WELFARE OF WORKERS IN FACTORIES AND WORKSHOPS.

The Secretary of State for the Home Department hereby gives notice that, in pursuance of the powers conferred on him by Section 7 of the Police, Factories, &c. (Miscellaneous Provisions) Act, 1916, of making Orders for securing the welfare of the workers employed in factories and workshops, he proposes to make an Order to apply to all factories and workshops or parts thereof in which are carried on the processes of icing, creaming and filling biscuits and wafers and mixing the ingredients therefor.

The Civil Service Commissioners hereby give notice that the following Regulations are published with the approval of the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury, viz.:—

REGULATIONS RESPECTING OPEN COMPETITIVE EXAMINATIONS FOR THE ADMISSION OF BOYS AND GIRLS TO THE CLERICAL CLASSES (GENERAL AND DEPARTMENTAL) OF THE CIVIL SERVICE.

These Regulations are liable to alteration from time to time.

1. AGE.—The limits of age are 16 and 17. For an examination beginning in one of the first six months of the year the governing date on which candidates must be of the prescribed age is the first of March; for an examination beginning in one of the last six months of the year the governing date is the first of September. A candidate who attained the age

of 16 on the governing date would be admitted, but a candidate who attained 17 on that date would not be admitted.

In reckoning age for competition persons who have served in any established civil situation to which they were admitted with the certificate of the Civil Service Commissioners may deduct from their actual age any time not exceeding two years which they may have spent in such service.

2. NATIONALITY. — Candidates must be natural-born British subjects and the children of fathers also natural-born British subjects:

Provided that exception may be made in the case of persons serving in a civil situation to which they were admitted with the certificate of the Civil Service Commissioners.

3. Candidates will be required to satisfy the Civil Service Commissioners that they are duly qualified in respect of health and character. Female candidates must be unmarried and will be required to resign their appointments on marriage.

4. The subjects of examination and the marks they will carry are as follows:—

(1) English	300
(2) Arithmetic	40
(3) Mathematics	200
(4) Science	200
(5) One of the following languages—French, German, Spanish, Latin, Greek, Welsh, Scottish Gaelic	200
(6) History	100
(7) Geography	100

5. All candidates take subjects 1 and 2; they may also offer all or any of the optional subjects 3 to 7. In these optional subjects a high standard of performance will be required, so that really good work on optional subjects aggregating 600 will get more marks than moderate work on a greater number and a candidate can be successful on optional subjects aggregating 600 or 700 as well as on a greater number.

Candidates must obtain such an aggregate of marks in the examination as a whole as to satisfy the Civil Service Commissioners.

6. The examination may be held in one part or in two parts, at the discretion of the Civil Service Commissioners. In the latter case the first part of the examination will be used to reduce the number of competitors to be admitted to the second part. Of those whose performance on the first part is best a certain number, to be determined by the Civil Service Commissioners, will be admitted to the second part of the examination. The successful list will consist of those candidates who obtain the highest aggregate marks on the whole examination. If the examination is held in two parts, the second part may be held in fewer centres than the first.

7. It will rest with the Civil Service Commissioners to determine the Departments to which the successful candidates shall be assigned. In making the assignments the Commissioners will be guided by the requirements of the public service. Subject to this condition, the wishes of candidates will, where possible, be respected.

8. Persons upon whose training for the occupation of teacher public money has been spent cannot be appointed until the consent

of the appropriate education authority has been notified to the Civil Service Commissioners.

Persons holding situations in the Civil Service must obtain the permission of the authorities of their Department to attend the examination before the commencement of the examination.

9. Application for permission to attend an examination must be made at such times and in such manner as may be fixed by the Civil Service Commissioners.

10. A fee of £2 will be required from every candidate attending an examination.

The Civil Service Commissioners further give notice that an Open Competitive Examination will be held under the foregoing Regulations, commencing on the 29th November, 1927. The following is a provisional list of the centres at which the first part of the examination may be held:—Aberdeen, Belfast, Birmingham, Bristol, Cardiff, Edinburgh, Glasgow, Hull, Leeds, Liverpool, London, Manchester, Newcastle-on-Tyne, Norwich, Nottingham, Plymouth, Portsmouth and Preston.

The final list of centres will be decided when the number of candidates desiring examination at each centre is known.

PORT OF LONDON AUTHORITY.

BYE-LAWS AMENDING THE PORT OF LONDON RIVER BYE-LAWS 1914.

The Port of London Authority, in exercise of the power and authority vested in them by the Port of London (Consolidation) Act 1920 and of every other power them hereunto enabling, do make the following Bye-laws:—

Repeal.

