GOVERNMENT OF IRELAND ACT, 1920.

Notice is hereby given, in accordance with the provisions of the Rules Publication Act, 1893, that after the expiration of 40 days from the date hereof, it is proposed to submit to His Majesty in Council the Draft of an Order in Council under section 69 of the Government of Ireland Act, 1920, entitled "The Land Purchase (Northern Ireland) Amendment Order, 1927." On account of the urgency of the matters dealt with by this Order it comes into operation forthwith provisionally in accordance with section 2 of the Rules Publication Act, 1893. Copies of the Draft Order can be obtained by any Public Body within 40 days from the date of this Notice at the Privy Council Office, Whitehall.
