The Civil Service Commissioners hereby give notice that the following Regulations are published with the approval of the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury, viz.:—

REGULATIONS RESPECTING OPEN COMPETITIVE EXAMINATIONS FOR THE SITUATION OF ASSISTANT EXAMINER IN THE COMPANIES (WINDING-UP) DEPARTMENT OF THE BOARD OF TRADE.

These Regulations are liable to alteration from time to time.

1. The limits of age for this situation are 20 and 24. Candidates must be of the prescribed age on the 1st July of the year in which they are examined.

In reckoning age for competition the following allowances will be made, viz.:—

(a) Candidates who have served or are serving in the Army, Navy or Air Force may deduct from their actual age any time during which they have so served.

(b) Candidates who have served in any established civil situation to which they were admitted with the certificate of the Civil Service Commissioners may deduct from their actual age any time not exceeding two years which they may have spent in such service.

2. No person will be eligible who is not a natural-born British subject, and the child of a father also a natural-born British subject; provided that exception may be made in the case of persons serving in a civil situation to which they were admitted with the certificate of the Civil Service Commissioners and provided that exception may be made as regards the father in the case of candidates who served in His Majesty's Armed Forces

during the Great War between the 4th August, 1914, and the 11th November, 1918.

3. Candidates must satisfy the Civil Service Commissioners as to their health and character. Female candidates must be unmarried or widows, and will be required to resign their appointments on marriage.

4. No person actually serving in the Army, Navy or Air Force will be eligible for admission to the examination unless he produces to the Civil Service Commissioners, when called upon to do so, the permission of his Commanding Officer to attend the examination, dated before the commencement of the competition, and given in accordance with such orders as may from time to time be issued.

Persons holding situations in the Civil Service must obtain the permission of the authorities of their Department to attend the examination before the commencement of the competition.

Persons upon whose training for the occupation of teacher public money has been spent cannot be appointed until the consent of the appropriate education authority has been notified to the Civil Service Commissioners.

5. The examination will be in the following subjects:—

1. English.
2. Accounts.
3. General Commercial Knowledge.
4. Commercial Law.

6. Candidates must obtain such an aggregate of marks in the examination as a whole as to satisfy the Civil Service Commissioners.

7. Applications for permission to attend an Examination must be made at such time and in such manner as the Civil Service Commissioners may appoint.

8. A fee of £3 will be required from every candidate attending an Examination.

THE ROADS ACT, 1920.

COUNTY OF WEST SUSSEX.

Notice is hereby given that on the twenty-ninth day of April, 1927, the Minister of Transport made an Order under Section 7 (4) of the Roads Act, 1920, amending a previous Order made by him under that sub-section on 4th April, 1925, in respect of certain roads in the County of West Sussex.
