The following Address was presented to The KING on the occasion of the opening by His Majesty of the King George V Wing of the King Edward VII Hospital for Windsor at Windsor on the 20th April, 1927:—

KING EDWARD VII HOSPITAL FOR WINDSOR.

May it please Your Majesties,

We, The President, Chairman, Governors, and Committee of King Edward VII Hospital for Windsor and the surrounding districts, desire to offer to Your Majesties on this important occasion a loyal and respectful welcome and to express our profound gratitude for the high honour done us by Your Majesties' presence to open the new part of this Hospital, which Your Majesty has graciously allowed us to name "The King George V Wing."

This Hospital as Your Majesties know was established on the foundations of St. Peter's Hospital and is called after our great benefactor His Late Majesty King Edward VII, who laid the commemoration stone on June 22nd, 1908, when Your Majesties were present. The first portion of the Hospital was opened in 1909 and since then the increased population of the large area served by the Hospital, together with the insistent demands of medical science for fuller and better equipment, made it necessary to make extensive additions to the original building. The X-ray department and Pathological Laboratory were provided in 1910, the Mary Elliman Ward for Women and the Helena Ward for Children in 1913, and the Orthopaedic Annexe was opened by H.R.H.

Princess Mary (Viscountess Lascelles) in May 1918. The Nurses Quarters of which the foundation stone was laid by Her Majesty The Queen in April 1924, were declared opened by our President, H.R.H. The Prince of Wales, in November of that year.

Even with these added premises the accommodation for male patients was so inadequate that early in 1926 the Committee were compelled to commence the new building, which Your Majesty is about to open to-day, and our accommodation will then be 50 beds for men, 40 for women, 20 for children and 15 private wards for patients of small means, making a total of 125 beds.

The cost of the new Wing including equipment, furniture and linen amounted to £11,780, and we are happy to inform Your Majesties that the whole amount has been found and subscribed by the benevolence of the friends of the Hospital and that it will be opened by Your Majesty free of debt. Even with this extra wing we are faced with the necessity of making provision at an early date for a new Nurses Hostel Annexe, so as to enable the Committee to provide more beds for women and children and to release rooms in the main building to meet the ever growing demand for private wards.

We are very grateful to Your Majesty for the generous donation that you make to our fund year by year, and the presence of Your Majesties here to-day shows once more Your constant interest in the work of the Hospital which will be an inspiring and stimulating encouragement to us all to discharge our duties to Your Majesties' satisfaction.

To which Address His Majesty was pleased to return the following gracious Answer:—

The Queen and I thank you for your loyal and dutiful Address. The noble work carried on by Hospitals in all parts of the country always has our fullest sympathy; and we naturally feel a special concern in the fortunes of an Institution which is of so much importance to the health and happiness of the people of Windsor. My family has for many years been closely associated with the Hospital work of your Borough and my dear Father laid the Foundation Stone of the new Hospital on this site, which was rightly called after him. The Queen and I have followed with the keenest interest its development and ever increasing usefulness and I am very glad that the new Wing which is to be opened to-day should bear my name.

The remarkable progress in the activities of your Hospital, during the short space of 20 years, bears striking testimony to the zeal and energy of the authorities, as well as to the public spirit and generosity of its benefactors. But there is no finality in Hospital work; and you remind us that, at the very moment when the new extension is completed, you are faced with the need for yet another addition, a new Hostel for Nurses, to build which I hope and trust the necessary funds will soon be available.

I declare the King George V Wing open; and I pray that God's Blessing may rest on this Hospital and on all who labour for the relief of the sufferers within its walls.

TENDERS FOR TREASURY BILLS.

1. The Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury hereby give notice that Tenders will be received at the Chief Cashier's Office, at the Bank of England, on Friday, the 6th day of May, 1927, at 1 o'clock, for Treasury Bills to be issued under the Treasury Bills Act, 1877, the National Debt Act, 1889, and the War Loan Acts, 1914-1919, to the amount of £35,000,000.

2. The Bills will be in amounts of £5,000 or £10,000. They will be dated at the option of the Tenderer on any business day from Monday the 9th May, 1927, to Saturday, the 14th May, 1927, inclusive, and will be payable at three months after date.

