AGRICULTURAL WAGES (REGULATION) ACT, 1924.

Whereas the Agricultural Wages Committee for the area comprising the administrative counties of Cambridge and Isle of Ely have in pursuance of the above Act, duly fixed minimum rates of wages for workers employed in agriculture for time work during the Corn Harvest of 1927 in that area and the said rates are set out in the Schedule to this Order. Now the Agricultural Wages Board in pursuance of the said Act, and for the purpose of carrying out the decision of the said Committee, hereby order that the provisions contained in the Schedule to this Order shall become effective from the 25th day of July, 1927.
