The following Addresses were presented to The KING on the occasion of His Majesty's visit to Cardiff on the 21st April, 1927, to open the National Museum of Wales:—

CARDIFF CORPORATION.

TO THEIR MOST GRACIOUS MAJESTIES
KING GEORGE V. AND QUEEN MARY.

We, The Lord Mayor, Aldermen and Citizens of the City of Cardiff, Your Majesties dutiful and faithful Subjects, humbly approach Your Majesties with the cordial expression of our attachment and loyal devotion and offer to Your Majesties an enthusiastic and warm welcome to the Metropolis of the Principality of Wales.

We recall with pride that Your Majesties' present visit to Cardiff is the third occasion in recent times for us to have the presence amongst us of the reigning Monarch, a Royal visit having been made in the year 1907, by Their late Majesties King Edward VII and Queen Alexandra, the memories of whose noble lives will ever remain an inspiration not only to the loyal inhabitants of this City, but to all your loving and devoted Welsh subjects.

We also recall with profound national pride that it was Your Majesty's illustrious father of blessed memory who granted the Royal Charter for the establishment of the National Museum of Wales (Amgueddfa Genedlaethol Cymru).

Your Majesty worthily continued the noble work of Your august father by laying the foundation stone of this National Institution on the 26th June, 1912, and Your Majesty's

present visit formally to declare open the National Institution is another signal proof of the continuity of Your Majesty's interest in the National aspirations of the Welsh people.

Such gracious acts fill the hearts of your faithful subjects with a deep sense of loyal affection and devotion to Your Gracious Majesties.

We are conscious and intensely proud of the intimate association of the Royal Family with our ancient and loyal City, as evidenced by the City's record of Honorary Freemen, pre-eminent amongst whom are to be found the august names of H.R.H. The late Duke of Clarence; your illustrious father, His late Majesty King Edward VII; H.R.H. The Prince of Wales and H.R.H. The Duke of York.

We cherish the fervent hope that the association thus established may ever continue and that opportunities will be afforded Your Majesty's Welsh subjects to demonstrate from time to time their allegiance and fealty to their beloved Sovereign and his Royal House.

We beg leave to allude to the great and magnificent work of your beloved Son, H.R.H. The Prince of Wales, in the realms of science, industry, trade and commerce. His noble character and intimate knowledge of human nature have endeared him to the hearts of all Your Majesty's loyal subjects throughout the British Empire and cemented the bonds of peace throughout the world. In expressing our warm admiration of His Royal Highness's noble and lofty ideals, we devoutly trust that His Royal Highness will be vouchsafed good health and strength to carry on his

great mission for which his unique personal qualities pre-eminently fit him.

May we also be permitted to refer to our City's youngest Honorary Freeman (H.R.H. The Duke of York) and Her Royal Highness The Duchess of York who are now visiting the Commonwealth of Australia to perform the opening ceremony of the Parliament Houses of that Great Dominion. We pray that the important commission may be crowned with unqualified success and that Their Royal Highnesses The Duke and Duchess may return to the shores of England with renewed health and vigour.

It is with supreme satisfaction that we are to-day afforded the pleasant opportunity of welcoming among us our much-beloved Queen, whose tender sympathies for the poor, the sick and the needy and whose many acts of mercy and kindness, combined with a charming personality, will ever live in the hearts of Your Majesty's most grateful subjects.

We earnestly invoke Divine Providence that He may grant to Your Majesties a long, happy and prosperous reign, ever working in the cause of peace and amity between the nations of the world and fostering those sciences and arts which conduce to the mental elevation of mankind so that it may hereafter form one of the brightest and most triumphant periods in the annals of our national history.

To which Address His Majesty was pleased to return the following gracious Answer:—

The Queen and I thank you for your loyal and dutiful Address and its words of kindly and enthusiastic welcome to the City of Cardiff. We retain very happy recollections of our previous visits to your City and to-day I shall have much pleasure in inaugurating the Welsh National Museum. Fourteen years ago I laid the Foundation Stone of this latest addition to the great group of public buildings which are the glory of Cardiff. Your citizens deserve the warmest congratulations on the insight and public spirit which moved them thus to appropriate the heart of Cathay's Park for a homogeneous gathering of buildings, devoted to municipal and national purposes and standing in a beautiful natural setting.

