**W**HEREAS by section 69 of the Government of Ireland Act, 1920, His Majesty is empowered by Order in Council to make such regulations as seem necessary or proper for setting in motion the Parliament and Government of Northern Ireland and also for any other matter for which it seems to His Majesty necessary or proper to make provision for the purpose of bringing the said Act into full operation or for giving full effect to any provision of the said Act; and in particular His Majesty is empowered amongst other things by any such Order in Council to make such adaptation of any enactments as appear to Him necessary or proper with respect to the execution of reserved services:

And whereas the public services in connection with the Supreme Court of Northern Ireland are reserved services:

And whereas subsection (5) of section 28 of the Purchase of Land (Ireland) Act, 1891, as adapted by Orders made under the Government of Ireland Act, 1920, provides that if and when the Judicial Commissioner is temporarily unable to attend, or his office is vacant, the Lord Chief Justice of Northern Ireland may nominate any judge of the High Court of Northern Ireland to act temporarily in his place, and the judge so nominated shall during such inability or vacancy have the same jurisdiction as if he were the Judicial Commissioner:

And whereas by the Land Purchase (Northern Ireland) Order, 1923, the powers of the Lord Chief Justice of Northern Ireland under the said subsection were saved notwithstanding anything in that Order:

And whereas in consequence of the smallness of the number of judges of the High Court of Northern Ireland as constituted by the Government of Ireland Act, 1920, it is necessary, in order to prevent the dislocation of judicial business, that the power aforesaid should be exercisable, not only with respect to judges of the High Court, but also the judges of the Court of Appeal of Northern Ireland:

And whereas the provisions of section one of the Rules Publication Act, 1893, have been complied with:

Now, therefore, His Majesty is pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:—

1. This Order may be cited as the Land Purchase (Northern Ireland) Order, 1927.

2. Subsection (5) of section 28 of the Purchase of Land (Ireland) Act, 1891, shall have effect as if for the words "judge of the High Court" there were substituted the words "judge of the Supreme Court."

WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of the Act of the 7th and 8th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 94, of the Act of the 13th and 14th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 94, and of the Act of the 32nd and 33rd years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 94, duly prepared, and laid before His Majesty in Council, a Scheme or Representation bearing date the 19th day of May, 1927, in the words and figures following, that is to say:—

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, acting under the provisions of the Act of the 7th and 8th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 94, of the Act of the 13th and 14th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 94, and of the Act of the 32nd and 33rd years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 94, have prepared, and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council, the following Scheme or Representation for altering the boundaries of the New Parish of Mount Pellon and the New Parish of Saint George, Ovenden, both in the County of York and in the Diocese of Wakefield:

"Whereas by the authority of an Order of Her said late Majesty in Council bearing date the 8th day of February, 1855, and published in the London Gazette on the 13th day of the same month a District Chapelry was assigned to the consecrated Church called Christ Church, situate at Mount Pellon, in the Parish of Halifax, in the said County of York and at that time in the Diocese of Ripon, but now in the said Diocese of Wakefield, and the said District Chapelry was named 'The District Chapelry of Mount Pellon':

"And whereas by the authority of another Order of Her said late Majesty in Council bearing date the 22nd day of February, 1878, and published in the London Gazette on the 26th day of the same month, a Consolidated Chapelry was assigned to the consecrated Church of Saint George, situate within the Township of Ovenden, in the Chapelry of Illingworth, in the said Parish of Halifax, and the said Consolidated Chapelry was named 'The Consolidated Chapelry of Saint George, Ovenden':

"And whereas the said District Chapelry of Mount Pellon and the said Consolidated Chapelry of Saint George, Ovenden, have

under the provisions of the Act of the 19th and 20th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 104, become New Parishes of the character contemplated by that Act, by the Act of the 6th and 7th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 37, and by the above-mentioned Act of the 32nd and 33rd years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 94:

"And whereas it has been represented to us, and it appears to us to be expedient that the boundaries of the said New Parish of Mount Pellon and the said New Parish of Saint George, Ovenden, should be altered in the manner which is hereinafter mentioned:

"Now, therefore, with the consent of the Right Reverend George Rodney, Bishop of Wakefield (in testimony whereof he has signed and sealed this Scheme or Representation), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, humbly represent, recommend and propose that from and after the day of the date of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme or Representation and without any assurance in the law other than such duly gazetted Order the boundaries of the said New Parish of Mount Pellon and the said New Parish of Saint George, Ovenden, shall be altered so that (first) all those portions of the said Chapelry of Illingworth and of the Chapelry of Luddenden, in the said Parish of Halifax, which are described in the First Schedule hereunder written and are delineated and set forth upon the map or plan hereunto annexed and are thereon coloured pink shall be dissevered from such Chapelries and shall be annexed to and shall in future form part of the said New Parish of Mount Pellon, and (secondly) all that portion of the said New Parish of Mount Pellon which is described in the Second Schedule hereunder written and is delineated and set forth upon the said map or plan hereunto annexed and is thereon coloured green shall be dissevered from such New Parish and shall be annexed to and shall in future form part of the said New Parish of Saint George, Ovenden.

"And we further represent, recommend and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from representing, recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid, or any of them, in accordance with the provisions of the hereinbefore mentioned Acts or of any of them, or of any other Act of Parliament.

"THE SCHEDULES to which the foregoing Scheme or Representation has reference.

