THE WOLLASTON GAS (MAXIMUM PRICE) ORDER, 1927, DATED JUNE 16TH, 1927, MADE BY THE BOARD OF TRADE UNDER SECTION 27 OF THE WOLLASTON GAS ORDER, 1906.

Whereas by Section 27 of the Wollaston Gas Order, 1906, the Board of Trade may by order in writing alter the maximum price of five shillings per thousand cubic feet which the Wollaston Gas, Coal and Coke Company Limited are authorised by that section to charge for gas supplied by them:

And whereas the Company have applied to the Board for the issue of an Order substituting a maximum price of six shillings and eightpence per thousand cubic feet in lieu of the existing maximum price:

Now, therefore, the Board of Trade, in exercise of the powers conferred upon them by the said section, hereby order as follows:—

1. The price of six shillings and eightpence per thousand cubic feet shall be substituted for the price of five shillings per thousand cubic feet mentioned in Section 27 (Price of gas) of the Wollaston Gas Order, 1906.

2. This Order may be cited as the Wollaston Gas (Maximum Price) Order, 1927.

Application of Part I of Sheep (Double Dipping) Order of 1920.

1.—(1). Part I (*Restriction on Movement of Sheep out of a Movement Area*) of the Sheep (Double Dipping) Order of 1920, hereinafter referred to as "the Principal Order," is hereby applied to the Area described in the Schedule hereto, which shall be a Movement Area for the purposes of that Order.

(2) This Article shall come into operation on the sixteenth day of July, nineteen hundred and twenty-seven.

Application of Part II of Sheep (Double Dipping) Order of 1920.

2. Part II (*Double Dipping of Sheep in a Double Dipping Area*) of the Principal Order is also hereby applied to the Area described in the Schedule hereto, which shall also be a Double Dipping Area for the purposes of that Order.

Period Prescribed as Double Dipping Period.

3. The dates between which all sheep in the Area described in the Schedule hereto are to be dipped within the Area by the Owner or person in charge of the sheep under and in accordance with Part II of the Principal Order are hereby fixed to be the twenty-fifth day of July and the thirty-first day of August, nineteen hundred and twenty-seven.

Modification of Principal Order in its Application to the Area to which this Order applies.

4. Articles 2 (2) and 8 of the Principal Order shall be read and have effect as if for the words "twenty-eight days" therein were substituted the words "fifty-six days."

SHEEP SCAB MOVEMENT AREAS.

The following Areas are now "Movement Areas" for the purposes of Part I of the Sheep (Double) Dipping Order of 1920 :—

Inverness.—An Area comprising the islands known as the Outer Hebrides (*except the islands of St. Kilda, Dune, Soay and Boreray*), in the county of Inverness.

Ross and Cromarty.—An Area comprising the island of Lewis, including the smaller islands adjacent thereto, in the county of Ross and Cromarty.

An Area comprising :—

In the administrative county of Derby.

The parishes of Hope Woodlands, Derwent, Edale, Dore and Totley, and such parts of the parishes of Charlesworth, Hayfield, Chapel-en-le-Frith, Peak Forest, Castleton, Aston, Thornhill, Bamford, Outseats and Hathersage, as lie to the south, east and north of the following boundary, namely :—

Commencing at the point of intersection of the boundaries of Cheshire, Derbyshire and Yorkshire, near Saltersbrook Bridge, then in a westerly direction along the county boundary of Cheshire and Derby to Crowden Station, thence along the road via Torside, and the Devils Elbow to the point where it reaches the boundary of the borough of Glossop, thence along the eastern boundary of the said boundary, to the point where it meets the main road to Hayfield, thence in a southerly direction along that road via the Grouse Inn to Hayfield, thence continuing in a generally south-easterly direction via Chinley Head and Bole Hill to Chapel-en-le-Frith, thence in an easterly direction along the road via Laneside to the Inn at Sparrowpit, thence along the road via Perryfoot, Oxlow House and the Winnats to Castleton, thence in an easterly and south-easterly direction along the main road via Hope to Hathersage, thence by the road under the Railway from Hathersage to Grindleford, west of Hathersage Station, to Grindleford Bridge, thence in a north-easterly direction along the road from Grindleford Bridge to Sheffield, to the point where it meets the western boundary of the parish of Totley, near Fox House Inn, thence in a northerly direction along the western boundaries of the parishes of Totley and Dore, to the county boundary, thence in a generally north-easterly and northerly direction to the point of commencement.

The parish of Bradfield; so much of the parish of Langsett as lies to the south and west of the road from Sheffield via Langsett and Crow Edge to Hepworth, and such part of the city and county borough of Sheffield as lies to the west of the following boundary, namely :—

So much of the parishes of Bowland Forest Higher Division, Bowland Forest Lower Division, Easington, Slaidburn, Newton, Bentham, Clapham-cum-Newby, Austwick, Lawkland, Giggleswick, Rathmell, Wigglesworth, Gisburn Forest, Tosside, Bolton-by-Bowland, Sawley, Grindleton, West Bradford, Waddington, Bashall Eaves and Great Mitton as lies within the following boundary, namely :—

Commencing at a point where the London Midland and Scottish Railway from Lancaster to Long Preston crosses the county boundary near High Bentham, thence south-easterly along that railway to the point where it intersects the road from Settle to Rathmell, thence in a southerly direction along that road via Rathmell, Wigglesworth, Becks Brow Bottom, Pikeber, Mere Sike, Flass Gate, Forest Becks, Holden, Bolton Peel, and Bow Lathe to Sawley; thence continuing in a south westerly direction along the road from Sawley via Foxley Bank, Grindleton, Lane Side, Lower West Clough, West Bradford, Waddington, Bashall Bridge, Backridge, and Bashall to the River Hodder; thence following the county
