# MERCHANT SHIPPING. FEES.

THE MERCHANT SHIPPING (FEES) AMENDMENT ORDER, 1927, DATED APRIL 4, 1927, MADE BY THE BOARD OF TRADE UNDER THE MERCHANT SHIPPING ACT, 1894 (57 & 58 VIOT. C. 60), AS AMENDED BY THE FEES (INCREASE) ACT, 1923 (13 GEO. 5. C. 4).

1. In pursuance of the powers conferred on the Board of Trade by the Merchant Shipping Act, 1894 (57 & 58 Vict. c. 60) as amended by the Fees (Increase) Act, 1923 (13 Geo. 5. c. 4), and the Economy (Miscellaneous Provisions) Act, 1926 (16 & 17 Geo. 5. c. 9), and of any other power in that behalf, the Board hereby direct that the fees specified in the Schedule to the Merchant Shipping (Fees) Order, 1924, (a) as amended by the Merchant Shipping (Fees) Amendment Order, 1926, (b) except those specified in parts 16, 19 and 20 of the said Schedule shall be reduced by 8\frac{1}{2} per cent.

2. This Order may be cited as the Merchant Shipping (Fees) Amendment Order, 1927, and shall take effect as from the 1st day of April, 1927.

Commencing at a point where the London Midland and Scottish Railway from Lancaster to Long Preston crosses the county boundary near High Bentham, thence south-easterly along that railway to the point where it intersects the road from Settle to Rathmell, thence in a southerly direction along that road via Rathmell, Wigglesworth, Becks Brow Bottom, Pikeber, Mere Sike, Flass Gate, Forest Becks, Holden, Bolton Peel, and Bow Lathe to Sawley; thence continuing in a south westerly direction along the road from Sawley via