I am touched by your warm and spontaneous assurances of loyalty and attachment towards me and my Family, and by your allusions to their efforts to serve and promote to the best of their powers the welfare of my People in this country and overseas. I pray that the Blessing of God may rest upon your ancient City and bring to its people peace, happiness and prosperity.

NATIONAL MUSEUM OF WALES.

TO THE KING'S MOST EXCELLENT MAJESTY.

May it please Your Majesty:—

We, the President, the Court of Governors, the Council and the Director of the National Museum of Wales, take the opportunity of Your Majesty's gracious presence among us for the purpose of opening the aforesaid National Museum to offer to Your Majesty the expression of our loyal devotion and heartfelt gratitude.

We recall that the Royal Charter by which this Institution was called into being emanated from Your Majesty's illustrious Father, his Late Majesty King Edward VII., of blessed memory.

We gratefully recall that Your Majesty worthily continued the work thus begun by graciously initiating on 26th June, 1912, the erection of the building which is the material habitation of the Institution, and of which a substantial portion is now complete.

The memory of Your Majesty's presence on the historical occasion of the laying of the Foundation Stone, and of Your Majesty's personal interest in the Museum, have been a constant source of strength and encouragement to those who in the difficult years which have intervened, have been entrusted with the privilege and responsibility of directing the progress of this National home of Science and Art. In particular the memory of a remark made by Your Majesty, that you hoped to be able to open the building which you were then inaugurating has been treasured by your people of Wales. To-day, thanks to the munificence of individual benefactors, the generous far-sightedness of public bodies in Wales, and the practical help granted by Your Majesty's Treasury, the hopes, deferred as a result of the War, have come to fruition, and with loyal gratitude we humbly thank Your Majesty for consenting, fifteen years after the gracious words referred to were uttered, to fulfil the desire which you then expressed.

The Institution was founded to teach the world about Wales and the Welsh people about their own Fatherland. Those responsible assured Your Majesty, when the Foundation Stone was laid, that no effort would be spared to render the Museum worthy of the gracious interest which Your Majesty was pleased to show. It is our hope that the effort will, in Your Majesty's eyes, be seen to have met with some degree of success. In respect to the building it is the unanimous opinion of those competent to judge that in dignity of architectural design, and in suitability to its purpose of instruction and exhibition, the National Museum of Wales stands in the front rank—a legitimate source of pride to our own and future generations. Its value and usefulness as a teaching institution may be illustrated by the fact that the small portion to which the public has had access has been visited during the last two years by over 300,000 of Your Majesty's subjects. The five Departments have been and are actively engaged in accumulating material bearing on the Geology, Botany, Zoology, Archaeology and Art of Wales, and present in their galleries a wide range of objects of special interest to the inhabitants of the Principality. The presence of Your Majesty to-day will encourage us to the further efforts necessary to provide new galleries for our ever-increasing collections.

It is with the greatest satisfaction that we welcome among us to-day Her Majesty the Queen. Her warm sympathy with the higher aspiration of the people of this Country and her intimate knowledge of matters artistic and archaeological have been manifested again and again, and we humbly thank Her for this renewed proof of Her interest in the objects for which this Museum has been established.

In conclusion we humbly desire to express our loyal devotion to Your Majesty's office and person and the earnest hope that our Almighty Father may grant Your Majesty many more years of happiness and prosperity, and that He may bless all Your Majesty's arduous labours for the welfare of your people.

To which Address His Majesty was pleased to return the following gracious Answer:—

I thank you for your loyal and dutiful Address and for the feeling terms in which it refers to the Queen and myself. I recall with pleasure that, nearly fifteen years ago, I laid the Foundation Stone of the National Museum of Wales, and also that of its near neighbour—the University College of South Wales and Monmouthshire.

The Founders of this Institution aspired to a high ideal—to teach the world about Wales and the Welsh People about their own Fatherland. To this end your efforts have been successfully directed. Within these walls provision is made for visitors whose interest has to be aroused and stimulated by the display of selected objects: also for the special student, desirous of investigating material bearing upon a particular subject. And these facilities to both visitor and student will be largely increased when, thanks to the liberality of your benefactors and with the assistance of the State, the successive additions to this wisely planned and skilfully designed building are completed.