#### "THE FIRST SCHEDULE.

"The territory to be annexed to the New Parish of Mount Pellon, in the County of York and in the Diocese of Wakefield, being:—

"I. All that portion of the Chapelry of Illingworth, in the Parish of Halifax, in the said County and Diocese, which is bounded upon part of the east, and upon the south east by the said New Parish of Mount Pellon, upon the west by the Chapelry of Luddenden, in the said Parish of Halifax, and upon the remaining sides that is to say, upon the north, upon the north east and upon the remaining part of the east, by an imaginary line commencing at the point where the boundary which divides the said Chapelry of Luddenden

from the said Chapelry of Illingworth crosses the middle of Clough Lane near its junction with the road leading past the western side of the tumulus known as Ring Camp, and extending thence first eastward and then north-eastward along the middle of Clough Lane for a distance of 27 chains or thereabouts to its junction with Moor End Road, and extending thence first eastward, then south eastward and then south westward along the middle of Moor End Road for a distance of 46½ chains or thereabouts to its junction with the footpath leading past the western end of Ramsden Wood into the road connecting Mount Tabor and Mount Pellon, and extending thence first south eastward and then southward along the middle of the said footpath for a distance of 10 chains or thereabouts to the boundary which divides the said Chapelry of Illingworth from the said New Parish of Mount Pellon.

"II. And also all that portion of the said Chapelry of Luddenden which is bounded upon the east partly by the said Chapelry of Illingworth and partly by the New Parish of Saint John, Ovenden, in the said County and Diocese, upon the north east by the last named New Parish, upon the north by the New Parish of Oxenhope, in the said County of York and in the Diocese of Bradford, and upon the remaining sides, that is to say, upon the west and upon the south west by an imaginary line commencing upon the boundary which divides the said New Parish of Oxenhope from the said Chapelry of Luddenden at the point in the middle of Fly Flat Reservoir where the boundaries of the Civil Parish of Oxenhope, the Civil Parish of Midgley and the Civil Parish of Halifax all meet, and extending thence south eastward and in a straight line for a distance of 1 mile and 32 chains or thereabouts to a point west of the house known as Haigh Cote in the middle of the ford across the stream which flows into the Northern end of Haigh Cote Dam, and extending thence southward and in a straight line (thereby crossing the south western corner of Leadbeater Dam and Castle Carr Road) for a distance of 1 mile and 7 chains or thereabouts to the centre of Caty Well Bridge which carries Saltonstall Lane across Caty Well Brook, and extending thence south eastward along the middle of Saltonstall Lane for a distance of 15 chains or thereabouts to its junction with the road leading to Wainstalls House, and extending thence south eastward and in a straight line for a distance of 35 chains or thereabouts to the point where the road leading from the house known as Upper Shaw Booth into Spanefield Lane is joined by the footpath leading from the houses known as Sandy Ford, and extending thence south westward along the middle of the last mentioned road for a distance of 2 chains or thereabouts to its junction with Spanefield Lane, and extending thence south eastward along the middle of Spanefield Lane for a distance of 21 chains or thereabouts to its junction with Stocks Lane, and extending thence south westward along the middle of Stocks Lane for a distance of 8 chains or thereabouts to a point opposite to the middle of the road leading to the Sentry Edge Quarries, and extending thence in a straight line due south east (thereby crossing the said quarries) for a distance of 14½ chains or thereabouts to the

boundary which divides the said Chapelry of Luddenden from the said Chapelry of Illingworth.

#### "THE SECOND SCHEDULE.

"The territory to be dissevered from the said New Parish of Mount Pellon and to be annexed to the New Parish of Saint George, Ovenden, in the said County of York and in the said Diocese of Wakefield, being:—

"All that portion of the said New Parish of Mount Pellon which is bounded upon the north east partly by the said Chapelry of Illingworth and partly by the said New Parish of Saint George, Ovenden, upon the east by the last named New Parish and upon the remaining sides, that is to say, upon the south, upon the south west, and upon the west, by an imaginary line commencing upon the boundary which divides the said New Parish of Saint George, Ovenden, from the said New Parish of Mount Pellon at the junction of Shroggs Road with Hebble Lane, and extending thence first north westward, then westward and then again north westward along the middle of Hebble Lane for a distance of 44½ chains or thereabouts to its junction with Wood Lane and the road called Scar Head, and extending thence first north westward and then north eastward along the middle of Scar Head for a distance of 16 chains or thereabouts to its junction with Boy Lane upon the boundary which divides the said New Parish of Mount Pellon from the said Chapelry of Illingworth."

And whereas drafts of the said Scheme or Representation have been transmitted to the Patrons and to the Incumbents of the Cures affected by the arrangements which are contemplated by such Scheme or Representation and such Patrons and Incumbents have respectively signified their assent thereto:

And whereas the said Scheme or Representation has been approved by His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said Scheme or Representation, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Acts.

And His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said Diocese of Wakefield.

and 5th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 39, and the Act of the 31st and 32nd years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 114, duly prepared, and laid before His Majesty in Council, a Scheme, bearing date the 19th day of May, 1927, in the words and figures following, that is to say:—

“ We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of the Act of the 33rd and 34th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 39, and of the Acts therein mentioned, that is to say, the Act of the 3rd and 4th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 113, the Act of the 4th and 5th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 39, and the Act of the 31st and 32nd years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 114, have prepared, and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council, the following Scheme for effecting a transfer of the ownership of the Advowson or perpetual right of Patronage of and presentation to the Churches and Cure (hereinafter called ‘ the said Benefice ’) of Holme with Langford, in the County of Nottingham and in the Diocese of Southwell:

“ Whereas the Advowson or perpetual right of Patronage of and presentation to the said Benefice of Holme with Langford is vested for an estate in fee simple without incumbrances in the Master, Fellows and Scholars of the College of the Holy and Undivided Trinity within the Town and University of Cambridge of King Henry the Eighth’s Foundation (hereinafter called ‘ the said Master, Fellows and Scholars ’):

