesaid.

(2) The decision of the registration officer on any objection made by any person under this Article shall be notified on or before the fifteenth day of September in any year.

(3) If any person is aggrieved by the decision of the registration officer on any such objection or by his failure to notify his decision, he may apply to a court of summary jurisdiction under subsection (5) of section 1 of the Act of 1922, in the same manner as if the registration officer had refused to comply with an application made to him under subsection (4) of the said section or had failed to notify his decision thereon.

5. Subsection (2) of section two of the Act of 1922 shall have effect as if the reference therein to persons marked in the electors lists as jurors or special jurors included a reference to persons whose names are on the list of claimants and who receive notice in accordance with Article 4 (1) of this Order that they will be marked as jurors.

6.—(1) Any sheriff by whom a jury summons is issued may require the person to whom the summons is issued to furnish to him in writing information with respect to his sex, profession, calling or business.

(2) If any person required by a sheriff to furnish information in pursuance of this Article fails to furnish in writing to the sheriff the required information within three days after the date on which the jury summons is received by him, or furnishes false information, he shall be liable on summary conviction in respect of each offence to a penalty not exceeding five pounds.

(3) Where a sheriff requires information to be furnished in pursuance of this Article, he shall for the purposes of facilitating the furnishing of the information enclose with the jury summons an officially-stamped postcard on which the information may be given.

7.—(1) This Order may be cited as the Juries Order, 1927.

(2) The Juries Order, 1923 is hereby revoked.

WHEREAS in pursuance of the powers conferred upon Him by the Air Navigation Act, 1920, His Majesty, in Council, was pleased to make the Air Navigation (Consolidation) Order, 1923, and the Air Navigation (Amendment) Order, 1925, amending the said Order:

And whereas it is expedient that the first-mentioned Order as so amended (hereinafter referred to as "the principal Order") should be further amended in manner hereinafter appearing:

And whereas the provisions of the Rules Publication Act, 1893, have been complied with:

Now, therefore, His Majesty is pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:—

1. The following paragraph shall be inserted at the end of Article nine of the principal Order:

"(4) A person shall not commit any act, whether by interference with the pilot or a member of the operative crew, or by tampering with the aircraft or its equipment, or by disorderly conduct, or by any other means, likely to imperil the safety of any aircraft, its passengers, or crew."

2. At the end of the second paragraph of sub-section (2) of Article 31, the following proviso shall be inserted:—

"Provided that for the purpose of determining whether a pilot is required to hold a licence to fly aircraft carrying passengers or goods for hire or reward, a member of an aeroplane club carried in an aircraft belonging to the club for the purposes of instruction or otherwise shall not, if the pilot is also a member of the same club, be deemed to be a passenger carried for hire or reward, notwithstanding that payment is made in respect of such instruction or carriage."

3. The following amendments shall be made in the First Schedule to the principal Order:—

(1) In paragraph 8, after the word "car" there shall be inserted the words "or basket";

(2) In sub-paragraph 9 (a), after the word "nacelle" there shall be inserted the word "instead".

4. The following amendments shall be made in the Fourth Schedule to the principal Order:—

(1) In the Sketch plan of lights on the aircraft, in Section I, for the words "through line of flight" there shall be substituted the words "of symmetry";

(2) In paragraph 1 of Section I, for the words from "which may be mistaken" to the end of the paragraph there shall be substituted the words "shall be exhibited" which may be mistaken for the navigation "lights hereinafter prescribed. The latter shall not be dazzling."

