#### PRESENT.

The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

HEREAS there was this day read at the Board a Memorial from the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty, dated the 9th day of May, 1927, (C.W. 2524/27) in the words following, viz.:—

"Whereas by Section 3 of the Naval and Marine Pay and Pensions Act, 1865, it is enacted, inter alia, that all pay, pensions, or other allowances in the nature thereof payable in respect of services in Your Majesty's Naval or Marine Force to a person being or having been an Officer, Seaman, or Marine therein, shall be paid in such manner and subject to such restrictions, conditions and provisions as are from time to time directed by Order in Council:

"And whereas Your Majesty was graciously pleased by Your Order in Council bearing date the 14th day of July, 1922, to provide, inter alia, that Officers who retired with gratuities under the Temporary Special Retirement Scheme (1920) contained in Schedule A thereof, shall not be liable if re-employed, to deduction from their full pay in respect of such gratuities:

"And whereas we consider that Officers retired with gratuities under subsequent Temporary Special Retirement Schemes, if reemployed, should similarly be exempt from deductions from their full pay in respect of the gratuities awarded to them on retirement:

"We beg leave humbly to recommend that Your Majesty may be graciously pleased, by Your Order in Council, to sanction the rule laid down in Schedule A, Section 1, paragraph 3, of Your Order in Council bearing date the 14th day of July, 1922, being extended to Officers retired with gratuities under Schedule B of that Order, or under Your Orders in Council bearing dates the 16th day of January, 1924, and the 5th day of November, 1926.

"The Lords Commissioners of Your Majesty's Treasury have signified their concurrence in this proposal."

His Majesty, having taken the said Memorial into consideration, was pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to approve of what is therein proposed.

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, acting in pursuance of the Union of Benefices Measure, 1923, have prepared, and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council, the following Scheme for the sale of the site of the Church (hereinafter called the old Church) which was formerly the Parish Church of the New Parish of Low Harrogate (Saint Mary) in the County of York and in the Diocese of Ripon and of the ground annexed or belonging thereto and for other matters incidental to such sale:

" Whereas by an Instrument dated the 27th day of July, 1916, prepared under the provisions of the Act of the 8th and 9th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 70, and of the 19th and 20th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 55, the then lately built and consecrated Church of Saint Mary, situate in the said New Parish of Low Harrogate (Saint Mary) was formally substituted for the old Church and thereupon became and is now the Parish Church of the said New Parish of Low Harrogate (Saint Mary):

" And whereas the old Church has since the date of the Instrument aforesaid been taken down and demolished under the authority of a Faculty of the Consistory Court of the said Diocese of Ripon granted the 30th day of

December, 1908:

"Now, therefore, we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, with the consent of the Right Reverend Edward Arthur, Bishop of Ripon (in testimony whereof he has hereunto set his hand), do humbly recommend and propose to Your Majesty as follows, that is to say:—

"1. That the site of the Old Church and the ground annexed or belonging thereto (not being ground forming part of a Churchyard which has been used for burials) shall be sold and disposed of by us the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners at such time or times and in such manner in all respects and subject to such conditions as we shall deem expedient, provided always that such sale or disposal shall be subject to the conditions and restrictions imposed by the said Union of Benefices Measure, 1923.

"2. That the net proceeds to arise from the sale or sales to be made by us the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners as aforesaid after the payment thereout of all costs and expenses of and in relation to such sale or sales and to the carrying into effect of this Scheme shall constitute a fund of which the income shall be available for payment of the expenses to be from time to time incurred in the repair and maintenance of the fabric of the Parish Church of the said New Parish of Low Harrogate (Saint Mary) and the said fund shall be invested in Trustee securities and shall either be retained by us the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners or be transferred to the Diocesan Authority as defined in the said Measure upon trust to pay the income arising from the investments from time to time representing the fund to the Incumbent and Parochial Church Council of the New Parish of Low Harrogate (Saint Mary) to be applied by them in defraying the cost of such repairs as may be necessary of the fabric of the said Parish Church of Low Harrogate (Sain't Mary) and any unapplied income from time to time shall be accumulated and added to the fund, but shall remain available for application to the cost of repairs subsequently required but no part of the original capital of the fund or of the investments representing such original capital shall be expended on the cost of repairs.

"Provided always that this Scheme shall not take effect until the consents and approval which by the said Union of Benefices Measure, 1923, are made requisite to the sale under the powers conferred by that Measure of the site of any Church shall be obtained to the sale hereby proposed of the site of the said old Parish Church of the said New Parish of Low Harrogate and of any ground annexed or

belonging thereto.

"And provided also that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid, or any of them, in accordance with the provisions of the said Union of Benefices Measure, 1923, or of any other Measure of the National Assembly of the Church of England, or of any Act of Parliament."

MERCHANDISE MARKS ACT, 1926.

THE MERCHANDISE MARKS EXEMPTION DIREC-TION (No. 1), 1927, DATED MAY 16, 1927, MADE BY THE BOARD OF TRADE UNDER SECTION 1, SUBSECTION (3), OF THE MERCHANDISE . MARKS ACT, 1926 (16 & 17 GEO. 5. c. 53).

Whereas the Merchandise Marks Act, 1926 (16 & 17 Geo. 5. c. 53), Section 1, provides that it shall not be lawful to sell, expose for sale, or, by way of advertising goods of some other kind, distribute, in the United Kingdom, any imported goods to which there is applied any name or trade mark being, or purporting to be, the name or trade mark of any manufacturer, dealer or trader or the name of any place or district in the United Kingdom, unless the name or trade mark is accompanied by an indication of origin.

