

Now, therefore, His Majesty is pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:—

1. This Order may be cited as the Land Purchase (Northern Ireland) Order, 1927.

2. Subsection (5) of section 28 of the Purchase of Land (Ireland) Act, 1891, shall have effect as if for the words "judge of the High Court" there were substituted the words "judge of the Supreme Court."

The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of the Act of the 7th and 8th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 94, of the Act of the 13th and 14th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 94, and of the Act of the 32nd and 33rd years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 94, duly prepared, and laid before His Majesty in Council, a Scheme or Representation bearing date the 19th day of May, 1927, in the words and figures following, that is to say:—

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, acting under the provisions of the Act of the 7th and 8th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 94, of the Act of the 13th and 14th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 94, and of the Act of the 32nd and 33rd years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 94, have prepared, and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council, the following Scheme or Representation for altering the boundaries of the New Parish of Mount Pellon and the New Parish of Saint George, Ovenden, both in the County of York and in the Diocese of Wakefield:

"Whereas by the authority of an Order of Her said late Majesty in Council bearing date the 8th day of February, 1855, and published in the London Gazette on the 13th day of the same month a District Chapelry was assigned to the consecrated Church called Christ Church, situate at Mount Pellon, in the Parish of Halifax, in the said County of York and at that time in the Diocese of Ripon, but now in the said Diocese of Wakefield, and the said District Chapelry was named 'The District Chapelry of Mount Pellon':

"And whereas by the authority of another Order of Her said late Majesty in Council bearing date the 22nd day of February, 1878, and published in the London Gazette on the 26th day of the same month, a Consolidated Chapelry was assigned to the consecrated Church of Saint George, situate within the Township of Ovenden, in the Chapelry of Illingworth, in the said Parish of Halifax, and the said Consolidated Chapelry was named 'The Consolidated Chapelry of Saint George, Ovenden':

"And whereas the said District Chapelry of Mount Pellon and the said Consolidated Chapelry of Saint George, Ovenden, have

under the provisions of the Act of the 19th and 20th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 104, become New Parishes of the character contemplated by that Act, by the Act of the 6th and 7th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 37, and by the above-mentioned Act of the 32nd and 33rd years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 94:

"And whereas it has been represented to us, and it appears to us to be expedient that the boundaries of the said New Parish of Mount Pellon and the said New Parish of Saint George, Ovenden, should be altered in the manner which is hereinafter mentioned:

"Now, therefore, with the consent of the Right Reverend George Rodney, Bishop of Wakefield (in testimony whereof he has signed and sealed this Scheme or Representation), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, humbly represent, recommend and propose that from and after the day of the date of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme or Representation and without any assurance in the law other than such duly gazetted Order the boundaries of the said New Parish of Mount Pellon and the said New Parish of Saint George, Ovenden, shall be altered so that (first) all those portions of the said Chapelry of Illingworth and of the Chapelry of Luddenden, in the said Parish of Halifax, which are described in the First Schedule hereunder written and are delineated and set forth upon the map or plan hereunto annexed and are thereon coloured pink shall be dissevered from such Chapelries and shall be annexed to and shall in future form part of the said New Parish of Mount Pellon, and (secondly) all that portion of the said New Parish of Mount Pellon which is described in the Second Schedule hereunder written and is delineated and set forth upon the said map or plan hereunto annexed and is thereon coloured green shall be dissevered from such New Parish and shall be annexed to and shall in future form part of the said New Parish of Saint George, Ovenden.

"And we further represent, recommend and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from representing, recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid, or any of them, in accordance with the provisions of the hereinbefore mentioned Acts or of any of them, or of any other Act of Parliament.

"THE SCHEDULES to which the foregoing Scheme or Representation has reference.

"THE FIRST SCHEDULE.

"The territory to be annexed to the New Parish of Mount Pellon, in the County of York and in the Diocese of Wakefield, being:—

"I. All that portion of the Chapelry of Illingworth, in the Parish of Halifax, in the said County and Diocese, which is bounded upon part of the east, and upon the south east by the said New Parish of Mount Pellon, upon the west by the Chapelry of Luddenden, in the said Parish of Halifax, and upon the remaining sides that is to say, upon the north, upon the north east and upon the remaining part of the east, by an imaginary line commencing at the point where the boundary which divides the said Chapelry of Luddenden