(3) In paragraph 2 of Section I, the words "of such a character as to be" shall be omitted wherever they occur; and for the words "bisected by a vertical plane through the line of flight" in both places where those words occur, there shall be substituted the words "bisected by the vertical plane of symmetry of the aircraft";

(4) In paragraph 7 of Section I, for the word "car", there shall be substituted the word "basket";

(5) In paragraph 8 of Section I, for the words "6 feet" where those words firstly

occur, there shall be substituted the words "12 feet"; and for the words "carry in" the same position as the group of lights "aforesaid, and in lieu thereof", there shall be substituted the words "have" attached to it, at intervals of not more than 300 feet measured from the "basket";

(6) In paragraph 9 of Section I, for the words "at sea" there shall be substituted the words "on the water";

(7) In sub-paragraph (a) of paragraph 14 of Section II, for the words from "light or" to the end of the sub-paragraph, there shall be substituted the words "light or flash" intermittently a lamp or a projector other than the navigation lights. In addition, "it shall make by international Morse Code, by means of sound or luminous signals, the two-letter group constituted by its nationality letter and the last letter of its registration mark";

(8) For paragraph 21 of Section III, there shall be substituted the following paragraph:—

"21. Subject to the provisions of paragraph 43 of this Schedule, flying machines shall always give way to balloons, fixed or free, and to airships, and airships shall always give way to balloons, whether fixed or free";

(9) In paragraph 40 of Section V, for the words "landing tee" there shall be substituted the words "landing T"; and at the end of the paragraph there shall be inserted:—

"In the event of there being no wind, a ball, easily visible, shall be hoisted on a mast, and if there is a landing T it shall be fixed";

(10) In paragraph 41 of Section V, at the end, there shall be inserted the words "or in the event of there being no wind. In the latter case, every flying machine, when taking off or landing, shall do so in the direction indicated by an appropriate signal, or, if there is a landing T, in the direction indicated by that T";

(11) For paragraph 43 of Section V, there shall be substituted the following paragraph:—

"43. Aircraft about to land on an aerodrome shall be given free way";

(12) For paragraph 45 of Section V, there shall be substituted the following paragraphs:—

"44.—(1) At every aerodrome, along the perimeter and at the approaches to the hangars, a neutral zone shall be set apart for flying machines manœuvring on the ground.

"(2) The part reserved for departures and landings shall be as large as possible.

"(3) Every flying machine when landing or taking off, shall do so in conformity with the provisions of paragraph 41 of this Schedule, and shall leave clear on its left any flying machine which has already landed or which is at rest on the ground.

"(4) Every flying machine when

" running along the ground in the zone reserved for departures and landings, shall do so in the direction of landing: Provided that, on aerodromes approved by the Secretary of State for the purpose, flying machines running along the ground may be authorised to cross the part reserved for departures and landings subject to regulations approved by the Secretary of State.

" 45.—(1) By way of exception to the general rule laid down in sub-paragraph (3) of paragraph 44 of this Schedule, at aerodromes to which this paragraph applies, the part reserved for departures and landings may be regarded as divided into two approximately equal zones, by a vertical plane bearing in the direction of landing described in paragraph 41 of this Schedule. For an observer facing in the direction of landing, the zone on the right shall be reserved for landings, and the zone on the left for departures.

" (2) The aerodromes to which this paragraph applies shall be indicated by a full, white star of five points, placed flat on the ground in the centre of the part of the ground reserved for departures and landings. The lines joining the points of the star shall form a regular pentagon of such a size that it may be inscribed in a circle the diameter of which is not less than 15 yards.

" (3) At aerodromes to which this paragraph applies a flying machine when landing shall do so in conformity with paragraph 41 of this Schedule, in the left part of the zone reserved for that purpose, but leaving clear on its left any other flying machine which has already landed, and a flying machine when taking off shall do so in conformity with paragraph 41 of this Schedule, in the left part of the zone reserved for that purpose, but leaving clear on its left any other flying machines which are at rest on the ground.

" 46. At every aerodrome while night landings thereat are expected, the following requirements shall be complied with:—

" (1) The aerodrome shall be defined as accurately as possible by red lights placed on the perimeter and on any obstacles on the aerodrome;

" (2) The direction of landing shall as far as possible be indicated by a luminous T, or failing this by three white lights forming an isosceles triangle, the base of which shall be about 200 yards long, and the height of which shall be at least twice as long as the base;

" (3) The white lights aforesaid shall be so placed that a flying machine will land in the direction leading from the middle of the base line to the apex of the triangle;

" (4) The base line shall indicate the place where a flying machine should come into contact with the ground, and the apex shall indicate the point

" before reaching which it should come to rest";

(13) For paragraph 48 of Section V, there shall be substituted the following paragraph:—

" 48. Suitable signals shall be placed on all obstacles on aerodromes, and also as far as possible on fixed obstacles dangerous to flying within a zone of 500 yards of all aerodromes."