Having in the past been a Trustee of the British Museum in London, I have followed with lively interest, which the Queen shared with me, the inception and development of the National Museum of Wales. I am glad to know that its influence extends beyond the City in which it has found a home and that, by means of affiliated museums, loan collections and in other ways, the whole Principality benefits from an Institution, the educational importance of which will be increasingly recognised by the people of Wales. In these days of material considerations when a large proportion of the population is congregated in towns and manufacturing districts, your Museum can render valuable help by cultivating in the Welsh People a sense of beauty and love of natural scenery: and, even more important, by fostering healthy pride in their Nation's historic past and kindling a spirit of loyal service to its future welfare.

I now declare the National Museum of Wales open for the use and enjoyment of the public: and the Queen and I are happy to have been associated with so memorable an event in its history.

SHORES OR BANKS OF ST. ANDREWS BAY, COUNTY FIFE.

REMOVAL OF MATERIALS PROHIBITED.

Whereas the Board of Trade, acting in pursuance of the Harbours Act, 1814, as amended by the Harbours Transfer Act, 1862, found it necessary for the protection of the Port of Dundee, to prohibit, by Order dated the 23rd day of October, 1899, the taking or removing of any shingle or ballast from the shores or

banks of St. Andrews Bay, between the eastern boundary of the lands of Kingask at Kittock's Den and the northern boundary of the lands of Brownhills, being within the said Port:

And whereas, for the further protection of the said Port of Dundee, and the shores and banks thereof, the Board of Trade find it necessary to extend the limits mentioned in the said Order:

Now the Board of Trade do hereby, by this Order, prohibit the taking or removing of any shingle or ballast from the shores or banks of St. Andrews Bay between the northern boundary of the said lands of Brownhills and a line drawn in a direction 065 degrees in continuation of the southern side of the eastern end of Woodburn Place, St. Andrews, Fife.

THE Newhaven Gas and Coke Company Limited (hereinafter called "the Company") whose address is the Gasworks, Railway Road, Newhaven, Sussex, are apply-

1. To authorise the Company to supply gas for all public and private purposes within the following areas in the County of East Sussex (hereinafter referred to as "the limits of supply") namely:—

2. To empower the Company upon the lands hereinafter described to continue maintain erect alter improve and renew gasworks machinery and apparatus and to do all such acts as may be proper for making storing and supplying gas and to manufacture work up purchase and convert the residual products of gas.

6. To authorise the Company to charge for gas supplied within such parts of the limits of supply as the Order may define such differential prices as the Order may prescribe and to provide that such prices shall not be taken into account in determining the dividend payable by the Company.

7. To define and limit the share capital of the Company for the purposes of the undertaking to be authorised by the proposed Order.

8. To empower the Company to establish a special purposes fund a renewal fund and a reserve fund and to make provision as to the purposes to which such funds shall be applicable.

9. To make provision with reference to the supply of gas by means of prepayment meters and charges therefor, the laying of pipes in private streets, and for ancillary purposes, the cutting off and reconnecting supplies and the expenses of so doing, the exemption of fittings from liability to distress, the payments to be made for stand by supplies of gas, the construction, placing, specification and inspection of pipes and other apparatus and appliances, antifluators, the provision of valves where high pressure air or other gas is used, the relief from obligation to supply gas, the entry on premises and removal of fittings, the notices to be given by consumers and the authentication thereof, the refusal to supply gas to persons in debt to the Company, the period of errors in defective meters, the charges for special reading of meters, licences and patents, the recovery of demands and penalties and the inclusion of several sums in one summons.

4. To exclude from incorporation some or all of the provisions contained in the Schedule

to the Electric Lighting (Clauses) Act 1899, or to incorporate the same with such modifications and exceptions as may be indicated in the Order, and to extend them to the undertaking to be authorised by the Order.

To authorise the Council to open, break up and interfere with all streets, roads and public places, ways, footpaths, bridges, culverts, sewers, drains and gas and water mains and pipes and telegraph and telephone and other wires within the area of supply and to lay down, erect, maintain, renew and remove, either above or underground or otherwise, electric lines, conductors, mains, pipes, tubes, wires, posts, street or distributing boxes, meters, apparatus or other works or things required for the purpose of enabling the Council to generate, supply, store, convey, transmit or distribute electricity within the area of supply, and to confer all such other powers upon the Council as may be necessary for effecting the objects of the proposed undertaking.