“ And whereas the said Master, Fellows and Scholars are desirous that the whole Advowson or perpetual right of Patronage of and presentation to the said Benefice of Holme with Langford, now vested in them as aforesaid, should be transferred to and be vested in the Bishop of Southwell for the time being:

“ And whereas the Right Reverend Bernard Oliver Francis, now Bishop of Southwell, is willing to accept such transfer, and in token of such his willingness and also in token that the same transfer has that consent of the Bishop of the Diocese which by the Acts in the hereinbefore mentioned Act recited or by some or one of them is made necessary he, the said Bernard Oliver Francis, Bishop of Southwell, has executed this Scheme as hereinafter mentioned:

“ And whereas the transfer of the Patronage of the said Benefice of Holme with Langford which is hereinbefore mentioned and hereinafter recommended and proposed will in our opinion tend to make better provision for the Cure of Souls in the Parishes or Districts in or in respect of which the right of Patronage or Advowson so recommended and proposed to be transferred as aforesaid arises or exists, that is to say, in the Parishes of Holme and Langford:

“ Now, therefore, with the consent of the said Master, Fellows and Scholars (in testimony whereof they have affixed their Common or Corporate Seal to this Scheme) and with the consent of the said Bernard Oliver Francis, Bishop of Southwell (in testimony whereof he has signed this Scheme and sealed the same with his Episcopal Seal), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, humbly recommend and propose that upon and from the day of the date of the publication in the

London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme and without any conveyance or assurance in the law other than such duly gazetted Order the whole Advowson or perpetual right of Patronage of and presentation to the said Benefice of Holme with Langford, now vested in them, the said Master, Fellows and Scholars as aforesaid, shall be transferred to the said Bernard Oliver Francis, Bishop of Southwell, and his successors in the same Bishopric, and shall thereupon and thenceforth become and be absolutely vested in and shall and may from time to time be exercised by the said Bernard Oliver Francis, Bishop of Southwell, and by his successors in the same Bishopric for ever.

“ And we further recommend and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any further or other measures relating to the matters aforesaid, or any of them, in accordance with the provisions of the said Acts, or of any of them, or of any other Act of Parliament.”

And whereas the said Scheme has been approved by His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said Scheme, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Acts.

And His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said Diocese of Southwell.

"And whereas by the authority of another Order of Her said late Majesty in Council bearing date the 8th day of February, 1890, and published in the London Gazette on the 11th day of the same month a District Chapelry was assigned to the consecrated Church of Saint Peter, Allerton, situate in the District Parish of Wilsden cum Allerton, in the said County of York and at that time in the said Diocese of Ripon but now in the said Diocese of Bradford, and the said District Chapelry was named 'The District Chapelry of Saint Peter, Allerton':

"And whereas the said District Chapelry of Saint Philip, Gírlington, and the said District Chapelry of Saint Peter, Allerton, have, under the provisions of the Act of the 19th and 20th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 104, become New Parishes of the character contemplated by that Act, by the Act of the 6th and 7th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 37, and by the above mentioned Act of the 32nd and 33rd years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 94:

#### "THE FIRST SCHEDULE.

"The territory to be annexed to the District of Saint Saviour, Bradford, in the County of York and in the Diocese of Bradford, being:—

"I. All those contiguous portions of the New Parish of Saint Philip, Gírlington, and of the New Parish of Saint Peter, Allerton, both in the said County and Diocese, which, taken together, are bounded upon the south and upon the south east by the said District of Saint Saviour, Bradford, and upon the remaining sides, that is to say, upon the north east, upon the north, and upon the west, by an imaginary line commencing upon the boundary which divides the said District of Saint Saviour, Bradford, from the said New Parish of Saint Philip, Gírlington, at the junction of Crow Tree Lane with Allerton Road, and extending thence first north westward and then westward along the middle of Allerton Road for a distance of 29½ chains or thereabouts to its junction with the new road called Rhodesway, and extending thence southward along the middle of the said new road (thereby crossing the boundary which divides the said New Parish of Saint Philip, Gírlington, from the said New Parish of Saint Peter, Allerton) for a distance of 33½ chains or thereabouts to the boundary which divides the said New Parish of Saint Peter, Allerton, from the said District of Saint Saviour, Bradford.

"II. And also all that other portion of the said New Parish of Saint Peter, Allerton, which is bounded upon the south by the New Parish of Saint James, Thornton, in the said County and Diocese, upon the east by the said District of Saint Saviour, Bradford, and upon the remaining side, that is to say, upon the north west, by an imaginary line commencing upon the boundary which divides the said District of Saint Saviour, Bradford, from the said New Parish of Saint Peter, Allerton, at a point in the middle of the said new road called Rhodesway opposite to the middle of the footpath leading past Oak Cottages into Chapel Lane, and extending thence south westward along the middle of the said new road for a distance of 3 chains or thereabouts to its junction with Thornton Road, and extending thence south westward along the middle of Thornton Road for a distance of 17 chains or

thereabouts to the boundary which divides the said New Parish of Saint Peter, Allerton, from the said New Parish of Saint James, Thornton.

“ All that portion of the said District of Saint Saviour, Bradford, which is bounded upon the north east, upon the north west and upon the west by the said New Parish of Saint Peter, Allerton, and upon the remaining sides, that is to say, upon the south east and upon the east, by an imaginary line commencing upon the boundary which divides the said New Parish of Saint Peter, Allerton, from the said District of Saint Saviour, Bradford, at the said point in the middle of the new road called Rhodesway opposite to the middle of the footpath leading past Oak Cottages into Chapel Lane, and extending thence first north eastward and then northward along the middle of the said new road for a distance of 20 chains or thereabouts to the boundary which divides the said District of Saint Saviour, Bradford, from the said New Parish of Saint Peter, Allerton.”