3. The Bills will be issued and paid at the Bank of England.

4. Each Tender must be for an amount not less than £50,000, and must specify the date on which the Bills required are to be dated, and the net amount per cent. (being an even multiple of one penny) which will be given for the amount applied for. Separate Tenders must be lodged for Bills of different dates.

5. Tenders must be made through a London Banker, Discount House or Broker.

6. The persons whose Tenders are accepted will be informed of the same not later than the following day, and payment in full of the amounts of the accepted tenders must be made to the Bank of England by means of Cash or a Banker's Draft on the Bank of England not

later than 2 o'clock (Saturday 12 o'clock) on the day on which the relative Bills are to be dated.

7. In virtue of the provisions of Section 1 (4) of the War Loan Act, 1919, Members of the House of Commons are not precluded from tendering for these Bills.

8. Tenders must be made on the printed forms, which may be obtained from the Chief Cashier's Office, Bank of England.

9. The Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury reserve the right of rejecting any tenders.

APPOINTMENTS OF STANDINGS FOR HACKNEY CARRIAGES WITHIN THE METROPOLITAN POLICE DISTRICT, AND REGULATIONS TO BE OBSERVED.

By virtue of the Act 13 and 14 Victoria, chapter 7, intituled "An Act for Consolidating the Office of the Registrar of Metropolitan Public Carriages with the Office of Commissioners of Police of the Metropolis, and making other provisions in regard to the Consolidated Offices."

I, WILLIAM THOMAS FRANCIS HORWOOD, Commissioner of Police of the Metropolis, do hereby APPOINT a Standing for Ten Hackney Carriages at Prima Road, Brixton, and do make the following Regulations with regard to the Boundaries for the same, viz. :—

On the North side of roadway, commencing at a point in line with the side door of No. 2, Brixton Road and extending Westward, by kerb, as far as necessary for ten carriages, leaving a sufficient space to permit vehicles drawing in at the Water Hydrant.

Front of vehicles toward the East.

Provided that no Hackney Carriage shall be suffered to stand across any street or thoroughfare, or opposite the end of any street or carriage-way, or upon any place where foot passengers usually cross the carriage-way.

MERCHANDISE MARKS ACT, 1926.

PROPOSED DIRECTION OF THE BOARD OF TRADE
THAT SECTION 1 SHALL NOT APPLY TO
PETROLEUM AND LIQUID PRODUCTS THEREOF.

The Board of Trade, having considered representations which have been made to them by persons appearing to the Board to have a

substantial interest in the matter, hereby give notice of their intention to direct, in pursuance of the powers conferred upon them by Section 1, Sub-section (3), of the Merchandise Marks Act, 1926, that Section 1 shall not apply to petroleum and liquid products thereof.

Any communication on the subject of the above proposed Direction should be addressed within fourteen days from the date of this notice to the Secretary, Board of Trade, Great George Street, Westminster, S.W. 1.

AGRICULTURAL WAGES (REGULATION) ACT, 1924.

Whereas the Agricultural Wages Committee for the area comprising the administrative counties of Cumberland and Westmorland, which, for the purposes of the Agricultural Wages (Regulation) Act, 1924, shall be deemed to include the city and county borough of Carlisle, the county borough of Barrow-in-Furness and the area comprising the Ulverston Rural District and the Grange, Ulverston and Dalton-in-Furness Urban Districts, in the administrative county of Lancaster, have, in pursuance of the above Act, duly fixed minimum and overtime rates of wages for workers employed in agriculture for time work in that area and the said rates are set out in the Schedule to this Order. Now the Agricultural Wages Board, in pursuance of the said Act, and for the purpose of carrying out the decision of the said Committee, hereby order that the provisions contained in the Schedule to this Order shall become effective from the 5th day of June, 1927.

2. For the purpose of the rates specified in Clause 1 (a) above the expression "week of customary hours" means a week of sixty-two hours (including any employment on Sunday).

3. Where a whole time male worker is employed by the week or any longer period and the hours of work agreed between the worker and the employer in any week (excluding hours of overtime employment) are in the case of a male worker hired by the month or longer period less than 62, or in the case of other male workers less than 54 in summer or 48 in winter, as the case may be, the rate of wages applicable to that worker shall be such as to secure to that worker the wages which would have been payable if the agreed hours had been the full hours mentioned above in the case of that worker.

