At the Court at Buckingham Palace, the 13th day of May, 1927.

PRESENT,

The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS there was this day read at the Board a Memorial from the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty, dated the 9th day of May, 1927, (C.W. 2524/27) in the words following, viz. :--

"Whereas by Section 3 of the Naval and Marine Pay and Pensions Act, 1865, it is enacted, *inter alia*, that all pay, pensions, or other allowances in the nature thereof payable in respect of services in Your Majesty's Naval or Marine Force to a person being or having been an Officer, Seaman, or Marine therein, shall be paid in such manner and subject to such restrictions, conditions and provisions as are from time to time directed by Order in Council:

"And whereas Your Majesty was graciously pleased by Your Order in Council bearing date the 14th day of July, 1922, to provide, *inter alia*, that Officers who retired with gratuities under the Temporary Special Retirement Scheme (1920) contained in Schedule A thereof, shall not be liable if re-employed, to deduction from their full pay in respect of such gratuities:

"And whereas we consider that Officers retired with gratuities under subsequent Temporary Special Retirement Schemes, if reemployed, should similarly be exempt from deductions from their full pay in respect of the gratuities awarded to them on retirement: "We beg leave humbly to recommend that Your Majesty may be graciously pleased, by Your Order in Council, to sanction the rule laid down in Schedule A, Section 1, paragraph 3, of Your Order in Council bearing date the 14th day of July, 1922, being extended to Officers retired with gratuities under Schedule B of that Order, or under Your Orders in Council bearing dates the 16th day of January, 1924, and the 5th day of November, 1926.

and the 5th day of November, 1926. "The Lords Commissioners of Your Majesty's Treasury have signified their concurrence in this proposal."

His Majesty, having taken the said Memorial into consideration, was pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to approve of what is therein proposed.

And the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty are to give the necessary directions herein accordingly.