And whereas drafts of the said Scheme or Representation have been transmitted to the Patrons and to the Incumbents of the Cures affected by the arrangements which are contemplated by such Scheme or Representation and such Patrons and Incumbents have respectively signified their assent thereto:

And whereas the said Scheme or Representation has been approved by His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said Scheme or Representation, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Acts.

And His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said Diocese of Bradford.

“ And whereas the said Benefices of Sampford Courtnay and Belstone are now full, the Reverend Henry Beaumont Fowke Burnaby being the present Incumbent of the said Benefice of Sampford Courtnay, the Reverend Herbert Wilson Milner being the present Incumbent of the said Benefice of Belstone and the said Benefice of Honeychurch is at present vacant:

“ And whereas only one Parsonage House will be left standing or remaining within or belonging to the United Benefice of Sampford Courtnay with Honeychurch when the union which is hereinafter recommended and proposed shall take effect namely the Parsonage House belonging to the said Benefice of Sampford Courtnay:

“ And whereas the Advowson or perpetual right of Patronage of and presentation to each of the said two Benefices of Honeychurch and Sampford Courtnay now belongs to one and the same Patron or Patrons:

“ Now, therefore, we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, with the consent of the said William, Bishop of Exeter (in testimony whereof he has signed this Scheme), do humbly recommend and propose to Your Majesty as follows, that is to say:—

“ 1. That the said Benefice of Honeychurch and the said Benefice of Sampford Courtnay shall be permanently united together and form

one Benefice with Cure of Souls under the style of ‘ The United Benefice of Sampford Courtnay with Honeychurch ’ but the Parishes of the said Benefices shall continue distinct in all respects.

“ 2. That a portion of the said Parish of Sampford Courtnay that is to say so much of the said Parish of Sampford Courtnay as is delineated and set forth upon the map or plan hereto annexed and thereon coloured green (including Sticklepath, Park Cottage, Combehead, Bude, Langland, West Willey and East Willey) shall be dissevered from the said Parish of Sampford Courtnay and shall become and be for all ecclesiastical purposes annexed to the said Parish of Belstone, provided always that no alteration shall be made in the Patronage of the said Benefice of Belstone by reason of such alteration of boundaries.

“ 3. That with the consent of the said Henry Beaumont Fowke Burnaby (testified by his signing this Scheme) (a) the union recommended in Clause 1 of this Scheme shall take effect immediately upon the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council affirming this Scheme and the said Henry Beaumont Fowke Burnaby shall become the first Incumbent of the United Benefice of Sampford Courtnay with Honeychurch, and (b) if upon the day aforesaid the said Benefice of Belstone shall be vacant the alteration of boundaries recommended in Clause 2 of this Scheme shall also immediately take effect but if upon that day the said Benefice of Belstone shall be full then such alteration of boundaries shall take effect upon the next avoidance thereafter of the said Benefice of Belstone.

“ 4. That upon the said union taking effect the Parsonage House at present belonging to the said Benefice of Sampford Courtnay shall become and be the house of residence for the Incumbent of the United Benefice of Sampford Courtnay with Honeychurch.

“ 5. That upon the alteration of boundaries contemplated by Clause 2 of this Scheme taking effect all the Tithe Rent Charge, glebe lands, and all other the endowments belonging to the said United Benefice or which may hereafter belong to the United Benefice of Sampford Courtnay with Honeychurch shall be charged and for ever after be chargeable in favour of the Incumbent for the time being of the said Benefice of Belstone with the annual sum or yearly rentcharge hereinafter mentioned, that is to say, a clear annual sum or yearly rentcharge of £200, the same annual sum or yearly rentcharge to be as from the date of the said union taking effect, due and payable to the Incumbent in whose favour it is charged and the said annual sum or yearly rentcharge to be apportionable between any outgoing Incumbent of the said Benefice of Belstone, or his representatives on the one hand and his successor in the same Incumbency on the other hand, and to be receivable by the Incumbent in whose favour it is charged as aforesaid by equal half yearly payments on the first day of June and the first day of December in every year: and for the recovery of the said yearly rentcharge the Incumbent of the said Benefice of Belstone shall have and be entitled to all the powers and remedies provided by Sections 121 and 122 of the Law of

Property Act, 1925, in respect of rentcharges to which those Sections apply. Provided always that if at any time the Incumbent for the time being of the said United Benefice shall by any Deed duly executed by him under his hand and seal in accordance with the provisions of any Statute in that behalf enabling him, grant, convey and annex to the said Benefice of Belstone any part or parts of the endowments belonging to the said United Benefice which shall in the opinion of the Bishop of Exeter for the time being be a just and fair equivalent or not less than an equivalent for the yearly rentcharge hereby created as aforesaid, then the said yearly rentcharge shall thereupon and thenceforth cease and be no longer payable, but provided nevertheless that for so long as the said Henry Beaumont Fowke Burnaby shall continue to be Incumbent of the United Benefice the amount of such annual sum or yearly rentcharge shall be reduced to £100, and the full annual sum or yearly rentcharge of £200 hereby created as aforesaid shall not become payable before the avoidance of the United Benefice by the said Henry Beaumont Fowke Burnaby.

" And provided further that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid, or any of them, in accordance with the provisions of the said Measure, or of any other Measure of the National Assembly of the Church of England, or of any Act of Parliament."

