The following Statutes made by the University of Oxford, on the 7th day of June, 1927, have been submitted for the approval of His Majesty in Council, and notice of their having been so submitted is published in accordance with the provisions of "The Universities of Oxford and Cambridge Act, 1923":—

UNIVERSITY OF OXFORD.

STATUTE APPROVED BY CONGREGATION ON TUESDAY, JUNE 7, 1927.

WHEREAS it is expedient to provide in the Statutes of the University of Oxford that women shall be eligible to any Professorship, Readership, or other University Teachership: NOW the said University in exercise of the powers in that behalf conferred upon it by the Universities of Oxford and Cambridge Act, 1923, and of all other powers enabling it, ENACTS, SUBJECT TO THE APPROVAL OF HIS MAJESTY IN COUNCIL, AS FOLLOWS.

In Statt. Tit. IV. Sect. 1. § 1 (Statuta, ed. 1926, p. 52), after cl. 6 the following new clause shall be inserted: "Women shall be eligible to any Professorship, Readership, or other University Teachership, on the same conditions as men."

UNIVERSITY OF OXFORD.

STATUTE APPROVED BY CONGREGATION ON TUESDAY, JUNE 7, 1927.

WHEREAS it is expedient to amend clause 5 of the General Regulations concerning the duties of Professors contained in subsection 3 of Sectio I of Titulus IV of the Statutes of the University of Oxford: NOW the said University in exercise of the powers in that behalf conferred upon it by the Universities of Oxford and Cambridge Act, 1923, and of all other powers enabling it. ENACTS, SUBJECT TO THE APPROVAL OF HIS MAJESTY IN COUNCIL, AS FOLLOWS.

In Statt. Tit. IV. Sect. I. § 3, in clause 5 of the General Regulations (Statuta, ed. 1926, p. 58), (1) the words "of every Professor" shall be struck out and the words "and Instruction given by every Professor" shall be substituted, and (2) after the words "shall otherwise determine" the following words shall be added: "and any fees received for other Lectures or Instruction given by him in the University shall be applied towards meeting the expenses of the Department of which he is in charge, or, if he is not in charge of a Department, shall be paid to the Curators of the University Chest for the credit of the Common University Fund."

UNIVERSITY OF OXFORD.

STATUTE APPROVED BY CONGREGATION ON Tuesday, June 7, 1927.

WHEREAS it is expedient to amend Sectio 1 of Titulus IV of the Statutes of the University of Oxford so as to provide for the payment of special allowances to certain Professors in respect of their duties as Heads of Departments: NOW the said University, in exercise of the powers in that behalf conferred upon it by the Universities of Oxford and Cambridge Act, 1923, and of all other powers enabling it, ENACTS, SUBJECT TO THE APPROVAL OF HIS MAJESTY IN COUNCIL, AS FOLLOWS.

In Statt. Tit. IV. Sect. 1, after § 4 (Statuta, ed. 1926, p. 65) the following new sub-section shall be inserted:-

- " § 5. Concerning special allowances to certain Heads of Departments.
- 1. In addition to the emoluments provided under the previous sub-section each Professor in the Schedule annexed to this sub-section shall receive from the Government Grant a sum of £200 a year by way of special allowance in respect of his duties as Head of the Department of which he is in charge, provided that he shall undertake not to receive any direct or indirect payment from any funds of, or at the disposal of, his Department or Laboratory.
- 2. Any question arising as to the interpretation of the provisions of this sub-section may be referred to the Visitatorial Board and the decision of that Board shall be final

Temporary Provision.

3. No Professor who possesses a right to retain a portion of the fees received from Students working in his Department under the provisions of the Statute Concerning fees payable to certain Professors', as that Statute stood in 1914, shall be entitled to receive any emoluments under the provisions of this subsection unless he shall agree to renounce such right for so long as his name appears in the Schedule annexed hereto.

TENDERS FOR TREASURY BILLS.

- The persons whose Tenders are accepted will be informed of the same not later than the following day, and payment in full of the amounts of the accepted tenders must be made to the Bank of England by means of Cash or a Banker's Draft on the Bank of England not later than 2 o'clock (Saturday 12 o'clock) on the day on which the relative Bills are to be
- 7. In virtue of the provisions of Section 1 (4) of the War Loan Act, 1919, Members of the House of Commons are not precluded from tendering for these Bills.
- 8. Tenders must be made on the printed forms, which may be obtained from the Chief Cashier's Office, Bank of England.

