Westminster, 12th April, 1927.

This day, the Lords being met, a message was sent to the Honourable House of Commons by the Gentleman Usher of the Black Rod, acquainting them that *The Lords, authorized by virtue of a Commission under the Great Seal, signed by His Majesty, for declaring His Royal Assent to the Acts agreed upon by both Houses, do desire the immediate attendance of the Honourable House in the House of Peers to hear the Commission read; and the Commons being come thither, the said Commission, empowering the Lord Archbishop of Canterbury, and several other Lords therein named, to declare and notify the Royal Assent to the said Acts, was read accordingly, and the Royal Assent given to:—*

- Royal and Parliamentary Titles Act, 1927.
- Sale of Food and Drugs Act, 1927.
- Forestry Act, 1927.
- Army and Air Force (Annual) Act, 1927.

The following Address was presented to His Majesty The KING at Buckingham Palace on the 4th instant:—

DELEGATES TO THE LISTER
CENTENARY CELEBRATIONS.

May it please Your Majesty,—

We who are here present by Your Majesty's gracious invitation, have assembled in the capital of Your Empire to celebrate the One

Hundredth Anniversary of the birth of Joseph Lister who, in recognition of his great achievements for Science and for Humanity, was raised by Her Majesty Queen Victoria to the peerage of this Realm with the title of Baron Lister of Lyme Regis.

Lord Lister's brilliant powers as an investigator, and his single-minded devotion to science, enabled him, in applying to the problems of surgery the discoveries of his great contemporary, Louis Pasteur, to lay bare the hidden causes of septic inflammation, to discover the means of its prevention and thereby to inaugurate a new epoch in the science and practice of surgery. It may well be doubted whether the scientific activity of any other one man has achieved so much for the saving of human life and for the prevention and relief of the physical sufferings which afflict mankind.

Among those who are present, in addition to delegates from the Learned Societies, the Universities, and the Medical and Surgical Colleges of this Kingdom, and from the Dominions of Your Empire Overseas, are representatives of Medical and Surgical Science from many other lands, who have come to join with us in commemorating the birth of Lord Lister, one of the greatest benefactors of the human race in all parts of the World.

As President of the Royal Society of London, an office in which Lord Lister himself was one of my most distinguished predecessors, I have the honour to express to Your Majesty the dutiful thanks of all the members of this delegation for the honour of

this reception, whereby Your Majesty participates in the Celebration for which we are assembled.

To which Address His Majesty was pleased to return the following gracious answer:—

I thank you for the Address which you have presented. It is with pleasure that I receive the delegates who are present here to-day and so take part in the Centenary Commemoration of Lord Lister's birth. Any country might be proud to claim Lord Lister as its citizen: and I and my people heartily welcome the representatives of medical and surgical science, both from the Overseas Dominions and from all parts of the civilised world, who have come to join us in honouring his memory.

You have truly said that Lister ranks among the greatest benefactors to mankind. Of all the many changes in the last hundred years none is more striking than the revolution in thought concerning surgery. It is hard now to realise the dread and apprehension with which formerly even a minor surgical operation was regarded. This change in our ideas is due partly to the discovery of anaesthetics and perhaps even more to Lister's work. Lister removed the horror of sepsis from surgical operations and for this he is rightly described as the father of modern surgery. The principles discovered and laid down by him are to-day being worked out by his successors and are still fruitful of new applications.

Naturally a layman looks first at the ultimate success and beneficent effects of Lister's work. These, however, were not the outcome of happy accident or sudden inspiration, but of long and patient study, of continuous experiment and finally of a wide knowledge and penetrating insight, enabling him to discern the importance and practical bearing of observations which, to some minds, might have remained a piece of academic research.

It is my earnest desire and hope that the Lister Centenary Celebrations may be in every way successful: and that this gathering of men of science from every quarter of the globe may conduce to foster and to strengthen the co-operation of all nations in the accumulation of scientific knowledge for the common benefit of the human race.

TENDERS FOR TREASURY BILLS.