And whereas drafts of the said Scheme have been duly published in accordance with the provisions of the said Union of Benefices Measure, 1923, and Notices have been transmitted to the persons or bodies entitled under the same Measure to receive Notice requiring any objections to such draft Scheme to be stated or transmitted in writing to the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners within the time prescribed in the Statutory Rules applicable to proceedings under the said Union of Benefices Measure, 1923:

And whereas the prescribed time has elapsed and no such objections have been so stated or transmitted to the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners:

And whereas public notice of the certification to His Majesty in Council of the said Scheme and the consent thereto in writing of the Bishop of Exeter has been duly given in the manner and within the time prescribed in the Statutory Rules aforesaid:

And whereas the said Scheme has been approved by His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to affirm the said Scheme and to order and direct that the said Scheme and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the date when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Measure.

And His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said Diocese of Exeter.

WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of the Union of Benefices Measure, 1923, duly prepared, and laid before His Majesty in Council, a Scheme bearing date the 2nd day of June, 1927, in the words and figures following, that is to say:—

" We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, acting in pursuance of the Union of Benefices Measure, 1923, have prepared, and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council, the following Scheme for effecting the union of the Benefice (being a Rectory) of Sulham and the Benefice (being a Rectory) of Tidmarsh, both of which Benefices are situate in the County of Berks and in the Diocese of Oxford:

" Whereas Commissioners appointed at our request by the Right Reverend Thomas, Bishop of Oxford, pursuant to the provisions of the said Union of Benefices Measure, 1923, to inquire into and report upon the union of the said two Benefices of Sulham and Tidmarsh duly made their Report to the said Bishop of Oxford and therein recommended the union of the said two Benefices and the terms for effecting the union, and the said Bishop of Oxford signified in writing his approval of the said Report:

" And whereas we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, have prepared this Scheme for the union of the said two Benefices based upon the terms recommended in the said Report:

" And whereas both of the said Benefices of Sulham and Tidmarsh are now full, the Reverend Henry Charles Wilder being the present Incumbent of the said Benefice of Sulham and the Reverend Thomas Sterling O'Reilly being the present Incumbent of the said Benefice of Tidmarsh:

" Now, therefore, we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, with the consent of the said Thomas, Bishop of Oxford (in testimony whereof he has signed this Scheme), do humbly recommend and propose to Your Majesty as follows, that is to say:—

" 1. That the said Benefice of Sulham and the said Benefice of Tidmarsh shall be permanently united together and form one Benefice with Cure of Souls under the style of 'The United Benefice of Tidmarsh with Sulham' but the Parishes of the said Benefices shall continue distinct in all respects.

" 2. That if upon the day when any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme shall be published in the London Gazette both of the said two Benefices shall be vacant, the union of the same two Benefices shall take effect forthwith: and if the said Benefice of Sulham only shall be then vacant the said union shall also take effect forthwith if the Incumbent of the other of the said two Benefices shall consent to become the first Incumbent of the United Benefice, but if he shall not so consent, then the said union shall take effect upon the then next avoidance of the said Benefice of Tidmarsh and the then Incumbent of Sulham shall be the first Incum-

bent of the United Benefice: and if the said Benefice of Tidmarsh only shall be then vacant the said union shall take effect upon the next avoidance of the said Benefice of Sulham: and if neither of the said two Benefices be then vacant, then the said union shall take effect on the next avoidance of the said Benefice of Sulham if the Incumbent at that time of the said Benefice of Tidmarsh shall have been instituted to Tidmarsh subsequently to the date of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme or if instituted before that date shall consent to become the Incumbent of the United Benefice: but if he shall have been instituted to Tidmarsh before that date and shall not so consent, then the said union shall take effect immediately upon the next vacancy of the Benefice of Tidmarsh following such avoidance of the Benefice of Sulham and the then Incumbent of Sulham shall become the first Incumbent of the United Benefice.

" 3. That if at the date when the said union shall take effect a new Parsonage House shall have been provided for the said Benefice of Tidmarsh in a situation suitable in the opinion of the Bishop of the said Diocese of Oxford for the residence of the Incumbent of the United Benefice such house shall become and be the house of residence for the Incumbent of the United Benefice but otherwise the Parsonage House then belonging to the said Benefice of Tidmarsh and the site and appurtenances thereof and the grounds usually occupied and enjoyed therewith shall so soon as conveniently may be after the said union has taken effect be sold and disposed of by us the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners at such time or times and in such manner in all respects as to us shall seem expedient and that the net proceeds of such sale shall be appropriated towards the cost of providing a new Parsonage House in a suitable position in the Parish of Tidmarsh as and for a house of residence for the Incumbent of the United Benefice.

" 4. That upon the said union taking effect the Parsonage House at present belonging to the said Benefice of Sulham and the site and appurtenances thereof and the grounds usually occupied and enjoyed therewith shall be sold and disposed of by us the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners at such time or times and in such manner in all respects as to us shall seem expedient and that the net proceeds of such sale shall be appropriated by us for the benefit of the United Benefice either towards defraying the cost of a new Parsonage House provided or to be provided as aforesaid for the Incumbent of the United Benefice or towards the augmentation of the endowment of the United Benefice.

" 5. That after the said union has taken effect the course and succession in which the respective Patrons shall present or nominate to the United Benefice from time to time as the same shall become vacant shall be as follows, that is to say, the right of presentation shall be exercised by the Patrons of the said two Benefices alternately, the Patron of the said Benefice of Sulham having the right upon the first presentation to the United Benefice to be made after the union and every alternate right of presentation and the Patron of the said Benefice of Tidmarsh having the right of presentation upon the second presenta-

tion to the United Benefice to be made after the union and every alternate turn thereafter.

" Provided always that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid, or any of them, in accordance with the provisions of the said Measure, or of any other Measure of the National Assembly of the Church of England, or of any Act of Parliament."

