TENDERS FOR TREASURY BILLS.

1. 3. The Bills will be issued and paid at the Bank of England.

4. Each Tender must be for an amount not less than £50,000, and must specify the date on which the Bills required are to be dated, and the net amount per cent. (being an even multiple of one penny) which will be given for the amount applied for. Separate Tenders must be lodged for Bills of different dates.

5. Tenders must be made through a London Banker, Discount House or Broker.

6. The persons whose Tenders are accepted will be informed of the same not later than the following day, and payment in full of the amounts of the accepted tenders must be made to the Bank of England by means of Cash or a Banker's Draft on the Bank of England not later than 2 o'clock (Saturday 12 o'clock) on the day on which the relative Bills are to be dated.

7. In virtue of the provisions of Section 1 (4) of the War Loan Act, 1919, Members of the House of Commons are not precluded from tendering for these Bills.

8. Tenders must be made on the printed forms, which may be obtained from the Chief Cashier's Office, Bank of England.

ANGLO-BELGIAN AGREEMENT RESPECTING LUNATICS.

The following agreement for the reciprocal notification of certain particulars respecting lunatic Belgian subjects in Great Britain or Northern Ireland and lunatic British subjects in Belgium has recently been concluded by an exchange of notes and came into operation on the 6th instant.

1. His Britannic Majesty's Government in Great Britain

shall be informed through His Britannic Majesty's Embassy at Brussels in all cases where a British subject is admitted to, dis-

2. Such information shall include the name of the asylum to which the patient is admitted and so far as possible the following details concerning the patient:—

- (1) Name (in full).
- (2) Date and place of birth.
- (3) Position or occupation.
- (4) Where living when admitted.
- (5) Last address in country of origin.
- (6) Names (in full) and addresses of parents, or nearest relations.
- (7) If patient is married, name (in full) and address of husband or wife.
- (8) Date of admission to, discharge from or death in the asylum.
- (9) Name of the person or authority at whose request the patient was admitted.
- (10) If the patient is admitted under a medical report, the date of such report, and the name and address of the doctor.

The Civil Service Commissioners hereby give notice that the following Regulations are published with the approval of the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury, viz. :—

REGULATIONS FOR THE COMPETITIVE SELECTION OF: (a) ASSISTANT CIVIL ENGINEERS; (b) ASSISTANT MECHANICAL AND ELECTRICAL ENGINEERS; AND (c) ASSISTANT SURVEYORS IN THE WORKS AND BUILDINGS DIRECTORATE OF THE AIR MINISTRY.

N.B.—These regulations are liable to alteration from time to time. Competitions do not take place at fixed intervals, but are held as occasion arises.

1. Candidates must have attained the age of 25 on a date to be fixed in respect of the competition in which they are to take part, but must not have attained 30 years of age on that date.

Candidates who have served or are serving in the Navy, Army or Air Force may deduct from their actual age, for this purpose, any time during which they have so served, but not exceeding 5 years.

2. Candidates must be natural-born British subjects and sons of fathers also natural-born British subjects; provided that exception may be made in the case of candidates serving in a civil situation to which they were admitted with the certificate of the Civil Service Commissioners, and provided that exception may be made as to the father in the case of candidates who have served in His Majesty's Armed Forces during the Great War between the 4th August, 1914, and the 11th November, 1918.

3. Until further Order, special consideration will be given to candidates who have served in His Majesty's Forces during the War.

No person will be eligible who obtained from any tribunal established under the Military Service Acts, 1916 to 1918, exemption from service in His Majesty's Forces under those Acts on the ground of a conscientious objection to the undertaking of military service, or, although not so exempted, declined to comply with obligations imposed upon him by those Acts.

4. Persons holding situations in the Civil Service must obtain the permission of the authorities of their Department to apply for appointment.

No person actually serving in the Navy, Army, or Air Force will be eligible for consideration unless he produces, when called upon to do so, the permission of his Commanding Officer to apply for appointment, dated before his appearance before the Selection Board, and given in accordance with such orders as may from time to time be issued.

Persons upon whose training for the occupation of teacher public money has been spent, cannot be appointed until the consent of the appropriate education authority has been notified to the Civil Service Commissioners.

5. Candidates must be prepared to serve at home or abroad as may be directed.

6. The Air Council will take such steps as they think most appropriate to make known

the existence of any vacancy or vacancies which they desire to fill on any one occasion, and the Civil Service Commissioners will satisfy themselves that the steps taken have been such as to secure all desirable publicity.

7. Application shall be addressed in the first instance to the Air Ministry and shall be made on a form to be obtained from that office. The candidate's credentials will be examined at the Air Ministry and the names of those candidates who appear to have the requisite qualifications and to be best fitted for appointment will be submitted to the Civil Service Commissioners. The Commissioners, if dissatisfied with the number or quality of candidates for any vacancy, may require further search to be made for qualified candidates. The Civil Service Commissioners may, if they think fit, assist in the scrutiny of the application forms of the candidates.

8. A candidate for appointment as Assistant Civil Engineer must be one of the following :—

(i) a corporate member of the Institution of Civil Engineers;

(ii) a corporate member of the Royal Institute of British Architects;

(iii) a corporate member of the Institution of Municipal and County Engineers;

(iv) a person qualified to become a corporate member of the Institution of Civil Engineers on attaining the prescribed age;

(v) a holder of a degree in engineering or an equivalent diploma;

(vi) a person who has held a commission in the Royal Engineers or an appointment in civil engineering under the British or Indian Government or a Dominion or Colonial Government and has been precluded by such employment from obtaining any of the above qualifications.

He must also have served for two years in an engineering firm of good standing or on the engineering staff of a government or large municipal department or in the Royal Engineers and have there gained experience in civil engineering both in the drawing office and on important engineering works.

9. A candidate for appointment as Assistant Mechanical and Electrical Engineer must be one of the following :—

(i) a corporate member or a person qualified on attaining the prescribed age to become a corporate member of the Institution of Civil Engineers, having taken electricity and heat engines in Section B of the Associate membership examination;

(ii) a corporate member of the Institution of Electrical Engineers;

(iii) a holder of a degree in engineering, obtained on electrical and mechanical work, or an equivalent diploma.

He must also have served for three years in an engineering firm of good standing and have there gained experience in both electrical and mechanical engineering.

10. Candidates for appointment to Assistant Surveyor posts must be Professional Associates, or Fellows, by examination, of the Surveyors' Institution, and should be fully qualified by experience in quantity surveying.

11. Candidates who are recommended by the Air Council and are accepted by the Civil Service Commissioners as possessing the requisite

qualifications will be summoned to an interview before a Selection Board, who will recommend, for the vacancies existing, those candidates who appear to them to possess the highest qualifications, and their decision will be final.