1. Bye-laws 16 and 28 (h) of the Port of London River Bye-laws 1914 shall after these present Bye-laws come into operation be and the same are hereby repealed.

Short title and commencement.

2. These Bye-laws may be cited as "The Port of London River (Amendment) Bye-laws 1927." and shall come into operation on the expiration of fourteen days after the date of the confirmation thereof by the Minister of Transport.

Interpretation.

3. In these Bye-laws words and expressions to which a special meaning is assigned by the Port of London River Bye-laws 1914 have the same meaning as they have in the Port of London River Bye-laws 1914.

Day signal for motor vessels under way with sails set and motors working.

4. A vessel when under way with sails set and being propelled by mechanical means other than that of steam, shall exhibit by day, in addition to any other signals prescribed by these Bye-laws or the Port of London River Bye-laws 1914, a black diamond shape not less than three feet in height and two feet in width which shall be placed vertically at the highest point of the masthead of such vessel as to be visible all round the horizon.

Sound signals for vessels in fog, etc.

5. In fog, mist, falling snow or heavy rain storms, whether by day or night, the signals described in this Bye-law shall be used as follows, viz.:—

(a) A vessel of five hundred feet or upwards in length when in the fairway, at anchor or not under way, shall—

(i) Ring in the forward part of the vessel the bell prescribed by article 15 (d) of the General Regulations for Preventing Collisions at Sea.

(ii) Sound at or near the stern of such vessel a loud-toned triangle or other loud-toned instrument that cannot be mistaken for a bell, whistle, syren, fog horn or gong.

The bell shall be rung and the triangle or other instrument sounded respectively for a period of five seconds, at intervals of not more than one minute.

(b) A vessel less than five hundred feet in length when in the fairway, at anchor or not under way, shall at intervals of not more than one minute sound a bell rapidly for about 5 seconds.

Lights and signals for vessel aground in or near the fairway.

6. A vessel of one hundred feet or upwards in length, other than a lighter, aground in or near the fairway shall, by night, exhibit in the forward part of such vessel three lights placed vertically, of which the centre one shall be red and the other two white (such lights to be visible all round the horizon at a distance of at least one mile), and by day shall exhibit three black shapes (the upper and lower to be spherical, not less than two feet in diameter, and the centre shape to be cylindrical, not less than two feet in length and nine inches in diameter). Such lights or shapes, as the case may be, shall be placed vertically in the forward part of the vessel not less than six feet apart.

A vessel of one hundred and fifty feet or upwards in length shall by night in addition to the above-mentioned lights exhibit the after light required to be carried by a vessel at anchor.

The lights or shapes mentioned in this Bye-law shall be so placed that the lowermost in the forward part of the vessel shall be at a height of not less than twenty feet and not more than forty feet above the hull, and the after light not less than fifteen feet lower than the lowermost forward light. This Bye-law shall not apply to vessels above London Bridge or to vessels lying at tiers, wharves, piers or jetties.

Vessel when towing to be fitted with mast or funnel by day.

7. A vessel when towing another vessel or when attached to another vessel for the purpose of towing or manœuvring the same shall be fitted with a mast of not less than fifteen feet in height above the hull unless such towing vessel has a funnel of such a height as to be visible above the vessel being towed or attached.

Penalty.

8. Any person acting in contravention of these Bye-laws shall for every such act be liable to the penalty prescribed by Bye-law 82 of The Port of London River Bye-laws 1914.

Any person desirous of making any objection to or representation respecting such proposed Bye-laws may do so in writing or otherwise, on or before the 31st day of August, 1927, to the undersigned.

So much of the parishes of Bowland Forest Higher Division, Bowland Forest Lower Division, Easington, Slaidburn, Newton Bentham, Clapham-cum-Newby, Austwick, Lawkland, Giggleswick, Rathmell, Wigglesworth, Gisburn Forest, Tossie, Bolton-by-Bowland, Sawley, Grindleton, West Bradford Waddington, Bashall Eaves and Great Mitton as lies within the following boundary namely:—

Commencing at a point where the London Midland and Scottish Railway from Lancaster to Long Preston crosses the county boundary near High Bentham, thence south-easterly along that railway to the point where it intersects the road from Settle to Rathmell, thence in a southerly direction along that road via Rathmell, Wigglesworth, Becks Brow Bottom, Pikeber, Mere Sike, Flass Gate, Forest Becks, Holden, Bolton Peel, and Bow Lathe to Sawley; thence continuing in a south westerly direction along the road from Sawley via Foxley Bank, Grindleton, Lane Side, Lower West Clough, West Bradford, Waddington Bashall Bridge, Backridge, and Bashall to the River Hodder; thence following the county boundary in a generally northerly direction to the point of commencement.