And whereas drafts of the said Scheme have been duly published in accordance with the provisions of the said Union of Benefices Measure, 1923, and Notices have been transmitted to the persons or bodies entitled under the same Measure to receive Notice requiring any objections to such draft Scheme to be stated or transmitted in writing to the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners within the time prescribed in the Statutory Rules applicable to proceedings under the said Union of Benefices Measure, 1923:

And whereas the prescribed time has elapsed and no such objections have been so stated or transmitted to the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners:

And whereas public notice of the certification to His Majesty in Council of the said Scheme and the consent thereto in writing of the Bishop of Oxford has been duly given in the manner and within the time prescribed in the Statutory Rules aforesaid:

And whereas the said Scheme has been approved by His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to affirm the said Scheme and to order that the Benefices therein recommended to be united shall be united to the extent and for the purposes recommended in the said Scheme, and further to order and direct that the said Scheme and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the date when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Measure.

And His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said Diocese of Oxford.

WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of the Act of the 6th and 7th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 37, duly prepared, and laid before His Majesty in Council, a Scheme, bearing date the 23rd day of June, 1927, in the words and figures following, that is to say:—

" We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of the Act of the 6th and 7th years of Her late Majesty Queen

Victoria, Chapter 37, have prepared, and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council, the following Scheme for constituting a separate District for spiritual purposes to be taken partly out of the Parish of Romford and partly out of the New Parish (some-time Consolidated Chapelry) of Saint Chad, Chadwell Heath, both in the County of Essex and in the Diocese of Chelmsford:

"Whereas we are satisfied that the said Parish of Romford and the said New Parish of Saint Chad, Chadwell Heath, are Cures wherein or in parts whereof the provision for public worship and for pastoral superintendence is insufficient for the spiritual wants of the inhabitants thereof and it has been made to appear to us that it would promote the interests of religion that the particular portions of the said Parish of Romford and of the said New Parish of Saint Chad, Chadwell Heath, which are hereinafter mentioned and described should be constituted a separate District in the manner which is hereinafter set forth:

"And whereas there is not at present within the limits of the said proposed separate District any consecrated Church or Chapel in use for the purposes of Divine Worship:

"And whereas for the purpose of providing an endowment for the said proposed District Amelia Florence Pemberton, of The Round House, Havering Atte Bower, Romford, in the said County of Essex, Spinster, has contributed and paid to the credit of our account at the Bank of England a sum of £6,000 to be held in trust by us towards the endowment of the said proposed District and, so soon as the said District shall have become a New Parish under the provisions of the herein-before mentioned Act, then of the said New Parish and towards the maintenance of the Minister or Incumbent thereof for the time being:

"And whereas we have in respect of the said sum of £6,000 agreed and undertaken to provide and pay by equal quarterly payments on the 1st day of February, the 1st day of May, the 1st day of August and the 1st day of November in each and every year to the Minister or Incumbent of the said proposed separate District or New Parish, so soon as a Minister shall have been duly licensed in accordance with the provisions of the herein-before mentioned Act, the sum of £270 per annum so long as the said capital sum shall remain in our hands:

"And whereas the said capital sum of £6,000 has been so contributed and paid as aforesaid upon the understanding and condition that (such arrangement appearing to us to be expedient) we should recommend and propose to Your Majesty in Council that the whole right of Patronage of the said District or New Parish and of the nomination of the Minister or Incumbent thereto should be assigned in the manner hereinafter set forth:

"And whereas the said Amelia Florence Pemberton, as the contributor of the said capital sum of £6,000, has nominated herself, the said Amelia Florence Pemberton, for her life and after her death the Reverend Henry Charles Robins, of The Vicarage, Romford, Clerk in Holy Orders, the Reverend Sydney Lawrence Brown, of Fryerning, Ingatestone,

in the said County of Essex, Doctor in Divinity, Clerk in Holy Orders and an Honorary Canon of the Cathedral Church of Chelmsford, the Reverend William Frank Hellyer, of The Vicarage, Chadwell Heath, in the said County of Essex, Clerk in Holy Orders, the Reverend William John Sparrow Simpson, of Saint Mary's Hospital, Great Ilford, in the said County of Essex, Doctor in Divinity, Clerk in Holy Orders and an Honorary Canon of the Cathedral Church of Chelmsford, and the Venerable Percy Matheson Bayne, of Number 88, Romford Road, Stratford, in the said County of Essex, Clerk in Holy Orders and Archdeacon of Southend, their heirs and assigns, as the persons to whom she desires that the whole right of Patronage of the said proposed District or New Parish (as the case may be) shall be assigned:

"Now, therefore, with the consent of the Right Reverend Guy, Bishop of Chelmsford (in testimony whereof he has signed and sealed this Scheme), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, humbly recommend and propose that all those portions of the said Parish of Romford and of the said New Parish of Saint Chad, Chadwell Heath, which are described in the Schedule hereunder written, all which portions together with the boundaries thereof, are delineated and set forth upon the map or plan hereunto annexed, shall upon and from the day of the date of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme become and be constituted a separate District for spiritual purposes and that the same shall be named 'The District of the Ascension, Collier Row, Romford':

"And we further recommend and propose that without any assurance in the law other than this Scheme and any duly gazetted Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying the same the right of Patronage of the said District so recommended to be constituted and, when such District shall have become a New Parish as aforesaid, then of such New Parish, and of the nomination of the Minister or Incumbent thereof, shall upon and from the day of the date of the publication in the London Gazette of such Order of Your Majesty in Council, be assigned to and become and be vested in and shall and may from time to time be exercised by the said Amelia Florence Pemberton for her life and that after her death the whole right of Patronage of the said proposed District or New Parish shall be vested in and shall and may be exercised by the said Henry Charles Robins, Sydney Lawrence Brown, William Frank Hellyer, William John Sparrow Simpson and Percy Matheson Bayne, their heirs and assigns for ever upon the trusts declared by a certain Deed already prepared and intended to be executed by the said Henry Charles Robins, Sydney Lawrence Brown, William Frank Hellyer, William John Sparrow Simpson and Percy Matheson Bayne.