4. The expression "week" means a week of employment of the worker.

5. For the purpose of the rates above specified employment in winter shall be deemed to be employment during the period commencing on the 1st day of November and terminating on the last day of February in each year, and employment in summer shall be deemed to be employment during the remainder of the year.

6. *Male Casual Workers.*—The wages payable for casual employment of male workers shall be not less than wages at the following minimum rates:—

9. For the purpose of the above rates, the hours of work shall not include meal times, but shall include any time during which, by reason of weather conditions, an employer has prevented from working a worker who was present at the place of employment and ready to work.

For the purpose of the application of the above differential rates of wages for overtime employment, the Cumberland and Westmorland Agricultural Wages Committee have, by Order dated 10th April, 1926, defined the following employment as the employment which is to be treated as overtime employment:—

(1) Male workers hired by the month or longer period:—

All employment in excess of 62 hours in any week (including Sundays).

(2) Other male workers:—

(a) All employment on a Sunday.

(b) All employment in excess of 48 hours in any week (excluding Sunday) in winter.

(c) All employment in excess of 54 hours in any week (excluding Sunday) in summer.

11. For the purpose of the application of the above minimum rates, the Cumberland and Westmorland Agricultural Wages Committee have, by Order dated 10th April, 1926, defined the following as the benefits or advantages which may be reckoned as payment of wages in lieu of payment in cash and the values at which they are to be reckoned:—

(1) *Benefits or Advantages.*

- (a) New Milk.
- (b) Potatoes.
- (c) Board (including any meals but not including intoxicating drink).
- (d) Lodging.
- (e) Cottage, including any garden provided with the cottage, except where the cottage is one in regard to which the Medical Officer of Health has reported that it is in a state so dangerous or injurious to health as to be unfit for human habitation.

(2) *Values.*

- (a) New Milk—4d. per quart, but not to exceed 2s. 4d. per week.
- (b) Potatoes sufficient to meet the requirements of the worker and his family resident with him—1s. 8d. per week.
- (c) Board. Workers of 16 years of age and over, 12s. 6d. per week.

- (d) Lodging. Workers of 16 years of age and over, 2s. 6d. per week.
Workers under 16 years of age, 2s. per week.
- (e) Cottage—3s. per week, less any rates which may be paid by the occupier.

2. *Stockmen and Shepherds of 21 years of age and over.*

(a) The wages payable for employment of male workers of 21 years of age and over wholly or mainly as Stockmen or Shepherds and being householders shall be not less than 43s. per week for hours customarily spent in attention to stock.

(b) The wages payable for employment of male workers of 21 years of age and over wholly or mainly as Stockmen or Shepherds and not being householders and not receiving board and lodging provided by the employer shall be not less than 36s. 10½d. per week for hours customarily spent in attention to stock.

(c) The wages payable for employment of male workers of 21 years of age and over wholly or mainly as Stockmen or Shepherds and receiving board and lodging provided by the employer shall be not less than 35s. (which sum shall include the value of such board and lodging as defined by the Committee) per week, for hours customarily spent in attention to stock.

3. *Other Male Workers of 21 years of age and over.*

The wages payable for employment of all other male workers of 21 years of age and over shall be not less than 31s. per week of 50 hours (excluding Sunday).

4. *All Male Workers under 21 years of age.*

The wages payable for employment of all male workers under 21 years of age shall be not less than wages at the following minimum rates:—

(i) All employment on a Sunday.

(ii) All employment in any week (excluding Sunday) in excess of 44 hours.

12. For the purpose of the application of the above minimum rates the Durham Agricultural Wages Committee have by Order dated 30th March, 1927, defined the following as the benefits or advantages which may be reckoned as payment of wages in lieu of payment in cash and the values at which they are to be reckoned:—

ORDER DEFINING THE EMPLOYMENT WHICH IS TO BE TREATED AS OVERTIME EMPLOYMENT.

The Herefordshire Agricultural Wages Committee in pursuance of the powers vested in them by the Agricultural Wages (Regulation) Act, 1924, and the Regulations made thereunder, do by this Order vary as from 1st May, 1927, their Order of the 12th April, 1926, defining the employment which is to be treated as overtime employment for the purpose of the application of any differential rate of wages for overtime fixed by the said Committee for the area comprising the administrative county of Hereford and hereby Order that such employment shall be as follows:—

1. In the case of male workers of 21 years of age and over employed wholly or mainly as bailiffs, waggoners, stockmen or shepherds, all employment in excess of 60 hours in any week (including Sunday).