SPECIAL REGULATIONS FOR THE NORMAL RE-CRUITMENT OF MALE ASSISTANT PREVENTIVE OFFICERS IN THE WATERGUARD SERVICE OF THE CUSTOMS AND EXCISE DEPARTMENT.

1. Candidates must have attained the age of 19 and must not have attained the age of 21 on the first day of the written examination.

In reckoning age for competition the following allowances will be made:—

- (i) Persons who have served or are serving in the Army, Navy or Air Force, may deduct from their actual age any time not exceeding two years during which they have served.
- (ii) Candidates who have served in any established civil situation to which they were admitted with the Certificate of the Civil Service Commissioners, may deduct from their actual age any time not exceeding two years which they may have spent in such service.
- 2. Candidates must be natural-born British subjects and the sons of fathers also natural-born British subjects: provided that exception may be made in the case of candidates serving in a civil situation to which they were admitted with the Certificate of the Civil Service Commissioners, and provided that exception to the latter condition of the rule may be made in the case of candidates who have served in H.M. Armed Forces during the Great War between the 4th August, 1914, and the 11th November, 1918.
- 3. No person actually serving in the Army, Navy or Air Force will be eligible for admission to the examination unless he produces to the Civil Service Commissioners, when called upon to do so, the permission of his Commanding Officer to attend the examination dated before the commencement of the examination and given in accordance with such orders as may from time to time be issued.

Persons holding situations in the Civil Service must obtain the permission of the authorities of their Department to attend the examination before the commencement of the examination.

Persons upon whose training for the occupation of teacher public money has been spent cannot be appointed until the consent of the appropriate education authority has been notified to the Civil Service Commissioners.

- 4. Candidates will be required to undergo a written examination in the following subjects:—
 - 1. English (including Writing and Spelling).
 - 2. Reading Manuscript.
 - Arithmetic.
 Geography.
 - 5. General knowledge.

And candidates who obtain such an aggregate of marks in this written examination as to satisfy the Civil Service Commissioners will be regarded as qualified to appear before the Selection Board. Success in the written

examination will not in itself confer any claim

to appointment.

5. Candidates who pass the written examination will be summoned for competitive interview by a Selection Board, and on the result of that interview the Selection Board will prepare a list of successful candidates, in order of merit, sufficient in number to fill such vacancies as have been reported to be filled on the result of the competition. Candidates interviewed by the Selection Board whose names are not included in that list will have no claim to an appointment.

6. Successful candidates will be required to satisfy the Civil Service Commissioners as to their health and character. They will be subjected to a rigid medical examination; they must possess full normal eyesight (without the aid of glasses) and good hearing; and they must be physically capable of performing the active

duties of the Waterguard Service.

7. Any attempt on the part of a candidate to enlist support for his application through Members of Parliament, or other influential persons, will disqualify him for appointment. The Selection Board will disregard spontaneous recommendations from persons who are not personally acquainted with the candidate's previous work.

8. Application to attend an examination must be made at such times and in such manner as may be fixed by the Civil Service

The Minister of Agriculture and Fisheries, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in him under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 to 1925, and of every other power enabling him in this behalf, hereby orders as follows:—

Authorisation of Landing of Animals for Exceptional Purposes.

1. The landing of the animals described in the First Schedule hereto, which are intended for exceptional purposes, is hereby allowed subject to the provisions of Part II (Quarantine) of the Third Schedule to the Diseases of Animals Act, 1894, and of the Foreign Animals (Quarantine) Order of 1896 and of this Order.

Definition of Quarantine Station.

2. The premises described in the Second Schedule hereto are hereby defined as a Foreign Animals Quarantine Station for the purpose of the detention of the Animals described in the First Schedule hereto.

Examination before Landing.

3. No such animals as aforesaid shall be landed except with a licence granted by an Inspector of the Ministry, which licence shall

not be granted unless and until the animals have been examined by a Veterinary Inspector of the Ministry and certified by him to be free from symptoms of contagious disease.

Regulations Applicable to the Animals on Landing.

4. The animals on being landed, shall forthwith be moved under the supervision of an Inspector of the Ministry of Agriculture and Fisheries from the quay to the premises described in the Second Schedule hereto, and shall be there detained for a period of twenty-eight days. During the said period the animals shall be kept separate from all other animals and no other animals shall be moved into such premises.