"And we further recommend and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid, or any of them, in accordance with the provisions of the said Act, or of any other Act of Parliament.

"THE SCHEDULE to which the foregoing Scheme has reference.

"The District of the Ascension, Collier Row, Romford, comprising:—

"I. All that portion of the Parish of Romford, in the County of Essex and in the Diocese of Chelmsford, which is bounded upon the west by the New Parish (sometime Consolidated Chapelry) of Saint Chad, Chadwell Heath, upon the north and upon part of the east by the Parish of Havering atte Bower, both in the said County and Diocese, and upon the remaining sides, that is to say, upon the remaining part of the east and upon the south, by an imaginary line commencing at the point where the boundary which divides the said Parish of Havering atte Bower from the said Parish of Romford crosses the middle of Havering Road near its junction with Chase Cross Road, and extending thence first southward, then south westward, then south eastward and then again southward along the middle of Havering Road for a distance of 1 mile and 13 chains or thereabouts to its junction with Collier Row Lane, and extending thence south westward and in a straight line (thereby crossing Rosedale Road and Hainault Road) for a distance of 35 chains or thereabouts to the centre of the bridge which carries Mawneys Road across the River Rom, and extending thence first north westward and then in various directions along the middle of the River Rom for a distance of 32 chains or thereabouts to the centre of the footbridge which carries across such stream the footpath leading from Cross Road into Collier Row Road north of Marks Gate, and extending thence first south westward, then north westward, then westward and then again north westward along the middle of such footpath for a distance of 33 chains or thereabouts to the boundary which divides the said Parish of Romford from the said New Parish of Saint Chad, Chadwell Heath.

"II. And also all that contiguous portion of the said New Parish of Saint Chad, Chadwell Heath, which is bounded upon the south west partly by the New Parish of Saint Peter, Aldborough Hatch, and partly by the New Parish of the Trinity, Barking Side, upon the north west partly by the New Parish of Chigwell Row and partly by the Parish of Lambourne, all in the said County and Diocese, upon the east partly by the said Parish of Havering atte Bower and partly by the said Parish of Romford, and upon the remaining sides, that is to say, upon the south, by an imaginary line commencing upon the boundary which divides the said Parish of Romford from the said New Parish of Saint Chad, Chadwell Heath, at a point on the eastern side of Whalebone Lane opposite to the middle of Rose Lane, and extending thence first westward across Whalebone Lane to a point in the middle of Rose Lane and then first westward and then north westward along the middle of Rose Lane for a distance in all of 21½ chains or thereabouts to its junction with the footpath leading to Padnall Place, and extending thence south westward along the middle of the last mentioned footpath for a distance of 11 chains or thereabouts to the boundary which divides the said New Parish of Saint Chad, Chadwell Heath, from the said New Parish of Saint Peter, Aldborough Hatch."

And whereas drafts of the said Scheme have, in accordance with the provisions of the hereinbefore mentioned Act, been transmitted to the Patrons and to the Incumbents of the Cures out of which it is intended that the District recommended in such Scheme to be constituted shall be taken, and such Patrons and Incumbents have respectively signified their assent to such Scheme:

And whereas the said Scheme has been approved by His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said Scheme, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Act.

And His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said Diocese of Chelmsford.

WHEREAS the Right Reverend Frank Theodore, Lord Bishop of Winchester, has, under Section 26 of the Pluralities Act, 1838, made a Representation to the Right Honourable and Most Reverend Randall Thomas, Lord Archbishop of Canterbury, in the following terms:—

"We, Frank Theodore, Lord Bishop of Winchester, in pursuance of the twenty-sixth section of the Pluralities Act, 1838, do hereby represent to Your Grace as follows:—

"That there is in the County of Hants and our Diocese of Winchester the Extra-parochial place or district commonly known as Wood Green, portions of which are detached from the main area. The population of the said Extra-parochial district is two hundred and sixty-seven or thereabouts.

"That there is also in the same County and Diocese the Rectory or Benefice of Hale the Parish whereof contains a population of three hundred or thereabouts with accommodation in the Parish Church for one hundred and fifty persons.

"The net annual value of the said Benefice of Hale is Two hundred and sixty pounds or thereabouts.

"That there is no Church for the said Extra-parochial district commonly known as Wood Green and the inhabitants thereof have been in the habit of worshipping in a Mission Room situate in the Parish of Breamore hereinafter mentioned and the Incumbent of the said Parish of Breamore has from time to time exercised the office of spiritual minister over the said district.

"That there is also in the same County and Diocese the Rectory or Benefice of Breamore the Parish whereof contains a population of five hundred and eight or thereabouts with accommodation in the Parish Church for two hundred and forty persons."

" The net annual value of the said Benefice of Breamore is Seven hundred and forty pounds or thereabouts.

" That it appears to us and we do hereby represent to Your Grace that under the provisions of the said Pluralities Act, 1838, the said Extra-parochial district commonly known as Wood Green the boundaries of which are more particularly delineated on the plan annexed to the Scheme appending to this Representation and are thereon verged pink may with advantage be annexed to the said Parish of Hale to which it is contiguous.