(14) In paragraph 49 of Section VI, for the words " shall carry " there shall be substituted the words " shall only carry."

5. In paragraph 1 of the Fifth Schedule to the principal Order, at the beginning there shall be inserted the words " Save as provided by Article 3 and Article 4 of this Order."

6. This Order may be cited as the Air Navigation (Amendment) Order, 1927.

And whereas by certain Orders in Council fees to be taken by Consular Officers have been fixed:

And whereas it is expedient to make alterations in certain fees and to create certain new fees:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, in pursuance of the before-mentioned Act, is pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:—

I. This Order may be cited as the Consular Fees (Amendment) Order in Council, 1927.

II. Fee No. 14 is hereby abolished and the following fee substituted therefor:

III. The following fee is hereby created:

" 28A. For ordinary periodical survey of a cargo or passenger vessel:—

"The amount of the fee leviable under (a) or (b) shall not exceed £100.

"For special survey of a cargo or passenger vessel, the fee chargeable shall be in accordance with the nature and extent of the services rendered.

"The above fees include the granting or renewal of a certificate of seaworthiness or a passenger certificate, but do not include overtime charges (*see* Fees Nos. 96 and 97) or travelling expenses."

5. Tenders must be made through a London Banker, Discount House or Broker.

6. The persons whose Tenders are accepted will be informed of the same not later than the following day, and payment in full of the amounts of the accepted tenders must be made to the Bank of England by means of Cash or a Banker's Draft on the Bank of England not later than 2 o'clock (Saturday 12 o'clock) on the day on which the relative Bills are to be dated.

7. In virtue of the provisions of Section 1 (4) of the War Loan Act, 1919, Members of the House of Commons are not precluded from tendering for these Bills.

FUR TRADE BOARD (GREAT BRITAIN).

PROPOSAL TO VARY MINIMUM RATES OF WAGES FOR CERTAIN CLASSES OF WORKERS AND TO FIX CERTAIN ADDITIONAL GENERAL MINIMUM PIECE RATES.

In accordance with Regulations made under Section 18 of the Trade Boards Act, 1909, by the Minister of Labour, and dated 31st October, 1918, 1st August, 1922, and 1st April, 1926, respectively, the Fur Trade Board (Great Britain) HEREBY GIVE NOTICE that they PROPOSE TO VARY the General Minimum Time Rates (and the Overtime Rates based thereon) for Male and Female Indentured Apprentices in the Cutting and Nailing Branch of the Furriers' Section of the Trade and the General Minimum Time Rates (and the Overtime Rates based thereon) for "Fur Sorters" and for "Tubbers," as set out in the Trade Board's Notice Z.(17) dated 29th December, 1924, and TO FIX additional General Minimum Piece Rates for Male and Female Workers for Beam Work, Hand Fleshing, Machine Fleshing, Pulling Over and Tubbing.

Particulars of the Minimum Rates proposed may be obtained on application to the Secretary of the Trade Board.

Under Section 3 (5) of the Trade Boards Act, 1918, the Trade Board will CONSIDER ANY OBJECTIONS to the above Proposal to Vary and Fix which may be lodged with them within two months from the 25th day of

MERCHANDISE MARKS ACT, 1926.

In accordance with the provisions of Sub-section 4 of Section 2 of the Merchandise Marks Act, 1926, the Board of Trade give notice that, in pursuance of applications received by them for the making of Orders in Council to require imported goods of certain classes and descriptions to bear an indication of origin, they have made a reference to the Standing Committee appointed by them under the Act in respect of the following classes and descriptions of goods:—

(1) (a) The following descriptions of steel:—
