The Home Secretary gives notice, that in pursuance of Section 2 (1) of the Employment of Women, Young Persons and Children Act, 1920, he has made an Order authorising the employment on two day-shifts, of women of 18 and male young persons of 16 years of age and over in the Grinding Department at the works of The British Barytes, Limited, Silkstone Common, near Barnsley, subject to the conditions that a worker shall not be employed in the afternoon shift in consecutive weeks; that suitable washing facilities, cloak-room and messroom accommodation shall be provided; that a woman or male young person shall not be allowed to lift, carry or move anything so heavy as to be likely to cause injury to such woman or male young person; and that the Secretary of State may at any time require the occupiers to make such special arrangements for the conveyance of workers living at a distance or otherwise for the welfare of such workers as may be necessary to prevent hardship.

RETAIL BESPOKE TAILORING TRADE
BOARD (ENGLAND AND WALES).

PROPOSAL TO FIX GENERAL MINIMUM PIECE-RATES AND TO VARY THE OVERTIME RATES FOR CERTAIN CLASSES OF MALE WORKERS IN THE MUNICIPAL BOROUGH OF MACCLESFIELD IN THE COUNTY OF CHESHIRE.

In accordance with Regulations made under Section 18 of the Trade Boards Act, 1909 by the Minister of Labour and dated 21st April, 1927, the Trade Board established under the Trade Boards Acts, 1909 and 1918, for those branches of the Trade specified in the Trade Boards (Tailoring) Order, 1919, which are covered by the Regulations made by the Minister of Labour and dated 6th August, 1924, with respect to the Retail Bespoke Section of the Tailoring Trade in England and Wales HEREBY GIVE NOTICE that they PROPOSE TO FIX General Minimum Piece-Rates and to Vary the Overtime Rates for certain classes of Male Workers in the Municipal Borough of Macclesfield in the County of Cheshire by providing:—

(1) that in the Municipal Borough of Macclesfield the General Minimum Piece-Rates for the classes of Male Workers specified in Part V of the Trade Board's Notice R.B. (W.L.) 2, dated 9th July, 1927, shall be the General Minimum Piece-Rates applicable under Part V of the Notice R.B. (W.L.) 2, in Area A (2);

(2) that the Overtime Rates in respect of the workers coming within the terms of Paragraph (1) of this Notice shall be calculated as provided in Paragraph 34 of the Notice R.B. (W.L.) 2.

Pursuant to Section 3 (5) of the Trade Boards Act, 1918, the Trade Board will consider any Objections to the above Proposal which may be lodged with them within two months from the 12th day of July, 1927. Such