2. In the case of all other male workers:—

(a) All employment in excess of 6½ hours on a Saturday or on such other day (not being Sunday) in every week as may be agreed between the employer and worker.

(b) All employment on a Sunday.

(c) All employment in excess of 53 hours in any week (excluding all hours which are treated as hours of overtime employment) in summer.

(d) All employment in excess of 48 hours in any week (excluding all hours which are treated as hours of overtime employment) in winter.

3. In the case of female workers:—

(a) All employment in excess of 6½ hours on a Saturday or on such other day (not being Sunday) in every week as may be agreed between the employer and worker.

(b) All employment on a Sunday.

(c) All employment in excess of 46½ hours in any week (excluding all hours which are treated as hours of overtime employment).

4. For the purpose of this Order employment in winter shall be deemed to be employment during the months of November,

December, January and February and employment in summer shall be deemed to be employment during the rest of the year.

In the case of a cottage with regard to which the Committee, on an application by or on behalf of a worker, have certified that by reason of inadequate accommodation, want of repair or sanitation or lack of water supply, the value of such cottage is less than 2s. 6d. in the case of a cottage of 4 rooms or 3s. in the case of a cottage of 5 rooms or more, the value shall be such sum less than 2s. 6d. or 3s. as the case may be, as the Committee shall determine on a consideration of the defects.

(c) Potato Ground—6d. per score yards, or 2s. 6d. for 100 yards.

(d) New Milk:—

The current wholesale price prevailing in the area of the Committee.

3. In pursuance of their said powers the said Committee hereby order that except as in this Order provided no benefit or advantage shall be reckoned as payment of wages in lieu of cash.

4. This Order shall come into operation on 1st May, 1927.

ORDER OF THE MINISTER OF

ANIMALS (LANDING FROM IRELAND,
CHANNEL ISLANDS AND ISLE OF
MAN) (AMENDMENT) ORDER OF 1927.

The Minister of Agriculture and Fisheries, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in him under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 to 1925, and of every other power enabling him in this behalf, hereby orders as follows:—

Amendment of Animals (Landing from Ireland, Channel Islands and Isle of Man) Order of 1923, with respect to Swine.

1. The Animals (Landing from Ireland, Channel Islands and Isle of Man) Order of 1923, hereinafter referred to as "the principal Order," shall be read and have effect as if Article 3 thereof (*Additional restrictions applicable to Landing of Swine from Ireland*) and Article 4 (*Provisions as to Movement of Swine and Licences for such Movement*) were revoked, and the following Article substituted therefor:—

"Additional Restrictions applicable to Landing of Swine from Ireland."

"3.—(1) The landing in Great Britain of swine brought from Ireland shall be subject to the following additional provisions:—

(2) (i) Swine not intended for immediate slaughter shall be accompanied on landing by the following additional documents, namely:—

(a) a declaration in the Form A set forth in the Second Schedule to this Order or to the like effect signed by the occupier of the premises where the swine have been kept, and countersigned by a member of the Police Force of the district in which such premises are situate; and

(b) a declaration in the Form B set forth in the said Second Schedule or to the like effect signed by the applicant for the health certificate required by Article 2 of this Order.

(ii) Swine not intended for immediate slaughter shall not during the voyage to Great Britain be permitted to come in contact with swine which are intended for immediate slaughter.

(iii) The declarations shall be delivered up with the health certificate required by Article 2 of this Order to an Inspector of the Ministry on the landing of the swine at the Landing Place:

(3) Swine shall not be landed from Ireland unless they have been marked by and at the expense of the owner or his agent by the painting or stamping with a blue adhesive composition of a broad line down the back and another broad line across the loins, thus:—, each line being not less than nine inches long."

Regulation of Movement of Swine from Landing Place.

2. The following Article shall be deemed to be included in and form part of Part IV of the principal Order as Article 33a:—

"Licence for Movement of Swine from Landing Place.

"33a.—(1) Swine landed from Ireland, the Channel Islands or the Isle of Man, shall not be moved from the Landing Place unless they are accompanied by a licence granted by an Inspector of the Ministry in accordance with the provisions of this Article.