And whereas Subsection (3) of the said Section 1 provides that if the Board of Trade are satisfied after considering such representations (if any) as may be made to them by any persons appearing to the Board of Trade to have a substantial interest in the matter, that, having regard to the special circumstances of the trade, difficulties would arise if the said Section 1 applied to goods of any class or description, or goods sold under any particular designation, and that public interests in the United Kingdom would not be prejudiced by exempting such goods from the operation of the said Section 1, they may direct that the said Section 1 shall not apply to such goods, or that goods shall not be treated as falling under the said Section 1 by reason only that they are so designated.

Now therefore the Board of Trade, having considered representations made to them in that behalf by persons appearing to the Board to have a substantial interest in the matter and being satisfied that, having regard to the special circumstances of the trade, difficulties would arise if the said Section 1 applied to Petroleum and Liquid Products thereof, and that public interests in the United Kingdom would not be materially prejudiced by exempting Petroleum and Liquid Products thereof from the operation of the said Section 1, hereby direct in pursuance of the powers conferred upon them by the said Subsection (3) as follows:

- 1. Section 1 of the Merchandise Marks. Act, 1926, shall not apply to Petroleum and Liquid Products thereof.
- 2. This Direction may be cited as the Merchandise Marks Exemption Direction (No. 1), 1927.

#### ORDER OF THE MINISTER OF AGRICULTURE $\mathbf{AND}$ FISHERIES.

(DATED 17TH MAY, 1927.)

The Minister of Agriculture and Fisheries, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in him under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 to 1925, and of every other power enabling him in this behalf, hereby orders as follows:---

Application of Part 1 of the Sheep (Double Dipping) Order of 1920.

- 1.—(1) Part 1 (Restriction on Movement of Sheep out of a Movement Area) of the Sheep (Double Dipping) Order of 1920 is hereby applied to the Area described in the Schedule hereto, hereinafter referred to as "the Area."
- (2) This Article shall come into operation on the twenty-fourth day of July, and shall cease to operate on the tenth day of September, nineteen hundred and twenty-seven.

## Modification of Principal Order in its Application to the Area.

2. Article 2 (2) of the Principal Order shall be read and have effect as if for the words "twenty-eight days" therein were substituted the words "fifty-six days."

Restrictions on Exposure of Sheep at Markets, &c. within the Area during the period from 24th July to 9th September.

- 3.—(1) Sheep on any premises in the Area shall not (except as hereinafter provided) be permitted to enter, or be exposed for sale or exhibition in any market, fairground, saleyard or place of exhibition in that Area during the period from 24th July to 9th September, in the current year, unless they have during the period from 15th July to 9th September in the current year been dipped twice on separate dates with an interval between the dippings of not less than seven clear days nor more than fourteen days (inclusive of one of the two dippings), and are accompanied by a declaration signed by the owner of the sheep, or his agent authorised in writing for this purpose, stating that the sheep have been so dipped, and the dates of dipping, and that since the second dipping the sheep have been kept separate as far as practicable while in the Area from other sheep not so dipped.
- (2) An Inspector of the Local Authority acting under the direction of the Local Authority, may grant an exemption, subject to such conditions (if any) as may be specified therein, exempting sheep in the Area from one or both of the dippings in any particular case in which the Inspector is satisfied that it is impracticable or inexpedient to dip the sheep. such case the reasons for granting the exemption shall be stated therein, and the Local Authority shall forthwith cause a copy of the exemption to be forwarded to the Ministry. If the Minister considers that the exemption is for any reason undesirable, and directs the revocation thereof, the same shall thereupon cease to operate, but not so as to affect the previous operation of the exemption.

## Special Provision as to Fat Sheep for Immediate Slaughter.

4. Where an Inspector of a Local Authority is satisfied that any sheep in his district in the Area are intended for immediate slaughter, and that it is impracticable or inexpedient that the same should in accordance with this Order be dipped before exposure for sale or exhibition, he may, subject to any directions by the Local Authority, by licence authorise the movement of the sheep to any market, fairground, saleyard or place of exhibition in

the Area, subject to such conditions (if any) as are inserted in the licence, and thereupon the sheep may, in accordance with such licence and conditions, be exposed for sale in the market, fairground, saleyard or place of exhibition free from any restrictions imposed by any Order of the Minister relating to Sheep Scab or Sheep Dipping; provided that an Inspector of a Local Authority shall not issue any such licence for movement to premises in the District of another Local Authority unless the consent of such Local Authority either generally or in the particular instance, has been previously obtained.

### Offences.

5. If a sheep is permitted to enter or is exposed for sale in any market, fairground, saleyard or place of exhibition, in contravention of this Order, the occupier of the premises, and the owner and person in charge of the sheep, shall, each according to and in respect of his own acts and defaults, be deemed guilty of an offence against the Diseases of Animals Act. 1894.

Period Prescribed as Double Dipping Period.

2. The dates between which all sheep in the Area described in the First Schedule hereto are to be dipped within the Area by the owner or person in charge of the sheep under and in accordance with Part II of the Principal Order are hereby fixed to be the twenty-fifth day of July and the first day of September in each year.

Modification of Principal Order in its Application to the Area to which this Order applies.

3.—(1) Articles 2 (2) and 8 of the Principal Order shall be read and have effect as if for the words "twenty-eight days" therein were substituted the words "fifty-six days."

2. The Principal Order shall, in its application to the Area described in the First

Schedule hereto also be read and have effect as if Paragraph 3 of Article 2 thereof were omitted therefrom.