1. The Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury hereby give notice that Tenders will be received at the Chief Cashier's Office, at the Bank of England, on Friday, the 22nd day of April, 1927, at 1 o'clock, for Treasury Bills to be issued under the Treasury Bills Act, 1877, the National Debt Act, 1889, and the War Loan Acts, 1914-1919, to the amount of £35,000,000.

2. The Bills will be in amounts of £5,000 or £10,000. They will be dated at the option of the Tenderer on any business day from Monday the 25th April, 1927, to Saturday, the 30th April, 1927, inclusive, and will be payable at three months after date.

3. The Bills will be issued and paid at the Bank of England.

4. Each Tender must be for an amount not less than £50,000, and must specify the date on which the Bills required are to be dated, and the net amount per cent. (being an even multiple of one penny) which will be given for the amount applied for. Separate Tenders must be lodged for Bills of different dates.

5. Tenders must be made through a London Banker, Discount House or Broker.

6. The persons whose Tenders are accepted will be informed of the same not later than the following day, and payment in full of the amounts of the accepted tenders must be made to the Bank of England by means of Cash or a Banker's Draft on the Bank of England not later than 2 o'clock (Saturday 12 o'clock) on the day on which the relative Bills are to be dated.

7. In virtue of the provisions of Section 1 (4) of the War Loan Act, 1919, Members of the House of Commons are not precluded from tendering for these Bills.

8. Tenders must be made on the printed forms, which may be obtained from the Chief Cashier's Office, Bank of England.

9. The Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury reserve the right of rejecting any tenders.

ORDER OF THE MINISTER OF
AGRICULTURE AND FISHERIES.

(DATED 14TH APRIL, 1927.)

The Minister of Agriculture and Fisheries, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in him under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 to 1925, and of every other power enabling him in this behalf, hereby orders as follows:—

*Authorisation of Landing of Animals for
Exceptional Purposes.*

1. The landing of the animals described in the First Schedule hereto, which are intended for exceptional purposes, is hereby allowed subject to the provisions of Part II (Quarantine) of the Third Schedule to the Diseases of Animals Act, 1894, and of the Foreign Animals (Quarantine) Order of 1896, and of this Order.

Definition of Quarantine Station.

2. The premises described in the Second Schedule hereto are hereby defined as a Foreign Animals Quarantine Station for the purpose of the detention of the animals described in the First Schedule hereto.

Examination before Landing.

3. No such animals as aforesaid shall be landed except with a licence granted by an Inspector of the Ministry, which licence shall not be granted unless and until the animals have been examined by a Veterinary Inspector of the Ministry and certified by him to be free from symptoms of contagious disease.

*Regulations Applicable to the Animals on
Landing.*

4. The animals, on being landed, shall forthwith be moved under the supervision of an Inspector of the Ministry of Agriculture and Fisheries from the quay to the premises described in the Second Schedule hereto, and shall be there detained for a period of twenty-eight days. During the said period the animals shall be kept separate from all other

(A) *Main Roads*:—

In the Parish of Hildenborough—

In the Parish of Leigh—
 Bid Bridge-Chiddingstone Road.

(B) Other Roads:—

In the Parish of Hildenborough—

Coldharbour Lane, Mount Pleasant Road.

The roadways and footways on the bridges carrying the roads leading from Noble Tree Cross to (1) Leigh and (2) Chiddingstone over the Southern Railway.

In the Parish of Leigh—

Green Avenue.

5. The names of streets and parts of streets in which it is proposed that electric lines shall be laid down within a period to be specified in the Order are as follows:—

In the Parish of Hildenborough:—

The main road from London to Tonbridge from the boundary of the Urban District of Tonbridge to the junction of the road to Penshurst immediately to the north-west of St. John's Church, the road from Hildenborough to Penshurst from its junction with the main road from London to Tonbridge as far as Noble Tree Cross, the road to Great Hollenden from its junction with the main road from London to Tonbridge at Watts Cross to its junction with Vines Road, and Vines Road from its junction with the road from Watts Cross to Great Hollenden for a distance of 400 yards.