(2) In the case of swine not intended for immediate slaughter it shall be a condition of such licence that the swine shall not, for a period of 27 days after arrival at the place of destination specified therein, be moved from such place of destination except to a bacon factory or slaughterhouse, and then only with permission in writing from a local Inspector. Swine, while detained under this Article, shall be kept separate from all other swine. This provision does not restrict the removal of the carcase of a pig slaughtered on the premises during the period of detention.

(3) (i) In the case of fat swine intended for immediate slaughter, the licence shall specify as the place of destination a particular bacon factory or slaughterhouse, or any particular lairs, market, or saleyard specially authorised to be used for the purpose of this Article by the Local Authority of the District.

(ii) Swine moved under this Article to any specially authorised lairs, market or saleyard shall not be moved therefrom except with a licence authorising such movement granted by a local Inspector of the District in which the lairs, market or saleyard are situate and then only direct to a specified bacon factory or slaughterhouse.

(iii) If any swine, other than swine landed under this Order are moved into any specially authorised lairs, market, or saleyard while such premises are being used for the purposes of this Article, those swine shall be subject to the same restrictions as regards licences and movement, as swine moved under this Article to such premises.

(4) Swine moved under this Article to a bacon factory or slaughterhouse shall after their arrival thereat be there detained until they are slaughtered.

(5) Swine while being moved from a landing place with a licence under this Article shall so far as is practicable be moved by rail and to the railway station nearest to the place of destination; and they shall in all cases be moved without unnecessary delay direct to the place of destination specified in the licence and not elsewhere:

(6) Swine moved with a licence under this Article shall not, unless otherwise expressly provided by Order of the Minister, be subject to any restriction on the movement of swine imposed by an Order of the Minister, or by regulations of a Local Authority, relating to swine fever.

(7) A copy of every licence granted under this Article by the Inspector or local Inspector shall be sent forthwith by him to the Local Authority of the District in which the authorised place of destination is situate, and also, where the place of destination is not an authorised lair, market, or saleyard, to the occupier of that place.

(8) A copy of every special authority for the use of any lairs, market or saleyard for swine moved under this Article shall forthwith be sent to the Ministry by the Local Authority granting it.

(9) For the purposes of this Article the expressions "market" and "saleyard" shall include "part of a market" and "part of a saleyard."

Amendment of Irish Animals (Marking) Order of 1923 (No. 2).

3. The Irish Animals (Marking) Order of 1923 (No. 2) shall be read and have effect as if the reference to swine in paragraph (3) of Article 1 of that Order were deleted.

Revocation.

4. The Order of the Minister No. 3775 dated 6th September, 1924, relating to the landing of fat swine from Ireland is hereby revoked.

Short Title.

5. This Order may be cited as the ANIMALS (LANDING FROM IRELAND, CHANNEL ISLANDS AND ISLE OF MAN) (AMENDMENT) ORDER OF 1927, and shall be read with the principal Order.

Commencement.

6. This Order shall come into operation on the tenth day of May, nineteen hundred and twenty-seven.

DESTRUCTIVE INSECTS AND PESTS
ACTS, 1877 AND 1907.

IMPORTATION OF RAW CHERRIES
ORDER OF 1927.

The Minister of Agriculture and Fisheries has made the above Order under the Destructive Insects and Pests Acts, 1877 and 1907.

The effect of the Order is to prohibit the landing in England and Wales of any raw cherries shipped from any port in European France unless they are accompanied by an official certificate. In the case of cherries grown in France, the certificate, in the terms prescribed in the schedule to the Order, must be given by an official of the French Phytopathological Service and may cover all the consignments included in one cargo. For cherries not grown in France, a certificate of origin in respect of each consignment is necessary, visé by a Local Authority and stating the country and place where the cherries were grown. These certificates must be delivered to the officer of Customs with the entry relating to the consignment.

Cherries landed in contravention of the Order must be destroyed by and at the expense of the importer unless their disposal otherwise is authorised by a licence issued by an Inspector of the Ministry; any person failing to comply with this provision or with the conditions of a licence is liable to a penalty of £10.

An Inspector of the Ministry may enter any premises and open, examine, and take samples of any consignment of cherries shipped or believed to have been shipped from any European country; any person wilfully obstructing or impeding an Inspector in the exercise of these powers, is liable to a penalty of £10.

The restrictions imposed by this Order do not affect the requirements of the Destructive Insects and Pests Order of 1922.

The Importation of Raw Cherries Order of 1926 is revoked.