" That it further appears to us that a portion of the said Parish of Breamore which portion contains an area of 210 square yards or thereabouts and is more particularly delineated on the said plan and thereon coloured green may be advantageously separated therefrom and be annexed to the said Parish of Hale to which Parish it may be more conveniently annexed.

" Thomas Vernon Booth Booth-Jones of Hale Park Breamore aforesaid is the Patron of the Benefice of Hale and Sir Hamilton Hulse Baronet of The Grange East Cliff Bournemouth in the County of Hants is the Patron of the Benefice of Breamore.

" The Reverend Arthur Percy Skene is the present Incumbent of the Benefice of Hale and the Reverend Roynon Jones Washington Latimer is the present Incumbent of the Benefice of Breamore.

" That pursuant to the directions contained in the said twenty-sixth section of the Pluralities Act, 1838, we, the said Lord Bishop have drawn up a Scheme in writing annexed to this Representation describing the mode in which it appears to us that the alterations proposed may best be effected and how the changes consequent on such alterations in respect of Ecclesiastical jurisdiction, Glebe lands, Tithes rent charges, and other Ecclesiastical dues, rates and payments, and in respect of Patronage and rights to pews may be made with justice to all parties interested and we do hereby submit the same to Your Grace together with the Consents in writing of the respective Patrons and Incumbents of the said Benefices to the intent that if Your Grace shall on full consideration and enquiry be satisfied with such Scheme you may certify the same and such consents as aforesaid to His Majesty in Council."

And whereas the said Scheme drawn up by the said Bishop and the Consents referred to in the said Representation are as follows:—

#### " SCHEME.

" It is proposed that the Extra-parochial district commonly known as Wood Green the boundaries of which are more particularly delineated on the plan hereunto annexed and are thereon verged pink shall be annexed for ecclesiastical purposes to the Parish of Hale to which it is contiguous.

" That the Incumbent of the Parish of Hale shall have the sole and exclusive Cure of Souls within the said Extra-parochial district commonly known as Wood Green and such district shall be subject to the same ecclesiastical jurisdiction as the Parish of Hale.

" That the inhabitants of the said Extra-parochial district commonly known as Wood

Green shall be entitled to accommodation in the Parish Church of Hale.

" That marriages, baptisms, churchings and burials, arising out of the said Extra-parochial district shall be solemnized and performed in the Church of the said Parish of Hale and all fees, dues, ecclesiastical offerings, and emoluments arising from or in respect of such Extra-parochial district shall henceforth belong to the Incumbent of the Parish of Hale.

" That the inhabitants of the said Extra-parochial district shall become liable in common with the inhabitants of the Parish of Hale to the repairs of the Parish Church of Hale.

" That no alteration shall be made in the Patronage of the said Benefice of Hale.

" It is also proposed that a portion of the Parish of Breamore which portion contains an area of two hundred and ten square yards or thereabouts and is more particularly delineated on the said plan and thereon coloured green may be advantageously separated from the Parish of Breamore and be annexed to the Parish of Hale to which Parish it may be more conveniently annexed.

" That the Incumbent of the Parish of Hale shall have the sole and exclusive Cure of Souls within such portion so to be separated from Breamore and annexed to Hale.

" That the inhabitants of such portion so to be separated from Breamore shall be entitled to accommodation in the Parish Church of Hale but shall cease to be entitled to any right or accommodation in the Parish Church of Breamore except nevertheless any person or persons (if any) possessing a legal right by faculty or otherwise to any pew or sitting in the said Parish Church of Breamore and who may not be willing to relinquish and give up the same.

" That the inhabitants of such portion so to be separated from Breamore shall have the same right to have marriages, baptisms, churchings and burials, solemnized and performed in the Parish Church of Hale as they might have had in the Parish Church of Breamore.

" That all fees, ecclesiastical offerings and emoluments, arising from or in respect of such portion so to be separated from the Parish of Breamore shall henceforth belong to the Incumbent of the Benefice of Hale.

" That no alteration shall be made in the endowments of either of the said Benefices of Hale or Breamore.

" That no alteration shall be made in the Patronage of the said Benefice of Breamore.

And whereas the Board of Trade are satisfied on representations made by consumers of the articles specified in the Schedule to this Order that those articles are not made in any part of His Majesty's Dominions in quantities which are substantial having regard to the consumption of those articles for the time being in the United Kingdom and that there is no reasonable probability that those articles will within a reasonable period be made in His Majesty's Dominions in such substantial quantities:

Now therefore We, being two of the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury, in pursuance of the powers conferred on Us by the said Section 10 of the Finance Act, 1926, and of all other powers enabling us in that behalf hereby order as follows:

1. Such of the articles mentioned in the Schedule to this Order as are not entered under the Customs Acts before the 27th day of June, 1927, shall be exempt from the duty imposed by Section one of the Safeguarding of

Industries Act, as amended by the Finance Act, 1926, for a period ending on the 6th day of March, 1928.

2. This Order may be cited as the Safeguarding of Industries (Exemption) No. 2 Order, 1927.

Commencing at a point where the London Midland and Scottish Railway from Lancaster to Long Preston crosses the county boundary near High Bentham, thence south-easterly along that railway to the point where it intersects the road from Settle to Rathmell, thence in a southerly direction along that road via Rathmell, Wigglesworth, Becks Brow Bottom, Pikeber, Mere Sike, Flass Gate, Forest Becks, Holden, Bolton Peel, and Bow Lathe to Sawley; thence continuing in a south westerly direction along the road from Sawley via Foxley Bank, Grindleton, Lane Side, Lower West Clough, West Bradford, Waddington, Bashall Bridge, Backridge, and Bashall to the River Hodder; thence following the county boundary in a generally northerly direction to the point of commencement.
