

(B) Other Roads:—

In the Parish of Hildenborough—

Coldharbour Lane, Mount Pleasant Road.

The roadways and footways on the bridges carrying the roads leading from Noble Tree Cross to (1) Leigh and (2) Chiddingstone over the Southern Railway.

In the Parish of Leigh—

Green Avenue.

5. The names of streets and parts of streets in which it is proposed that electric lines shall be laid down within a period to be specified in the Order are as follows:—

In the Parish of Hildenborough:—

The main road from London to Tonbridge from the boundary of the Urban District of Tonbridge to the junction of the road to Penshurst immediately to the north-west of St. John's Church, the road from Hildenborough to Penshurst from its junction with the main road from London to Tonbridge as far as Noble Tree Cross, the road to Great Hollenden from its junction with the main road from London to Tonbridge at Watts Cross to its junction with Vines Road, and Vines Road from its junction with the road from Watts Cross to Great Hollenden for a distance of 400 yards.

In the Parish of Leigh:—

The road from Hildenborough to Penshurst from The Vicarage to the entrance to Hall Place.

6. To prescribe a maximum price or prices that may be demanded by the Council in respect of any supply of electricity in the added area.

7. To confer upon the Council all or some of the powers of the Electricity (Supply) Acts 1882 to 1926 and enactments incorporated therein and to alter, vary or extinguish all rights and privileges which would or might interfere with any of the objects of the Order, and to confer all other rights or privileges necessary for carrying such objects into effect.

Every local or other public authority company or person being desirous of bringing before the Electricity Commissioners any objection respecting the application may do so by registered letter addressed to the Secretary, Electricity Commission, Savoy Court, Strand, London, W.C. 2, and despatched on or before the 16th day of May 1927 and a copy of such objection must also be forwarded to the undermentioned Clerk or Parliamentary Agents.
